Time that we no longer have for our families, for our friends, for shaping our opinions. Dealing WITH Exchange:

Mark Fisher **Folders**

If you have identified sources of e-mail that will only be addressed to you (relatives, friends, etc.) you can create a personal folder to receive their messages.

It isn't really private, but it can be convenient. Go to <C>onfigure in the <M>ail menu, and add a folder, choosing a unique name for the folder (probably your name). I think it will be at the end of the folder list. The system news folder has a zillion permissible sources - to get past it use CTRL-B to go to the bottom of the list. Use the arrow keys to move the highlighted line to the new folder's name that you've just created, and press CTRL-A to add the e-mail addresses of the sources of possible mail to be put in that folder.

This can be done "retroactively," allowing you to add a name to the list AFTER receiving a message. Once you have added a name to the list, the message will be re-sorted to the appropriate folder. Future messages received from these addresses (NOT names) will be put directly into the specified folder.

These addresses are CASE SENSITIVE, and I've run into problems using this feature due to minor misspellings. If you receive a message from someone not listed in your folder's "acceptable names" list, it will be put in the general mailbox. This is a signal that you need to update your folder address list.

That's it! Leave me a note if you have any questions.

The Queue:

There are four entries in the <M>ail portion of Exchange, and the Queue may be the most obscure of all of them. Basically, a copy of EACH message sent out from our home pad is retained in the message queue until deliberately deleted. In the case of messages "mailed" to ourselves, TWO copies are thus retained please delete your messages from the queue after you are sure they have been received.


