SESSION I

1. Open the class with a short build-up of how this class, Christian Family and Sex, has set people free with the accuracy of God's Word in this area for which the world has no real answers.
2. Have some singing and a short prayer.
3. Roll segment #1 (57 minutes, 56 seconds). Be sure scripture sheets are distributed.

4. After segment #1, take a ten-minute break.
5. After the break, briefly recap segment #1. Explain that when Dr. Wierwille handles the questionnaire during segment #2, they are to put down the first thing that comes into their minds, as it will probably be the most honest response. Dr. Wierwille has a purpose in not allowing much time to answer these questions.
6. Roll segment #2 (46 minutes, 55 seconds)

1. Open with a short recap of Session 1. Have some singing and a word of prayer. Be sure students have scripture sheets ready.

2. Roll segment #3 (58 minutes, 10 seconds).

SESSION III

1. Open with a word of prayer. Perhaps have some singing. Recap the previous session.
2. Roll segment #5 (57 minutes, 45 seconds). Be ready to hand out sheet on virtuous woman.

5. After segment #6, take a ten-minute break.

6. After the break, assemble as a group and assign Twigs. Be sure to choose leaders who know the material and are very sharp, spiritually. Remind them that these Twig groups are not teaching sessions, but rather sharing sessions to help solidify the teaching. It is good to have six to eight people per group. Twig leaders should never answer questions or share material that cannot be documented from the teaching. After each session with Twigs, meet with your Twig leaders and check on students' progress. See who needs extra help and encouragement.
7. Reassemble and close with a word of prayer.

SESSION IV

1. Open with prayer and quickly review the last session.
2. Roll segment #7 (57 minutes, 31 seconds).

6. After segment #8, break into Twig groups for approximately one hour.
7. Reassemble and close with a word of prayer.

SESSION V

1. Open with prayer and singing.
2. Roll segment #9 (58 minutes, 52 seconds).

Finish language barrier, male and female anatomy
3. After segment #9, have the students stand and stretch for a minute.
4. Roll segment #10 (57 minutes, 41 seconds).

Male and female anatomy
5. After segment #10, take a ten-minute break.
6. Roll segment #11 (47 minutes, 45 seconds).

Female anatomy

7. After segment #11, have some really enthusiastic singing.
8. Close with prayer and build the excitement for the next session.

SESSION VI

1. Open with prayer and singing. Build excitement for the rest of this class, Christian Family and Sex.
2. Roll segment #12 (58 minutes, 0 seconds).
Childbirth, lovemaking
3. After segment #12, take a ten-minute break.
4. Roll segment #13 (57 minutes, 58 seconds).
Lovemaking, birth control, masturbation
5. After segment #13, break into Twig groups. Be sure to communicate with your Twig leaders about any opportunities to which you need to minister. People should be free, honest, and open by this point and really able to receive the greatness of God's Word concerning the Christian family and sex.
6. Reassemble and close with singing and prayer.

SESSION VII

1. Open with prayer. Build excitement for this last session of the class.
2. Roll segment #14 (57 minutes, 43 seconds).
Art of dating, parents, responsibilities of men and women
3. After segment #14, take a ten-minute break.
4. Roll segment #15 (56 minutes, 20 seconds).
Question and answer period, close of class
5. After segment #15, you may want to have a short period of sharing. Share your heart and how excited you have been to be a part of this great class. Encourage them to review the scripture sheet and to collect a library of suggested reading . . . and to read these books. Explain that the books are for their benefit.
6. Do not answer questions unless you can document the answer by the teaching of the class. Basically, all the questions will have been handled by Dr. Wierwille.
7. Perhaps sing a stately hymn from "Sing Along The Way" and close with a word of prayer.

The Way of a Man with a Maid - Proverbs 30:19

The greatest of God's works is His Word and the Word of God is the will of God. In order to know God's will for us in the Christian Family and Sex field, we must once again get back to the integrity and accuracy of God's Word. There must be signposts in His Word for us to get the knowledge needed so that our lives may be an adornment of the glory of God and so that we may do His will in every category.

- I. The human being must be fantastic because God made man just a little lower than Himself. Psalm 8.
 - A. Jesus Christ is not ashamed to call us brethren. Heb. 2:1-18
 1. He is able to succour us because he was tempted in all ways (sexually, plus).
 - a. Pull out the unnecessary "shoots" in our minds.
 2. Men and women are to become dynamic and wonderful sons of God.
 - a. The emphasis in this class is placed on the family and the relationships within that family.
 - (1) Sex is a part of the family.
- II. Man, with all of his awesomeness and greatness, still does not know a lot of things. Job 39:1ff.
 - A. The heavens continue to declare God's greatness. Psalm 19:1-4.
 1. God, as the creator - Elohim.
 2. God, in relationship to that which He's created - Jehovah. Psalm 19:7-9
 - B. Jesus Christ - our rock and redeemer. Psalm 19:14
 1. Man, whom God so wonderfully made, formed and created, with Christ in him, makes it possible to have that wonderful Christian Family.

III. God put man in the garden to work. Genesis 2:15.

A. A wonderful Christian Family = no one being lazy.

1. Culture teaches us to be lazy.
2. Plenty of work to do in the home.
3. Teach children how to work and love it.
 - a. If you don't work, you don't eat.
II Thessalonians 3:10.
4. Good, solid work is mental and physical.
5. To be enthusiastic and have drive, man needs to work.

IV. Godly design to the Christian Family.

A. One household - one boss.

B. God made woman to be man's helpmate. Genesis 2:18.

1. She is a companion, not a slave (two-way deal).
2. She brings out the best in man.
 - a. No nagging.
 - b. More than a "baby factory."
 - (1) She makes her man feel "all man."
 - (2) He makes his woman feel "all woman."
 - c. Woman came out from "behind" Adam's rib.
Genesis 2:21.

C. One flesh is a real challenge in any circumstance.

1. Husband and wife need knowledge of the Word plus renewed mind. God first.

2. Move away from parents' supervision.
3. Parents mind their own business.
4. Work out your own problems.
 - a. No running home to "mama."
 - b. No lawyer.
5. Work to mold thinking and goals to agree.

V. A glimpse at sex within the marriage.

A. Adam and Eve: Before the fall, they had a wonderful relationship and companionship.

1. Be fruitful and multiply.
 - a. They had intercourse.
 - b. God blessed them.
 - c. Everything God made was very good.
 - (1) Sex is not dirty.
 - (2) Genitals are not dirty.

VI. God first in all things we do.

A. Responsibility for things given to us by God. I Cor. 2:12.

B. Glorify God in our body because we belong to Him.
I Corinthians 6:15-20.

1. Physically.
 - a. Appearance important.
 - b. Have respect for yourself.
 - c. Body and clothing in alignment.
2. Spiritually.
 - a. Confess what the Word says.
 - b. We were bought with a price.
 - (1) We are not our own.
 - (2) Be a good witness for God.

C. Be thankful to God for each other. Ephesians 5:20.

1. Wife is to husband as church is to Christ.
Ephesians 5:23.
 - a. "submit" = subject.

2. Husband, protector and provider . . . "king of the castle."
 - a. He needs woman. Ephesians 5:25-30.
 - (1) She puts husband on a pedestal because he so loves. Ephesians 5:33. "reverence" = worship.

D. Tenderness and Forgiveness. Colossians 3:12.

1. Everyone "blows it."
2. Children obligated to obey only when parents walk the Word. Colossians 3:20.
 - a. Children fellowship because they want to.
 - b. Mean what you say and say what you mean.
 - c. Father never irritates to discouragement.
 - d. Keep that Word central because every jot and tittle will be fulfilled.

E. Woman - the weaker vessel?

1. Grandmother instructs: Titus 2:1-5.
 - a. To be a good wife and mother.
 - b. To be a good housekeeper.
2. Woman's adornment - an inside job. I Peter 3:8.
 - a. Beauty is the Christ within you.
 - (1) It shows in your walk, talk and smile.
 - (2) Physical beauty and strength is secondary.
3. Giving honor. I Peter 3:7.
 - a. Woman physically strong and specially made.
 - (1) Curvature of arm, for carrying babies.
 - (2) Strength in the hip area.
 - (a) Only a woman can deliver babies.
 - (b) She can outwork a man any day.
 - b. Husband not to give wife the hardest job.
 - (1) Biblically, the wife would care for the animals.
 - (2) She would be separate from the workers of the fields.

- (a) Joy and rejoicing.
Proverbs 5:18.
- (b) Like a three-fold cord.

4. The virtuous woman. Proverbs 31.
 - a. Greatest record written about woman.
 - b. Acrostic.
 - c. Proverbs 31:10a. "who can find" - erotesis = interrogating question for thoughtful consideration.
 - d. Price far above rubies. Proverbs 31:10b.
 - (1) Emphasis on plurality (rubies).
 - (a) Woman who loves the Word can't be bought.
 - e. Basis is that she is God-fearing.

F. Man and woman - single and married. I Corinthians 7.

1. Corinthians written to the Church.
2. Man - anthropos = human being as distinct from an animal.
 - a. God never categorized man as an animal.
3. Conditions for marriage. I Corinthians 7:2.
 - a. Control sexual burning.
 - b. Emotional maturity.
 - c. Compatibility.
 - (1) RENEWED MIND IS NOT PRE-MARITAL SEX.
 - (2) Rendering due benevolence takes care of the physical needs of the marriage. I Corinthians 7:3.
 - (a) Lovingly give due benevolence by the renewing of the mind.
 - (3) Abstinence. I Corinthians 7:5.

- (a) Only by mutual agreement.
 - (b) Only when husband and wife desire deeper spirituality.
 - (c) Only for short period of time.
- (4) Sex.
- (a) Aids in keeping husband in sound mental and physical condition.
 - (b) Keeps body physically satisfied.
4. All God's Word is God's will.
- a. Holy men of God spake. II Peter 1:21. Galatians 1:11, 12.
 - (1) By permission - requests - may. I Corinthians 7:6.
 - (2) By commandment - demands - do.
5. Paul's credentials. I Corinthians 7:7.
- a. Member of the Sanhedrin (70 who ruled Israel).
 - (1) 30 years old.
 - (2) Married.
 - (3) Father of at least 1 child.
 - (4) Authorized to cast his vote. Acts 26:10.
 - (5) "Proper gift of God."
 - (a) He could contain sexually.
6. "As the Lord hath called." I Corinthians 7:17.
- a. Two believers. I Corinthians 7:10, 11.
 - (1) Separation due to lack of renewed mind.
 - b. One believer - one unbeliever. I Corinthians 7:12-16.
 - (1) Sanctified - set apart for a very special reason.
 - (a) Unbeliever favored because of the new birth of the believer.
 - (b) Children in the Gathering Together.
 - (2) Stay married if at all possible. I Corinthians 7:17.

There is a big difference in being servants of men, or Christ's servants to men. I Corinthians 7:23.

- c. Two unbelievers. I Corinthians 7:24.
 - (1) One becomes saved.
 - (2) They remain married unless unbeliever departs.
- d. "Now concerning virgins." I Corinthians 7:25.
 - (1) "Yet I give . . ." - by freedom of will, according to revelation.
 - (2) "Judgment" - diagnosis - exact knowledge according to revelation.
 - (3) To abide as he, Paul, is. I Corinthians 7:18, 20, 24.

"Therefore, for a man so to be is good for the present necessity because of the urgency of the times." (For our time together here on earth.) - Literal according to usage, I Corinthians 7:26.

- e. Christian husband.
 - (1) If he can contain, he is not to remarry.

"Brethren, let every man, wherein he is called, therein abide with God." "I suppose therefore that this is good for the present distress, I say, that it is good for a man so to be."

"Art thou bound unto a wife? seek not to be loosed. Art thou loosed from a wife? seek not a wife."

"But and if thou marry, thou hast not sinned;

"Now concerning virgins I have no commandment of the Lord: yet I give my judgment, as one that hath obtained mercy of the Lord to be faithful."

". . . and if a virgin marry, she hath not sinned."

I Corinthians 7:24, 26, 27, 28a,
25, 28b.

- f. "Trouble" - added responsibility. I Corinthians 7:28c.
 - (1) Specific revelation concerning married couple with children must be carried out.
 - (2) "I spare you" - no added responsibility if not married.

Unless we move the Word accurately in its integrity in this time, there will be no more time to move it. I Corinthians 7:29, 30.

Don't get hung up in material things beyond need. I Corinthians 7:31.

"If any man thinks that he is shamed by the behavior of his virgin daughter

because she has passed the marriage age and he has not given her in marriage and that he should give her, let him do what he will and he does not sin. Let her be married.

"If he has sincerely decided and is not forced by circumstances, but has determined and decreed in his heart to keep his virgin daughter single, he does well.

"So then he who gives his virgin daughter in marriage does well; and he who does not give his virgin daughter in marriage does even better."

 - a. Adam and Eve sinned. Eve because she was tricked, Adam because he loved Eve.
 - b. Sinned by masturbation - but the sin was treason, not masturbation.

- (1) Masturbation not necessary when due benevolence is given in marriage.
 - (2) Adam and Eve changed the truth of companionship into a lie. Romans 1:25.
7. Children now necessary to bring forth the Savior. Genesis 3:16.
 8. Driven out so man could be redeemed. Genesis 3:22-24.
 9. Man not made for man, but for woman and vice versa. Romans 1:20-32.
 - a. They changed the truth of God. Romans 1:24, 25.
 - (1) Made images and worshipped other gods.
 - (2) Dishonored their own bodies (homo and lesbian)
 - b. God gave them up to passions of infamy. Romans 1:26.

VIII. Anticipation, Realization and Memory.

Make sure that what you anticipate is right on with the Word so that after realization of it the memory is sweet.

A. God never asks us to forget, only to forgive.

1. There are memories of things in our lives that hurt. (Like a scar, the memory can heal to the place where there is no hurt.)
2. All sex starts in the mind.
 - a. By our wills we can be on top of a situation and control it.
3. Anything that ever succeeds requires work. Most people work TOWARDS the marriage and BEFORE the marriage.

B. Marriages are NOT made in heaven.

1. Marriage is a DO-IT-TOGETHER kit.

- a. Married couples can have different interests without causing strife.
 - b. Come to agreements regarding material goods.
 - c. No other woman or man can ever take the place of your husband or wife.
 - d. Sex starts at the breakfast table.
- C. Couple should take time to get the marriage cemented on Biblical principles.
1. Babies then can come.
 2. We can talk about anything without feeling embarrassed or shocked when it is from the Biblical point of view.
 3. You never get anything solved unless you talk about it honestly and openly according to the accuracy of God's Word.
- D. The new morality.
1. It's important to know how to use sex, not whether it is good or bad.
 2. Sensual gratification - abolishing repression and inhibitions by making sex available whenever and wherever an impulse or desire occurs.
 3. Produces new breed of fears and disturbances, far more catastrophic than the puritanistic movement.
 4. Promulgated by many prominent people in our country.
- E. Truth, not sex, sets people free from inhibitions and repression.
- F. The human body - the most beautiful thing next to God's Word.
1. Sex appeal is:
 - a. Physical.
 - b. Mental.
 - c. Emotional.
 - d. Passion.
 - e. Then, orgasm.

G. A working agreement between husband and wife (time element involved to develop a love relationship).

1. All sex is designed for a greatness in the love relationship in the family.
2. Man's quick arousal is one reason that he is the head of the wife, so he can control the climax timing.
3. No woman is the property of any man or vice versa. We are God's workmanship.

1. Scientifically, no one knows what triggers the beginning of the labor.

C. Birth.

1. The most dramatic part of the birth is the crowning because this is when the baby takes its first breath of life and becomes a living soul.
2. Twins:
 - a. Fraternal - two ovum, two sperm enter ovum at same time, two placentas.
 - b. Identical - one ovum, one sperm - as they unite they can separate off while cells are dividing within 6-8 days (one placenta, 2 sacs possible).

- J. Man doesn't always need to be the instigator of sex.
- K. Sex is not to be a momentary blast, but an all-inclusive relationship.
- L. Mind must turn to how rather than how often.
 - 1. Beauty of tenderness rather than great excitement . . .
- M. Remember woman needs love.
- N. Make the marriage a do-it-together project.
- O. The Creator loved us so much that He made us to love each other.
- P. Field of lovemaking.
 - 1. First part, EXCITEMENT - foreplay.
 - 2. Then, PLATEAU - intercourse.
 - 3. Finally, RESOLUTION - afterglow.
- Q. Basic 7 major intercourse positions - husband and wife must work out what will bless both.
- R. Planned parenthood and birth control:
 - 1. Contraceptives.
 - a. Vasectomy: sever vas deferens and tie it off - should be thought of as permanent.
 - b. Tubal ligation: sever fallopian tubes - also permanent.
 - c. Withdrawal: at the point of ejaculation, the man withdraws his penis.
 - d. Foam and jelly.
 - e. Pill: it simulates pregnancy in that the uterus will not accept the ovum - considered most effective.
 - f. IUD: very effective.
 - g. Diaphragm: can have no deleterious effect - very effective when used! (Don't leave it in the drawer!!)
 - h. Condom: widely used.
 - i. Rhythm: must know the time of ovulation.
 - j. morning after pill coming

8. Things are to be used. People are to be loved.

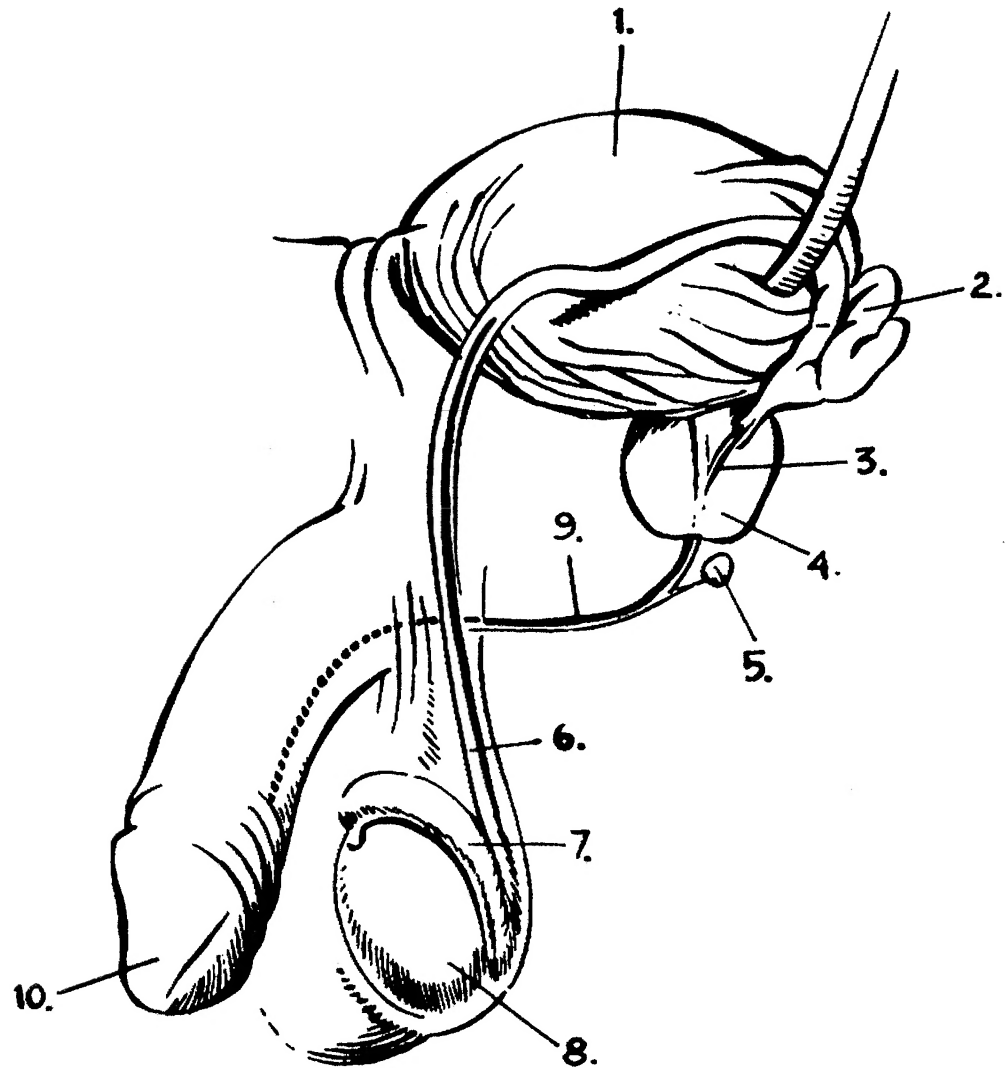

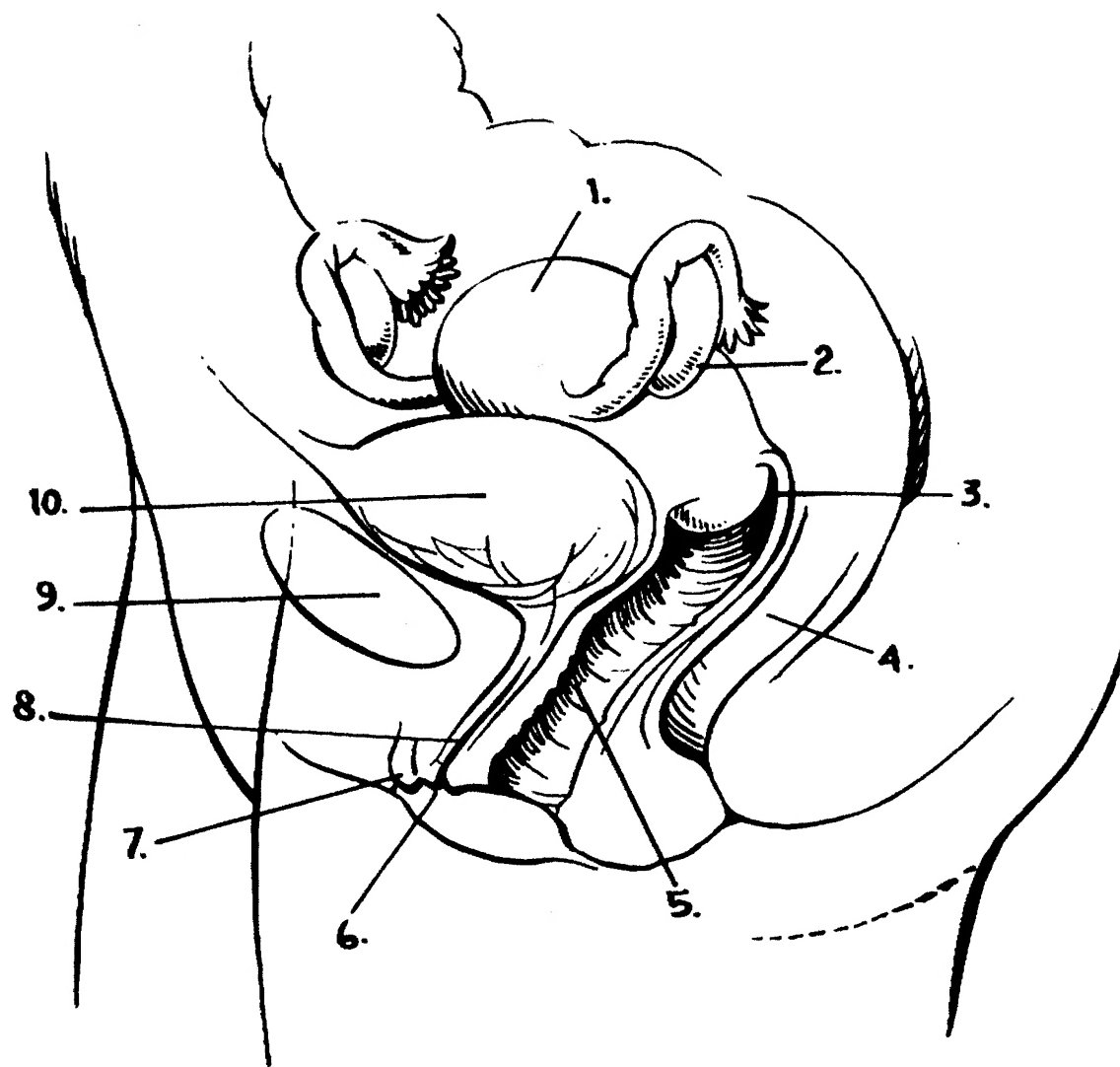
