On the first page of this interesting volume is a large shield of arms of Flavius, Prince of Orsini, emblazoned on vellum; this is followed by a printed leaf, the Privilege of Clement VIII to Giacomo Lauro in 1598, with the Arms of the Pope on the opposite side; after which are copies of letters to Lauro from the most illustrious persons of the time, exquisitely written in the finest Italian hand, probably by the artist himself, commencing with one from Sigismund the Third, King of Poland, 1601.

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
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
