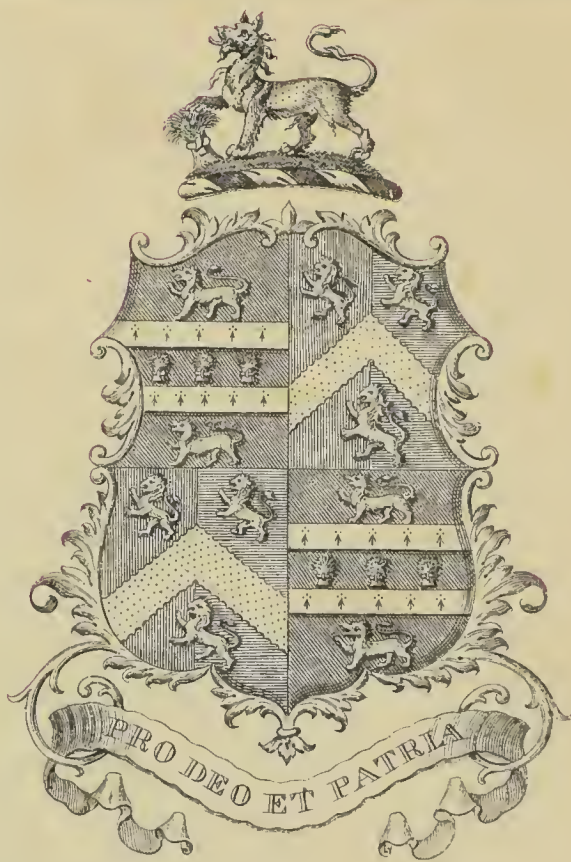

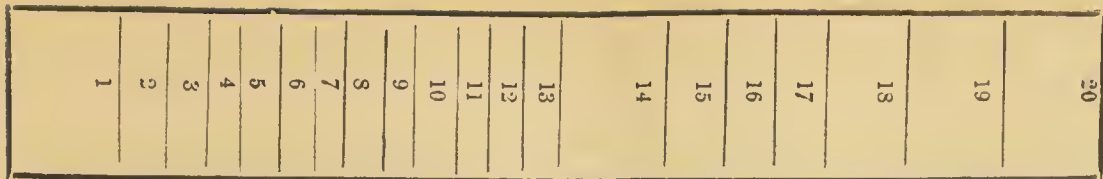
CONDITIONS OF SALE.
