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FOREWORD

Upon the lifting of the enforced curtailment of major capital improvements, and even adequate maintenance, at the end of World War II, the State was confronted with a sizeable backlog of needed projects to bring its physical plant up to a point of adequacy. The required modernization and replacement of facilities, and the provision of new ones to meet increased demands, compelled the State to undertake a heavy construction program.

The report that follows spans the eighteen year period, 1947-1964, and indicates the extent of the program to overcome the critical deficiencies. It discloses that during this period the expenditure of more than \$409,113,267 has been authorized by the General Assembly for capital improvements, exclusive of highways. The report sets forth a summary of the authorized expenditures by major functions for both State-owned and non-State-owned capital assets; a tabulation of legislative fund authorizations; and a detailed compilation, by agency and institution, of all projects that have been authorized during the eighteen-year period. The State Planning Department, of course, is primarily concerned with State-owned capital assets. Expenditures authorized for non-State-owned capital assets are included primarily to present a complete picture. The chart on page 9, shows authorized capital improvement expenditures by basic function for both State-owned and non-State-owned capital assets.

It is hoped that this report will serve as a useful reference and be helpful to State officials, legislators and others in the consideration of future capital improvement programs of the State.



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

In addition to this loan, (General Public School Assistance Loan of 1949), the State's credit has been extended to the local subdivisions in connection with the General Public School Construction Loans of 1949, 1953, 1956, 1962 and 1963 which total \$215,000,000. Debt service for these loans is payable by the local subdivisions. It should be realized, however, that this practice of so extending the State's credit affects its credit position.

² In addition to these loans, the State's credit has been extended to the local subdivisions and/or sanitary districts, and hospitals in connection with the General Sanitary Facilities Construction Loan of 1963 in the amount of \$5,000,000, the Hospital Construction Loan of 1964 in the amount of \$50,000,000, and the Airport Development Program and Construction Loan of 1964 in the amount of \$500,000.
