The Mountain View Leader devotes a column or more denouncing Supervisor Mitchell, and offers a reward for his capture. Great guns, Smith, a man that is the "watch dog of the treasury" can't be expected to attend to a small matter like road repairing.

We are glad to know that the Santa Clara "Journal" has discovered that there is such a paper as "Realty" published at Skyland, in the Santa Cruz mountains. This most interesting paper, filled with an abundance of ads has been a regular visitor to our sanctum for some years.

The California Legislature is in session. Glad to see that this county's members all opposed extravagance in money for attaches and supplies. Governor Pardee's final message was a lengthy but important one. He leaves the office with a good record. May Governor Gillett live up to the high standard set by his predecessor.

The new county officers assumed their duties at noon Monday, with the exception of Sheriff Langford, ex-Sheriff Ross having secured at the last minute a restraining order from Judge Rhodes stopping Langford from taking office. The matter is now in the courts for settlement. Tom Treanor did not oppose Flannery's stepping into office, leaving it to the court to dispose of the contest. District Attorney Campbell holds over until the Appellate Court cracks the District Attorneyship nut. Campbell served a restraining order upon the Supervisors to keep them from declaring the office vacant and appointing a successor. This freed Messrs. January, Tax Collector; Spitzer, Assessor; Bateman, Superintendent of Schools; Conant, Treasurer; Parker, Auditor; Kell, Coroner; McMillan, Surveyor; Pfister, Clerk; and Supervisor Roll, all re-elected, took their offices without incident. The new Supervisor, Hugh Hersman, took his seat in place of Elmer Rea. The Board organized by electing Supervisor Mitchell chairman.

Thursday morning witnessed the formal opening of the Interurban car line from Meridian Corners to Cupertino. On Wednesday President Hale and Manager Chapin invited the Supervisors and a number of prominent business men to enjoy their hospitality and two cars were necessary to convey the party over the line. The new road taps a rich fruit section and the road is over a pursued right-of-way on the south side of the Stevens Creek road. This new piece of road connects with the line which is being constructed between Vasona (a station on the Southern Pacific R. R. two miles south of Campbell) and San Mateo. When complete it will be possible to go to San Francisco by electric cars. The new piece of road is of the same excellent construction as the roads now in use by that company. Our people are beginning to realize that this section of country are just entering upon an era of electric road building which bodes much good for this valley. That new road when completed, skirting the foothills as it does, will be a most charming ride and to quote John G. Saxe who wrote:

"For oh! it's mighty jolly  
 Riding on the trolley  
 Up the hill, down the dale, and o'er the level plain.  
 Nervousness and weariness,  
 Soon are changed to Cheeriness  
 By the breezy motion  
 Which, like magic potion,  
 Sets the blood to music and rests the troubled brain."

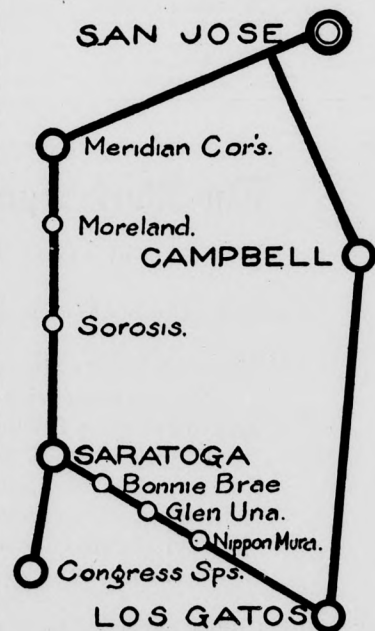
