

" Lieutenant-Colonel Russell Manners, C.B., entered the army as an ensign in the 74th Highland Regiment in 1791, served with the Bombay army in the second Mysore war, and was present at the storming of Seringapatam in 1799, and at the siege of Pondicherry. He served with the 74th in the Peninsula War, and was present at the battle of Busaco, pursuit of Massena, actions of Foz d' Armel, Sabugal and El Bodon; he commanded the regiment at the battle of Fuentes d'Onor, and at the siege of Ciudad Rodrigo; he was present at the first siege of Badajoz, and commanded his regiment at the last siege. He was also present at the battle of Salamanca, the capture of Madrid, and the retreat from that city. At the battle of Orthes, again in command of the 74th, and was present in the last battle in the campaign of 1814, fought at Toulouse. In 1815 he was nominated a Companion of the Bath, and he had received both the gold and silver medals for his services on eight different occasions."







\*\*Peter White was born 1st Aug. 1785, and served as boatswain's servant on board the "Latona" in Lord Howe's action, 1st June, 1794; was Midshipman of the Defence at Copenhagen 1801; and, at the Battle of the Nile; was transferred as Master's Mate to H.M.S. "Sultan," 15 Dec. 1807 and whilst serving in that ship he commanded a boat in an attack upon three French vessels, of which two were boarded and captured. For this service, 4th Dec. 1811, he was ordered by Lord Exmouth to act as Lieutenant. For further services, see O'Byrne, page 1,282. (See illustration).

Bartholomew George Smith Day entered the Navy, 27 Nov. 1804, as Fst.-cl. Vol., on board the Amsterdam frigate, Capt. Wm. Ferris, employed in the West Indies; and, on next joining the "Revenge ' Capt. Robt. Moorsom, took part, as Midshipman, in the battle of Trafalgar, 21 Oct. 1805. Until Nov. 1808, he afterwards became attached in succession, on the Channel and Halifax stations, to the "Medusa 32," Capt. Hon. Duncombe Pleydell Bouverie, "Leopard 50," flag-ship of the Hon. Geo. Cranfield Berkeley, and "Chibucto" and "Bream" schooners, both commanded by Lieut. Geo. Gover Miall. Being then appointed Acting-Master of the "Supérieure" sloop, Capts. Wm. Ferrie, Humphrey Fleming Senhouse, Henry Conyngham Coxen, and Robt. Russell, he assisted, in company with the "Horatio" and "Latona," at the capture, on 10 Feb. 1809, of the French 40-gun frigate "La Junon," after a contest in which the "Supérieure" figured very conspicuously; and, in the same and the following year, he was also present at the reduction of the islands of Martinique, Guadeloupe, and St. Martin. Between Oct. 1810. and his promotion to the rank of Lieutenant,—which took place 11 Feb. 1815, three years after he had passed his examination,— Mr. Day appears to have been next employed—in the "Royal Sovereign" yacht, in the river Thames—the "Dominica" sloop, Capt. Robt. Hockings, and "Queen 74." flag-ship of Sir Fras. Laforey, both on the West India station—and the "Cyrus 20," Capt. Wm. Fairbrother Carroll, off the coast of France. From April to Sept. 1815, he afterwards served in the "Slaney 20," Capt. Geo. Rose Sartorius; but since the latter date he has not been affoat.

Lieut. Day, when in the "Bream," in Chesapeake Bay, had the good fortune to suppress a mutiny which had broken out on board that vessel. (See illustration).

Pearse (Commander, 1825, F-P., 23; H-P., 31). John

Pearse was born 17 May, 1780.

This officer entered the Navy, at the commencement of 1793, on board the "Myrmidon," slop-ship at Plymouth, Lieut.-Commander John Burrows; and, between June, 1794, and the date of his promotion to the rank of Lieutenant 29 Dec. 1800, was employed as Midshipman in the "Gibraltar 80," Capt. John Pakenham, "Bombay Castle 74," Capts. Jas. Macnamara, Wm. Shield, and Thos. Sotheby, "Culloden 74," Capt. Sir Thos. Troubridge, "Princess Royal 98," Capt. Thos. Macnamara Russell, and "Ville de Paris 110," flag-ship of Earl St. Vincent. He officiated for some time, too, as Acting-Lieutenant of the "Neptune" and "Téméraire 98's." In the "Gibraltar" he fought in Hotham's action 13 July, 1795; in the "Bombay Castle," in which ship he was wrecked in Dec. 1796, he witnessed the capture, in Tunis Bay, of the "Nemesis" of 28, the "Sardine" of 22, and a polacre of 20 guns, as likewise the evacuation of the island of Corsica; and in the "Culloden" he was present in the action off Cape St. Vincent, at the bombardment of Cadiz, in the expedition against Teneriffe, and at the battle of the Nile. He served also on shore at the sieges of Naples and Capua, at the capture of Civita Vecchia and Rome, and at the bombardment, in 1799, of Alexandria. With the colours taken at Capua Mr. Pearse was sent by Lord Nelson to the Queen of Naples, by whom he was presented, in return, with a diamond ring.

Thomas Mansel entered the Navy in 1789, as Fst.-cl. Vol., on board the "Hyæna 24," Capts. Hon. Courtenay Boyle and David Lloyd, stationed at first in the North Sea and afterwards in the Mediterranean. Removing as Midshipman, in 1800, to the "Elephant 74," Capts. Thos. Foley and Geo. Dundas, he served in that ship under Lord Nelson at the battle of Copenhagen, 2 April, 1801, and on proceeding to the West Indies took part in the operations of 1803 against the French at St. Domingo.


