ACE How Long The Real Feeling No Future In Your Eyes You're All That I Need

"How Long" was one of the first songs I wrote and the first on which I sang lead vocals. It was recorded at Rockfield Studios, a converted cattle-shed in Wales, during a two week recording session. It's from the album <u>Five A.Side</u> which also contains "The Real Feeling". The album is basically the band's set recorded on a 16 track. Recording the album was the best time of my life. "How Long" was actually written about a group trying to "poach" Ace's bass player, Tex Comer.

"How Long" proved to be a hard act to follow. "No Future In Your Eyes" is from the second album <u>Time</u> <u>For Another</u> which was written and recorded following the first US tour in 1975.

"You're All That I Need" was produced by Trevor Lawrence. Ace achieved its ambition of recording "the band". It was recorded at the Shangri-La Studios in Zuma Beach in 1976 while living in California.

> SQUEEZE Tempted

I joined Squeeze just prior to their recording of <u>East</u> <u>Side Story</u>. The album was produced by Elvis



Costello. A version of "Tempted" with Glenn (Tilbrook) singing was already in the can. One day, the band started kicking around an RBB version of the song and Elvis said to me, "P.C., this is right up your street!" The version with me singing the lead vocal is the version that eventually went on the album. It was a slight departure for Squeeze who were better known for being a "new wave" punkish band.

I just completed working on the new Squeeze album which is called <u>Some Frantsic Place</u>, I was asked to play keyboards on all the tracks and I sang lead on "Loving You Tonight" which will be a single from the album. I have been touring with Squeeze this year while accommodating Mike + The Mechanics as we commence work on the fourth album.

CARLENE CARTER Do Me Lover Oh How Happy

"Do Me Lover" and "Oh How Happy" were recorded in Nick Lowe's "Ampro" studio in Shepherd's Bush in London. The studio was a converted living room of a normal terraced house. The songs were recorded shortly after leaving Squeeze.

PAUL CARRACK The Rumour

"The Rumour" is from my first solo album, <u>Nightbird</u>. It showed a slightly more "earthy" side of my music and features great drumming from my long-time friend Andy Newmark and a sax solo from my buddy Mel Collins. After these sessions, Andy landed a gig with Roxy Music on my suggestion.

l Need You Always Better With You A Little Unkind

"I Need You" was the first single from the second solo album, <u>Suburban Yoodoo</u>. The album received a four star review in <u>Rolling Stone</u> and was placed on the magazine's Top Twenty Album list of that year. The video cost \$3,000 to make and became a staple on the "new" MTV. Linda Ronstadt and Aaron Newille recently recorded the song on their album <u>Cry Like A Rainstorm - Howl Like The Wind</u>.

"Always Better With You" and "A Little Unkind" were the second singles in the US and UK respectively. <u>Suburban Yoodoo</u>, produced by Nick Lowe, has a very urgent live feel. All the songs were recorded live with a four piece band. Martin Belmort played guitars, Bob Invin on drums, and James Eller on the bass. The band was shared between Nick Lowe and myself - depending on who had an album to promote.

These songs are from the album One Good Reason. This album was a much more polished effort.



contrasting a soulful voice with more hi-tech production. It was recorded at Comfort's Place Studios in Surrey, England. It was produced by Chris Neil who I had previous success with on the <u>Mike +</u> <u>The Mechanics</u> album.

The first US single, "Dont Shed A Tear" remained on <u>Billboard</u>'s Hot 100 for twenty-four weeks. The video for the song was largely the brainchild of English director Peter Care who has gone on to directing videos for Tina Tumer and New Order.

The second single, "One Good Reason" keeps the Squeeze connection. Chris Difford wrote the lyrics from my scrambled guide vocals. "Button Off My Shirt" was written by Craham Lyle and Billy Livsey who have written for Tina Turner. "When You Walk In The Room" was recorded at the suggestion of Chris Nell who loves the sone.

I Live By The Groove Only My Heart Can Tell Battlefield Loveless

I Live By The Groove, from the <u>Groove Approved</u> album, was produced partly in New York Mth T-Bone Wolk. Recording in New York City was something I had always wanted to do. The album was recorded between two tours with Mike + The Mechanics. After the phenomenal success of "The Living Years". I wanted to move away from the "clinical" approach of Chris Neul. I co-wrote "I Live By The Groove" with Eddle Schwartz who wrote "Don't Shed A Tear".



*Only My Heart Can Tell * and * Loveless * were cowritten with T-Bone. Nick Lowe suggested the title for * Loveless *. The original album version does not feature the string arrangement, which was added later by Joe Mardin, Arif s son.

"Battlefield" was originally a very "skiffle" type demo by Nick Lowe. I worked on the music to make it more swing/Motown oriented. Later, Peter Asher asked me and Nick to write a bridge for the version recorded by Diana Ross. Nick and I were happy to oblige.

MIKE + THE MECHANICS

Silent Running (On Dangerous Ground) The Living Years

I met writer B.A. Robertson who suggested I guest on Mike Rutherford's solo album. I went to Rutherford's studio where "Silen Running" was a ready made track waiting for the vocals. I put on the headphones and went to work. After swimming against the tide during the 80's with a very low-tech approach with Nick Lowe, this was evidence that my voice would work in a more modern setting. I felt the project could be very exciting, and as it turned out I was proven right.

After hearing an initial draft version of "The Living Years" track, I always felt I was meant to sing the song. It was written by B.A. and Mike. It related to my own life in that my father passed away when I was eleven. As a young boy I was totally devastated



and to this day I feel that I never fully recovered from the loss. I am amazed at the number of people who stop me on the street and tell me how the song has moved them or actually made them call up a loved one. I think that's wonderful.


