THE FINANCIAL SITUATION.

Although our subscription income is steadily increasing, it does not yet, in spite of the care with which it is administered, provide sufficient funds to meet essential expenditure. We look forward to a not distant time when increased membership and sales will balance our necessary expenses for offices, staff, etc. In the meantime we are faced with an inevitable, though decreasing, annual deficit.

In order to cover this deficit and enable the work of the Association to be carried on in these years of pioneer effort, some generous members of the Association combine to support a Guarantee Fund, upon which the Association may call annually to the extent of its need.

The total guaranteed for 1930 is at present £382. We need at least £500, though we should like to see the sum much higher, in order to reduce the *pro rata* call eventually made on the individual Guarantor.

Guarantees may be for any sum from 5/- upwards, and we urge members who have not yet done so to support this fund to the utmost of their ability. No money is asked for at present; when a call is necessary guarantors will be advised. Forms on application.

ESPERANTO FILM.

The first presentation of the Esperanto Talking Film in this country was made on Sunday, May 11th, at the Futurist Theatre, Birmingham.

The performance was a special one, for which invitations had been sent out. About 1200 people attended, and had a very enjoyable afternoon. The Esperanto film, although short, is very good, and the enunciation was perfect. In addition to this film, which was shown twice, the British Movietone News and a long ordinary talking film were shown, and Esperanto songs were heard, amplified from gramophone records.

The presentation of the Esperanto film was introduced by Mr. I. H. Wright, and a vote of thanks to the Paramount Company was proposed by Prof. R. Beazley and seconded by Mr. R. Farrow. The Theatre Management had prominently decorated the front of the Theatre with an Esperanto welcome, and with flags. Thanks are due to the Midland Esperantists, to the Paramount Company, and to the Manager and Staff of the Futurist Theatre, for this well carried out and exceptionally fine propaganda effort.

To Group Secretaries. This column is for you. Please send all news of general interest. Be brief. Be precise. Give dates; auspices, hour, place, day, fee, teacher of classes; interesting features of meetings.

Avoid padding, and details of no interest to readers in other parts of the world. Reports should be by preference typed, on one side of the paper, and not mixed up with letters on other matters. The recognised abbreviation for *Sinjoro* is *S-ro* (not *S.*, *So.*, *S'o.*, *Sr.*, or *Snjo*). Write in Esperanto by preference, otherwise English, but not in a mixture. Note that *studento* means an undergraduate, a university student, and that pupils in a class are (or should be) *lernantoj*. Reports must reach the B.E.A. by the 10th of the month. Attention to these matters would greatly reduce labour in the office. Especially welcome are concrete facts showing progress, and details of new methods of propaganda which you have found successful; the kind of thing you yourself look for in reports by other group secretaries.

What to Avoid. “The weekly meeting of our Esperanto class, which will perhaps some day affiliate to the B.E.A., was held last Tuesday as usual, in the house of a friend of one of our *membroj*, Miss Jonkins, who kindly lent her cosy drawing-room *por la okazo*, but did not commence punctually as announced, as members straggled in late owing to the rain, though six *samideanoj* were present, including a visitor, who was much impressed (he is a local bookseller); and the smallness of numbers was compensated by the enthusiasm of those *studentoj* who had braved the elements. The chair was taken by our energetic secretary, *Fraŭlino* Tupton, who is also the *kasisto* and Librarian of the *Grupo*, and after her opening remarks, in which she eloquently explained that *la kara* is an international language designed to help and not to hinder the spread of the national tongues, invented by Dr. Zamenhof, the *kunveno* was commenced by Miss *Gonz*, who though she had learned Esperanto only three weeks and two days was tastefully clad in green crepe de chine, and sang with great feeling and perfect pronunciation the international anthem *La Espero*, to the music of *S'o Menil*, gracefully accompanied by her charming fiancé Mr. Smyth Robinson (the leaves of the music being most skilfully turned by their mutual friend *Sinjoro* D. W. H. Brown) and responded to a hearty encore by repeating the last verse, in the last line of which all present in the room joined, and went home hoping to have the pleasure of hearing the talented *fraŭlino* again at a no distant date, after which the meeting closed at the usual hour.”
