19th BRITISH ESPERANTO CONGRESS, WHITSUNTIDE.

This year the Congress will be held at Newcastle-on-Tyne in the very fine premises of the Armstrong College. On Thursday evening there will be a lecture in the College by Prof. W. E. Collinson, on "The Problem of an International Language." The Congress proper begins on Friday evening, May 25th, with a Concert and Social Evening. During Saturday morning there will be conducted tours through old Newcastle, giving glimpses of its 1800 years' history.

The Annual Meeting of the B.E.A. will be held in the King's Hall of the College, at 4.30 p.m., and at 7.30 p.m. a public meeting will present to the Congress members a North-umbrian programme of song by the well-known Prudhoe Gleemen, and to the general public addresses on "Esperanto and Education" by recognised authorities on the subject.

On Sunday, May 27th, there will be a "Vagado" in Jesmond Dene, Newcastle's famous natural park, and at 1 p.m. the Congress Lunch. The Diservo will be in Newcastle Cathedral, and arrangements are being made for a Congress tea after the service. Congress members are also invited to attend the evening service at Brunswick Church, where seats will be reserved as necessary. A Concert in the King's Hall will conclude the day's programme.

On Whit-Monday there will be a whole-day

excursion to Hexham and the Chesters Roman Camp, with lunch in Hexham.

The Congress Ball will be held in the King's Hall in the evening.

Those who can help in the Concerts on Friday and Sunday evenings please inform the Secretary as soon as possible.

Newcastle is still a "war-stricken" area, and suffers desperately from industrial depression; but the local samideanoj will give the warmest of welcomes to all who come.

Scouts. The Secretary of the *Scouts' Esperanto League*, Norman Booth, Netherton, Huddersfield, writes with reference to the Jamboree to be held in Lancashire in 1929, that scouts will attend from 40 countries or more. Interpreters are asked to volunteer. The S.E.L., asks Esperantists to encourage Scouts to learn Esperanto and join S.E.L., and to offer their services as Esperanto Instructors to Scout Troops. The three most important scout magazines in Britain have recently published articles on Esperanto. It is up to Esperantists to follow this up with their local troops.

Youth. The Committee of the *World Youth Peace Congress* to be held in Overijssel, Holland, 17-26 August, is taking seriously its resolution to use Esperanto only for translation purposes at this Congress. PASSED PRELIMINARY EXAMINATION.
