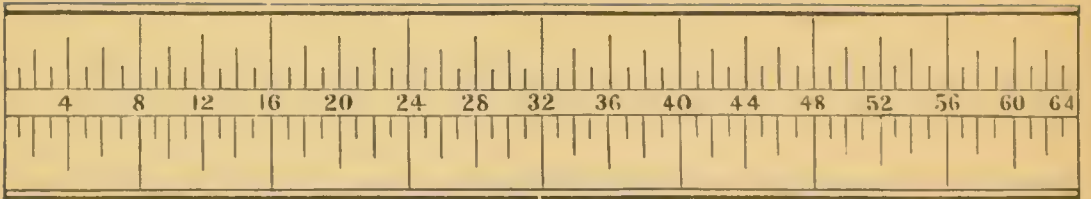
P R E F A C E.

I present herewith the fifth and last part of the Numismatic Cabinet of the late Prof. CHARLES E. ANTHON, President of the American Numismatic and Archæological Society. 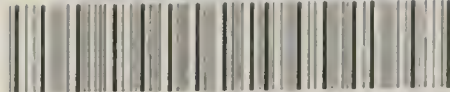
