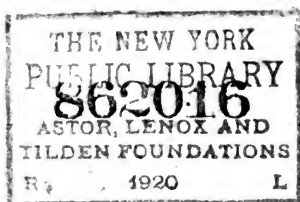

## PREFACE.

THE publisher has attempted the compilation of the NEW-YORK STATE REGISTER, from a decided conviction that such a work will be *useful* to the people of the state, as a *book of reference*, communicating much valuable information to men of business, and others. The *utility* of such a book, must be manifest to all, and has been abundantly tested in other states.

The *plan* of the work was projected in *May last*, without a knowledge on the part of the publisher that any other person had *ever* been engaged in a similar undertaking, and with the belief that such a plan was *entirely new in its application to this state*. But some time in September last, after the original scheme was completed, and the outlines of it were nearly filled up, the publisher was accidentally apprized that a work in some respects *similar*, though *essentially different* in its character, was published at ALBANY, in the year 1821, by B. THALHIMER, Esq. which was afterwards discontinued.

The NEW-YORK STATE REGISTER, is designed to be published *annually*. Of its merits, and its claims to patronage *the public* must judge. Unwearied efforts and untiring labour have been exerted to make it what it is, and *what it is*, with all its imperfections, is *stamped* upon its face. That it is *entirely free from errors* is not expected, but it is believed to be as correct as, in the nature of things, it is possible in the *first instance* to make such a book, out of an *unorganized mass of materials*, collected from every quarter of this great state. It may be proper however for the publisher to state, that in the *great delay* of some of his correspondents, he has met with impediments to that degree of accuracy, which he had flattered himself would *characterize* the work in the outset.

Such *inaccuracies* as are known to exist, are *corrected* as far as possible in the *Appendix*, to which the reader is referred.

With these remarks, and with the hope that this little *Manual* will receive sufficient patronage to remunerate the author for the great labour and expense which have attended its publication, and induce its continuance hereafter, it is now submitted to the *decision of the public*.

To his correspondents and friends, who have answered his inquiries, the publisher tenders his grateful acknowledgments, while he respectfully solicits their future assistance.

*Ardent Spirits are not necessary to support the Laborer in hot Weather.*—"The experiment," says Dr. Mussey, "has been made a thousand times, and the result is well known, viz. that more labor can be accomplished in a month, or a year, under the influence of simple nourishing food and unstimulating drink, than through the aid of ardent spirits. 'I visited,' says a gentleman, 'four or five years since, in New-Jersey, an iron foundry belonging to Mr. Wood, of Philadelphia; I think there were thirty or forty men employed in the establishment, and all they drank was pure spring water. I saw them often, while lading out the hot metal and sweating at every pore, take a mug, run to the spring, and drink very freely of the water. I inquired if they did not feel any ill effects

It is in the power of every ship-owner to prevent the use of ardent spirits on board his vessels, by sending out a few barrels of molasses, and a few dozen bottles of the essence of spruce, for beer.

"To the foregoing suggestion it may be proper to add, that, for laboring men in hot weather, sweetened water, sometimes with the addition of ginger, is a most salutary drink; so also is a mixture of milk and water."

THE  
**CONSTITUTION**

OF

**THE STATE OF NEW-YORK.**

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**ADOPTED IN CONVENTION IN 1821.**

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WE, the people of the State of New-York, acknowledging with gratitude the grace and beneficence of God, in permitting us to make choice of our form of government, do establish this Constitution.

ARTICLE FIRST.

SECTION I. The legislative power of this state shall be vested in a senate and an assembly.

SEC. II. The senate shall consist of *thirty-two* members. The senators shall be chosen for *four* years, and shall be freeholders. The assembly shall consist of *one hundred and twenty-eight* members, who shall be *annually* elected.

SEC. III. A majority of each house shall constitute a quorum to do business. Each house shall determine the rules of its own proceedings, and be the judge of the qualifications of its own members. Each house shall choose its own officers; and the senate shall choose a temporary president when the lieutenant governor shall not attend as president, or shall act as governor.

SEC. IV. Each house shall keep a journal of its proceedings, and publish the same, except such parts as may require secrecy. The doors of each house shall be kept open, except when the public welfare

shall require secrecy. Neither house shall, without the consent of the other, adjourn for more than two days.

SEC. V. The state shall be divided into *eight districts*, to be called SENATE DISTRICTS, each of which shall choose *four* senators.

The *first* district shall consist of the counties of Suffolk, Queens, Kings, Richmond, and New-York.

The *second* district shall consist of the counties of Westchester, Putnam, Dutchess, Rockland, Orange, Ulster, and Sullivan.

The *third* district shall consist of the counties of Greene, Columbia, Albany, Rensselaer, Schoharie, and Schenectady.

The *fourth* district shall consist of the counties of Saratoga, Montgomery, Hamilton, Washington, Warren, Clinton, Essex, Franklin, and St. Lawrence.

The *fifth* district shall consist of the counties of Herkimer, Oneida, Madison, Oswego, Lewis, and Jefferson.

The *sixth* district shall consist of the counties of Delaware, Otsego, Chenango, Broome, Cortland, Tompkins, and Tioga.

The *seventh* district shall consist of the counties of Onondaga, Cayuga, Seneca, and Ontario.

The *eighth* district shall consist of the counties of Steuben, Livingston, Monroe, Genesee, Niagara, Erie, Allegany, Cattaraugus and Chautauque.

And as soon as the senate shall meet, after the first election to be held in pursuance of this constitution, they shall cause the senators to be divided by lot into four classes, of eight in each, so that every district shall have one senator of each class; the classes to be numbered, one, two, three, and four. And the seats of the first class shall be vacated at the end of the *first* year; of the second class at the end of the *second* year; of the third class at the end of the *third* year; of the fourth class at the end of the *fourth* year, in order that one senator be *annually* elected in each senate district.

SEC. VI. An enumeration of the inhabitants of the

state shall be taken, under the direction of the legislature, in the year one thousand eight hundred and twenty-five, and at the end of every ten years thereafter; and the said districts shall be so altered by the legislature, at the first session after the return of every enumeration, that each senate district shall contain, as nearly as may be, an equal number of inhabitants, excluding aliens, paupers, and persons of colour not taxed; and shall remain unaltered until the return of another enumeration, and shall at all times consist of contiguous territory; and no county shall be divided in the formation of a senate district.

SEC. VII. The members of the assembly shall be chosen by counties, and shall be apportioned among the several counties of the state, as nearly as may be, according to the numbers of their respective inhabitants, excluding aliens, paupers, and persons of colour not taxed. An apportionment of members of assembly shall be made by the legislature, at its first session, after the return of every enumeration; and when made, shall remain unaltered until another enumeration shall have been taken. But an apportionment of members of the assembly shall be made by the present legislature, according to the last enumeration, taken under the authority of the United States, as nearly as may be. Every county heretofore established, and separately organized, shall always be entitled to one member of the assembly; and no new county shall hereafter be erected, unless its population shall entitle it to a member.

SEC. VIII. Any bill may originate in either house of the legislature; and all bills passed by one house may be amended by the other.

SEC. IX. The members of the legislature shall receive for their services a compensation, to be ascertained by law, and paid out of the public treasury; but no increase of the compensation shall take effect, during the year in which it shall have been made. And no law shall be passed, increasing the compensation of the members of the legislature beyond the sum of three dollars a day.

SEC. X. No member of the legislature shall receive any civil appointment from the governor and senate, or from the legislature, during the term for which he shall have been elected.

SEC. XI. No person, being a member of Congress, or holding any judicial or military office under the United States, shall hold a seat in the legislature. And if any person shall, while a member of the legislature, be elected to Congress, or appointed to any office, civil or military, under the government of the United States, his acceptance thereof shall vacate his seat.

SEC. XII. Every bill which shall have passed the senate and assembly, shall, before it become a law, be presented to the governor: if he approve, he shall sign it; but if not, he shall return it, with his objections, to that house in which it shall have originated, who shall enter the objections at large on their journal, and proceed to reconsider it. If, after such reconsideration, two thirds of the members present shall agree to pass the bill, it shall be sent, together with the objections, to the other house, by which it shall likewise be reconsidered; and if approved by two thirds of the members present, it shall become a law. But in all such cases, the votes of both houses shall be determined by yeas and nays; and the names of the persons voting for, and against the bill, shall be entered on the journal of each house respectively. If any bill shall not be returned by the governor, within ten days (Sundays excepted) after it shall have been presented to him, the same shall be a law, in like manner as if he had signed it, unless the legislature shall, by their adjournment, prevent its return; in which case it shall not be a law.

SEC. XIII. All officers holding their offices during good behaviour, may be removed by joint resolution of the two houses of the legislature, if two thirds of all the members elected to the assembly, and a majority of all the members elected to the senate, concur therein.

SEC. XIV. The *political* year shall begin on the first day of January; and the legislature shall every year assemble on the first Tuesday of January, unless a different day shall be appointed by law.

**SEC. XV.** The next election for governor, lieutenant governor, senators, and members of assembly, shall commence on the first Monday of November, one thousand eight hundred and twenty-two; and all subsequent elections shall be held at such time in the month of October or November, as the legislature shall by law provide.

**SEC. XVI.** The governor, lieutenant governor, senators, and members of assembly, first elected under this constitution, shall enter on the duties of their respective offices, on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and twenty-three; and the governor, lieutenant governor, senators, and members of assembly, now in office, shall continue to hold the same, until the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and twenty-three, and no longer.

#### ARTICLE SECOND.

**SEC. I.** Every male citizen, of the age of twenty-one years, who shall have been an inhabitant of this state one year preceding any election, and for the last six months a resident of the town or county where he may offer his vote; and shall have, within the year next preceding the election, paid a tax to the state or county, assessed upon his real or personal property; or shall by law be exempted from taxation; or being armed or equipped according to law, shall have performed, within that year, military duty in the militia of this state; or who shall be exempted from performing military duty, in consequence of being a fireman, in any city, town, or village, in this state: And also every male citizen of the age of twenty-one years, who shall have been, for three years next preceding such election, an inhabitant of this state; and for the last year a resident in the town or county where he may offer his vote; and shall have been, within the last year, assessed to labour upon the highways, and shall have performed the labour, or paid an equivalent therefor, according to law, shall be entitled to vote in the town or ward where he actually resides, and not elsewhere, for all officers that now are,

or hereafter may be, elective by the people: But no man of colour, unless he shall have been for three years a citizen of this state, and for one year next preceding any election, shall be seized and possessed of a freehold estate of the value of two hundred and fifty dollars, over and above all debts and incumbrances charged thereon; and shall have been actually rated, and paid a tax thereon, shall be entitled to vote at such election. And no person of colour shall be subject to direct taxation, unless he shall be seized and possessed of such real estate as aforesaid.

SEC. II. Laws may be passed, excluding from the right of suffrage persons who may have been, or may be, convicted of infamous crimes.

SEC. III. Laws shall be made for ascertaining, by proper proofs, the citizens who shall be entitled to the right of suffrage hereby established.

SEC. IV. All elections by the citizens shall be by ballot, except for such town officers as may by law be directed to be otherwise chosen.

#### ARTICLE THIRD.

SEC. I. The executive power shall be vested in a governor. He shall hold his office for two years; and a lieutenant governor shall be chosen at the same time, and for the same term.

SEC. II. No person, except a native citizen of the United States, shall be eligible to the office of governor; nor shall any person be eligible to that office, who shall not be a freeholder, and shall not have attained the age of thirty years, and have been five years a resident within this state; unless he shall have been absent during that time on public business of the United States or of this state.

SEC. III. The governor and lieutenant governor shall be elected at the times and places of choosing members of the legislature. The persons respectively having the highest number of votes for governor and lieutenant governor, shall be elected; but in case two or more shall have an equal and the highest number of votes for

governor or for lieutenant governor, the two houses of the legislature shall, by joint ballot, choose one of the said persons so having an equal and the highest number of votes for governor or lieutenant governor.

SEC. IV. The governor shall be general and commander-in-chief of all the militia, and admiral of the navy of the state. He shall have power to convene the legislature (or the senate only) on extraordinary occasions. He shall communicate by message to the legislature, at every session, the condition of the state; and recommend such matters to them as he shall judge expedient. He shall transact all necessary business with the officers of government, civil and military. He shall expedite all such measures as may be resolved upon by the legislature, and shall take care that the laws are faithfully executed. He shall, at stated times, receive for his services a compensation, which shall neither be increased nor diminished, during the term for which he shall have been elected.

SEC. V. The governor shall have power to grant reprieves and pardons, after conviction, for all offences, except treason and cases of impeachment. Upon convictions for treason, he shall have power to suspend the execution of the sentence, until the case shall be reported to the legislature at its next meeting; when the legislature shall either pardon, or direct the execution of the criminal, or grant a farther reprieve.

SEC. VI. In case of the impeachment of the governor, or his removal from office, death, resignation, or absence from the state, the powers and duties of the office shall devolve upon the lieutenant governor, for the residue of the term, or until the governor absent or impeached, shall return or be acquitted. But when the governor shall, with the consent of the legislature, be out of the state in time of war, at the head of a military force thereof, he shall still continue commander-in-chief of all the military force of the state.

SEC. VII. The lieutenant governor shall be president of the senate, but shall have only a casting vote therein. If during a vacancy of the office of governor, the lieu-



tenant governor shall be impeached, displaced, resign, die, or be absent from the state, the president of the senate shall act as governor, until the vacancy shall be filled, or the disability shall cease.

#### ARTICLE FOURTH.

**SEC. I.** Militia officers shall be chosen, or appointed, as follows: Captains, subalterns, and non-commissioned officers, shall be chosen by the written votes of the members of their respective companies. Field officers of regiments and separate battalions, by the written votes of the commissioned officers of the respective regiments and separate battalions. Brigadier generals, by the field officers of their respective brigades. Major generals, brigadier generals, and commanding officers of regiments or separate battalions, shall appoint the staff officers of their respective divisions, brigades, regiments, or separate battalions.

**SEC. II.** The governor shall nominate, and, with the consent of the senate, appoint all major generals, brigade inspectors, and chiefs of the staff departments, except the adjutant general, and commissary general. The adjutant general shall be appointed by the governor.

**SEC. III.** The legislature shall by law direct the time and manner of electing militia officers, and of certifying their elections to the governor.

**SEC. IV.** The commissioned officers of the militia shall be commissioned by the governor; and no commissioned officer shall be removed from office, unless by the senate, on the recommendation of the governor, stating the grounds on which such removal is recommended, or by the decision of a court martial, pursuant to law. The present officers of the militia shall hold their commissions, subject to removal as before provided.

**SEC. V.** In case the mode of election and appointment of militia officers hereby directed, shall not be found conducive to the improvement of the militia, the legislature may abolish the same, and provide by law for their appointment and removal, if two thirds of the members present in each house shall concur therein.

**SEC. VI.** The secretary of state, comptroller, treasurer, attorney general, surveyor general, and commissary general, shall be appointed as follows: The senate and assembly shall each openly nominate one person for the said offices respectively; after which they shall meet together, and if they shall agree in their nominations, the person so nominated shall be appointed to the office for which he shall be nominated. If they shall disagree, the appointment shall be made by the joint ballot of the senators and members of Assembly. The treasurer shall be chosen annually. The secretary of state, comptroller, attorney general, surveyor general, and commissary general, shall hold their offices for three years, unless sooner removed by concurrent resolution of the senate and assembly.

**SEC. VII.** The governor shall nominate, by message in writing, and, with the consent of the senate, shall appoint all judicial officers, except justices of the peace, who shall be appointed in manner following, that is to say: The board of supervisors in every county in this state shall, at such times as the legislature may direct, meet together; and they, or a majority of them so assembled, shall nominate so many persons as shall be equal to the number of justices of the peace, to be appointed in the several towns in the respective counties. And the judges of the respective county courts, or a majority of them, shall also meet, and nominate a like number of persons; and it shall be the duty of the said board of supervisors, and judges of county courts, to compare such nominations, at such time and place as the legislature may direct. And if, on such comparison, the said boards of supervisors, and judges of county courts, shall agree in their nominations, in all or in part, they shall file a certificate of the nominations, in which they shall agree, in the office of the clerk of the county; and the person or persons named in such certificates shall be justices of the peace: and in case of disagreement, in whole or in part, it shall be the farther duty of the said boards of supervisors, and judges respectively, to transmit their said nominations, so far as they disa-

gree in the same, to the governor, who shall select from the said nominations, and appoint so many justices of the peace as shall be requisite to fill the vacancies. Every person appointed a justice of the peace, shall hold his office for four years, unless removed by the county court, for causes particularly assigned by the judges of the said court. And no justice of the peace shall be removed, until he shall have notice of the charges made against him, and an opportunity of being heard in his defence.

**SEC. VIII.** Sheriffs and clerks of counties, including the register and clerk of the city and county of New-York, shall be chosen by the electors of the respective counties, once in every three years, and as often as vacancies shall happen. Sheriffs shall hold no other office, and be ineligible for the next three years after the termination of their offices. They may be required by law to renew their security, from time to time; and in default of giving such new security, their offices shall be deemed vacant. But the county shall never be made responsible for the acts of the sheriff; and the governor may remove any such sheriff, clerk or register, at any time within the three years for which he shall be elected, giving to such sheriff, clerk, or register, a copy of the charge against him, and an opportunity of being heard in his defence, before any removal shall be made.

**SEC. IX.** The clerks of courts, except those clerks whose appointment is provided for in the preceding section, shall be appointed by the courts of which they respectively are clerks; and district attorneys, by the county courts. Clerks of courts and district attorneys shall hold their offices for three years, unless sooner removed by the courts appointing them.

**SEC. X.** The mayors of all the cities in this state shall be appointed annually, by the common councils of the respective cities.

**SEC. XI.** So many coroners as the legislature may direct, not exceeding four in each county, shall be elected in the same manner as sheriffs, and shall hold their

offices for the same term, and be removable in like manner.

**SEC. XII.** The governor shall nominate, and, with the consent of the senate, appoint masters and examiners in chancery, who shall hold their offices for three years, unless sooner removed by the senate, on the recommendation of the governor. The registers and assistant registers shall be appointed by the chancellor, and hold their offices during his pleasure.

**SEC. XIII.** The clerk of the court of oyer and terminer and general sessions of the peace in and for the city and county of New-York, shall be appointed by the court of general sessions of the peace in said city, and hold his office during the pleasure of the said court; and such clerks and other officers of courts, whose appointment is not herein provided for, shall be appointed by the several courts, or by the governor, with the consent of the senate, as may be directed by law.

**SEC. XIV.** The special justices, and the assistant justices, and their clerks, in the city of New-York, shall be appointed by the common council of the said city, and shall hold their offices for the same term that the justices of the peace, in the other counties of this state, hold their offices, and shall be removable in like manner.

**SEC. XV.** All officers heretofore elective by the people shall continue to be elected; and all other officers, whose appointment is not provided for by this constitution, and all officers whose offices may be hereafter created by law, shall be elected by the people, or appointed, as may by law be directed.

**SEC. XVI.** Where the duration of any office is not prescribed by this constitution, it may be declared by law; and if not so declared, such office shall be held during the pleasure of the authority making the appointment.

#### ARTICLE FIFTH.

**SEC. I.** The court for the trial of impeachments and the correction of errors shall consist of the president

of the senate, the senators, the chancellor, and the justices of the supreme court, or the major part of them; but when an impeachment shall be prosecuted against the chancellor, or any justice of the supreme court, the person so impeached shall be suspended from exercising his office until his acquittal; and when an appeal from a decree in chancery shall be heard, the chancellor shall inform the court of the reasons for his decree, but shall have no voice in the final sentence; and when a writ of error shall be brought, on a judgment of the supreme court, the justices of that court shall assign the reasons for their judgment, but shall not have a voice for its affirmance or reversal.

SEC. II. The assembly shall have the power of impeaching all civil officers of this state, for mal and corrupt conduct in office, and for high crimes and misdemeanors: but a majority of all the members elected shall concur in an impeachment. Before the trial of an impeachment, the members of the court shall take an oath or affirmation, truly and impartially to try and determine the charge in question, according to evidence; and no person shall be convicted without the concurrence of two thirds of the members present. Judgment, in cases of impeachment, shall not extend farther than the removal from office, and disqualification to hold and enjoy any office of honour, trust, or profit, under this state; but the party convicted shall be liable to indictment and punishment according to law.

SEC. III. The chancellor and justices of the supreme court, shall hold their offices during good behaviour, or until they shall attain the age of sixty years.

SEC. IV. The supreme court shall consist of a chief justice and two justices, any of whom may hold the court.

SEC. V. The state shall be divided, by law, into a convenient number of circuits, not less than four, nor exceeding eight, subject to alteration, by the legislature, from time to time, as the public good may require; for each of which a circuit judge shall be appointed, in the same manner, and hold his office by the same tenure,

as the justices of the supreme court, and who shall possess the powers of a justice of the supreme court at chambers, and in the trial of issues joined in the supreme court, and in courts of oyer and terminer and gaol delivery. And such equity powers may be vested in the said circuit judges, or in the county courts, or in such other subordinate courts as the legislature may by law direct, subject to the appellate jurisdiction of the chancellor.

SEC. VI. Judges of the county courts, and recorders of cities, shall hold their offices for five years, but may be removed by the senate, on the recommendation of the governor, for causes to be stated in such recommendation.

SEC. VII. Neither the chancellor, nor justices of the supreme court, nor any circuit judge, shall hold any other office or public trust. All votes for any elective office, given by the legislature or the people, for the chancellor, or a justice of the supreme court, or circuit judge, during his continuance in his judicial office, shall be void.

#### ARTICLE SIXTH.

SEC. I. Members of the legislature, and all officers, executive and judicial, except such inferior officers as may by law be exempted, shall, before they enter on the duties of their respective offices, take and subscribe the following oath or affirmation :—

I do solemnly swear, (or affirm, as the case may be,) that I will support the constitution of the United States, and the constitution of the state of New-York; and that I will faithfully discharge the duties of the office of \_\_\_\_\_ according to the best of my ability.

And no other oath, declaration, or test, shall be required as a qualification for any office or public trust.

#### ARTICLE SEVENTH.

SEC. I. No member of this state shall be disfranchised, or deprived of any of the rights or privileges secured to any citizen thereof, unless by the law of the land, or the judgment of his peers.

**SEC. II.** The trial by jury, in all cases in which it has been heretofore used, shall remain inviolate for ever; and no new court shall be instituted, but such as shall proceed according to the course of the common law, except such courts of equity as the legislature is herein authorized to establish.

**SEC. III.** The free exercise and enjoyment of religious profession and worship, without discrimination or preference, shall for ever be allowed in this state, to all mankind; but the liberty of conscience hereby secured shall not be so construed as to excuse acts of licentiousness, or justify practices inconsistent with the peace or safety of this state.

**SEC. IV.** *And whereas*, the ministers of the gospel are, by their profession, dedicated to the service of God, and the cure of souls, and ought not to be diverted from the great duties of their functions: therefore, no minister of the gospel, or priest of any denomination whatsoever, shall, at any time hereafter, under any pretence or description whatever, be eligible to, or capable of holding, any civil or military office or place within this state.

**SEC. V.** The militia of this state shall, at all times hereafter, be armed and disciplined, and in readiness for service. But all such inhabitants of this state, of any religious denomination whatever, as from scruples of conscience may be averse to bearing arms, shall be excused therefrom by paying to the state an equivalent in money; and the legislature shall provide, by law, for the collection of such equivalent, to be estimated according to the expense, in time and money, of an ordinary able-bodied militia man.

**SEC. VI.** The privilege of the writ of habeas corpus shall not be suspended, unless when, in cases of rebellion or invasion, the public safety may require its suspension.

**SEC. VII.** No person shall be held to answer for a capital or otherwise infamous crime, (except in cases of impeachment, and in cases of the militia when in actual service; and the land and naval forces in time of war,

or which this state may keep, with the consent of congress, in time of peace, and in cases of petit larceny, under the regulation of the legislature,) unless on presentment; or indictment of a grand jury; and in every trial on impeachment or indictment, the party accused shall be allowed counsel as in civil actions. No person shall be subject, for the same offence, to be twice put in jeopardy of life or limb; nor shall he be compelled, in any criminal case, to be a witness against himself; nor be deprived of life, liberty, or property, without due process of law: Nor shall private property be taken for public use without just compensation.

**SEC. VIII.** Every citizen may freely speak, write and publish his sentiments, on all subjects, being responsible for the abuse of that right; and no law shall be passed to restrain or abridge the liberty of speech or of the press. In all prosecutions or indictments for libels, the truth may be given in evidence to the jury; and if it shall appear to the jury, that the matter charged as libellous is true, and was published with good motives, and for justifiable ends, the party shall be acquitted; and the jury shall have the right to determine the law and the fact.

**SEC. IX.** The assent of two thirds of the members elected to each branch of the legislature shall be requisite to every bill appropriating the public moneys or property, for local or private purposes, or creating, continuing, altering, or renewing any body politic or corporate.

**SEC. X.** The proceeds of all lands belonging to this state, except such parts thereof as may be reserved or appropriated to public use, or ceded to the United States, which shall hereafter be sold or disposed of, together with the fund denominated the common school fund, shall be and remain a perpetual fund; the interest of which shall be inviolably appropriated and applied to the support of common schools throughout this state. Rates of toll, not less than those agreed to by the canal commissioners, and set forth in their report to the legislature of the twelfth of March, one thousand eight hun-



dred and twenty-one, shall be imposed on, and collected from, all parts of the navigable communications between the great western and northern lakes and the Atlantic ocean, which now are, or hereafter shall be, made and completed: And the said tolls, together with the duties on the manufacture of all salt, as established by the act of the fifteenth of April, one thousand eight hundred and seventeen; and the duties on goods sold at auction, excepting therefrom the sum of thirty-three thousand five hundred dollars, otherwise appropriated by the said act; and the amount of the revenue, established by the act of the legislature of the thirtieth of March, one thousand eight hundred and twenty, in lieu of the tax upon steam-boat passengers, shall be and remain inviolably appropriated and applied to the completion of such navigable communications, and to the payment of the interest, and reimbursement of the capital, of the money already borrowed, or which hereafter shall be borrowed, to make and complete the same. And neither the rates of toll on the said navigable communications; nor the duties on the manufacture of salt aforesaid; nor the duties on goods sold at auction, as established by the act of the fifteenth of April one thousand eight hundred and seventeen; nor the amount of the revenue, established by the act of March the thirtieth, one thousand eight hundred and twenty, in lieu of the tax upon steam-boat passengers; shall be reduced or diverted, at any time before the full and complete payment of the principal and interest of the money borrowed, or to be borrowed, as aforesaid. And the legislature shall never sell or dispose of the salt springs belonging to this state, nor the lands contiguous thereto, which may be necessary or convenient for their use, nor the said navigable communications, or any part or section thereof; but the same shall be and remain the property of this state.

**SEC. XI.** No lottery shall hereafter be authorized in this state; and the legislature shall pass laws to prevent the sale of all lottery tickets within this state, except in lotteries already provided for by law.

**SEC. XII.** No purchase or contract for the sale of

lands in this state, made since the fourteenth day of October, one thousand seven hundred and seventy-five, or which may hereafter be made, of or with the Indians in this state, shall be valid; unless made under the authority, and with the consent, of the legislature.

SEC. XIII. Such parts of the common law, and of the acts of the legislature of the colony of New-York, as together did form the law of the said colony on the nineteenth day of April, one thousand seven hundred and seventy-five; and the resolutions of the congress of the said colony, and of the convention of the state of New-York, in force on the twentieth day of April, one thousand seven hundred and seventy-seven, which have not since expired, or been repealed, or altered; and such acts of the legislature of this state as are now in force, shall be and continue the law of this state, subject to such alterations as the legislature shall make concerning the same. But all such parts of the common law, and such of the said acts, or parts thereof, as are repugnant to this constitution, are hereby abrogated.

SEC. XIV. All grants of land within this state, made by the king of Great Britain, or persons acting under his authority, after the fourteenth day of October, one thousand seven hundred and seventy-five, shall be null and void: but nothing contained in this constitution shall affect any grants of land within this state, made by the authority of the said king or his predecessors, or shall annul any charters to bodies politic and corporate, by him or them made, before that day: or shall affect any such grants or charters since made by this state, or by persons acting under its authority; or shall impair the obligation of any debts contracted by the state, or individuals, or bodies corporate, or any other rights of property, or any suits, actions, rights of action, or other proceedings in courts of justice.

#### ARTICLE EIGHTH.

SEC. I. Any amendment or amendments to this constitution may be proposed in the senate or assembly: and if the same shall be agreed to by a majority of the

members elected to each of the two houses, such proposed amendment or amendments shall be entered on their journals, with the yeas and nays taken thereon, and referred to the legislature then next to be chosen, and shall be published for three months previous to the time of making such choice ; and if, in the legislature next chosen, as aforesaid, such proposed amendment or amendments shall be agreed to, by two thirds of all the members elected to each house, then it shall be the duty of the legislature to submit such proposed amendment or amendments to the people, in such manner, and at such time, as the legislature shall prescribe: and if the people shall approve and ratify such amendment or amendments, by a majority of the electors qualified to vote for members of the legislature, voting thereon, such amendment or amendments shall become part of the constitution.

#### ARTICLE NINTH.

SEC. I. This constitution shall be in force from the last day of December, in the year one thousand eight hundred and twenty-two. But all those parts of the same which relate to the right of suffrage, the division of the state into senate districts, the number of members of the assembly to be elected, in pursuance of this constitution ; the apportionment of members of assembly ; the elections hereby directed to commence on the first Monday of November, in the year one thousand eight hundred and twenty-two ; the continuance of the members of the present legislature in office, until the first day of January, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty-three, and the prohibition of authorizing lotteries ; the prohibition against appropriating the public moneys, or property, for local or private purposes, or creating, continuing, altering, or renewing, any body politic or corporate, without the assent of two thirds of the members elected to each branch of the legislature, shall be in force, and take effect, from the last day of February next. The members of the present legislature shall, on the first Mon-

day of March next, take and subscribe an oath or affirmation, to support this constitution, so far as the same shall then be in force. Sheriffs, clerks of counties, and coroners, shall be elected at the election hereby directed to commence, on the first Monday of November, in the year one thousand eight hundred and twenty-two: but they shall not enter on the duties of their offices before the first day of January then next following. The commissions of all persons holding civil offices, on the last day of December, one thousand eight hundred and twenty-two, shall expire on that day; but the officers then in commission, may respectively continue to hold their said offices, until new appointments or elections shall take place, under this constitution.

SEC. II. The existing laws relative to the manner of notifying, holding, and conducting elections, making returns, and canvassing votes, shall be in force, and observed in respect to the elections hereby directed to commence on the first Monday of November, in the year one thousand eight hundred and twenty-two, so far as the same are applicable. And the present legislature shall pass such other and further laws, as may be requisite for the execution of the provisions of this constitution, in respect to elections.

Done in convention, at the capitol, in the city of Albany, the tenth day of November, in the year one thousand eight hundred and twenty-one, and of the independence of the United States of America the forty-sixth.

We, the Secretary, Surveyor General, Attorney General, Comptroller, and Treasurer of the said State, having duly calculated and ascertained the whole number of votes given at an election held in the several towns and wards in this state, on the fifteenth, sixteenth, and seventeenth days of January, in the year one thousand eight hundred and twenty-two, pursuant to certain resolutions of the convention called under the act, entitled, "An act recommending a convention of the people of this state," passed March 13th, 1821, *do determine and declare*, conformably to the transcripts returned to the Secretary's office, that the whole number of votes

duly given at such election was one hundred and sixteen thousand, one hundred and thirty-four ; of which number, seventy-four thousand seven hundred and thirty-two votes were duly given *for* the amended constitution adopted by the said convention, and forty-one thousand four hundred and two votes were duly given *against* the said amended constitution. We do therefore *certify* and *declare*, that a majority of thirty-three thousand, three hundred and thirty votes was given for the said constitution; and that the same is duly *ratified* and *confirmed* by the citizens of this state.

Given under our hands, at the secretary's office, this sixteenth day of February, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty-two, and in the forty-sixth year of the independence of the United States.

### AMENDMENTS TO THE CONSTITUTION.

The following amendments to the constitution were proposed by the legislature, in 1825; were referred to the legislature of 1826; agreed to by two thirds of the members elected to each house of that legislature; submitted to the people, and approved and ratified, at an election, held on the sixth, seventh, and eighth days of November, 1826.

#### FIRST AMENDMENT.

That the people of this state, in their several towns, shall, at their annual election, and in such manner as the legislature shall direct, elect by ballot their *justices of the peace*, and the justices so elected in any town shall immediately thereafter meet together, and in presence of the supervisor and town clerk of the said town be divided by lot into *four* classes of *one* in each

class, and be numbered one, two, three, and four; and the office of number one shall expire at the end of the *first* year, of number two at the end of the *second* year, of number three at the end of the *third* year, and of number four at the end of the *fourth* year, in order that *one* justice may thereafter be *annually* elected; and that so much of the seventh section of the fourth article of the constitution of this state, as is inconsistent with this amendment, be abrogated.

#### SECOND AMENDMENT.

That so much of the first section of the second article of the constitution, as prescribes the qualifications of voters, other than persons of colour, be, and the same is hereby abolished, and that the following be substituted in the place thereof.

Every male citizen of the age of *twenty-one* years, who shall have been an inhabitant of this state *one* year next preceding any election, and for the last *six* months a resident of the *county* where he may offer his vote, shall be entitled to vote in the *town* or ward where he *actually resides*, and not elsewhere, for all officers that now are, or hereafter may be, elective by the people.

ELECTORS' MEETINGS.

All elections for Governor, Lieutenant Governor, Senators, Representatives in the Congress of the United States, Members of Assembly, Sheriffs, Coroners, and Clerks of the several counties, including the Register and Clerk of the city and county of New-York, shall be by *ballot* on the *first Monday of November*, in every year, and shall be continued for *three successive days*, including the first. The elections in the cities of New-York, Albany, and Schenectady, shall be by *wards*, and in all *other* parts of the state by *towns*.

By the constitution, SHERIFFS and CLERKS of counties, including the Register and Clerk of the city and county of New-York, are to be chosen by the electors of the respective counties once in every *three* years, and as often as vacancies shall occur.

The Secretary of State, Comptroller, Attorney General, and Surveyor General, hold their offices for *three years*.

The Treasurer is chosen *annually* by the Legislature.

The Deputy Secretary and Deputy Comptroller are appointed by the Secretary and Comptroller, and hold their offices during the pleasure of the persons appointing them.

\* His Excellency, MARTIN VAN BUREN, of Albany, was *elected* Governor of the State in *November*, 1828; accepted the office, and entered on its duties *January 1st*, 1829. On the 12th of *March* following he *resigned*, after a service of about two months and a half, that he might assume the office of *Secretary of State* in the government of the *United States*.

† The *Lieutenant Governor* has *no salary*; but in lieu thereof he receives \$6 *per day* while the Legislature or the Court for the trial of *Impeachments* and the *Correction of Errors* is in *session*, and \$6 for every 20 miles *travel*.

One member of the senate is *annually* elected in each district, to supply the vacancies created by *rotation*; and in case of *death* or *resignation*, the vacancies thereby created are supplied at the next annual election, whenever occasion requires, and the persons so elected hold their offices for the *remainder* of the unexpired term. When two persons are elected in the *same* district, one to supply a *vacancy*, and the other not, the two persons so elected, decide by *lot* which shall hold the *longest* term, without any reference to the votes given at the election.

The compensation allowed to each senator is \$3 per day for attendance, and \$3 for every 20 miles travel.

The *salary* of the clerk is \$1200.

*Mem.*—On the 9th of April, 1814, the district of New-York was divided into *two* districts, which are called *Northern District* and *Southern District*.

Richard R. Lansing was *first* appointed Clerk of the District Court of New-York, to reside at UTICA, on the 28th of July, 1812. *previous* to the division mentioned above.

## STATE COURTS.

All JUDICIAL officers, except *Justices of the Peace*, are appointed by the *Senate*, on the nomination of the *Governor*.

## COURT OF ERRORS.

*The Court for the Trial of Impeachments and the Correction of Errors*, consists of the *President of the Senate*, the *Senators*, the *Chancellor*, and the *Justices of the Supreme Court*, or the *major part* of them.

If the *Chancellor*, or a *Judge of the Supreme Court*, be *impeached*, he shall be *suspended* from office until his acquittal.

On an *appeal* from a decree in chancery, the *Chancellor* shall assign *the reasons* for his *decree*; and on a *writ of error* brought on a judgment of the *Supreme Court*, the *Justices* shall give *the reasons* for their *judgment*; but neither shall have any voice in the *decision* of the case on trial. The reasons so to be assigned by the *Chancellor*, or *Justices of the Supreme Court*, shall be submitted *in writing*, before the argument of the *appeal*, or *writ of error*, as the case may be.

On any *interlocutory* or *other* question, either on *appeal* or *writ of error*, *not affecting* the *merits* of the cause, or point decided in the *Court of Chancery*, or *Supreme Court*, the *chancellor* or *justices* may vote.

The *President of the Senate* *presides* in the *Court of Errors*.

This court has full power to correct and redress all *errors* that may happen in the *Court of Chancery*, or in the *Supreme Court*.

The *writs* and *process* of the court shall be signed by the clerk, and *tested* in the name of the *president of the senate*.

*Sessions* of the court may be holden at the capitol, in the city of ALBANY, at such times as the court shall, from time to time, direct; but not more than *two* such sessions shall be holden *during the recess* of the legislature in any one year; and when so holden, during the

recess of the legislature, the president of the senate and the senators shall receive the same compensation for travelling and attendance, as for attending a meeting of the senate.

The *Clerk* shall receive the same *daily compensation* for his attendance, at any term during the recess, as is allowed to members of the senate.

## COURT OF CHANCERY.

The powers of the Court of Chancery are vested in the CHANCELLOR, who holds his office during good behaviour, or until he attains the age of *sixty years*. His salary is \$2000. This court was organized under the constitution of the state in March, 1778, though from the earliest judicial history distinct from a court of law. The Chancellor appoints the *Register* and *Assistant Register*, and *Clerks* in Chancery, who hold their offices during his pleasure. He also appoints the REPORTER IN CHANCERY, and *licenses* all *Solicitors* and *Counsellors* to practise in the Courts of Chancery. He may appoint *Commissioners* to take Affidavits to be read in the Courts of Chancery, at his discretion.

[The office of *Assistant Register in Chancery* was established at New-York, in the year 1804, and Isaac L. Kip, Esq. was appointed Assistant Register, November 22, 1804, by the Hon. JOHN LANSING, jun. then Chancellor. He was the *first* person who held the office of Assistant Register under the law of the state of New-York. Mr. Kip was appointed one of the *Clerks* of the Court of Chancery by the Hon. ROBERT R. LIVINGSTON, then Chancellor, March 7th, 1795, in the place of JOHN W. WATKINS, Esq. *resigned*. He resigned his office as *Assistant Register*, July 31, 1823, the same day on which the constitutional term of service of the Hon. JAMES KENT as Chancellor of the state expired, and was succeeded by JOHN L. LAWRENCE, who was appointed by Chancellor SANFORD, August 2d, 1823, and entered on the duties of his office, August 11, 1823, which he continued to perform until February, 1829, when the present incumbent was appointed.]

MASTERS and EXAMINERS in Chancery are appointed by the *Senate*, on the nomination of the Governor, and hold their offices for *three years*. *Masters* must be of the degree of Counsellor at Law, or Solicitor, or Counsellor in Chancery.

The salary of the *Reporter* is \$500; that of the *Chancellor's Clerk* is \$600.

**STATED TERMS.**—On the *fourth Mondays of January and August*, at the Capitol in the city of *Albany*; and on the *fourth Mondays of May and October*, at the City-Hall, in the city of *New-York*.

The *stated Terms* are appointed by the Chancellor, and may be *altered* by him as the public convenience may require. *Every stated Term* shall be held *eight days*, at least, and longer, if necessary.

**MOTION DAYS.**—The *first and third Tuesdays* of every month *during vacations* are assigned for hearing *motions and petitions* before the CHANCELLOR, at the Capitol in the city of *Albany*. *Motions and petitions* shall have a *preference over Calendar causes* on the *first day* of the Term, and on *Monday* of every week thereafter during the Term, but on *no other day*, without a *special order*.

#### SUPREME COURT.

The Supreme Court consists of a *Chief Justice* and *two Justices*, any of whom may hold the court.

The **JUSTICES** of the SUPREME COURT hold their offices during good behaviour, or until they attain the age of *sixty years*. Their salary is \$2000 each.

The **JUSTICES** of this court may appoint as many *Commissioners* to take Affidavits to be read in the Supreme Court in this state, as they may deem necessary. There are four Clerks of this court, each of whom is *required by law* to appoint some proper person to be his *deputy*.

WILLIAM M. OLIVER was appointed *first* Clerk.]

STATED TERMS.—At *Albany*, on the *first* Monday of *January*, and *third* Monday of *October*; at *New-York* on the *first* Monday of *May*; and at *Utica*, on the *first* Monday of *July*. They are called the *January, May, July, and October Terms*.

The several Terms may be continued and held from the commencement thereof, until and including the *fifth Saturday* after the commencement of each Term; but no *argument* of any cause shall be heard during the *fifth* week of any Term, unless by *consent of parties*, or their counsel.

#### CIRCUIT COURTS.

The state is divided, by law, into *eight Judicial Circuits*, corresponding with the *eight Senate Districts*, which may be altered from time to time, by the Legislature, as the public good may require.

The **CIRCUIT JUDGES** hold their offices during good behaviour, or until they attain the age of *sixty years*. Their salary is \$1250 each.

Each Circuit Judge is a *Vice Chancellor* within his circuit, and shall, *concurrently* with the Chancellor, and *exclusively* of any other Circuit Judge, have and exercise all the *original* jurisdiction and powers which now are, or hereafter may be, vested in the Chancellor, in all causes and matters in *equity*, and in all matters of which the cognizance is, or shall be vested in the Chancellor, by virtue of any statute, in the following cases :

1. Where such causes and matters shall have *arisen within the circuit* of such Judge, or,

2. Where the *subject matter* in controversy shall be *situated* within such district.

3. Where the *defendants* or persons proceeded against, or *either* of them, *resides* within such limits, subject to the *appellate* jurisdiction of the *Chancellor*.

The Vice Chancellors of the several circuits shall hold *four stated* terms in each year, at such times and in such counties in their circuits as they shall respectively appoint, at the usual places of holding courts therein ; and when so appointed, the said terms shall remain unaltered for *two* years. They may also hold so many *special* terms at such times and places as they shall deem proper.

A *stated* or *special* term may be holden by a *Vice Chancellor*, at the *same time* that any such term shall be holden by the Chancellor.

**MOTION DAYS.**—The days for hearing *motions* before the Vice Chancellors of the *first* and *third* circuits, are the *second* and *fourth Tuesdays* of each month, at the Capitol in the city of **ALBANY**, and at the City-Hall in the city of **NEW-YORK** ; and before the *other* Vice Chancellors at their places of *residence*, or such places as they may appoint.

The *Clerks* of the several counties (except the city and county of **New-York**) are, by virtue of their offices, *Clerks* of the *Circuit Courts*.

The Clerk of the *Supreme Court*, residing in the city of New-York, is Clerk of the *Sittings and Circuit Courts* held in and for the city and county of New-York.

*Monday* of each week in *vacation*, is assigned for hearing *motions*, and *petitions in equity*, and the *argument* of causes heard out of term by consent of parties; and when the judge is holding the Circuit Courts in any of the counties of this Circuit, *except Saratoga*, motions and petitions in the court of equity will be heard, and may be *noticed* for the first day of the circuit, at the Judge's chambers, at the place where the circuit is appointed to be held.

#### FIFTH CIRCUIT.

Nathan Williams, *Utica*, Judge.

*Clerk in Chancery.*

The FIFTH CIRCUIT is composed of the counties of *Herkimer*, *Madison*, *Oneida*, *Lewis*, *Jefferson*, and *Oswego*.

HERKIMER COUNTY.—On the *second Mondays* in *March* and *September*, at the court-house.

MADISON.—On the *fourth Mondays* in *March* and *September*, at the court-house.

ONEIDA.—On the *first Monday* in *April*, at the court-house in *Rome*, in 1829, and at the court-house in *Whites-town*, in 1830; and on the *first Monday* in *each year*, at the court-room in *Utica*.

LEWIS.—On the *Tuesday next before* the third *Monday* in *June* and *December*, at the court-house.

**JEFFERSON.**—On the *third* Mondays in *June* and *December*, at the court-house.

**OSWEGO.**—On the *fourth* Tuesday in *June*, at the court-house in *Oswego*; and on the *fourth* Tuesday in *December*, at the court-house in *Richland*.

#### COURTS OF EQUITY.

**MADISON COUNTY.**—On the Friday *next after* the fourth Monday of *March* in each year, at the court-house.

**HERKIMER.**—On the *last* Tuesday in *July*, in each year, at the court-house.

**ONEIDA.**—On the *first* Tuesday in *September*, in each year, at the court-room in *Utica*.

**JEFFERSON.**—On the Friday *next before* the third Monday in *December*, in each year, at the court-house.

And on *every Monday* in the year when the Circuit Judge is not otherwise engaged, at his chambers in *Utica*.

#### SIXTH CIRCUIT.

*Clerk in Chancery.*

This CIRCUIT is composed of the counties of *Broome*, *Chenango*, *Cortland*, *Otsego*, *Steuben*, *Tioga*, and *Tompkins*.

**CHENANGO.**—*Third* Monday in *December*, and *last* Monday in *May*, at the court-house in *Norwich*.

**BROOME.**—*Fourth* Monday in *December*, and *first* Monday in *June*, at the court-house in the village of *Binghampton*.

**TIOGA.**—The *first* Thursday *after* the fourth Monday in *December*, at the court-house in *Owego*; and the *first* Thursday *after* the first Monday in *June*, at the court-house in *Elmira*.

**STEBEN.**—*Fifth* Monday in *December*, 1828, (after that the *winter circuit* will be held on the *first* Monday in *January*;) and *second* Monday in *June*, at the court-house in the village of *Bath*.

**TOMPKINS.**—*First Monday in January, 1829; after that year, second Monday in January, and fourth Monday in June, at the court-house in the village of Ithaca.*

**CORTLAND.**—*Second Monday in January, 1829; after that year, the third Monday, and the first Monday after the fourth Monday in June, at the court-house in the village of Cortland.*

**OTSEGO.**—*First Monday in September, and second Monday in March, at the court-house in the village of Cooperstown.*

*Stated Equity terms in said Circuit.*

**CHENANGO.**—*At the court-house in the village of Norwich, on the Thursday preceding the last Monday in May.*

**STÜBEN.**—*At the court-house in the village of Bath, on the first Thursday after the fifth Monday in December, 1828; after that, the first Friday after the second Monday in June, in each year.*

**TOMPKINS.**—*The first Wednesday after the third Monday in June, in each year.*

**CORTLAND.**—*The Friday succeeding the first Monday after the fourth Monday in June, in each year.*

**WAYNE.**—*On the second Mondays in January and June, at the court-house in the village of Lyons.*

**SENECA.**—On the *third* Monday in *January*, at the court-house in the village of *Waterloo*, and on the *third* Monday in *June*, at the court-house in *Ovid*.

**CAYUGA.**—On the *fourth* Mondays in *January* and *June*, at the court-house in the village of *Auburn*.

**ONONDAGA.**—On the *first* Mondays in *February* and *September*, at the court-house in that county.

**YATES.**—On the Tuesdays *next after* the second Mondays in *February* and *September*, at the court-house in the village of *Penn Yan*.

*The Courts of Equity during the same years, will be held at*

**ONONDAGA.**—On the *second* Tuesday in *March*.

**CANANDAIGUA.**—On the *second* Tuesday in *July*.

**WATERLOO.**—On the *second* Tuesday in *October*.

**AUBURN.**—On the *second* Tuesday in *December*.

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#### EIGHTH CIRCUIT.

This CIRCUIT is composed of the counties of *Allegany, Cattaraugus, Chautauque, Erie, Genesee, Livingston, Monroe, Niagara, Orleans.*

**MONROE.**—On the Monday *next after* the first Saturday in *March*, and *last* Monday in *August*, at the court-house in *Rochester*.

**ORLEANS.**—On the Monday *next after* the third Saturday in *March*, and on the Monday *next after* the first Saturday in *November*, at the court-house in *Albion*.

**GENESEE.**—On the *first* Monday in *April*, and *second* Monday in *September*, at the court-house in *Batavia*.

**NIAGARA.**—On the *second* Tuesday in *April*, and on the Monday *next after* the second Saturday in *November*, at the court-house in *Lockport*.

**ERIE.**—On the *third* Monday in *April*, and *third* Monday in *September*, at the court-house in *Buffalo*.

**CHAUTAUQUE.**—On the *fourth* Monday in *April*, and *first* Monday in *October*, at the court-house in *Mayville*.

**CATTARAUGUS.**—On the *Friday after* the fourth Monday in *April*, and *third* Monday in *October*, at the court-house in *Ellicottville*.

ALLEGANY.—On the *first* Monday in *May*, and on the Thursday *after* the third Monday in *October*, at the court-house in *Angelica*.

LIVINGSTON.—On the *second* Monday in *May*, and *fourth* Monday in *October*, at the court-house in *Geneseo*.

*Stated terms of the Court of Equity, for the Eighth Circuit, will be held at the following times and places for the years 1829 and 1830 :—*

At ROCHESTER.—On the Friday *after* the fourth Monday in *October*.

At BATAVIA.—On the Friday *after* the third Saturday in *March*.

At BUFFALO.—On the *fourth* Monday in *September*.

At ANGELICA.—On the Friday *after* the first Monday in *May*.

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Neither the CHANCELLOR nor JUSTICES OF THE SUPREME COURT, nor any CIRCUIT JUDGE, can hold *any other office* or public trust. *All votes* given for either of them, (during their continuance in office,) for any *other office*, are *void*.

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#### COURTS OF OYER AND TERMINER AND GENERAL JAIL DELIVERY.

These Courts consist of *one Circuit Judge*, and not more than *three Judges of the Courts of Common Pleas* and *General Sessions of the Peace*, in the several counties in this state.

At least *two Circuit Courts* and Courts of Oyer and Terminer and Jail delivery must be holden in each year in each of the counties in this state, separately organized; and in the city and county of New-York there must be at least *four* such courts in each year.

The *times* and *places* of holding these courts in each circuit, are fixed and appointed by each Circuit Judge for the period of *two years*.

Every Circuit Judge is required by law, to transmit to the Clerk of each county *within* his circuit, a copy of every appointment of circuits made by him, immediately upon making the same, which shall be *filed* and



*preserved* by such Clerk. Each Judge shall transmit to the *state printer* a copy of every appointment of Circuits made by him, which shall be published in the *state paper*, pursuant to law.

These Courts may direct their writs into any of the counties of the state, as occasion may require.

The COUNTY CLERKS in the respective counties, are *ex officio* Clerks of the Courts of Oyer and Terminer.

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COURTS OF COMMON PLEAS AND GENERAL SESSIONS OF THE PEACE.

The JUDGES of the Courts of Common Pleas and General Sessions of the Peace, are appointed by the Senate, on the nomination of the Governor, and hold their offices for *five* years.

DISTRICT ATTORNEYS are appointed by the Courts of Common Pleas, and hold their offices for *three* years.

The SHERIFFS and CLERKS of the several counties, including the Register and Clerk of the *city of New-York*, are chosen by the *people*, and hold their offices for *three* years.

The COUNTY CLERKS are *ex-officio* Clerks of the Courts of Common Pleas and General Sessions of the Peace, in their respective counties, and are the REGISTERS OF DEEDS.

SHERIFFS are *ineligible* for the *next* three years succeeding the termination of their offices.

CLERKS OF COURTS, *other* than County Clerks, are appointed by the *Courts* of which they respectively are Clerks, and hold their offices for *three* years.

COUNTY TREASURERS are appointed by the *Board of Supervisors* in each county, and hold their offices during the pleasure of the Board appointing them.

SURROGATES "are appointed in the manner prescribed by the constitution for judicial officers *other* than Justices of the Peace," and hold their offices for *four* years. They have no *clerks* known to the laws of the state. They hold their courts at such times and places as they may direct, and *certify* their own proceedings.

In March, 1823, after the adoption of the constitution,

an act was passed *abolishing* the Court of Probates, and *granting* the powers thereof to Surrogates.

**CORONERS**, not exceeding *four* in each county, are elected in the same manner as *Sheriffs*, and hold their offices for *three* years.

The *stated terms* of the Courts of Common Pleas and General Sessions of the Peace, in *all* the counties in the state, are regulated by *statute*. In all cases not *special-ly* provided for, they are holden at the Court-Houses in the several counties, and are holden at the *same terms* unless otherwise designated by law.

**STATED TERMS.**—*Third* Tuesday of *March*, and the *second* Tuesdays of *June*, *September*, and *December*. But *no trial* can be had in any *criminal* prosecution during the *first* week of the said terms.

The Court of Common Pleas, for the county of Albany, may be held by the first Judge of the County Court of the said county, either *alone*, or with one or more of the other Judges; but it is the *special* duty of the *First Judge* to hold the said Court.

## JUSTICES OF THE PEACE.

The *first* election of Justices of the Peace, by the *people*, since the *amendment* to the constitution, was holden in November, 1827, and since that period they have been regularly chosen at the *Fall* election in each year.

But in conformity with the amendment to the constitution, and by virtue of a law enacted at the *last session* of the legislature, Justices of the Peace are *hereafter* to be elected by the people of the several towns in the state, at their *annual town* meetings.

*Each* town is entitled to *four* Justices of the Peace, who hold their offices for *four* years, *except* when elected to fill a *vacancy*. They are, immediately after their election, divided, by lot, into *four* classes. The term of the first class expires at the end of *one* year; the term of the second class at the end of *two* years; the term of the third class at the end of *three* years; and the term of the fourth class at the end of *four* years, succeeding such election.

Justices of the Peace have *jurisdiction* of

1. Actions of debt, covenant, and assumpsit, wherein the debt, or balance due, or the damages claimed, shall *not exceed fifty dollars*.

2. Actions of trespass, and trespass on the case, for injuries to persons, or to real or personal property, wherein the damages claimed shall not exceed fifty dollars.

3. All actions for any penalty not exceeding fifty dollars, given by any statute of this state.

4. All actions commenced by *attachment* of property, as provided in the statute, wherein the debt or damages claimed shall not exceed *one hundred dollars*. And,

5. To take and enter judgment on the *confession* of a defendant, where the *amount* confessed shall not exceed *two hundred and fifty dollars*.

But no Justice of the Peace shall have *cognizance* of any action,

1. Wherein the *people* of this state shall be named as

a party, excepting suits for penalties not exceeding *fifty dollars*.

2. Nor where the *title to land* shall in any wise come in question, as provided in the statute.

3. Nor of any action of *assault and battery*, false imprisonment, slander, or malicious prosecution.

4. Nor of any *matters of account*, where the sum total of the accounts of both parties, proved to the satisfaction of the Justice, shall exceed *four hundred and fifty dollars*.

5. Nor of any actions against *executors or administrators, as such*, or against *corporations*.

## CITIES.

## ALBANY.

The CHARTER of this city was granted, as is expressed therein, "at the humble petition of the Justices of the Peace of the said town of Albany," to the inhabitants thereof, "by the name or names of *The Mayor, Aldermen, and Commonalty of the City of Albany,*" by THOMAS DONGAN, Governor, July 23d, 1686, in the *second* year of the reign of JAMES II.

Its *officers* are a Mayor, Recorder, Aldermen, Assistant Aldermen, Supervisors, Assessors, Collectors and Constables, Treasurer or Chamberlain, Sheriff, Coroner, Clerk of the Market, High Constable, sub-Constable, Marshal or Sergeant at Mace. These are the officers named in the Charter.

There are *five Wards* in this City, *each* of which is entitled to elect two *Aldermen*, two *Assistants*, one *Supervisor*, one *Assessor*, one *Collector*, and two *Constables*.

*Two* Aldermen, *two* Assistants, and *one* Constable are to be *annually* chosen in *each* of the said wards on the last *Tuesday* of *September*; and *one* Supervisor, *one* Assessor, and *one* Constable in each of the said wards, *annually* on the *first* Tuesday of *May*.

The officers holding any city election are required to give *five days* previous notice of the time and place where such election is to be holden, in at least *three* public places in *each* ward.

The Mayor, Recorder, Aldermen, and Assistant Aldermen, in this, as in the other cities in this state, constitute the *Common Council*.

The MAYOR is *annually* appointed by the Common Council, and holds his office for *one year*, or until another be appointed and sworn in his stead.

The Aldermen, Assistants, and Chamberlain, are to be *sworn into office* on the second Tuesday of *October* in each year, or as *soon thereafter* as they shall attend in Common Council.

The RECORDER is appointed by the senate, on the nomination of the governor, and holds his office for *five years*.

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 HUDSON CITY.

This city was *incorporated* by the Legislature, April 22d, 1785, and is divided into *two wards*.

Its *officers* are a *Mayor*, *Recorder*, *two Aldermen*, and *two Assistant Aldermen*, in each ward; a *Clerk*, a *Marshal*, a *Chamberlain*, *one Supervisor*, *three Assessors*, *one Collector*, *two Constables*, and as many *Overseers of highways* in each ward as the Common Council may direct.

The *annual* election is holden in each ward on the first Tuesday of April.

The Common Council are required by the charter to appoint, annually, *three* persons in each ward as *Inspectors of elections*, who are bound to give *three days* public notice of the time and places of holding city elections in each ward, to be set up *in writing* in three public places therein.

The COMMON COUNCIL consists of the Mayor, Recorder, Aldermen, and Assistants.

The MAYOR is appointed by the Common Council in the month of *January*, annually.

The RECORDER is appointed by the senate, on the nomination of the Governor, and holds his office for *five years*.

The MARSHAL is appointed in the same manner, and holds his office for *three years*.

The CHAMBERLAIN is *annually* appointed by the Common Council.

The **MAYOR'S COURT** is composed of the Mayor, Recorder, Aldermen, and Assistants. Its *jurisdiction* extends to all causes of action, *wherever* arising. *No appeals* are tried before this court, *except* appeals from Justices of the Peace. In *criminal* cases they, and each of them, have the *same powers* as the Justices of the Peace, in the several towns.

The **CLERK** of this court is appointed by the court, and holds his office during the pleasure of the power appointing him. He is *ex officio* Clerk of the city.

## NEW-YORK.

The CHARTER of the *Colony of New-York*, called "the Charter of Liberties and Privileges, granted by his Royal Highness JAMES, Duke of York, Albany, &c., to the inhabitants of New-York and its dependencies," and assented to by the Governor and Council, October 30th, 1683, *recognises* the "CITYE OF NEW-YORKE," *the actual incorporation* of which must have taken place *prior* to this period.

The City of NEW-YORK is divided into *fourteen Wards*, each of which is entitled to *one Alderman* and *one Assistant*, who are chosen *annually*, on the *first* Monday of November.

The Mayor, Recorder, Aldermen, and Assistant Aldermen, compose the COMMON COUNCIL of the city.

The *Mayor* is elected *annually*, by the vote of the *Common Council*, and holds his office for the term of *one year* from the first day of January, or until another is appointed and sworn in his place.

The *Recorder* is appointed by the Senate, on the nomination of the Governor, and holds his office for *five years*.

The *other* officers of the city, elected by the people, are *two Assessors*, *two Constables*, and *one Collector*, in each ward, who are chosen at the *annual* meeting in November.

No person is entitled to *vote* in any city election, *except* in the *ward* in which he shall *actually reside*.

## CITY OF SCHENECTADY.

The city of Schenectady was *incorporated* by an act of the Legislature, passed March 26th, 1798.

Previous to its incorporation, the corporate property was held under letters patent dated November 1st, 1684, to Ryer Schermerhorn and others, in trust for the benefit of the inhabitants. Schermerhorn, as survivor, conveyed to William Apple, October 21st, 1714, who, on the same day, conveyed to Aaron Bradt and others in trust. Bradt survived the other trustees, and devised the common lands and property to Abraham Fonda and others, as trustees for the inhabitants, and from the trustees the same passed into the hands of the corporation of the city, and was vested in them by the act of incorporation.

The city was originally divided into *four* wards, called the first, second, third, and fourth wards, each ward electing *two Aldermen*, and *two Assistants*, who, with the Mayor, composed the Common Council of the city.

The usual police powers were vested in the Common Council, but no provision was made for the appointment of a RECORDER, nor for the holding of a MAYOR'S COURT. The act of incorporation requires the Common Council to meet on the *first Tuesday of May annually*, and to appoint a TREASURER, CLERK, and MARSHAL.

The *election* of Aldermen, Assistants, and Town Officers, is directed to be holden on the *first Tuesday of April annually*.

The Common Council hold *stated* meetings at the City Hall on the *first Monday* of every month.

The *first* election for Charter Officers was holden on the *first* Tuesday of April, 1798, and the following persons composed the COMMON COUNCIL at the time of its organization, on the ninth day of April, 1798, viz.

By an act of the legislature, passed April 14, 1820, the third and fourth wards, usually called the "out," or "country wards," were separated from the city, and erected into towns, the former called "*Rotterdam*," and the latter "*Glenville*;" and a *division of the common property* was directed by the act which allotted *one half* to the first and second, and the *other half* to the third and fourth wards.

## CITY OF TROY.

The city of TROY was incorporated April 12th, 1816.

It is divided into *six* wards. Its officers are a *Mayor* and *Recorder*, *six Aldermen*, and *four Assistants*, a Clerk, a Marshal, a Chamberlain, Supervisors, one or more Collectors, six Assessors, and six Constables.

The MAYOR is appointed in the month of January *annually*, by the Common Council.

The Recorder is appointed by the Senate on the nomination of the Governor, and holds his office *five* years.

The *annual* city election in *each* ward is holden on the *second* Tuesday of *May*, when all the city officers are elected except the Mayor and Recorder.

The MAYOR'S COURT holds its sessions on the *first* Tuesday of *every* month.

The Mayor's Court has jurisdiction over all actions *real*, *personal*, and *mixed*, arising *within* the city; also of *transitory* actions which may not have originated therein.

The Clerk of the county is *ex officio* Clerk of the Mayor's Court.

## COMMON SCHOOLS.

The following is an *abstract* from the *last* report of the *Superintendent* of common schools, made to the Legislature of the state, February 5th, 1829.

The superintendent is *required* by the law relating to common schools, to prepare and submit to the Legislature an *annual* report on the following subjects connected therewith.

I. The *condition* of the common schools of the state.

II. *Estimates* and *expenditures* of school moneys.

III. Plans of *improvement* and *management* of the common school fund, and *better organization* of common schools.

IV. All matters relating to *his office*, and to common schools, which he may deem *expedient* to communicate.

*First.* There are 55 organized *counties*, and 757 *towns* and *wards* in the state, from all of which reports on the *condition* of the schools have been received.

The *first* returns, under the *present* school system, were made in 1816. In that year, 2755 *school districts* were reported, in which 140,106 children were instructed. The *increase* of *school districts*, in thirteen years, has been 5854; and the increase of *scholars* during the same period has been 328,099.

*Second.* In 1828, the sum of \$232,343 21 cents, was paid to the several school districts, *one hundred thousand dollars* of which were paid from the *state treasury*; \$119,209 30 cents were raised by a *tax* upon the *towns*, and \$13,133 91 cents were derived from a local fund, possessed by certain towns. The towns raised, by a *voluntary tax*, \$19,209 30 cents more than was required of them, to entitle them to the public money.

The amount of money distributed to the several districts in 1828, *exceeded* that paid in 1827, by \$9347 44 cents.

The *productive capital* of the SCHOOL FUND, since the last report, has been *increased*, from various sources, \$61,854 34 cents: and the *whole* productive capital of that fund now amounts to \$1,684,628 80 cents.

*Third.* The care of the lands appropriated to the common school fund, is vested in the commissioners of the land office.

There is now in the Treasury, (*February*, 1829,) \$70,446 24 cents capital paid in, to be invested in some of the stocks of this state.

It is the duty of the *Comptroller* to invest in the stocks of this state, the capital of the Common School Fund which may hereafter be paid into the Treasury.

*Fourth.* The character and usefulness of schools depend upon the qualifications of Teachers.

More than 8600 teachers are now required to supply the district schools of the state. To meet the demand, reliance must be placed upon the higher seminaries of learning. For this purpose, also, academies are in some measure made nurseries of teachers for common schools.

The miserable economy which not unfrequently prevails, of employing cheap teachers, without reference to their fitness, has a tendency to depress rather than elevate the standard of education in our common schools.

The superintendent recommends that provision be made, by law; for enumerating the number of children taught in all the schools in the city of New-York, as well as the number of children between five and fifteen, and concludes his report by remarking, that returns have been received of the condition of the common schools from the commissioners of every town and city in the state.
