MEZZ MEZZROW 1944 - 1945

n 1945, during a residency at "Jimmy Ryan's" in New York, Mezz Mezzrow was approached by John van Beuren. The young admirer of the clarinetist brought up the idea of founding a record company that would produce the kind of music Mezzrow loved to play but which was not popular with major labels at the time. Thus, Mezzrow became producer and president fo the tiny "King Jazz" label that issued a small number of fine records!

Mezz Mezzrow's real name was Milton Mesirow. He was born in Chicago on November 9, 1899. In his teens Mezzrow

In his teens Mezzrow took up the saxophone and clarinet, and from 1924 he became closely associated with the "Austin High School Gang", a group of young white musicians from Chicago. Mezzrow had already recorded with several local bands by the time he fronted his own group in 1928. After a few months in New York, he visited Europe for the first time in 1929. While leading his own quartet in Paris, he met Hugues Panassié, who became totally influenced by Mezzrow's ideas and concepts. Back in New York, Mezzrow worked with Red Nichols, Jack Levy and several other groups. He organized his own bands for various recording sessions in the mid-thirties, but did not always work as a fulltime musician. His legendary "Disciples Of Swing" premiered at the Harlem Uproar House, and also played at the Savoy. Together with his friend Hugues Panassié, he organized the famous "Swing" sessions in 1938, helping pave the way for the Revival movement of the coming years. In the early forties, Mezzrow spent a spell in prison. He then worked with his own little bands at various New York clubs, often employing pianist Art Hodes. In 1945, Mezzrow founded a small recordcompany, King Jazz, which released some outstanding 78s in the classic New Orleans tradition. In 1946 with Bernard Wolfe he wrote his autobiography, "Really The Blues", a book spiced with exageration, but nevertheless of considerable documentary value. Mezzrow returned to France with his own band in 1948, and after several further European trips, finally settled in Paris. Throughout the fifties and sixties he played and recorded with many local and visiting musicians. Mezz Mezzrow died in Paris on August 5, 1972.

This third volume of the recordings of Mezz Mezzrow presented in chronological order, opens with a session with Art Hodes and Danny Alvin with whom Mezz occasionally worked at the time. All the other tracks on this CD were made for King Jazz. The majority of these performances was not issued on 78s due to a lack of money. Mezzrow recalled: "We began to record like mad: during the first months of 1945, we made over fifty sides. (...) The music we played together, not a note of it on paper, all of it welling up out of our enthusiasm and our warm feeling." Indeed, much of the resulting music is outstanding. The first session is a real gem: Sidney Bechet and Hot Lips Page were on incredible form that day. Aided by a star-studded rhythm team, the impromptu band turned in several masterpieces, including "Blood On The Moon" with a terrific vocal by Lips Page. The next day Cousin Joe, who later made scores of recordings under his own name, was brought in while Douglas Daniels, formerly with the Spirits of Rhythm, is also heard on one track. The instrumentals from both the August 1945 sessions are dominated by Sidney Bechet's majestically soaring soprano. Mezzrow is incited by Sidney: the clarinetist has never played better than on "Bowin' The Blues" or the catchy "De Luxe Stomp"! Those who criticize Mezzrow for his allegedly faulty playing should listen to this great CD over and over again. To be continued...


