


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


















Tomb H 30, showing covering-slabs over the shaft and remains of brickwork.












CONJECTURAL PLAN OF THE TEMPLE AS ORIGINALLY DESIGNED BY HATSHEPSUT.








NORTH WALL OF THE OUTER FORTIFICATIONS.


