The population of Glendale, as given by the 1921 city directory just completed by The Evening News, is 15,626.

In Glendale there are 7,241 males and 8,386 females, a difference of 1,145 in favor of the latter.

This city's population two years ago, as shown by the directory a little less than two years, is 301½ per cent.

The increase from 1910 to 1920 was 393 per cent.

The directory shows the population of Casa Verdugo and North Glendale to be 708, there being 342 males and 366 females, the latter predominating by twenty-four.

By adding the population of the city of Glendale to that of Casa due to qualities of mind and body Verdugo and North Glendale, the total is 16,334 for this city and its
