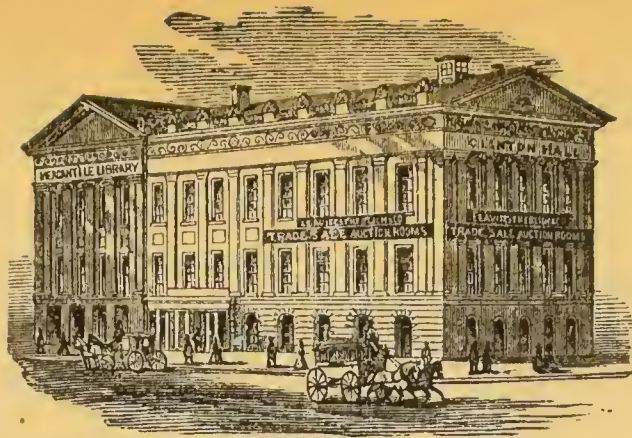

infer, according to our leisure or skill, the name of the Prince, the value of the coin, the nation for whose convenience it was issued, and the date; but most of all, in the dark concerning the signification of the mass of symbols with which the metal is enriched.
