Right on the heels of a statement by the acting minister of war that Pancho Villa is going to be taken "dead or alive, if it takes the last dollar in the treasury and the last living soldier in the Mexican army," comes the story that the bandit chief has been offered a position as head of the rurales, but has refused it.

What are we to believe in the face of such contradictions?

Notwithstanding our suspicion of the method by which the new regime came into power, notwithstanding our abhorrence of the method by which Carranza was put out of the way, we would like to wish the present administration of Mexico well. We would like to have faith in the fine promises to restore law and order, rehabilitate the country's finances, do away with militarism, and, Burton-Chandler above all, to accord just treatment to Americans.

But with "war to the death" declared against banditry one day, and the most notorious bandit offered an important government lot. position the next, we can hardly be blamed if we accept the fine promises with reserve. Deeds, in the case of Mexico, are necessary to restore our faith.

PLEDGE OF LOYALTY

To ask citizens, as the American Flag Day Association proposed, to take a pledge of loyalty to the United States as a part of Loyalty Week observance, may be deemed by some an insult, as implying doubt of their patriotism. That is a narrow view to take of it. It was noticeable that during the war persons who were the loudest vard, near Pacific. in denouncing (on the ground that it was affront to question their loyalty) the request that they renew their promise of fidelity were among those whom there was reason to suspect. The patriot was glad to proclaim his allegiance publicly.

The giving of the pledge should be regarded in the same way as the display of the flag or the singing of the national anthem on a patriotic occasion.
