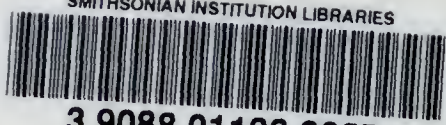

## COINS OF THE AMERICAN COLONIES.

- 1 **Massachusetts** : Shilling: NE in incused square, struck close to top: the left upright of N does not show. R XII in similar square; very good and rare.
- 2 — Willow tree shilling: rudely designed tree in oval of pellets: MASAHVSEETS N. R 6522 | XII in broken circle of pellets: NEWENG N; a very fine specimen of this rare piece.
- 3 — Oak Tree Shilling: 1652; very good.
- 4 — Another, different dies; fair.
- 5 — Oak Tree Three Pence: 1652: fine; rare.
- 6 — Oak Tree Twopence; 1662; good.
- 7 — Pine Tree Shilling, 1652: split tree variety: pierced; very good.
- 8 — Pine Tree Shillings, 1652: pellet each side of tree: broad planchets: very fair and one good, but clipped; 2 pcs.
- 9 — Pine Tree Shilling, 1652: small planchet; very good.
- 10 — Pine Tree Sixpence, 1652: ASATH worn off: otherwise very good; scarce.
- 11 — Pine Tree Threepence, 1652: very fair; pierced.
- 12 — Cents and Half Cents, 1787-'8: latter both 1787: very fair to very good; 4 pcs.
- 13 **Maryland** : Annapolis Shilling, 1783: very good; scarce.
- 14 **Kentucky** : Halfpennies: pyramid of stars: plain and lettered edges: very fine and uncirc.; 2 pcs.
- 15 **Louisiana** : Sous, 1721 '2, '67; poor to good; 4 pcs.
- 16 **Florida** : pewter Halfpence, Jas. II.: poor and uncirc.; 2 pcs.
- 17 **New Jersey** : St. Patrick Halfpenny and Cents of 1787, '8: one "fox type"; very fair to very good; 6 pcs.



- 18 **New York** : Cents, 1787 (2), and Mott's token, 1789; poor: latter very good; 3 pcs.
- 19 — Talbot, Allum & Lee Cents, 1794, '5: good: latter uncirc.; 2 pcs.
- 20 — Another pair, equally good, but 1794 has been varnished; 2 pcs.
- 21 — Immunis Columbia Cent, 1787: seated figure r.: with balance and flag. R̄ spread eagle: very good; scarce.
- 22 **Connecticut** : Cents, 1785, '7: one AUCTOR: CO rest on head (new variety?): good lot; 5 pcs.
- 23 **Virginia** : Halfpennies, 1773: Geo. III.: different dies: good to uncirc.; 4 pcs.
- 24 **Carolina** : Halfpenny, 1694: elephant l. R̄ GOD: | PRESERVE: | CAROLINA: AND | THE: LORDS: | PROPRIETORS | 1694: pierced at top, otherwise very fine; very rare.
- 25 — London Elephant Halfpenny, same obv. as that on preceding; good.
- 26 **Castorland** (Carthage, N. Y.): silver and bronze tokens, 1796: thin planchets: uncirc.; 2 pcs.
- 27 **Rosa Americana** : Penny, 1722: UTILE DULCI in legend; fine.
- 28 — Halfpenny: AMERI: VTILE. DVLCI. 1722; very good.
- 29 — Twopence, 1723: Crowned rose: fine, sharp, uncirc.; rare.
- 30 — Another: broader planchet: *very* fine; scarce.
- 31 — Others: good; 2 pcs.
- 32 — Penny, 1723; fine.
- 33 — Another; fine.
- 34 — Halfpenny, 1723: crowned rose: very fine; scarce.
- 35 — Penny and twopence (2), 1723: barely fair; 3 pcs.
- 36 **Wood's** Halfpence, 1723: different dies: uncirc.: bright: as a lot: rarely equalled; 3 pcs.
- 37 **Pitt and Franklin Press** tokens: former clipped on right: otherwise very good: latter good; 2 pcs.
- 38 **Continental Currency** (sic) Dollar, 1776: sun over dial: very fine sharp specimen: uncirc.; rare.
- 39 **Nova Constellatio** Cents, 1783, '5: former with one L: poor to very good; 3 pcs.

- 40 **Washington** Cents, 1783: all different heads: very good lot; 4 pcs.
- 41 — Duplicates of preceding lot: good; 4 pcs.
- 42 — Cents, 1783: Lincoln's restrikes in silver, copper and one bronzed: proof; 3 pcs.
- 43 — Duplicate lot: equally perfect; 3 pcs.
- 44 — Duplicates in copper (2), and bronzed (2): proofs; 4 pcs.
- 45 — Cent, 1791: small eagle; very good.
- 46 — Cent, 1791: large eagle; uncirc.
- 47 — Halfpenny, 1793; ship over date; fine.
- 48 — Penny: military bust l. R eagle surmounting shield; uncirc.
- 49 — Halfpenny, 1795: by Clark & Harris: fireplace; uncirc.
- 50 **Miscellaneous**: Vermont, "Vox Populi" Halfpence, and Columbia Farthings (4 very fine specimens): etc., 2 pierced: fair to very fine; 10 pcs.
- 51 **Massachusetts** Note, 1778: 6 pence: pine tree; good.
- 52 Pine tree Sixpence, 1652: finely engraved: Birch Cent, and Fugio Cent, 1787: of the kind usually catalogued as "not guaranteed"; 3 pcs.

### FOREIGN SILVER CROWNS, ETC.

- 53 **Anhalt**: Alexr. Carl: Double Thaler, 1840: portrait r. of one of the ugliest appearing personages found on a coin. R fine shield of arms: almost proof; rare.
- 54 — — Thaler of same: 1846 product of the Anhalt mines: crowned bear on wall; fine.
- 55 — Leopold Fred.: Thaler, 1858: profile l. with curls. R arms supported by bears; very good.
- 56 **Austria**: Francis II. Crown, 1793; good.
- 57 **Baden**: Leopold: Crown, 1833: portrait r. R arms supported by griffons; fine.
- 58 **Bavaria**: Louis I: Crown, 1826: portrait r. R portraits *vis-a-vis* of Reichenbach and Fraunhofer: uncirc.; scarce.
- 59 — — Crown 1828. Similar obv. R portraits of the Queen and eight children in circular medallions; uncirc.

- 60 — — Double Thaler, 1839; very good.
- 61 — Maximilian II: Double Thaler, 1849: fine portrait r.  
R the Munich statue of Orlando di Lasso: fine proof;  
scarce.
- 62 **Bohemia**: Louis II: Crown: lion rampant. R Saint  
standing: field burnished: loop removed; very good.
- 63 **Breslau**: Philip Gotthard: Half Crown, 1754: bust r. R  
arms: fine; rare.
- 64 **Brunswick & Luneburg**: Henry Julius: Crown, 1613:  
wild man with uprooted tree l. R arms; very good.
- 65 — Anthon Ulric: broad Crown, 1705: wild man with tree  
on right. R arms; fine.
- 66 — 4 and 24 Groschen (two each) 1700-'85: one pierced:  
good to fine; 4 pcs.
- 67 **China**: old Mexican Dollar covered with "chop-marks";  
fine.
- 68 **Denmark**: Christian IV: Crown, 1646: crowned bust in  
armor r. R lion rampant with axe: fine; scarce.
- 69 — Frederick III: 1648:  $\frac{1}{8}$  Crown (Klippe), 1 Mark; also  
2 Marks Chris. IV. with Hebrew inscription: good to  
fine; 3 pcs.
- 70 **France**: Henry IV: Testoon, 1608; very good.
- 71 — Louis XIV: 6, 12 Sous,  $\frac{1}{2}$ , 1 Crown, 1652-1705:  
different portraits: very good; 4 pcs.
- 72 — Louis XV: Crowns: 1716, '26: infant bust r. youthful  
bust l.: former fine, scarce: latter fair; 2 pcs.
- 73 — Louis XVI. Crown 1793. Also Louis XVIII, 5 Francs,  
1814: fine: former shows file marks in planchet; 2 pcs.
- 74 — Republic: 5 Francs, 1849, '51: Hercules and Concord  
types: fine; 2 pcs.
- 75 **Frankfurt**: Schutzen-Thaler, 1862, and Gulden 1846:  
fine; 2 pcs.
- 76 **Greece**: Otho: 5 Drachmi, 1833: uncirc., rare so perfect.

l. R British arms, lion and unicorn supporters;  
uncirc.

R crowned arms on ermine mantle; uncirc.

- 79 **Hohenlohe**: Louis Fred. Chas.: Crown, 1797: fine bust l. in armor, decorated with the Red Eagle. R̄ arms on ermine mantle: uncirc.; rare.
- 80 **Hohenzollern-Sigmaringen**. Carl: Double Thaler, 1844: portrait l. R̄ crowned arms supported by mastiffs; barely circulated.
- 81 **Hungary**: Rudolph II: Crown, 1606: mailed bust r. R̄ arms in Collar of the Fleece; fine.
- 82 — Leopold, the "Hogmouth": broad Crown, 1692: obv. worn on a box. R̄ fine.
- 83 **Italy**; Napoleon I:  $\frac{1}{4}$ ,  $\frac{1}{2}$ , 1, 5 Lire, 1809-14: very good; 4 pcs.
- 84 **Jever**: Friderica Sophia: Thaler, 1798: Russian Imperial eagle with arms of Jever on breast: very fine; rare.
- 85 **Japan**:  $\frac{1}{4}$ , 1 Bou, oblong square: and  $\frac{1}{2}$ , 1 Yen, circular coinage: very fine; 4 pcs.

R̄ view of Jerusalem and the angel destroying the besieging army: VT . SANHERIB . A . IERUSALEM | 2 . REG . 19 .: very fine: rare; size 30.
- 86 **Lippe**: Paul Alexr.: Double Thaler, 1843; very good.
- 87 **Lombardy**: Five Lire, 1848; fine.
- 88 **Malta**: De Rohan: Double Scudo, 1789: bust r. in armor. R̄ arms on eagle; very good.
- 88 **Mecklenburg-Schwerin**: Fred. Franz: Thaler, 1848: portrait; uncirc.
- 90 **Mexico**: Augustin, 2, 8 Reales 1823. Also Maximilian, Peso, 1866: very good to very fine; 3 pcs.

Bishopric arms; fine.

- 95 **Naples**: Republic: Crown, 1798: very fine; scarce.
- 96 **Nassau**: William: Crown, 1833: nude bust r. R̄ arms;  
fine.
- 97 — Adolph: Double Thaler, 1854, and Gulden 1842: very  
fine: scarce; 2 pcs.
- 98 **Netherlands**: 5, 14, 30 Stuivers, 1, 2½ Guilders, 1578-  
1847: for Amsterdam Siege, Friesland, Utrecht and  
Daventer: very good lot; 5 pcs.
- 99 **Norway**: Carl XIV (Bernadotte): 24, 60 Skil., 1 Specie  
Daler: 1821-'44: each with portrait: fine, scarce;  
3 pcs.
- 100 **Papal States**: Clement XI: Crown, 1704: Arms. R̄ a  
bishop exhibits the Infant Savior to kneeling angel  
and worshippers: very good; loop removed.
- 101 — Benedict XIV, Clement XIII, Pius IX (3 types):  
1754-1866: Lire: good; 5 pcs.
- 102 **Parma**: Maria Louisa: Five Lire, 1815: fine bust l.  
R̄ Arms on crowned ermine mantle: fine perfect  
proof: the most beautiful we have seen; very rare.
- 103 **Peru**: Cob money, ½, 1 (2), 2 (4), 4, 8 Reales, 1714-  
'70: also Sol 1869: a very good series; 10 pcs.
- 104 **Piedmont**: Republic, 1801: Five Francs; fine.
- 105 **Poland**: Sigismund III: Crown, 1630: half length bust  
in armor r., with orb and sword. R̄ crowned arms of  
Poland, Sweden, etc.: very good; scarce.

- 106 — Revolution 1831: Ducat (gold), 5, 2 Zlote, 10, 3 Groszy: 1 Zloty, paper: all uncirc., in morocco case with Polish inscription: a rare set; 6 pcs.
- 107 **Prussia**: Fred. Wm. III, and Wm. I: Thalers, 1799-1866: good to uncirc.; 3 pcs.
- 108 **Reuss, Senior**: Henry XX: Double Thaler, 1851: fine portrait l. R̄ Arms on crowned ermine mantle: barely circulated, proof surface; very rare.
- 109 **Russia**: Peter the Great: Ruble: bust r. R̄ Imperial eagle: very good; loop removed.
- 110 — Anna: Ruble, 1733; very good.
- 111 — Nicholas, Three Rubles (*Platina*) 1832: uncirc.; scarce.
- 112 **Saxony**: Chris., Jno. Geo. and Aug.: Crown and  $\frac{1}{3}$  Crown: 3 busts on former: good and fine; 2 pcs.
- 113 — Eight Brothers Crown, 1610: half length busts of the whole family; very good.
- 114 **Saxony**: John George: Double Crown, 1630: Centenary of Augsburg Confession; fine and rare.
- 115 — Carl Alexr.: Double Thaler, 1855: fine portrait l. R̄ arms under crowned ermine canopy: uncirc.; rare.
- 116 — John: Double Thaler, 1858; fine.
- 117 **Saxe-Altenburg**: Joseph: Double Thaler, 1847: with portrait: very fine; rare.
- 118 — George: Double Thaler, 1852: with portrait; very fine; rare.
- 119 **Saxe-Coburg-Gotha**: Ernst: Double Thaler, 1854: portrait: fine; rare.
- 120 **Saxe-Meiningen**: Bernhard: Double Thaler 1853, and Gulden, 1838: with portraits: fine and scarce; 2 pcs.
- 121 **Schwarzburg**: Fred. Gunther: Double Thaler, 1845: fine portrait r. R̄ elegant shield of arms with many quarterings, surmounted by crested helmets, and supported by wild man and woman: very fine; rare.
- 122 **Schwarzburg - Sondershausen**: Gunther Fred. Carl: Double Thaler, 1854: fine portrait l. R̄ similar to that next preceding: barely touched by circulation; rare.

- 123 **Sicily**: Joseph Bonaparte: Crown, 1801: with portrait; fine.
- 124 — Another: 1806: similar but smaller portrait and letters; nearly as fine.
- 125 — Ferdinand I, Francis I; Crowns, 1818, '25: also Sardinian Five Lire of Victor Emmanuel, 1850: very good to uncirc.; 3 pcs.
- 126 **Spain**: Joseph Bonaparte: 20 Reales, 1809: Also Ferdinand and Isabella Real, and Ferd. VII, Valencia 4 Reales Siege piece: good to fine; 3 pcs.
- 127 **Sweden**: Gustavus Adolphus: Crown, 1632:  $\frac{3}{4}$  faced bust laureated and mailed.  $\text{R}$  garnished shield of arms: fir cone below indicating the mintage of Augsburg, which accounts for the fine die work: fine; rare.
- 127a — Chas. IX, XI, and XII. Crown, 2 Marks and  $\frac{1}{3}$  Crown: very fair to very good: all scarce; 3 pcs.
- 128 — Oscar I: Specie Daler: portrait; fine.
- 129 **Tuscany**: Peter Leopold: Crowns, 1770, '87: different busts: good; 2 pcs.
- 130 — Chas. Louis and M. Aloysia: Ten Lire, 1807: fine busts jugata r.  $\text{R}$  Crowned arms; Florence mint: uncirc.: a beauty; rare.
- 131 — — Ten Paoli (Crown), 1806: busts vis-a-vis: Pisa mint; very good.
- 132 — Leopold II: Ten Paoli (or 4 Florins), 1839: with portrait: fine work; uncirc.
- 133 **Westphalia**: Jerome Bonaparte: Thalers, 1811, '12: with portraits: fair and fine; 2 pcs.
- 134 **Vaud**: Half Crown, 1810; very fine.
- 135 **Venice**: Republic: Five Lire, 1848: lion of St. Mark on pedestal; fine.
- 136 **Wurtemberg**: William: Double Thaler, 1855; and Gulden, 1848 (fine): former uncirc.: scarce; 2 pcs.
- 137 **Hindostan**: Aurunzeb and Jehan Shahs: Rupees: each in descriptive wrapper: very good; 2 pcs.
- 138 **Akbar, Oude**: Jehangir and Ghazi-ed-din Haider: Rupees: very good; 2 pcs.
- 139 **Persia**: Husein: Oblong Rupee: very good; rare.

- 140 **Rangpur**: Narsingha: square Rupee: fine; rare.
- 141 **Jayanti-Pura**: broad Rupee, 1712: fine; very good.
- 142 **Assam**: Rudra, Lakshmi, Bharatta: octagonal Rupees (3) and  $\frac{1}{8}$  R.: fine; 4 pcs.
- 143 **Madras**, Tunis, Ceylon, Turkey, India, etc.: interesting lot: Para to  $\frac{1}{4}$  Pagoda: some rare: good to uncirc.: 1 pierced; 24 pcs.
- 144 **Siam**: bullets,  $\frac{1}{4}$  (3) and  $\frac{1}{8}$  Tical: very good; 4 pcs.
- 145 **Bracteates**, large sizes, 18 to 23: Fred. I., etc: fine; 5 pcs.
- 146 **Poland**, Portugal, Venice, France: good lot of old pieces 5c. to 50c. sizes: 4 pierced; 15 pcs.
- 147 **Demarara**, Honduras, Chili, Haiti, Windward Is., Mexico: 3c. to 25c. sizes: several rare: desirable lot; 25 pcs.
- 148 **Miscellaneous European Coins**: Franc to half Crown size: good lot; 29 pcs.
- 149 — Half to 1 Franc sizes: poor to fine; 50 pcs.
- 150 — All below Dime size: poor to fine; 131 pcs.

- 154 **Leipzig**, 1650: Peace stands on war relics. R̄ two cherubs hold the Saxon ægis over the city: very fine, pierced; size 32.
- 155 **Regensberg**, 1627: Angels with palm and olive branches fly toward a church, the Trinity above in clouds. R̄ 17 shields of arms encircle inscription: very fine; 35.
- 156 **Dutch Mortuary** medal, 1692: for Matthias Gerkens: emblems of Time above skull and crossed bones: appropriate inscriptions: oval, cast: fine; 34 x 38.



- 157 **Papal States**: Benedict XIII.: coronation, with bust: very good; 28.
- 158 **Martin Luther**: bust r. R a palm tree on river-bank: 2nd Jubilee, 1717: fine; 20.
- 159 **Sweden**: Frederic: bust r. by *Hedlinger*. R caduceus and ears of wheat, 1721: very good: scarce; 25.
- 160 — Adolphus Frederic, Gustavus III, Carl XIII: with portraits: fine: 19; 4 pcs.
- 161 **Austria**: Ferdinand II, Rudolph II: fine busts. R Jonah cast out by sea-monster: 7 shields of arms: former cast: fine: 17 and 16; 2 pcs.
- 162 **France**: Louis XII, Chas. IX, Henry III: struck from re-engraved dies: with portrait: very fine: 19 pcs.
- 163 — Louis XIV, XV, XVI: 1671-1793: all with portraits: one pierced: good to very fine: 17 to 24; 7 pcs.
- 164 — Various commemorative medals, 1614-1774: good to very fine: one pierced: 16 to 20; 12 pcs.
- 165 — Masonic: Lodge of the Imperial Eagle, 5807: very fine: rare; 18.
- 166 — Bank of France, 1799: Minerva and Fortuna stand by a safe: octagonal, very fine; 23.
- 167 **England**: Chas. II, 1673: Christ's Hospital Naval School badge: small boy surrounded by Arithmetic, Astronomy and Mathematics personified: ships in offing. R blank: border pierced, 11 holes: very good and rare; 51.
- 168 **England**: Geo. IV, dedication Waterloo Bridge, 1817. Princess Charlotte, 1796: Geo. I, coronation: also profile bust Chas. I (cut out, 10 x 20), Chas. II & Catherine, Duke Wellington, Jenny Lind: good to v. fine: 8 to 22; 7 pcs.
- 169 — War medals, SEBASTOPOL and AVA bars: former nicked, fine: 23; 2 pcs.
- 170 **Miscellaneous**: mostly German, 1551-1815: 4 cast, 2 pierced: interesting lot, very good: 13 to 25; 20 pcs.

- 171 **Napoleon I**: fine laureated profile r. by *Droz*. R Strasburg sacrifices at an altar: Peace of Schönbrunn, 1809; 43.
- 172 — Similar obv. R France enthroned gives a decoration to a togated traveller presented by Mercury; 43.
- 173 — Nude bust r. by *Andrieu*. R Munich presents city keys to Victory, 1799; 37.
- 174 — Smaller profiles by *Andrieu*. R Mt. Blanc School of Mines, Simplon, Capitulation of Ulm, Vaccination, Medal Press, Occupation of Hanover, Presburg Treaty: all size 26, and 1 Jeton, plated, size 20; 9 pcs.
- 175 **Louis XVIII**: fine profile r. by *Andrieu*. R Venus di Milo; 32.
