It seems to be taken for granted that every movement for the improve ment of conditions in Redwood City should receive its heartlest support from its business men, and this is proper enough. At the same time the business men are entitled to the support of the people, and this means their patronage as well as their commendation. The man who earns hist money in Redwood City has neither the moral nor the business right to go elsewhere for the supplying of his neds.

### We Need Modern Appliances.

After seemingly interminable delays, for which no one seems to be responsible or blamable, the people of Redwood City are now in a position to realize the promise of a much needed municipal improvement. With the passing of the deeds to the municipal lighting plant, the city is now in legal Possession of the poles of that system. This removes the last obstacle to the speedy installation of the proposed electric fire alarm system.

It is sincerely to be hoped that the Trustees will meet with no further obstructions in this work and that the system will be completed without further delay. Not only will the installation of this system give an added feeling of security to the residents of the city, who must of necessity live in constant fear of fire but it will result in a material and immediate financial benefit. It is well known fact that for some time the fire underwriters have meen wait ing a justification for a material reduction in the burdensome rates of fire insurance, and they have repeat edly announced their readiness to make a readjustment of rates as soon as this improvement is completed.

However, the Trustees should not stop at the completion of this improvement, important as it admitted ly is. Steps should be taken withimprove the fire fighting weapons of out unnecessary delay to further the department, which at this time are seriously lacking. With our splendid water system, there is but little need of fire engines, but ex perience teaches that under ordinary circumstances the modern chemiacal machine is the most effective means

of fighting fires. To secure the most benefit of this character of apparatus it is essent ial that it should arrive at the location where it is to be used promptly. The most effective way of providing this would seem to be a combination chemical and hose wag on, to be drawn by horses kept by the city for that purpose and ready for instant use. To provide this would, would not be material to the tax payer, for the simple reason that the tax payer is also the fire insurance rate payer, and the slight increase in tax would be more than offset by the reduced insurance rate.




