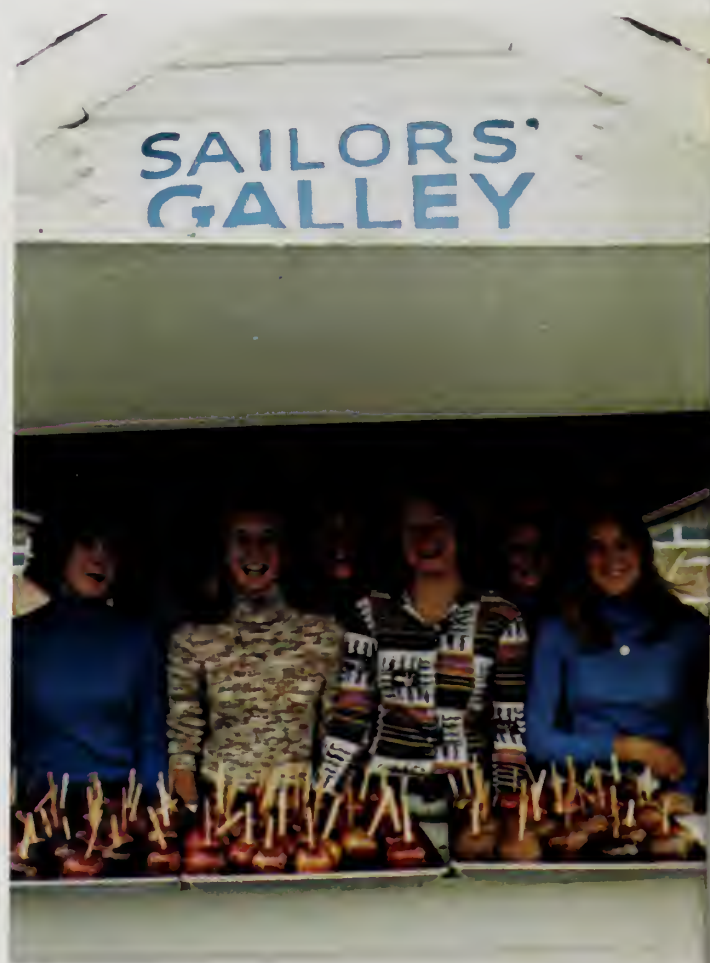

Do You Know Your Scituate?

Did you know that the father of our town arrived in Scituate in the early 1600's and left shortly after his arrival? The father of our town, better known as Timothy Hatherly, did not leave out of dislike or hardships. No, he went back to England to ask for a land grant in the Scituate area and so that people could come to settle here.

Do you want proof that there were people in Scituate as early as 1628? Well, there is a piece of paper concerning the transfer of land from a Henry Merrit to

Nathaniel Tilden bearing that date.

Edward Foster, nephew of Tim Hatherly, was left in charge of Scituate while his uncle returned to England. He and five others are all known to have settled here around 1628. The others are William Gilson, Anthony Annable, Thomas Bird, Nathaniel Tilden, and Henry Crowley. Are any of these men your relatives?

Those of you who got to the Musquashcut-Minot area, consider yourself among the braver set. Back in the early days,

Timothy Hatherly was certainly brave when he chose to settle there.

Once the Scituate Militia, under the command of Captain Pierce, was ordered to pursue a group of hostile Indians. With fifty men and twenty friendly Indians, there were no encounters until Pawtucket. This was the scene of a courageous but losing battle. Captain Pierce and his men, not knowing the numbers that awaited them, fought back-to-back in the river until the last man fell. Three men lived to tell of the battle.

Next time you are asked to leave the Peggoty Beach area when a group of you have gathered to have a little get together, ask, "Why were the men of Kent allowed to congregate in this area?" . . . The first community settlement was along Kent Street. Their reasons for being there were a little different than ours today, protection being the main one.

In 1895 a dark pink carnation, called the "Mrs. Thomas Lawson," was invented. Thomas Lawson went out and spent \$30,000 to buy all of these flowers, which he wanted exclusively for his wife.


Scituate and Plymouth county officials wanted to ensure that all the towns' lands were legally acquired. To do so, Wampatuck, a Wampanoog Indian, was asked to put in writing the transfer of lands to Hatherly, Lawson, and other settlers. Whether it was under force or not, this paper was signed.

Beautiful red roses and stately white fences were the trade-marks of the Lawson estate. There were some people who "borrowed" the red rose bushes to brighten their own lawns. Lawson did not despair. He just replaced each bush with a new

one, which was just as beautiful.

In 1656, the first Quakers came to Scituate. The town branded these peace-loving people as evil because they did not share in the Puritans' beliefs. Anyone who tolerated the Quakers was considered evil also. James Cudworth, a prominent man in the town's affairs, was removed from all offices he held for being tolerant of Quakers.

The influential Thomas Lawson paid 1,000 men to build his estate. It was so large when it was finished, that it took 150 men to take care of it.

You might find it interesting to know that the North River bridge charged a toll. The cost for a man and his horse was higher than for a man on foot. Two priests, traveling in opposite directions, set up a system to beat the high cost. Each would leave his horse on his own side, cross the bridge, paying for himself, and ride off on the other's horse. What a way to economize!

Many of you think that the purpose of the Lawson Tower is to cover an unstable water tower. Did you know that it also keeps the water colder during the summer months than most water towers?

Did you know that there was a huge storm in 1898 that took off about two hundred tons of fourth cliff?

The extravagant Tom Lawson had a very original hobby. He owned a large collection of lucky elephants. Three are still standing on the Common today.

It seems to be common knowledge that Lawson owned much of this town. Is it to your knowledge that he also owned the world's only seven-masted schooner?

If not for the industrious men of the North River, the famed Lewis and Clark

Expedition might never have occurred. The ship Columbia, built in 1773 at Briggs Landing on the North River (just up from the Route 3A Bridge) gave its name to the Columbia River in Oregon, which her captain discovered during a voyage along the west coast. This discovery subsequently inspired the Lewis and Clark Expedition. The Columbia was, also, the first ship to carry the U. S. flag around the world, and to countries such as China, Great Britain, and Canada. For those who would like to see the ship, there is a full size replica of her in Disneyland.

The revolutionary spirit was alive and kicking in Scituate, especially in Chief Justice William Cushing, the only member of the King's Bench in the Massachusetts Supreme Court who supported freedom and independence of the colonies. Not surprisingly, he was also the only member of the bench to be retained after the courts were reorganized in 1775.

If George Washington had his way, Cushing's title, "Chief Justice of Massachusetts" would have been changed to "Chief Justice of the United States," but Cushing declined the position because of poor health. He and Washington were long time friends, for it was Cushing who administered the oath of office at Washington's second Inauguration in 1793.

Cushing clearly took the word freedom seriously, for he made a momentous decision concerning a certain slave, which abolished slavery in Massachusetts — the first state ever to have this distinction.

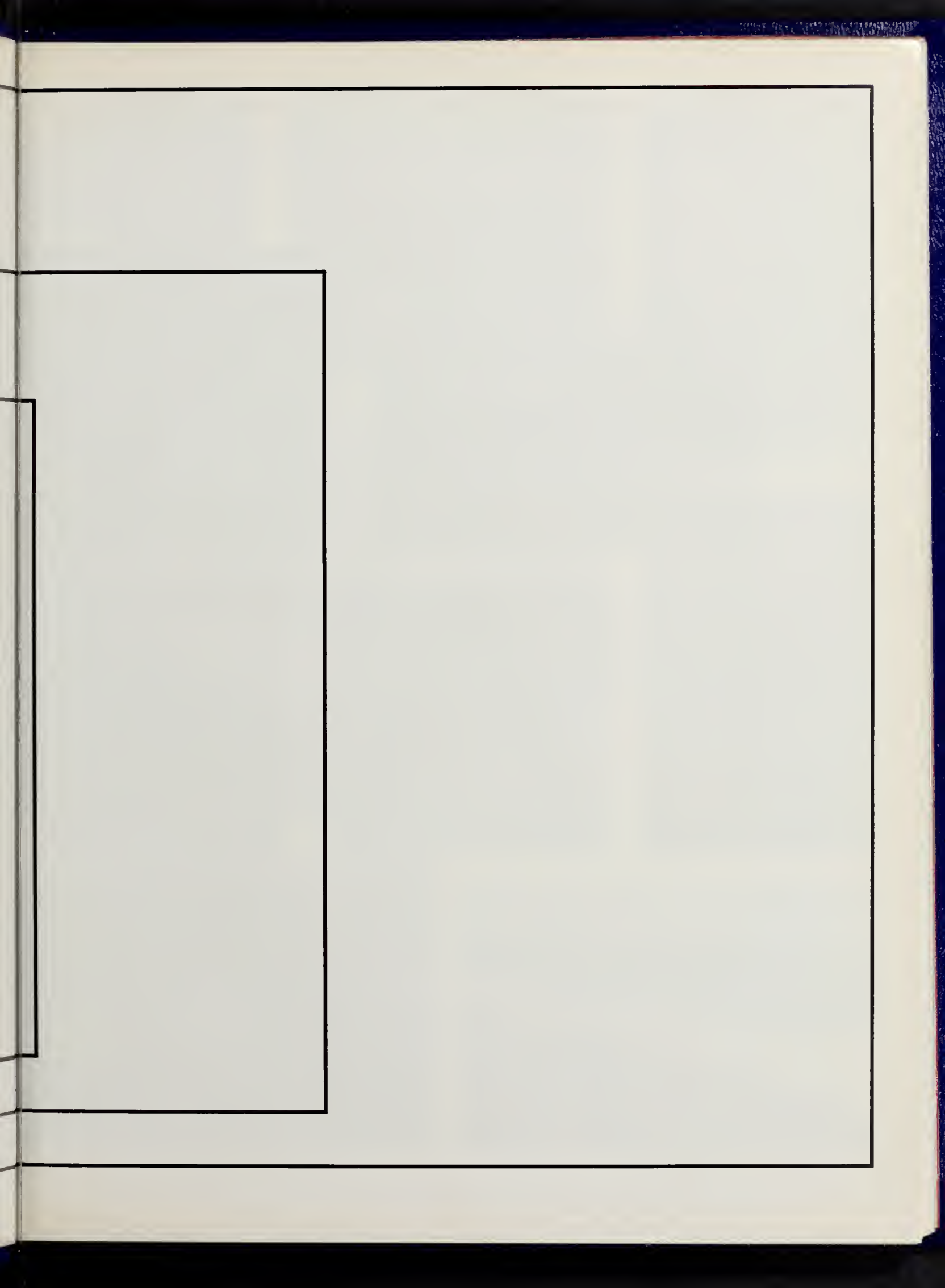
Both the North River and Scituate Harbor won great renown during the 1700's for their famous, as well as infamous, ships. One ship built in 1772 on the North River was not too popular in this area about 200 years ago. Named the Beaver, she gained her fame on a dark autumn night, when rebellious Boston citizens, disguised as Indians, crept aboard to empty her holds of the hated English tea that meant repression to the American colonies. The Beaver will always have a place in history as one of those unfortunate ships that hosted the Boston Tea Party.

Not all of Scituate's patriots were men. Two of the most courageous and inventive heroines of the War of 1812 were Abigail and Rebecca Bates, who, by pretending they were American troops, saved Scituate's ships and supplies from being looted by the British. Rebecca grabbed a rifle, taught Abigail how to use the rifle and sticks, and together they ran across the cedarwood. In the night of February 17th they put on, as the boys say, their "war" clothes, looked and I could see by some of the barges sailing on their way and I remember when I looked upon those hills had seen the flag and they moved about in such a manner that never heard and they picked him up by the back of his neck and hauled him in." "Amazing what two "mere girls" can do if they try.

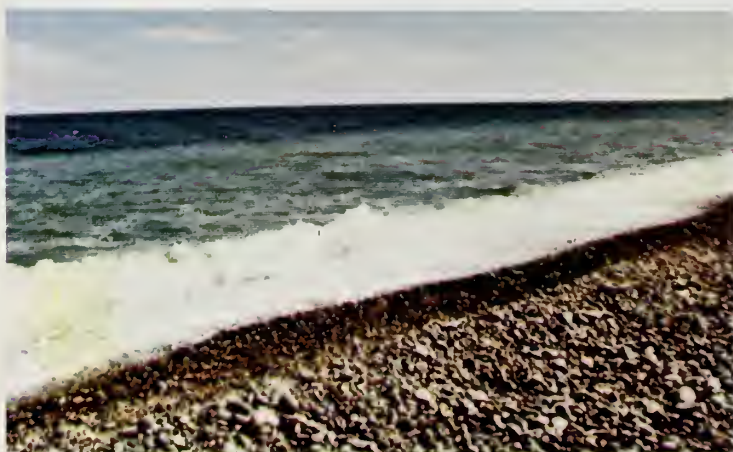

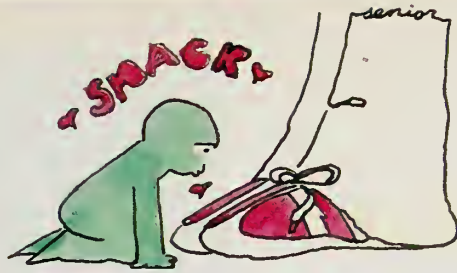
Class History
