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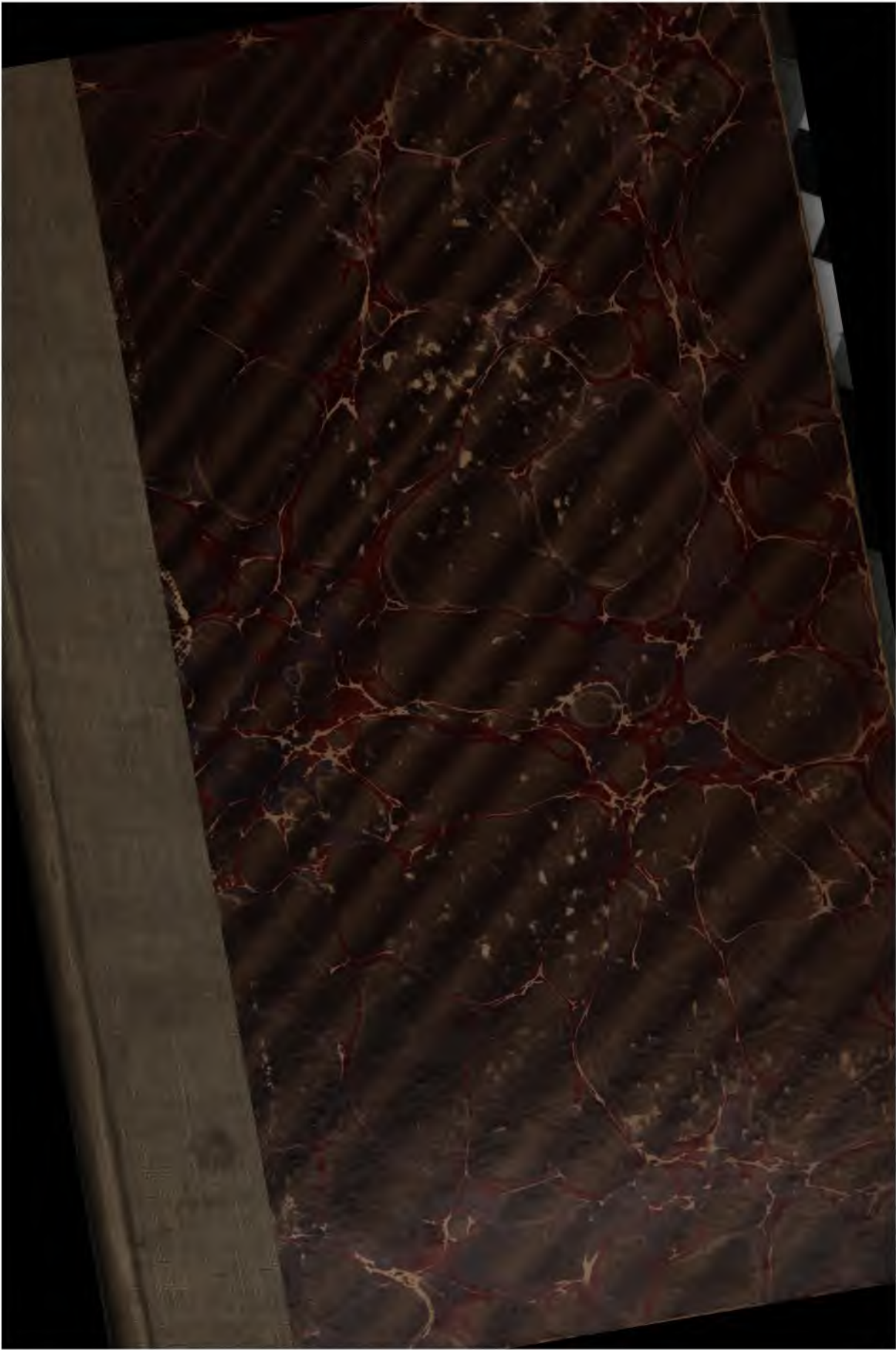
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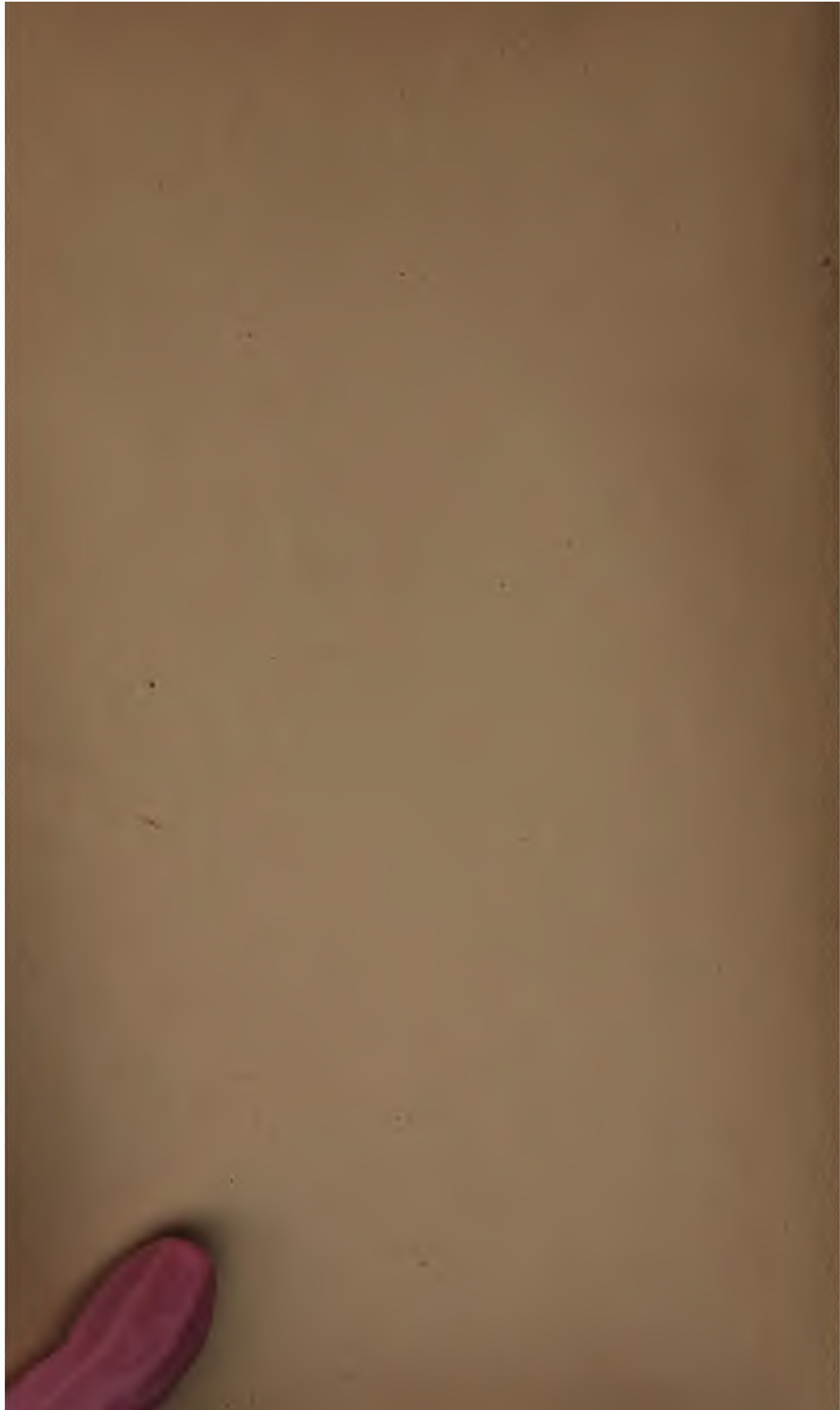


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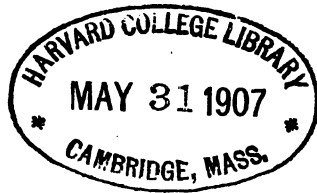
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PREFACE.

The Moss Side Free Library, which already contains two valuable collections relating to Thomas De Quincey and Mrs. Gaskell, is now further enriched by the gift of a Brontë collection. This donation consists of 150 books and pamphlets gathered together by Mr. Joseph James Gleave, of Whalley Range, Manchester, who is well-known for his interest in all that appertains to the Brontës.

In making the donation to the Manchester Free Libraries' Committee, Mr. Gleave wished to have the collection housed in the Free Library of Moss Side, having been a resident in that district for about thirty years. The books and pamphlets to be treated in the ordinary way as reference books.

The following catalogue of the collection has been prepared for the benefit of Brontë students. Though the list is not intended as a bibliography of the subject, it has been thought advisable to include references to a few books and pamphlets contained in other Manchester libraries.

These outside references, numbering 25 items only, are distinguished by initials. Some references have also been made to books in the Gaskell and De Quincey collections at Moss Side and in the general library. The total of books, etc., easily accessible number about 230.

In addition to the gift of the Brontë collection, Mr. Gleave has also defrayed the cost of printing this catalogue.

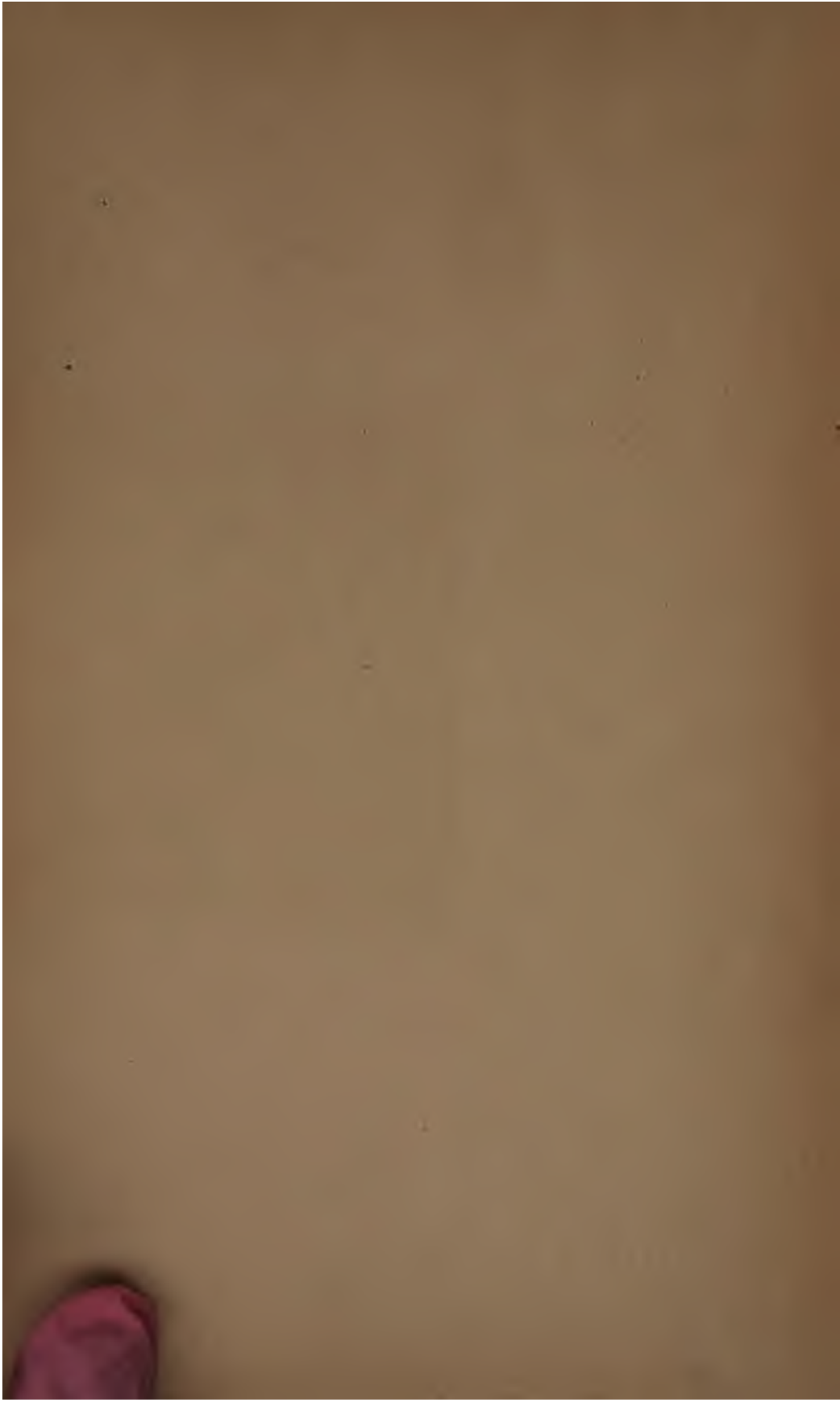
