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


















































































### **MONSTER MUSEUM**


























































































# picture dictionary B BRIDGES

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
The Romans built these bridge piers in a prow-shape to reduce the undercutting effect of a swift current on the masonry.



The stones of the arch were set in overlapping rows for maximum strength. They were held together by their shape alone.



History's first great bridge engineers were the Romans. Their wonderful massive stone archways are found throughout Europe.



When these piers were completed, a timber "falsework" was then erected to support the wedge-shaped stones of the arch.



When a longer span was required, the Romans built a larger central arch. Steps (Pedes pontis) were provided for pedestrians.
