Los Angeles Orders Miles of Public Highway Cleared of Signs.

Los Angeles.-Under a new antibillboard law, county officers are out prohibited under the ordinance, because they foot up public property, in this instance the highways. This law is regarded as the opening wedge BRIEF ITEMS for more drastic legislation against billboards, which, although not on county property, line the thoroughfares and obstruct the landscape view. It includes not only signboards, but signs of all kinds, and will do away with the practice of giving liver pills and headache cures publicity by extolling their virtues on county bridges and culverts. Guide posts are the only decorations which may be erected along the highways. The penalty for violation is a fine of \$25 to \$200, with a jail alternative of fifty days.



MENACE TO THE APPLE TREE.

Speculation as to What Might Happen if All Apples Were Coreless.
We have already viewed Colorado's

ew coreless apples from several positions, one of which also brought Edward into the field of vision, engaged in the kindly task of expressing the emotions experienced by him "after taking," but the subject is a large one. as well as interesting, says the New York Times, and it may be worth while to take another look at it. The ques-tion, is the coreless apple better than the apple with a core? was answered with a vehement affirmative by king, and as he, in the course of long and active life, has tasted most varieties of most fruits, including, if there is anything in rumor, some described by the specialists as "prohibita," his verdict is a weighty one, if not absolutely final, and it's no wonder that the ingenious pomologist has taken pains to publish the royal commendation of his apple fast and far.

But while we have now as little doubt as he that the coreless apple is good—to eat—second thoughts on the subject have raised in our minds a few doubts if in the long run it will prove advantageous for men or for apples to turn the latter so far away from the way in which nature intended them

Coreless means seedless, and seedles means doomed to an extinction that may be remote, but it is as sure as sure can be. Were all apple trees rendered seedless, the duration of the spe cles would be limited to the time dur-ing which, without the invaluable aid of "crossing," the trees then alive could continue to send up from their roots a constantly deteriorating series of new shoots. Into that sad condition some cruel accident of environment has already thrown the banana, and if tosomething—a frost, an insect or like—should kill all the banana plants there never would be any more of them, in this world at least. Persistent propagation of the potato
