

PREFACE.

The purpose for which this Catalogue was first printed having passed, the compiler desires to make it of more permanent value to connoisseurs and lovers of the works of Landseer, and therefore has included the unengraved as well as the engraved works of our great artist; he has added the more important subjects which are only partially known. This edition has also a separate index for the unengraved pictures, which can be distinguished by the absence of numbers. An index to the names of the various engravers is given. The compiler has embodied as much information as possible relative to each picture. The short descriptions and anecdotes are believed to be authentic, having been obtained direct from the parties named or from personal knowledge acquired in business transactions.

Landseer was fastidious in his art, hence he left many sketches and unfinished works, some barely indicated, others more advanced. It is said of him that he would at times place a clean canvas on his easel and for a day and sometimes for several days let it remain without touching pencil or brush, until the entire subject had become matured in his mind, when he would commence to sketch and paint with extreme rapidity and precision. No doubt he laboured at the mechanical portion of his art in close study and drawing from models as other men have to do, but his best work was from within rather than from without. The humour, interest, pathos, cunning, and in some cases the ferocity expressed by his animals, did not come so much from models mechanically and laboriously copied, as from the revelations of genius, matured however by intense study of the originals. It has been said that his animals have too much of human expression, and this has been objected to; but the abiding value of Landseer's work will be in this grand speciality, which distinguished him above all other painters of animals, namely, that farce, comedy, or tragedy, are to be found in some of his groups, and one or other in single subjects, which all classes of persons understand and appreciate who have the pleasure of looking at a Landseer picture or engraving. Haydon, in one of his lectures, stated that Landseer and Lance were both students under him, and to Lance he remarked, "Still life will be your forte, you must be the Weenix of English art;" to Landseer he said, "Study animals, and be the Snyders of England."

Note.—Subjects marked thus * indicate that the Pictures or Drawings were exhibited at the Royal Academy of Arts, Burlington House, which Exhibition closed March 14, 1874, and those marked thus † were the exhibited *Sketches*. Figures in parenthesis (139) are the numbers in the Royal Academy catalogue.



drawing was sold at the Artist's sale in a scrap book, lot 1013; the book sold for 115 guineas, and was bought by Messts, Henry
Graves & Co.; and another composition in water colour was also sold there, lot 446, for 62 guineas, to Mr. Miller. This subject
was also engraved very small by J. Le Keux.

	Mr. Bell gives the following account of the picture in his catalogue. It has been reported that the mare would not stand to be shod unless in company with a donkey. The truth is that the intimacy of the mare and the donkey commenced in the studio, and was cemented on the canvas. Another rumous states that the scene, as painted, occurred in the forge of a country blacksmith, where the mare was having a shoe fastened, and that the painter was so pleased with the composition that he made an elaborate sketch for the picture on the spot. Some critics have noticed the "oversight" of the mare having no bridle or halter. This was not an oversight, as she would stand to be shod or cleaned without being fastened, but had a great objection to be tied up in a forge or against a post or door. When this has been attempted, she often started back with a sudden jerk and broke the bridle. Other critics have remarked that from the mode of painting the toe of the off fore foot, the mare appears as if her weight rested on only two legs. This was noticed before the picture was finished, and she was placed in position several times for the purpose of ensuring accuracy. In every instance she placed the foot exactly in the position represented.	
	The subject originally intended was a mare and foal, with which object the mare was turned out for breeding. In due time the foal arrived, and frequent bulletins were forwarded to St. John's Wood reporting progress, and anxiously requesting an appointment for a sitting. The foal passed through the age of infancy and out-grew its mother.
