

From Pat Bailey's notebook:

NOTE: This undertaking has been somewhat like constructing a crossword puzzle covering over 140 years of local names, without a central source of materials for reference....

.... over a community attendance area that touched three counties - Alamance, Orange and Chatham - in a time frame when counties were not mandated to keep vital statistics (birth/death data) as public records until 1913!

Extensive and exhaustive efforts have gone into compiling this comprehensive survey of Bethel United Methodist Church Cemetery. Bethel is recognized as a "Preaching Point" for Methodist circuit riders since 1819. Early services were held in local homes, the Bobbit House/school; organized as Methodist Protestant Church in 1836; and first church structure built in 1841.

Available data shows the first recorded burial as that of little Benjamin Pleasant Holt, almost three years old when he died on February 20, 1847. He was a son of the Rev. John R. and Catherine (Trollinger) Holt. He possibly was a visiting or circuit pastor.

Many depressed graves in the area of the 1844-1847 Holt marker show that, even though unmarked, there were several others in the Bethel community whose presence and identity has faded with time.

This central area of the "Old Section" was also mid-way of what was once the original cemetery enclosed by a fence. Tradition tells us that the "first burial outside the fence", on the west side, was that of Mrs. Maude (Foust) Thompson, 1899-1924 (now Row 7, #17).

Little is known of the record keeping of those early years. However, it would be impossible today to have any resemblance of a full cemetery survey without the dedicated efforts of the late Miss Marcia Foust (sister of Mrs. Maude Foust Thompson) who served as Secretary of Bethel Memorial Assoc. for over 40 years. She retrieved as best she could what early records that survived the early years, preserved, enlarged and shared this information through her care and concern for church and community.

This first limited edition of "BACK TO BETHEL", an inventory of Bethel United Methodist Church Cemetery, is a beginning point on which to build as the Bethel Memorial Association celebrates its 60th anniversary, 1927-1987.

It combines the earliest surviving data, the "Marcia Foust records", the research work of Mrs. Ella Mae (Workman) Perl, the continuance of cemetery records by Cemetery Registrars, the late Harvey C. Foust, and Gray McPherson; personal cemetery data logged by the family of Cemetery Chairman Raymond Braxton, and research by Church Historian Pat Bailey.

There actually has been a "beating of the bushes" as missing identities were sought in abandoned, overgrown private cemeteries in the area.

Many thanks to those families who have shared their "Bible writings" of personal information, school records, old letters, journals and estate papers. This has been supplemented with business, census, court records, and early newspapers, as time permitted. Appreciation also for research assistance from Miss Wilma Griffin, Mrs. Louise Thompson and Miss Kim Coggins.

As with all human endeavors, there is room for errors and corrections. Where corrections are needed, notify church or cemetery officers.

#### McPHERSONS

of "Old Orange" and southern Alamance County, North Carolina

DANIEL McPHERSON, born ca. 1682, near Inverness, Scotland, was kidnapped, age 14, while tending sheep on his father's farm. Held shipboard captive, he was brought to America and sold as an indentured servant in the area of New Castle, Delaware. After earning his freedom, on Oct. 10, 1706 bought land in Kennett Square, Chester Co., Pa.; married 1712 Ruth Shires (of Great Britain). Daniel McPherson's Will, probated 1755 in Lancaster County, Pennsylvania, shows six children:

- a. Ann McPherson, 1714-1795, married 1733 in Delaware to Nathaniel Carter; migrated south to Orange Co, N.C., settled and raised a family.
- b. John McPherson, born 11-6-1718, married Mary Green.
- c. Daniel McPherson, born ca. 1722, married Mary Richardson
- d. William McPherson, born ca. 1726, married 1. Margaret Trego, settled Cross Creek (now Fayetteville); to Old Orange/south Alamance/ Chatham Co.; first land grant to "McFerson" was in Webb Lindley section; His second wife was Phoebe Passmore.
  - e. Stephen McPherson, born ca. 1728, married Mary Carter
  - f. Otniel McPherson, ca. 1732-1745, "killed by lightning."

#### From Pat Bailey's notebook: MEET MAE McPHERSON

Mae McPherson, whose first paying job was \$1.00 a month to clean Bethel Church, is leaving it a legacy that will last forever.

In sponsoring publication of "BACK TO BETHEL", Mae McPherson is making available for others a 140 year summary of burials in the Bethel Church cemetery. The compilation of names and dates and ancestors will give a basic foundation on which to build records as the community increases.

Mae, oldest of the ten children of Robert Lee and Ada Mirretta "Etta" (Cheek) McPherson, says she still remembers a lot about rocking cradles and carrying babies. Her youngest brother and sister were born after the family moved from the country. "Where things were about the same," she said, "except we didn't have to haul water from the spring."

"We children did anything and everything to help Mama with the housework and Papa with the farming," said Mae. "It was hard times back then. Our parents worked very hard to keep us fed and clothed."

Home for the Robert Lee and Etta (Cheek) McPherson family was the big house south of the soapstone mine. In later years it was known as the Ross Woods' place.

Even though the family was large, at meal time the table was big enough for everyone to be seated at the same time. There was a bench on one side of the table and chairs on the other.

"Every Saturday Mama would do extra cleaning and cooking. We all helped. The lamps would be filled with enough oil to last for a week, and the lamp globes soap-and-water washed. There's no telling how many scrub brooms we wore out scrubbing the wood floors of the old house. We didn't have floor coverings like rugs or linoleum."

Highlight memories of childhood were swimming in Cane Creek and visiting grandparents. Grandparents Jim and Nancy McPherson lived down the hill on the Bethel Church - South Fork Road near the Cane Creek swimming hole. "...and Grandma Nancy always had cookies or gave us a slice of cake when we came by."

"And especially nice were those Saturday afternoons when Papa would put straw in the farm wagon and Mama would cover it with a quilt. We children would ride back there to go to Grandpa and Grandma (Merriman Luther and Victoria Rich) Cheek's home up on the (Cane) mountain. They always had two extra beds made up in the extra bedroom. Grandpa Cheek was one of the best Grandpas that ever lived, and Grandma 'Vic' was about the best cook anywhere around."

Still one of Mae's cherished possessions is the split-oak hand woven lunch basket that great-grandfather Henry Rich made for her when she started to school at Bethel. She carried her lunch in it for the seven years that she walked to Bethel School.

It was when she was in the upper classes at the two-room school that Mae got her first paying job...\$1.00 a month for cleaning Bethel Church. It was a big church to the little girl. Sometimes she would pay a classmate part of her wages to go with her at school lunchtime to help do the sweeping. She recalls that there was no carpet and the wooden floor grew a lot of dust.

"Christmas at Bethel Church was a big occasion for everybody. The little children were expected to say speeches. And the prettiest Christmas tree of all times," she said, "was the year they put up a big holly near the choir corner."

#### Barefoot in the choir

Mae McPherson, even now, squiggles embarrassingly on remembering the time she sang barefoot in the choir for a funeral. She had walked barefoot to the church for a meeting of the Busy Bee Club, an organization for the young folks. "The people were already coming in for a funeral and there was no choir," said Mae. "They pushed us little girls up there to do the choir singing."

When she was in the seventh grade at Bethel her parents moved closer to town, now the site of an Industrial Park on Anthony Road. But back then it was a "way out farm" where lived a great Uncle and Aunt, Heenan and Callie Rich Hawks. Her father took over the farming and was helped by the children until they were old enough to work in the mills.

Mae had another year of education by walking to the school house behind Shiloh Church. Later, school busses made it possible for her younger brothers and sisters to attend E. M. Holt School. A sister, Naomi, was the "First Girl School Bus Driver in North Carolina," according to a newspaper account.

Mae worked in the mills, folding half-hose and "boarding". During World War II she worked in Washington, D.C., in Flight Training Research. Home ties pulled her back to North Carolina, where, after years as a waitress, she is now retired.

About Bethel School: "Mrs. Inez Foust was my first school teacher. She was a neighbor. Everyone loved her. She was a grand lady."

About Bethel Church: "It was where I first went to church and Sunday School. Being the eldest, I went there longer than any of my brothers and sisters. I still keep my membership there. I wanted to do something nice for Bethel."

"My parents and grandparents are there, as are other relatives. Coming back to Bethel for Homecoming is a big Sunday for all of us. I wanted to do something as a Memorial for my family," said Mae McPherson. "I love Bethel."



#### "UNCLE DEWEY" THOMPSON TELLS IT LIKE IT WAS

What he didn't tell was how he got the nickname of "Jake."

When he came back to Bethel for a visit with the home folks, what he did tell were text book tales of custom and community.

The daring-do son of Flora and Alson Gray Thompson was named "Dewey" about ninety years ago. but it was in his growing-up years that as the legendary "Jake" he is still recalled as, "Oh...he was the one that...."

Among the "that" stories is the one about the time he dropped a bullet in the school house stove at Bethel. In the resulting explosion, fortunately no one was injured.

He knew who was raised on moonshine and cornbread; and which farmer would raise the most commotion on finding his field of watermelon stacked!


And about some of the old-timers "up on the (Cane) mountain": "Some of those old mountaineers back then...some of them lived to be so old that they didn't know how old they were. They just lived til...all of a suddenly...they got tired of living and then they laid down and died."

And about the time he hitched three mules with an evener to a walking plow, steel-beamed with an eight-inch lay. It deep-tilled down to the hard pan clay. Dewey said he still remembers walking down the furrow up to his knees. A neighbor complained to his father, "that boy isn't plowing, he's ditching!"

Heeding the call to "go West young man," and dismissing the nickname of "Jake" as he passed Chicago, he followed the harvest season to North Dakota territory. It was "Dewey Thompson" that found the North Dakota farm land challenging, and a pretty young lady named "Alice" more interesting than bachelorhood.

Raising a family, cultivating more acreage and riding herd on more livestock than most folks can comprehend, has seasoned the enterprising student from the old Bethel School House.

On a recent visit to Bethel and Cedar Cliff, Uncle Dewey shared fragments of information about the home communities and their turn-of-the-century ways.



Cemeteries and Camp meetings:

"The Bethel cemetery was inside a fence of woven wire. I's sure there were two gates, a small one to walk through and a large drive-in gate. The road went between the church and the cemetery, and if you were a youngster it was quite a ways down there.

"During those week revival meeting, they had camps set up all around there where the graveyard is now. Some of the folks would stay here for the week and some would have to go home and do chores.

"I can hear some of them old Mamas now. They called them the 'Shouting Methodists.' They'd get happy and shout...."

"We used to go to the Bethel Camp Meetings. We used to go and stay part of the time. Some of the families stayed all week. I remember staying there. But the older kids later, you know, kinda broke up (and went elsewhere).

"When the meetings were close enough to drive, our folks would go out for the day. They would get up and do their work. And they would go out and stay through the afternoon service that got out around 3 or 4 o'clock and still have time to get back home before dark.

"The meetings faded. Don't know whatever became of the 'Camp', they called it. Not everybody went. The ones that lived far off couldn't afford it. The Camp was just a place they could sleep. And if it rained, you and your stuff was under a roof.

"It was a portable type camp they put up for the revival meetings. I don't ever remember seeing a canvas tent. They (the shelters) was all made out of wood, in sections. Some of the families would haul them out and set them up. And some of the old families built 'tents' that were there for a long time. After a while they rotted down, and after they went the meetings, like everything else, kind of faded.

"They got too wise, or wealthy, or something...to support them."

"Later on the families went to church in wagons. They didn't have buggies and carriages at first. Bethel was quite a way to travel. It was quite a chore to take a wagon. them old lumber wagons had high wheels. But you could put some planks around the side and some straw on the wagon floor and it was a good place to sit and ride. Or you could take some straight back chairs, or use wagon boxes that were not too wide, and set 'em two-by-two, side-by-side. But if the team started up a little quickly, you or the chairs would go over the side.

"Dad would climb aboard the wagon, give a snap to the lines and say 'Children, hang on!' Then he would call out to the horses by name, and we would start out."

"I can remember when Dad bought that big surry. The last one was a surry. The other one was a hack. Well, it had side curtains. You could roll 'em up, and hook 'em. It was real fancy....like out of this world.

"When folks got the buggies, that done away with the Camp Meetings. Why..... you could take the family and trot your horses right along. In the big old lumber wagons it took forever to get there, over the dirt and muddy roads."

Funeral service.....

"The pall bearers would take them out of the hearse like they do now, and carry them into the church. I can remember a long time ago when they had stools to set the casket on. Now they've got these things on rollers. Don't know what you call 'em. They roll them out to the front door and put the casket on it and roll 'em down the aisle. We used to have to go out and get 'em and place 'em."

"The hearses? They were about like those car ambulances, only they had kerosene lamps on each side. The hearses were all black, you know, and had curtains hanging in them. Before that they had horse-drawn hearses...."

"Those car-ambulance-hearses had glass windows...that could be rolled up and down. Then....they had tinted glass you could see through but couldn't tell what color the casket was."

#### "Laying Out" and "Setting Up".

"It was customary to set up when somebody died. When you laid a corpse, somebody from 'round the neighborhood would come and set up all night. Sometimes they'd take turns. But somebody sat with them all the time until that person was buried.

"Way back, they would lay them (the deceased) out on their beds if it was convenient. And there was the time they would take a room of the house and clear everything out of it except the 'setting up' chairs. And they would put the body in the casket and set the casket on two chairs. Sometimes...they would keep them maybe a couple of days in the casket, or a day on the bed.

"When somebody died you'd buy a garment. Or if they had nice clothes like they do now, they'd dress them and lay them out.

"In the meantime (between the death and the funeral), if any of the neighborhood wanted to come and pass through and view them they could."


#### FUNERAL TALK.....



"They always 'got you' at funerals. If you were an old person or a young person, they would always get your life history. If you were a farmer or a mechanic or a housewife or whatever, they would ask your family and get a full run down of what you (the deceased) had done.

"And of course most everybody made it good...they naturally would. They would say it, and then they'd tell it...you know, read it off....'he's got so many brothers and so many sisters...and he was born in Alamance or Orange or Chatham, or wherever he was born....'

"They are getting away from that history of people stuff. You very seldom hear them say it now. It's more like, '\_\_\_\_\_ is being buried here...and he should have been buried because....'




BETHEL CEMETERY WAS ONCE ENCLOSED BY A FENCE

In the background can be seen the wire fence that surrounded Bethel cemetery until the late 1920s. Possibly there was an earlier fence, of logs or split rails, that enclosed the original cemetery which dates to the 1840s.

This photograph taken by Mrs. Mamie McBane McPherson shows the flower sprays on the July 22, 1927 grave of Mrs. Sarah Margaret Terry McPherson, the mother of her husband, Lonnie McPherson.

To the right of center is the "picture" tombstone for Mrs. Maude Forest (Foust) Thompson, sister of Marcia Foust and daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Albert L. "Buddy" Foust. Maude, the first wife of Alfred T. Thompson, died January 16, 1924. Hers is said to be the "first grave outside the fence."

#### BETHEL COMMUNITY COULD HAVE BEEN CALLED "SCHNATTERLY"

The Mary Schnatterly, born 1763 in <u>Bethel</u> Township of Lancaster County, Pennsylvania, who married Peter Foust, of same area, came to North Carolina and named their Foust homestead (now on the Snow Camp Road) "<u>Bethel</u>...because of the likeness to their Bethel Township in Pennsylvania."

The name "Schnatterly" (Pa.) transitioned to "Snotherly" (N.C.) when her parents, George Phillip Schnatterly, and wife, Elizabeth Turley, sold their farm adjacent to the Eisenhowers (President Dwight D.'s family) and migrated south to "Old Orange" County, N.C.

George Phillip Schnatterly's Will, dated January 1793, Lancaster, Pa., was probated in November 1793 in Orange County, N.C. He and his wife are buried at Stoner's Cemetery (between Southern Alamance High School and Belmont Village). Phillip was one of the first Deacons at Stoner's Church, which no longer exists.

Of their nine children, this information is shared by Mrs. Alba Lee Scott of Knoxville, Tenn., who inquired of south Alamance's Bethel about her kinfolk.

Elisabetha Schnatterly married Daniel Foust (Guilford Co.); Mary (mentioned above) married Peter Foust (early to south Alamance); and John married Elizabeth Gibbs (kin of Stockards and Eflands) and moved 1790s to Tennessee where their home is on the National Register at Knoxville.

Peter Jacob Snotherly (note name change) married Mary Loy (Randolph Co. NC); Susannah married William Osborne (to Ohio); Rachel married William Stout (Davidson Co.); Henry married Mary Thomas (to Tenn. in 1815); and Sarah Snotherly (no further records).

Catherine "Dutch Katie" Snotherly married 1802 Orange Co., N.C. Josiah "Uncle Si" Thompson of the "English Tommy" Thomas Thompson (sometimes called the "Saxapahaw Thompsons").

HERRON - HERRING family on Cane Mountain started from a "doorstep baby."

Family tradition tells that the baby boy left on the doorstep of John Foust, Sr., and his wife, Susannah Hornaday, around 1825, was taken in and raised as one of their own.

The infant was named "Herron...after the white bird that sometimes flew over their home on the eastern slopes of Cane Mountain."

Henderson "Hense" Herron's descendants carried the name "Herron" until grandson James Thomas "Tom" Herron entered military service in World War I.

An army clerk held firm that the "right way to spell the name was 'Herring' after the fish by that name."

Proper spelling wasn't a big thing on Cane Mountain. The new inductee wasn't about to start off his military hitch by arguing with the educated U.S. Army.

Farmer Tom Herron (Pvt., #1323076) survived the front line fox holes in France to return to his wife (Rachel Kimball) and baby (Clyde Thomas) with the new name of "HERRING".

Although several times decorated for bravery under fire, the returned war hero thought it easier to accept the new name than to fight the mountain of paper work to change it.

Thus began the variance of Herron - Herring spelling on Cane Mountain.


## LONG MAY IT WAVE

From the "Flander's Field" of World War II, there has been returned to Bethel one of its young men who was cut down by enemy fire on Omaha Beach following the Normandy beachhead invasion of France.

Pvt. Raymond Victor McPherson, 330th Infantry, 83rd Infantry Division, U.S. Army was killed on July 4th, 1944. Four years and four days later his body was escorted "back to Bethel" and given a military funeral.

From that day forward, an American flag has always flown over his grave in Bethel Row 10, # 7.

Raymond's sister, Mae McPherson, has made possible the publication of this Memorial Edition of Bethel's cemetery history. Their parents are Robert Lee and Etta Cheek McPherson (Bethel Row 10, # 4 5).

## MYSTERY SCRUBBINGS REVEAL HIDDEN MESSAGES

"BACK TO BETHEL" was delayed in publication by an unexpected event that would appear to be fiction....but is indeed fact!

Several tombstones in the older section of Bethel cemetery were found to have hidden messages after a "mystery scrubber" gave them a thorough cleaning.

The person, or persons, who did the cleaning is unknown.

Almost daily in the two preceeding weeks, while workers were on the church grounds doing maintenance, carpentry and other chores, no one was reported seen in the vicinity of the scrubbed tombstones.

With the removal of decades of discoloration, there were found inscriptions not known to be present. The build-up of moss or fungi had, in some instances, almost completely obliterated the small lettering.

The new found wording ranged from a marriage date, to logos, to poetry.

On one marker, four lines of inscription were found on the reverse side of the tombstone at just above ground level.

Perhaps the mystery scrubber had knowledge of these messages.


"I remember listening to my two grandfathers talk about the Civil War," he said. "The biggest holler Dad could remember his Dad hollering about was when the Yankees left and the war was over. On their way back home they came through here and stole horses...or anything that was out in the open. They'd take a wagon, or anything they wanted. They'd take it as they was a'going by."

"I know Dad talked about his Dad, as to how they went out in the woods, way down away from the buildings;...they cut trees and made a log pen, put their horses inside and quarded it day and night. That's how they saved their horses."

# ASTRONAUT THOMAS STAFFORD HAS MANY CLOSE TIES TO BETHEL

Astronaut Thomas Patton Stafford has so many close kinship ties to Bethel that it could almost be called his "home church" in North Carolina.

His paternal grandparents are buried here; their descendants too numerous to mention. His grandfather, George Stafford IV's first wife, Catherine E. McCauley, and two of their children are buried in this row. After Catherine's death, George married second, Mariah "Polly" Thompson of the Salem Methodist Church community where they moved their membership and are buried. Polly's brother, Sabert W. Thompson, is buried at Bethel (see story, page 61, Row 17 #35). Their parents were "Big John" and "Betsy" (Wood) Thompson. "Big John" was a son of Thomas Thompson, whose father was the early settler "English Tommy" Thomas Thompson.

Grandparents George and Polly (Thompson) Stafford's daughter, Emily, married Rev. William Pike, whose son, Will Pike, is buried here at Bethel in Row 13.

George and Polly's son, Sabert Stafford, moved to Oklahoma where he married Mary Patton, of the Patton-Foust ancestors of early Alamance County. Sabert and Mary's son, Thomas Patton Stafford was one of the chosen few to be named pioneers of outer space.





Unmarked graves at Bethel.....

Bethel has an old cemetery. It was around the 1840s when statistics show the transition from burial in private, family cemeteries to a centralized church maintained cemetery. Friends Meetings in the area had their burial grounds, however there were a number of families in south Alamance who were not of the Quaker faith.

Or, as it has been said, "Professing Quakers but practicing Methodists."

A good number of Bethel graves were once marked with field stones. At some point in time, when the "scratched on" names had weathered away, the field stones were removed. At some of these once-marked graves, a small square of cement was poured and given a number to mark the place.

In the time lapse of over 140 years, there are noticeable instances of sunken soil in the rectangular shape of other unmarked graves.

Several rows in Bethel cemetery have off-sets; which may be explained by this recollection of Dewey Thompson:

"In those earlier years at Bethel, they had so much trouble when they'd dig a grave (that it was confusing). They'd dig into where somebody had already been buried. They didn't have a marker....and all that.

"They just took the cemetery and leveled it, lined it up and started all over again as best they could."

"A lot of people are buried out here at Bethel that nobody knows. Just graves, but no markers. Nobody now knows who they were."

BETHEL'S MYSTERY GRAVE: "WHO WAS JOHN RICE?"

(Row 24, #38)

.... His life took him from prince to pauper.

Mystery, or an element of the unknown, has long surrounded the unpretentious grave in the extreme southeast corner of Bethel cemetery.

All that was known about this grave was that it carried the name "John Rice."

All that was known about the man was that he had a wife named "Anna".

As this cemetery survey progressed, the story that unfolded is unusual. RECOLLECTION: as told by Lister Wood from his grandmother Dinah Herren Allen.

Around the turn of the century, community custom was strict regarding burial inside Bethel's fenced cemetery. Whether or not there are black burials remains in legend. Handed down accounts speak positive, although carried over records have not shown the "who" or the "where."

Within sight of Bethel Church was a private cemetery for slaves. Once marked by a pear tree on the hilltop rise, the area is now cleared pasture continuously swept by winds from across Cane Mountain.

Be that as it may, John Rice did not come under the "pear tree rule."

John Rice lived in the community as a loner. At his death there was less than full approval of his burial with residency status inside the cemetery fence.

"Dunc" (Duncan) Cooper is the one who had the final say: "He isn't black. He is white. He is one of us. Let him be buried here, but outside the fence."

"John Rice was born in Germany. His father worked in the orchards for the King (name unknown). Young John often played with one of the King's sons of the same age. When John was 16, he and his royal playmate were scuffling in a release of boyish energy. John told that he was swinging, around in circle, his companion, who fell, hitting his head on a rock.

"Whether or not it was fatal (John assumed that it was), he ran away. John said that "either way, I knew | I would be hung on the spot.'"

John ran. He ran frightened, and far. He never returned to his home. He never again saw his parents. He made his way to the waterfront to look for a boat that would take him further away. He hired on a ship readying to leave for America.

At age 16, the young John Rice left his homeland as a "Wanted Person."

"John told that he worked for two years, until he could get his citizenship papers, and then started drifting. The route or directions of his travels are not known, other than when he arrived here (southern Alamance County) he was married. His wife, Anna, was reportedly half-Indian.

"Their final years were in a crude shanty on the old Henry Stout place. John died on a floor pallet. There was no bed in the house.

"Some men of the community prepared him for burial. They asked his wife if she wanted to look at him.."...to see him laid out?"

"Her reply was, 'He didn't look after me while he was alive, and I won't do it for him after he is dead.'

Editor's note: There is no further reference of Mrs. Anna Rice after her statement that she was going to live in the County Home. The Bethel Memorial Association has placed a marker for John Rice. The next time you are in his corner, share a flower.

Loneliness could be a cry for understanding.



- NOTE: Visually...an overview map of the Northeast Section is self-explaining, showing burials and plot reservations; but by relative listing....confusing!
- NOTE: Actually....some graves on the North end of Row 16, #1&2, are inside the ancient plotting of the Northeast Section. However, for the expediency of concluding Phase I of this cemetery survey, those NE graves referred to are being shown here as an extension of row in listings of the Old Section.

In the War Between the States, the action of Confederate George W. Barbee of Bethel community was singled out as "of particular interest" when State Archivists wrote a history of Company G, 44th Infantry Regiment, N.C. State Troops:

"Sgt. George W. Barbee...enlisted at 'Clover Orchard' (NC) at age 21, on March 31, 1862. Mustered in as a Private. Promoted to Corporal in June 1863. Promoted to Sergeant in October 1864. Captured at the Appomattox River, Va., April 3, 1865. Confined at Point Lookout, Md., until released June 23, 1865.

"He carried the regimental flag until the night of April 1, 1865, when he wrapped a stone in it and dropped it in the Appomattox River, saying that 'No enemy can ever have a flag of the Forty-fourth North Carolina Regiment."

In questioning the reluctance of Bethel community families to talk of the Civil War period, Madge Braxton recalled the quote of "Aunt Ellen" - Mrs. Ellen Braxton (Daniel Bivins) (David) Thompson (Bethel Row 12, #28), sister of Oscar C. Braxton.

"The older people wouldn't talk about it much," she said. "They called it the time of the troubles."

\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*

Company G of the 44th Infantry Regiment had a generous number of south Alamance County men within its ranks. In a general summary, those that were not captured, died!

Richard Godfrey enlisted 2-1-1862; died four weeks later at Raleigh of typhoid fever. John Pugh enlisted 3-12-1862 and died six weeks later at Raleigh. Henry Foust, James Holmes, Green Nicholson and William Thompson enlisted together, 3-1-1862.

Captured together near Petersburg, Va., were Jacob Foust, Seymour P. Holt, Green Nicholson and Henry O'Daniel. Surviving the violent and hand-to-hand combat in defending the South Anna Bridge, Va., and taken prisoner were: George and Henry Foust, James Holmes, James Moore, Henry O'Daniel, Laban Payne and Allen Roberson. Confined at Fort Monroe, Va., all returned to duty except the two who died "at home", six months later ....six weeks and two miles apart. James Holmes (brother of Rev. George W.) died 1-31-1864. James Moore (son of Green, and sister of Mrs. Cornelia (Arlendo) Foust) died 3-14-1864...the same day as home neighbor and ill Company G infantryman, William Thompson. (See item, page 53) Will's brother, George, signing up to serve out his hitch, is shown in three different units of the 44th: Companies B, F & G.

Sabert Thompson and Green Nicholson were captured together at Bristoe Station. Handy Payne was captured at Sutherland's Station; Laban Payne at Hatcher's Run. George Thompson and Allen Roberson were captured at Burgess Mill. Nathaniel Roberson was on a special assignment near Petersburg, Va., when captured.

From this one Company G, held prisoner at the same time at Point Lookout, Md., were: Daniel Foust, George Barbee, Laban Payne, Allen Roberson, Nathaniel Roberson, and George and Sabert Thompson.

BY GEORGE, THEY DID IT! George Barbee and George Foust enlisted together at Clover Orchard, 3-31-1862. Barbee (see story above) drowned the regimental flag. George Foust, of Company G, was one of the eighty-two men of the 44th Regiment who was present for the surrender at Appomattox Court House on April 9, 1865.

## IN BETHEL METHODIST CHURCH CEMETERY

His identity remains unknown. His grave remains unmarked.

Three generations later the story still holds firm. D. L. Foust, Jr., great-grandson of Peter Foust (in whose home the soldier died) shares this family story:

"He (the Union soldier) was wounded when he came here. His horse brought him in. The family doctored on him. He died with a fever a few days later. I've been told that he was buried about the middle of Bethel cemetery. They took care with the grave so that it wouldn't be noticed as being different. The secrecy was in fear of retaliation from militia in the area."

Fact:

This happened in the closing days of the Civil War, probably in the Spring of 1865. After the soldier died his weapons remained in the community.

Legend:

"When the wounded soldier's horse brought him to the farm house he was carrying a long rifle, a bayonet, and a sword...."

Confirmation: When his horse brought him to the farm house there was hanging by a strap from the saddle horn an Austrian imported mini-musket. The 56 cal. cap lock musket carries a wooden stock on which is scratched the initials "W.E.C." This is not proof positive of the person's identity for likely the gun had been liberated from some southern battlefield.

The four-sided bayonet that was sticking out of his blanket roll still easily attaches with a twist-clip at the end of the musket barrel.

The standard issue U.S. Calvary saber is for a right-handed person.



Notes from Pat Bailey's scrapbook:....talking with "Uncle Dewey" Thompson

CEDAR CLIFF CHURCH GETS THE GO AHEAD.....

"I don't know who should get the credit for starting Cedar Cliff (Methodist Church), but when Dad (Alson Gray Thompson) and Uncle Buddy (Rev. Horatio Seymour Blair Thompson) and Uncle George (Thompson) and some of the Paynes had their membership at Bethel....Cedar Cliff, you might say, was going under.

"They had such few members over there. They got in a pretty nice minister over there, and he started asking 'Why don't you people move your membership? It's closer...and your attendance would build up Cedar Cliff.'"

"It made sense all right. And it was closer. So Dad said to \_\_\_\_\_, I'm in favor of it.

"Uncle Buddy was a preacher too. He thought that would be fine. Well....they got together and had a meeting at Cedar Cliff. They notified all the members around that belonged to Bethel to come to the meeting. Everyone was invited to have their say.

"Some of the Paynes that was members thought the membership shift would be fine and dandy. Dad and Uncle Buddy and Uncle George and the Paynes and different ones, they decided to go along with it. They were the ones that explained it to Bethel.

"Of course it hurt Bethel, taking that many members out. but you could see the advantage. It was closer to Cedar Cliff, and it would be helping them out.


"And the next thing they came up with was they were going to move all their Bethel graves to Cedar Cliff. But that never did materialize.

"I know what Dad said. He said it was all in your mind as to how and where you attended church. And he didn't think it made any difference where you're buried or how you were buried.

"A lot of people around the neighborhood that are members of Cedar Cliff have some family buried at Bethel."

"Dad talked a long time that we was going to move all our relations buried at Bethel over to Cedar Cliff. Then he got to thinking. All you could do was just take some of the dirt, or something, you know. But the body would still be here. They kinda gave up on the grave moving. At one time they were going to move all the Thompsons together....."

# FIRST BURIAL AT CEDAR CLIFF WAS BEFORE THERE WAS A CEMETERY

"Aunt Katie Payne was the first grave that was here, according to "Uncle Dewey" Thompson on a recent visit from Cogswell, North Dakota.

"'Cedar Cliff didn't have a cemetery. There was only one acre in the church lot. It was winter, and everything was kinda snowed in.

"This was close after the membership shift from Bethel. Uncle Buddy (Rev. H.S.B. Thompson) was the preacher. A half-way preacher, you know. Preached some. Farmed some. He went all over like preachers do. They would preach at two or three churches and then they would move them. And they'd preach a season or two and then get moved again. He finally got tired of that, and he moved back here to take care of his Dad, Grandpa Sabert Thompson.

"Well, it was Uncle Buddy that was the cause of us moving back here. And a lot of others, I don't remember their names, got in behind Cedar Cliff to get their church going.

"Well, then came winter, and Aunt Katy died. Folks were asking where are we going to bury her? There was no cemetery, and no land. Doc Rumbley owned right up to here.

"Uncle Labe (Laban) Payne and Aunt Katie, they wasn't ours but they were old and everybody called them Uncle and Aunt.

"I know what Uncle Labe said. 'By God, you know I'm going to have Mother buried here even if I have to bury her on church ground. And he did.

"It was winter time and it may not have been over a couple of days to work it out. But they found Doc Rumbley, and Doc said, 'Hot dang...that was his word...Hot dang. You tell Uncle Labe to bury his wife wherever he wants to around there. I'll give him the land.'"

"When Aunt Katy died, that was the start of Cedar Cliff cemetery."

# Country Folks

It was a cold February day in 1922. A biting wind blew down Bass' Mountain and spread its icy fingers around the procession that made its way along the dirt road towards Bethel Methodist Protestant Church.

The horse drawn hearse bore the remains of Henry M. Rich, who had died the day before at the home of his sister, Mrs. M.L. Cheek.

Ernest Thompson held the reins of the sleek horses. Beside him sat young Alvis Rich, already a funeral director, but not serving in that capacity on that particular day. Alvis was a mourner at the funeral, for Henry M. Rich was his grandfather.

Alvis M. Rich, semor member of the firm of Rich and Thompson, is still an active mortician. The eighty-year-old Mr. Rich talked willingly and interestingly to me one day last week, but I realized that I was talking to a busy man who had only limited time to reminisce when four bodies lay in his establishment.

Mr. Rich was licensed in his chosen profession in 1922, the same year he rode the chilly road from Bass' Mountain to Bethel.

Incidentally, Alvis Rich recalls that on that day he got out of the unheated vehicle to walk a while in an effort to get warm. Some vicious looking dogs came charging out of the woods, whereupon the young undertaker got warm in a hurry as he raced to the safety of the hearse.

By 1922 Rich and Thompson had a motor hearse, but the condition of some roads made it necessary to take the team-drawn vehicle to an occasional country funeral.

The horse-drawn hearses were works of art, with drapes and Grecian columns carved into the wooden sides. The sedate carriers represented weeks of work by craftsmen. On either side of the stately hearses were lamps made of German silver, beautifully designed and executed. Such vehicles were much more expensive than the Packard hearse that the local funeral home owned by the early twenties.

Alvis Rich's father, William A. Rich, was licensed as a funeral director in 1902. Ernest Thompson joined him in 1916 and the firm assumed the name it carries today.

William Joseph Rich, son of Alvis and his wife, the late Mitylene Isley Rich, carries on the family tradition. Joe is a licensed funeral director and embalmer and a member of the business his grandfather founded.

Alvis and Mitylene's other children are Dr. Allen Rich, an eye surgeon in Florida, and daughter Allene, a medical technician at Grady Hospital in Atlanta.

The veteran director remembers home funerais and longer church services than those common today. Funerals are no longer held in homes; church rites are generally briefer than they used to be; graveside services are becoming more common.

Mr. Rich recalls that with the establishment of Trollinger's Florist in 1921, hot house flowers and professional arrangements began to appear at local buriais. Before that time, home grown, seasonal flowers were used.

Mr. Rich observed that requests for cremation are still infrequent in this area.

I mentioned that my grandfather, the late Harrison Guthrie, along with my father and my uncles, Jim and Mallie, built coffin cases which they hauled by wagon to funeral parlors in Graham and Burlington. Alvis Rich remembered that and mentioned another source of funeral supplies in South Alamance. The late Anderson McBane kept a store of coffins at his shop in the Chatham Church Community.

Regardless of one's church affiliation or the lack of it, funerals in this section are religious in nature. Bereaved families turn to, or in some cases, back to the church to bury their dead.

They also turn to funeral directors whom they trust. Alamance County is blessed with such individuals. Our people are served by superior funeral establishments offering efficient and understanding services.




