merican producer and critic Chris Albertson once described Lil Hardin Armstrong as "without doubt, the most vivacious jazz performer" he had ever met. Although she was never among the most impressive planists around, her numerous recordings from close to five decades – not only those made together with her husband Louis Armstrong – all bear the stamp of a highly individual artist and personality!

Lillian Hardin was born in Memphis, Tennessee in February 1898. After having studied music at Fisk University, she moved to Chicago before turning twenty. Playing frequently with King Oliver since 1921, Lillian Hardin was able to cut her first records with him in 1923. The band's second cornetist, Louis Armstrong, and the young pianist married the following year. Their marriage lasted until 1931. Lil Hardin Armstrong, at the time more ambitious than her husband, was mainly responsible for Louis' taking the chance to work with the most popular orchestra of the time, Fletcher Henderson's. During his stay she was leading her own small group in Chicago, which Louis joined late in 1925. Both musicians can of course be heard on the legendary "Hot Five" and "Hot Seven" recordings of the period. At the end of the decade Lil Hardin Armstrong continued her studies, mainly in classical music in Chicago and New York. She later appeared in several successful Broadway-shows, namely "Hot Chocolates" and "Shuffle Along". In the mid and late thirties Lil fronted groups and orchestras of various sizes with which she toured mainly between Chicago and New York. After returning to Chicago in 1940 she played longer residencies as a soloist in various nightclubs in around the city. Lil Hardin Armstrong visited Europe for the first and only time in 1952, when she could be heard in Paris and London. She hardly ever left the city of Chicago during the last two decades of her life although occasionally touring Canada, Lil Hardin Armstrong died while participating at a memorial concert for her former husband on August 27, 1971 - some two months after Satchmo.

This CD includes all recordings made under the name of Lil Armstrong between October 1936 and March 1940 in chronological order. All of these sessions are interesting since they present a mixture of famous and lesser-known musicians. The first six tracks feature a particularly attractive line-up, although Chu Berry seems not to have his best day. Robert Caroll's tenor on the other hand is very impressive on "Born To Swing" and "Sit-Down Strike For Rhythm". The September 1938 date presents Roy Eldridge's cousin Reunald Jones on trumpet: It is almost unbelievable that this gifted musician was granted so little solo-space during his career - even when he later worked with Count Basie. His solos on those four tracks are outstanding - to say the least. Listen also to J.C. Higginbotham, specially on "Harlem On Saturday Night"! The final session with lonah lones (not related to Reunald) is without any of Lil's pleasant vocals but includes the singing of Midge Williams and one Hilda Rogers. All things considered, very interesting small-group swing, indeed!
