

- I. THE highest Bidder is to be the Buyer; and if any Dispute arise between Two or more Bidders, the Lot so disputed shall be put up again and re-fold.
- II. No Person to advance less than 1s. Above Five Pounds, 2s. 6d. and so on in proportion.
- III. The Purchasers to give in their Names and Places of Abode, if required, and to pay down 20l. per Cent. in Part of Payment of the Purchase Money; in Default of which, the Lot or Lots so purchased, to be immediately put up again, and re-fold.
- IV. The Purchaser is to take his Lot or Lots away at his own Expence, within One Day from the Day of Sale.

ANTIQUE SCULPTURE.

- 16 A pair of elegant marble vases mounted with or-moulu, on carved pedestals
- A female bufto, antique
- A man's bufto, ditto, on a marble column pedeftal
- A STORM AT SEA with ships in distress. No artist ever represented those awful scenes with more truth and dignity—finished with great precision and a delicate pencil
- THE SACRÍFICE, OFFERING, AND COMPACT BE-TWEEN JACOB AND LABAN, a nobly composed picture, full of grace and elegance
- THE MARTYRDOM OF ST. SEBASTIAN Vandyck, after seeing the works of Titian, endeavoured to attain that stile of colouring, visible in this fine and spirited performance
- 22 MONTE CAVALLO—the whole evidently a correct copy from nature, figures included, which are full of spirit and animation
- 23 ST. JEROME—a grandeur and boldness of correct academic drawing, the true characteristic of the Carracce school; a finished cabinet picture
- 24 FOUR PICTURES REPRESENTING THE ELE-MENTS. Few pictures can deferve more attention, the subjects confisting of innumerable objects, most wonderfully executed—the whole in perfect preservation.
- 25 A DUTCH BURGOMASTER, half length, a fine and correct representation. This mafter is esteemed the Vandyck of the Holland school



- 26 A landscape, view in Flanders, with cottages and peasants, one of those spirited pictures which never fail our admiration; the figures inimitably touched
- 27 The holy family, a beautiful cabinet picture
- 28 The temptation of St. Anthony, a subject well suited to the genius of this singular artist, to bring forward those magic powers his mind possessed for incantations or supernatural effects, in which he has here succeeded to admiration—a very capital picture
- 29 A whole-length portrait of the Duke of Richmond, placed in a genteel easy attitude, the true character of Vandyck's fine portraits
- 30 A Flora with Cupids. Albano possessed the graces in an eminent degree; the character and figure of Flora is elegant; the whole mellow and harmonious in colouring
- 31 The head of Christ, fully impressive of meekness and Divinity
- 32 A view of a fountain and part of the Colosseum, and other noble fragments of antiquity; to these interesting objects he has placed a young artist drawing, as handing to posterity those venerable remains
- A hermit in meditation. Douw was a scholar of Rembrandt, whose glowing effects he strongly imitated with a correctness of drawing and high finishing far surpassing his master. This is of his finest class
- 34 A man's portrait, three-quarter, a very striking marked character, painted and coloured in his finest manner
- A vafe with flowers. He has never finished a picture more highly; the flowers appear as detached from the surface; the colouring clear and beautiful
- 36 A Dutch lover treating his mistress, one of those high-finished performances which so eminently distinguish this master's works
- 37 An Italian sea port with galleots and various shipping, embellished with figures, placed in a proper mercantile situation, a pleasing clear picture



- 38 The Ecce Homo, a grand composition full of expression. The works of this master are much admired for their boldness and relief of colours
- 39 A large picture of a reposo with angels. This painter was a rival candidate with Rubens for colouring—painted in a masterly grand stile
- A ditto with ruins, exhibiting the most capital remains of those noble antiquities in the environs of Rome, so much the admiration of the world—executed with a freedom and taste for which his works are eminently distinguished
- 41 Ditto, the companion, equally capital
- Mars, Venus, and Cupid, undoubtedly painted after Rubens had studied the works of Titian and Veronese, whose taste of colouring and composition he has joined to his own lively imagination—it was ever esteemed one of his finest pictures in the Orleans collection
- 43 A half-length oval portrait of the Elector Palatine, repletewith taste and elegance
- 44 Lord Herbert, pourtrayed with great spirit and finely coloured
- 45 A NOBLE LANDSCAPE, with a diffant view of the Escurial—
 the scene is presumed to be a correct view—the whole treated,
 in a masterly stile—a very capital performance
- 46 THE VIRGIN AND INFANT CHRIST—a graceful ease
 -and maternal affection in the madona beholding the beloved
 infant—a very capital picture
- 47 A WHOLE-LENGTH PORTRAIT OF A LADY OF
 QUALITY, a very lively and expressive countenance—
 a rich and boldly coloured picture
- A SEA PORT. Claude had a fingular happiness in the choice of his subjects. This noble and extensive scene possesses all that vapour or true aerial perspective, that will ever attract our admiration—very capital
- The children in the wood, a most beautiful combination of effects, finely coloured
- *49 A landscape with Jacob and Rachel, with cattle. Landscapes
 by Murillio are very scarce and valuable

- 60 A VERY CAPITAL HIGH-FINISHED BRONZE BUS-TO, on a marble column pedestal
- 61 DIANA PUNISHING PROFANE LOVE
- 62 A small landscape with a group of cattle and figures, fine
- 63 A small pleasing landscape, touched with great spirit
- 64 THE PORTRAIT OF THE CELEBRATED H. GRO-TIUS. There needs no illustration, only to observe, it is a great character exquisitely painted by one of the first-rate geniuses. From the collection of Sir J. Reynolds
- 65 DITTO OF THE PRINCESS OF ORANGE, mother of King William III. This artist was formed on the fine taste of Van Dyck, of whom he was a pupil
- 66 A LANDSCAPE, a grand romantic scene, the figures representing the return of Adonis from the chace. All the works of Titian are strongly marked with a fire and native genius. When we consider how scarce the landscapes of Titian are, they become invaluable
- 67 ST. JOSEPH. The works of Guercino are of the highest character in the annals of painting; what a chaste and modest ferenity in the countenance of the faint! truly graceful and sublime
- 68 ST. PAUL. The companion, of equal merit
- A view of the Grand Rigatta at Venice. The lively, spirited, and natural manner in which Canaletti has represented this busy scene, interests the spectator as much as if he was actually present—unquestionably one of his most capital pictures
- 70 A WHOLE LENGTH PORTRAIT OF HENRIETTA.

 OF LOTHARINGE, Princess De Pfalsbourg, 1634,
 a graceful figure, attended by a black page, one of Van

 Dyck's finest coloured pictures
- 71 A SCENE OF A FARM YARD, WITH A GROUP OF CATTLE, during a storm of rain, a bold and grand design, painted with great facility and spirit

- 72 HERODIUS, a very beautiful elegant figure. Dolcé was quite original in his manner, which was very elaborate; from his great attention and accuracy of drawing and high-finishing, he has produced very few pictures, which makes them in great request
- 73 THAT NOBLE AND EXTENSIVE SCENE, the boaft of modern Rome, the great church of St. Peters, with the approach of the grand colonade, including the Vatican; it is enriched with many figures, and finished in a corress file
- 74 THE COMPANION, Place del Popello, of equal merit
- 75 ST. IGNATIUS attired in his priestly habit, in the attitude of ecstacy and inspired devotion; Rubens has treated this subject in a grand stile, the colouring truly harmonious, and painted with a spirited and slowing pencil
- 76 THE SACRIFICE OF IPHIGENIA, after Pouffin, the first artist of the French school; the whole is a master piece of composition full of character and expression, and stamped with true genius
- 77 A GROUP OF CATTLE IN A LANDSCAPE, the pictures of this master are deservedly in great esteem, there is a pleasing delicate softness with a transparent glow of colouring, very fascinating, which this picture possesses in the highest perfection
- 78 THE MAGDALEN IN THE DESERT, attended by angels; how graceful has he imagined this subject of forrow, piety, and resignation, as giving up the soul prepared for Eternity. This picture does great honour to the works of Cortona; from the collection of the Duke de Noailles
- 79 A LANDSCAPE WITH CATTLE, one of his finest highfinished cabinet pictures; his pictures are very scarce and held in great esteem; he died only aged 29 years
- THE JUDGEMENT OF PARIS. Van der Werf hardly ever produced a more capital picture; if we take it for elegance of composition, it has all the graces of a Parmegiano, with that high-finishing and rich colouring in which his works so much excel

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- A LANDSCAPE FROM NATURE in a pleafing tone of colouring, which pictures are in much request; the figures fuited to the scene and finely painted by Ad. Van de Velde; a fine cabinet picture
- 82 FLEMISH PEASANTS PLAYING AND RECREATING
 WITH SKETTLES, &c. a very animated picture, with
 that filvery tone of colouring and fmart penciling fo much
 admired in his finest works
- 83 A SMALL LANDSCAPE WITH A GROUP OF CAT-TLE AND FIGURES. This cabinet jewel includes all the beauties and perfections of this admired artist
- 84 A DUTCH PEASANT, OR A POT COMPANION
 HOLDING A JUG. One of the finest specimens of
 this great artist for correctness of drawing and beautiful
 warmth of colouring
- 85 THE COMPANION EQUALLY FINE
- 86 A PAIR OF BEAUTIFUL SMALL PLEASING LAND-SCAPES AND FIGURES, ovals
- 87 THE RETURN FROM THE CHACE. One of his finished and elaborate cabinet pictures, possessing all the powers both in composition and execution of this inimitable artiss
- 88 THE BATH OF DIANA WITH ACTEON. Titian has repeated this subject with variations on a larger scale; but this is admitted one of the most beautiful rich coloured cabinet pictures extant of this master
- Without prefuming too much, it is hardly possible for the arts of drawing and colouring to do greater justice to the arch looks and spirited countenances of this group of peasants, which was painted in the infant discovery of oil colours and has happily remained in perfect preservation
- tural and graceful attitude of the Madona and beautiful pleasing character of the infant Saviour are in compleat harmony; the colouring chaste and true to nature, with a strict correctness of finishing so much admired in the works of this celebrated artist

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THE GARDEN OF LOVE. It is impossible to conceive a more striking or picturesque scene, in which Rubens with all his powers of the arts, has pourtrayed himself with his wife, with Van Dyck and other eminent artists, and intimates, into one splendid group at the entrance to the garden of his own house; the colouring harmonious and pleafing.-This subject became so great a favourite at the time, that Rubens, at the particular request of his friends, has repeated it several times in different fizes

THE TRANSFIGURATION. The original has ever been the admiration of all men of taste and judgment, admitted as the finest of all his works; more need not be said in the illustration. This copy, which is visibly the hand of Julio Romano, has been judged to rival if not excel even the original in point of spirit and expression; such a masterly picture by his best scholar becomes a very valuable acquisition

- A VENUS, CUPID AND SATYR. The graceful attitude of Venus is inimitably conceived; the eager defire of Cupid to recover his power is of a poetical fancy, it is Corregio in all his perfection of art and tafte. The late Mr. Van de Gucht paid Sir William Hamilton, who brought this picture into England £1500. for it; it is truly a chef d'œuvre
- A VERY CAPITAL LANDSCAPE, CATTLE AND FIGURES. There is not a picture extant of this great master more noble or skilful in point of a general composition, or figures more pleasing and natural; his animals are characterised in a beautiful stile, quite his own, and finished with an accurate pencil; it is from the collection of Duke De Noailles
- A NOBLE LANDSCAPE, in which he has exhibited his taste to great advantage; the subject of the figures present. the worshipping of the molten calf; the composition con-

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tains a variety of characters disposed of with great propriety and elegance; the whole a clear and brilliant harmonious effect; one of his most capital pictures

96 . Capital pictures of this esteemed artist are become very scarce, as they have been in refearch for all the the great cabinets in Europe. This picture is a striking proof of Cuyp's great powers in giving effects. The landscape a beautiful picturesque scene, a country intersected with waters, with a funny clear and brilliant air; figures judiciously placed and cattle finely drawn; the whole scene appears like animation placed before us by the highest perfection of human art; it is no presumption to say it is a matchless and valuable performance

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
