- 5* ——— Constantius II (337-361), Solidus, Thessalonica mint, CONSTANTIVS AVGVSTIVS within a laurel wreath, diad. bust right, *rev.* VICTORIAE DD NN AVGG, TES. Two Victories supporting a wreath inscribed VOT/XX/MVLT/XXX, the whole within a laurel wreath (C.280). *Extremely fine.* 1

- 10* — Anastasius (491-518), Solidus, Constantinople mint, facing helmeted bust with shield and spear, *rev.* VICTORIA AVCCCS. Victory with long cross (DO, pl. I 3 f). *Extremely fine.* 1
- 11* — Justinus I (518-527), Tremissis, Constantinople mint, *rev.* Victory. *Very fine.* 1
- 12 — Justinianus I (527-565), Solidus, facing helmeted bust with globe cruciger, *rev.* VICTORIA AVCCCΔ facing Victory (DO 9, d.2). *Fine.* 1
- 13* — Constans II (647-668), Solidus, facing busts of Constans and Constantine IV, *rev.* VICTORIA AVCY(?) +. Cross on globus between Heraclius and Tiberius standing (DO 29). *Nearly extremely fine.* 1
- 14* — Constantine IX (1042-1053), Solidus (histamenon), bust of Christ Pantokrator, *rev.* crowned cuirassed bust of emperor with sword and globe cruciger, facing, between two stars (DO 742, 4a). *Nice style, extremely fine.* 1
