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## JIMMIE LUNCEFORD AND HIS ORCHESTRA 1938-1939

elvin "Sy" Oliver was not only a member of the famous trumpet section in Jimmie Lunceford's band but was also responsible for many marvelous arrangements for the orchestra. He later remarked: "It was an interesting band for musicians, and an interesting band for non-musicians. That's why we had such a following. "These recordings from 1934 and 1935 present Jimmie Lunceford and his Orchestra on their way to fame. Although James Melvin Lunceford was born in Fulton, Missouri in 1902 he spent' most of his childhood in Denver, Colorado. After his studies at Fisk University he taught music in Memphis, Tennessee. His first band was composed of former colleagues and students, including some musicians that were to remain members of Jimmie's orchestra for many years (Willie Smith, Edwin Wilcox, Moses Allen and Jimmy Crawford). Like comparable Territory Bands it took them several difficult years of touring in the Mid-West but they gradually succeeded to build up a national reputation. Based in New York since the early thirties the band continued to tour extensively and its European excursion in 1937 made the orchestra very popular outside the United States. Leader Jimmie Lunceford was a multi-instrumentalist but gradually gave up playing after 1930 in order to concentrate on his duties as conductor. In 1947 he suffered a heart attack while on tour in the state of Oregon and died a few days afterwards.

This second CD of Jimmie Lunceford's entire studio recordings in chronological order opens with two tracks from November 7, 1934 and leads you well into his last session of the following year. "Since My Best Gal Turned Me Down" was arranged by Sy Oliver and features the underrated Joe Thomas on tenor-sax as well as Edwin Wilcox. The kind of singing by the trio heard here and elsewhere on this CD had by then become one of the orchestra's trade-marks. It is interesting to compare the different arrangements by Sy Oliver who equally contributed "Shake Your Head", "Four Or Five Times", "Babs", "Swanee River" and a host of others that are contained herein. Besides these little masterpieces the works of arranger Eddie Durham shoul not be forgotten. He was definately one of the most influential creators of the Swing Era, working also for the bands of Count Basie and Glenn Miller. Probably his loveliest contribution to the band-book of Jimmie Lunceford is his interpretation of "Avalon". This intricate tune has not always been well dealt with but the version by Jimmie Lunceford and his Orchestra is particularly pleasing. Nevertheless it is Edwin Wilcox's "Rhythm Is Our business" which showcases the quality of this outstanding band at its best. Saxophonist-vocalist Willie Smith introduces members of the orchestra in this unmistakable style. Indeed, rhythm was their business! To be continued on volume 3...
