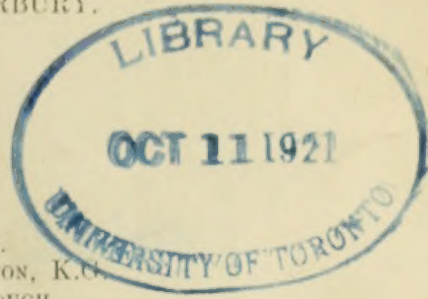

## REPORT.

THE date of the Annual Meeting has been altered from July (during which month it has always been held in the past) in accordance with a Resolution, moved by Miss Graham, and passed at the General Annual Meeting held on the 15th July, 1920, Mr. Lindsay, K.C. (*Norroy King of Arms*), Chairman of the Council, in the Chair, that Rule 5 should be altered to read as follows:—

“A General Meeting of Subscribers will be held annually in the autumn to receive the Secretary’s Report on the work and proceedings of the Society, and the Treasurer’s Financial Statement; to elect Officers for the ensuing year; and to transact the business of the Society generally. Notice of any Business to be brought forward shall be given to the Secretaries at least three weeks before the date of this Meeting.”

It is hoped that the new date will be found more convenient for Members, and that we may have larger attendances than has hitherto been usual.

The following Report of the Council will be presented to the Members:—

Our Membership for the past year remained steady, 169 against 170, but with great regret the Council have to report several resignations at the end of the year, without a corresponding number of new subscribers. Death has also taken his toll, though not such a heavy one as last year. We have to lament the loss of Prebendary Deedes, who, at the time of his death was engaged in editing the register of “John de Pontissara,” of Winchester. His task was nearly finished, but he did not live to complete the final editing of the concluding pages. Mr. Johnson has kindly undertaken this duty, but the issue may be delayed for a short time.

The Cantilupe Society having completed its work, our connection with it consequently ceases. We have received their final volume of the Hereford Registers, a large one of nearly four hundred pages and a preface; it contains the registers of Bothe, Foxe and Boner, and an index, and this we propose to distribute as our chief issue for the coming year. The final part of Richard Gravesend, of Lincoln, with the index, is printed;

we only await some addenda promised by Canon Foster and an introduction by Mr. Hamilton-Thompson.

Owing to the crushing cost of printing, binding and other expenses of publication, we are much hampered in our work, but it is hoped progress may be made with the Rochester, Salisbury, and London registers, all of which are in hand. When prices come down we can increase our issue, but we have to proceed very carefully, counting the cost, and arranging our out-put according to our means. The Hereford Registers mentioned above are already paid for, and the cost of issuing this large part will be comparatively small. It is feared, however, that if prices do not show a marked decrease, it will be necessary to reduce our publications to half-yearly parts instead of quarterly.

A complete set of our publications has been presented to the reconstructed library at Louvain, and another set, as far as available, will in due course be sent to the School of Advanced Historical Research.

The Treasurer's financial statement will be found on the fourth page of this Report. It will be noticed that our balance carried forward to the new year compares unfavourably with that which we had at the beginning of this; the chief reason is that the heavy payment to the Cantilupe Society, to which allusion is made above, comes into last year's Balance Sheet instead of that of the current year. We therefore start the year with £61 12s. 10d., against £108 3s. 2d. A comparison of the two Balance Sheets will easily account for the difference; the cost of printing is more than double, and the expense of distribution of parts has very much increased.

The Council appeal to the Members of the Society to pay their subscriptions due on the 1st July, and also to those Members who are in arrears to send their cheques to the Secretary at No. 1, Fleet Street, without delay.

Owing to all this increased expense the Resolution passed in 1910, "that no more than one part may be issued to any Member whose subscription is in arrear," will have to be rigorously enforced.

New Members will be welcomed, and those joining who desire to obtain back parts will be able to do so at a greatly reduced cost.

## RULES OF THE SOCIETY.

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I.—The object of this Society shall be to print, for distribution among its members only, Copies, Abstracts, and Indexes of the Bishops' Registers and other Ecclesiastical Records in the Provinces of Canterbury and York.

II.—The Annual Subscription shall be One Quinea, payable in advance on the 1st July.

III.—Each member of the Society, having paid his subscription, shall be entitled to a copy of every work produced by the Society, and to vote at the general meetings, within the period subscribed for.

IV.—The management of the Society's affairs shall be vested in a Council consisting of the Presidents, the Vice-Presidents, Chairman of Council, Treasurer, and Honorary Secretaries, and twelve ordinary members, to be elected annually; but vacancies occurring between the general meetings shall be filled up by the Council. The Council may, if they think fit, elect a Chairman from outside their own body.

V.—A General Meeting of the Subscribers shall be held annually in the autumn to receive the Secretaries' Report on the work and proceedings of the Society, and the Treasurer's Financial Statement; to elect officers for the ensuing year; and to transact the business of the Society generally. Notice of any business to be brought forward shall be given to the Secretaries at least three weeks before the date of this Meeting.

VI.—The Council shall meet when necessary for the dispatch of business, three forming a quorum, including one of the Secretaries. Presidents and Vice-Presidents shall not be summoned to meetings of the Council unless they shall have given notice in writing to the Secretaries of their desire to serve upon it. The Chairman of the Meeting shall have a casting vote.

VII.—These Rules may not be amended or altered except at the Annual General Meeting, and notice of any proposed change shall be given to the Secretaries at least three weeks before the date of the Meeting at which it is to be considered.
