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## NOTE.

WITH the exception of a few unimportant subjects, this is a Catalogue of a collection of etchings and dry points by Whistler recently purchased in Great Britain, and long distinguished as one of the finest existing, both as to the condition and quality of the prints.

The subjects are arranged according to Wedmore's Catalogue and the Appendix thereto, with the exception of the Naval Review subjects. These are described at length, as some of them are not described by Wedmore, his descriptions of the others are not definite, and one (Visitors' Boat), is inaccurate.

The subjects not heretofore described are arranged at the end, as nearly as possible chronologically.
