Pan-European Congress. (Vienna, 4—7 October, 1926). This Congress is called by the Pan-European Union, to consider problems relating to the Union of Europe. Information may be obtained from Oesterreichische Verkerbüro, Friedrichstrasse, Wien I., or from Centra Oficejo de Paneŭropa Unio, Hofburg, Wien I. Esperanto is officially recognised as a language usable at this congress.

Rotary. Mr. C. F. Carr gave a fine address to the Weymouth Rotary Club on 7 June. A motion was passed: "That the Weymouth Rotarians ask the R.I.B.I. to ask the Board of Education to recognise Esperanto as a modern language in secondary schools."

Socialist. The S.A.T. Congress will be held in Leningrad, 5—10 August. Special concessions by the Soviet Government have been granted to visitors. The organisers are offering free accommodation to all foreign Esperantists. A caravan leaves London on 31st July for "two or three weeks' stay. Particulars from Workers' Esperanto Club, 144 *High Holborn, London, W.C. 1*. At least 30 will go from Britain.

A Week-end Summer School of B.L.E.S. will be held in Harrow, from 11.0 to 7.0., on 18th July. Particulars from S. Hodges, 96 *Herga Rd., Wealdstone*.

Articles on Esperanto have appeared in *Birmingham Town Crier*, *Lansbury's Labour Weekly*, *Sunday Worker*, and *Daily Herald*.

Members of the Labour Party are asked to support the resolution on Esperanto which is tabled for the Party's next Annual Congress.

The National Council of Labour Colleges have given free correspondence courses in Esperanto to 75 locked-out miners.

Theosophy. Mr. Peter Mylles, 28 *West View, Letchworth, Herts*, on behalf of the International Correspondence League of the Theosophical Order of Service, asks for names and addresses of British Esperantists willing to interchange occasional correspondence on subjects of mutual interest with Esperantist Members of the Theosophical Society in other countries. He has a number of correspondents waiting to be put into touch. We hope that readers will help.

Tramwaymen in Edinburgh are learning Esperanto for use during the Congress week. Congress Members will have the use of the Corporation Trams and Omnibuses free during the Congress. *Speed* (June) states that a conductor has already been heard to exclaim "La luno brilos bele hodiaŭ nokte," and that the passengers were not sure whether this was bad language or not!

"Experimental Wireless" and "The Wireless Engineer."

The value of Esperanto to the wireless experimenter is emphasised by the result of a questionnaire recently submitted to readers of *Experimental Wireless and The Wireless Engineer*. The replies received showed very clearly that an Esperanto section was keenly appreciated, and such a section is now incorporated each month. The Esperanto section takes the form of a number of brief extracts of the articles appearing in the previous issue. These are of special service to those foreign readers who can read Esperanto but whose

knowledge of English is not sufficient to enable them to gather the contents of an article by simply perusing the pages.

Experimental Wireless has already shown itself ready to take the lead in international collaboration by indexing its articles on the Dewey system, in common with technical magazines in other countries, and the above-mentioned Esperanto feature is a fresh sign that the magazine is in the van of progress. We trust that wireless magazines in other countries will reciprocate for mutual benefit by publishing similar Esperanto abstracts in their columns. We are proud that England in this matter at least is leading the way, and commend the magazine, which is admittedly in the forefront of serious wireless magazines, to all readers interested in radio. The price is 1/- monthly, and it can be obtained anywhere.

VARIOUS.

Esperanto and Radio. The petition to the B.B.C. has so far been signed by perhaps one member in ten. The readiness of the average member to leave even a little thing like this to the other members is very characteristic, but is not calculated to give a true impression of the real strength of the desire for Esperanto broadcasting. One bright exception must be mentioned, in the person of Mr. S. P. Marks, who has obtained some 360 signatures. All honour to him. But is it fair to leave to him, and one or two like him, the work which must be done by every member, if the petition is to be presented?

Apudmara Renkontejo Esperantista. It is intended to organise an Esperantist week in Cannes at a very low figure from 22—28 August. All information from Ch. Cresp, 14 Rue du Docteur Gazagnaire, Cannes, Alpes Maritimes, France.

Vienna Congress. Members are aware that the Vienna Congress left a deficit of over £600. This was partly due to the optimism of the Congress Committee, who overestimated the number who would attend, and consequently made expensive arrangements accordingly; and partly due to the fact that those attending did not support the entertainments provided, which were therefore pure loss. Appeals were subsequently made for help, and it is right to say that in many cases money sent was not acknowledged, and complaints were not attended to.

The debt now remains at about £500, and the local friends who arranged the congress are threatened by legal proceedings, and have issued a further appeal for help.

Now is not the time for criticism or complaints, which it is admitted were sometimes justified. Esperantists generally, and especially those who attended the Congress, or who announced their adhesion and did not attend, and so are to some extent personally interested in the matter, are asked to send contributions direct to the U.E.A. in Geneva (or through the B.E.A.) The U.E.A. will see that contributions sent are properly acknowledged, and reach the right quarter.

The B.E.A. Congress members in Huddersfield made a start by a collection of £6.

SO NOW WE KNOW!

The following are amusing examples of the danger of rushing into print on matters of which one is profoundly ignorant. Comment is needless.

"It is one of the commonplaces of statesmanship that an international language is necessary to progress. Esperanto was tried as that language, and Esperanto failed. Why? Simply because nobody could be bothered to learn it. Esperanto had none of the simplicity and energy required in a common tongue. It was tortuous, unwieldy; and so it has fallen into oblivion, leaving the way clear for its successor—American!"—John Lockett in *T.P.'s and Cassell's Weekly*, 26 June.

"Esperanto . . . is not easy of acquirement to the

non-European, . . . it is contamned (sic) by philologists and philosophers alike. It is, they say, at once too rough and ready and too complicated phonetically: it has no history and no beauty . . . For the jargon of commerce, and the crudely universal notices and declarations which confront the international traveller, Esperanto has indeed a message of hope . . . But literature, and the expression of personal thought, continue to demand some less jerry-built, more naturally grown and naturally twisted language . . . To learn a living foreign language is to learn the mind of a living people, but to learn an invented universal tongue teaches nothing except the mind of its inventor." —Leader in *The Liverpool Post and Mercury*, 2 July, 1926.
