







He remains oblivious to the outside world of evil and perversion which is personified by such characters as: Cousin Kevin, "the mastest playment you could ever meet," a Cypys who promises a cure, and wicked Uncle Ernie, "I'm glad you won't see or hom me is I fliddle about."

Meanwhile, Tommy's internal world grew more inenes as he immersed himself in the only two activities that seemed to give him astisfaction; playing pinball and gazing at his reflection in the mirror. His confliction was disagnesed clinically normal be a doctor who, "outdoor the low," Although Tommy passed all the tests, the doctor knew "all hope hie sutth him had not with

me. Guilt-ridden and obsessed, Tommy's parents try in vain to cure him of the illness they created, but the boy continues to respond only to his image in the mirror, and his frenetic talent of playing pinball, which by now has earned him fame and a large following.

by now has earned him tame and a large following, In a frustrated attempt to communicate with her son, obedience failing, temperance gone, Tommy's mother smashes the mirror. The shattered glass cuts through Tommy's dark and silent world. He is cured. And with the cure comes a new enlightment. He believes himself to be a Meesash. "Toure a trail of rooted popie, memorized by just the sight. The few I touched now are disciples, tove as one. ... I um the light." Word of the pinball wizard's miraculous cure becomes front page news. Tommy becomes an "evangelest," passing on the shadow and the light of his experience. His sermons bring forth the multitudes.

Under the management of Uncle Ernie, Tommy's 'Holiday Camp'' becomes the site for his converts. Tommy provides each with a pinball machine for their own reformation, until finally his followers rebel against his power, and authority. "We aun't goma take you, never dat and never will. We ain't goma take you. We forsake you. Gonna rape you. Let's forcet you, better still."

Once again, Tommy is isolated from the outside world, but this time he is free to be an independent part of it.
