The greatest cabaret star of her New York generation is Andrea Marcovicci. Ever since I had the joy a few years ago introducing Marcovicci in a Coward Cabaret at Carnegie Hall, I have gone back again and again to hear her at the Algonquin: not just a singer but a singing actress, she turns her songs into short stories or one-act plays and sings them with a haunting tenderness, a yearning sense of what might once have been, which once heard is never forgotten.

The dramatic connection is not surprising: she started out as a movie actress. But it is in her singing that Marcovicci seems to find and hit her full range: there's an urgent kind of intimacy, once likened to that of Ingrid Bergman in Casablanca, which sings through the lyrics, turning even the most banal into moments of unforgettable romanticism.

Marcovicci is not a belter: when she takes a show tune it is to turn it into a torch song of heightened sexuality and awareness. Every song is approached as though it were a new role, and as a result every one is given new meaning.

Of all the stars, from Steve Ross to Michael Feinstein, who have come up through Don Smith's management of the Oak Room at the Algonquin in New York, Marcovicci is far and away the most dramatic.
