## INTRODUCTION.

The Collection of Coins here catalogued was formed upwards of half a century ago by that well-known archæologist the late Charles Warne, Esq., F.S.A. The result of his researches into the ancient history of his native county produced his standard work of "Ancient Dorset," which includes an account of the Saxon, Danish and Norman mints, and led him to form a collection of coins struck at Bridport, Dorchester, Shaftesbury and Wareham. But his zeal in collecting coins of Saxon and later times was evidently exceeded by his inclination for the Roman, especially for such as were issued by the two Emperors Carausius and Allectus. This will be at once apparent to all those looking over the examples here gathered together, and it can be safely said that no more important series of these very interesting British coins has ever been offered for sale.
