Die Sammlung enthält u. a. das 152 S. starke Verzeichnis über das „Cabinet of Coins“ von John Brodribb Bergne, eine der wertvollsten englischen Kollektionen, die vorzüglich eine reiche Auswahl von Münzen u. Medaillen aus der ersten Regierungszeit der verstorbenen Königin Viktoria enthielt und bei der Versteigerung vom 20.-30. Mai 1873 eine Gesamtsumme von £ 6102.13.— brachte. Die Serie ist hübsch gleichmässig in 6 Halbfrzbd. gebunden, von denen jeder ein heraldisches Ex-libris trägt. (Thomas William Minton.)

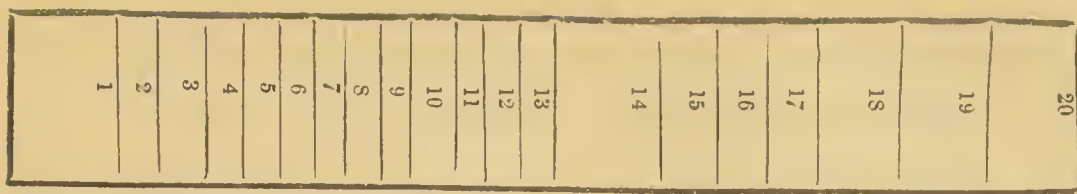
CONDITIONS OF SALE.
