As one of the results of the very rapid growth of our city the approaches to nearly all of our schools are in very bad condition, and a great deal of street improvement work

The Board of Education is unable to meet the situation because of the large amount involved in improving the streets adjacent to twelve school buildings. If this matter had to be taken care of out of the current funds of the district, and it cannot be otherwise taken care of except by the proposed bond issue, it would seriously cripple the work of the schools for the coming year.
It is very important both from the stan dpoint of the comfort and convenience of the children in the schools and from the stand point of advertising Glendale as a progressive city in public matters, that the streets adjacent to the schools and other public
buildings should be in excellent condition at all times.

The effect of not having the funds to meet this emergency may be seen by a visit to the Doran Street school on the corner of Doran and Everett streets, where it was found necessary on three sides of the school grounds to make half a street, leaving a
dirt road on the school side dirt road on the school side.

The Board of Education and the City Council have held several conferences look ing toward a solution of the problem, and have found it impossible to solve it in any other way by the proposed bond issue.

If these bonds are not voted it is inevitable that every school in Glendale will be surrounded by half-made streets, a condition which the progressive citizens of Glen-
dale will not tolerate. dale will not tolerate.
