THE REPORT

THE Council submits the following report and statement of accounts for the year ending 30 June 1937 for the consideration of the Society.

At the thirty-second Annual General Meeting of the Society on 18 November 1936 the adoption of the report and statement of accounts was moved by the Chairman, the Provost of Southwell. Professor F. M. Stenton gave an address on 'The Peculiar Jurisdiction of Southwell and its Records'.

Part CI, the continuation of the Register of Hamo de Hethe, Bishop of Rochester, has been issued (Part VII).

Parts CII and CIII, the Wills volume of the Register of Henry Chichele, Archbishop of Canterbury (1414-43), are in the press and will be issued very shortly (Parts I and II).

The thanks of the Society are due to Mr. Charles Johnson for the Rochester Register, and to Professor E. F. Jacob and the Warden and Fellows of All Souls for the Canterbury Register; and to the British Academy for a generous grant towards the publication of Part VII of Hamo de Hethe and Part VI of Simon of Sudbury.

Further progress has been made with the work on the Index to the Register of Simon of Sudbury, Bishop of London (Part VI), and it will be issued early in 1938.

For the year 1937-8 it is proposed to issue two more volumes of the Register of Archbishop Chichele and Part VII of the Register of Archbishop Winchelsey.

The Treasurer's statement will be found on pages 6 and 7. The thanks of the Society are due to the British Academy for £100, to Mrs. Graham for £5 5s., to Mr. Chitty for £3 3s., and to Miss Rivington for £3 3s.

Seven new members have joined the Society, the Bishop of Portsmouth, the Provost of Southwell, the Rev. Seiriol J. Evans, Mr. W. K. Evers, Mrs. A. G. Little, the Rev. S. L. Pollard, and Durham University Library.

The Council records with regret the death of Mrs. Brocklebank.

Three resignations have been received. There are now 87 individual members and 130 libraries, making a total of 217.

By arrangement with the Surtees Society members of the Canterbury and York Society have the privilege of buying the Register

of William Greenfield, Archbishop of York (1306-15), edited by Professor Hamilton Thompson. Vol. I was issued in 1931, Vol. II in 1934, Vol. III in 1936, Vol. IV will be issued shortly, price £1 5s. Application should be made to S. C. Ratcliff, Esq., 47 Calton Avenue, S.E. 21.

In 1938 the Somerset Record Society will issue the Registers of Bishop Stillington (1466-91) and Bishop Fox (1492-4). The privilege of *temporary* membership of the Somerset Record Society is offered to members of the Canterbury and York Society. Application should be made to the Rev. By arrangement with the Surrey Archaeological Society, every member of the Canterbury and York Society will receive an offprint of *The Return of the Clergy in Surrey in 1562* made by Robert Horne, Bishop of Winchester, in response to Archbishop Parker. *The Return* is edited by Canon Goodman with an introduction by Mr. Baskerville.

The Council desires to call the attention of members to the final volume (III) of *General and Provincial Chapters of the English Black Monks* (Royal Historical Society 1937); and to *Statuta Capitulum Generalium Ordinis Cisterciensis*, Vol. IV (1401-56), Bibliothèque de la Revue d'Histoire Ecclésiastique, Louvain, 1936. Reference to all printed episcopal registers, arranged under counties, which have been published by this Society and others, will be found in *A Select Bibliography of English Genealogy*, by H. G. Harrison (Phillimore & Co., 1937).

RULES OF THE SOCIETY

I.—The object of this Society shall be to print, for distribution among its members only, Copies, Abstracts, and Indexes of the Bishops' Registers and other Ecclesiastical Records in the Provinces of Canterbury and York.

II.—The Annual Subscription shall be One Guinea, payable in advance on the 1st July.

III.—Each member of the Society, having paid his subscription, shall be entitled to a copy of every work produced by the Society, and to vote at the general meetings, within the period subscribed for.

IV.—The management of the Society's affairs shall be vested in a Council consisting of the Presidents, the Vice-Presidents, Chairman of Council, Treasurer, Honorary General Editor, and one, or more, Honorary Secretaries, and twelve ordinary members, to be elected annually; but vacancies occurring between the general meetings shall be filled up by the Council. The Council may, if they think fit, elect a Chairman from outside their own body.

V.—A General Meeting of the Subscribers shall be held annually in the autumn to receive the Secretary's Report on the work and proceedings of the Society, and the Treasurer's Financial Statement; to elect officers for the ensuing year; and to transact the business of the Society generally. Notice of any business to be brought forward shall be given to the Secretary at least three weeks before the date of this Meeting.

VI.—The Council shall meet when necessary for the dispatch of business, three forming a quorum, including the Secretary. Presidents and Vice-Presidents shall not be summoned to meetings of the Council unless they shall have given notice in writing to the Secretary of their desire to serve upon it. The Chairman of the Meeting shall have a casting vote.

VII.—These Rules may not be amended or altered except at the Annual General Meeting, and notice of any proposed change shall be given to the Secretary at least three weeks before the date of the Meeting at which it is to be considered.
