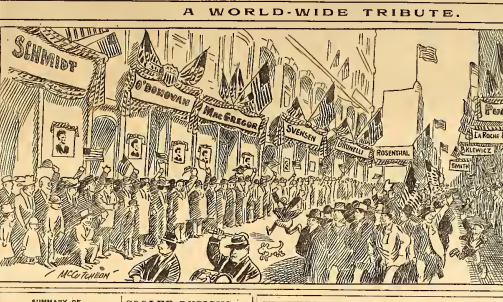


SHAFT TO LINCOLN MARKS BIRTH SITE

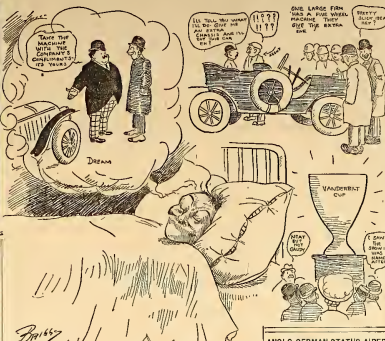

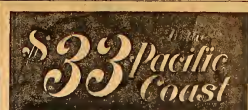
