CONDITIONS of SALE.

I. **T**HE highest Bidder is to be the Buyer ; but if any Dispute shall arise between two or more Bidders, the Lot in Dispute is to be put up again.

II. No Bidder is to advance less than SIX PENCE ; above a Pound, ONE SHILLING ; above Five Pounds, TWO SHILLINGS and SIX PENCE.

III. Every Purchaser is to pay down Two Shillings and Six-Pence in the Pound in Part of Payment, and is to give in his Name and Place of Abode, if required.

IV. The Lots are to be removed, with all Faults, at the Expence of the Buyers, within Three Days after the Sale is ended, and the Remainder of the Purchase-Money to be then paid ; in Default of which, the Deposit is to become forfeited, the Lots resold, and the Deficiencies, if any, are to be made good by the first Purchasers.
