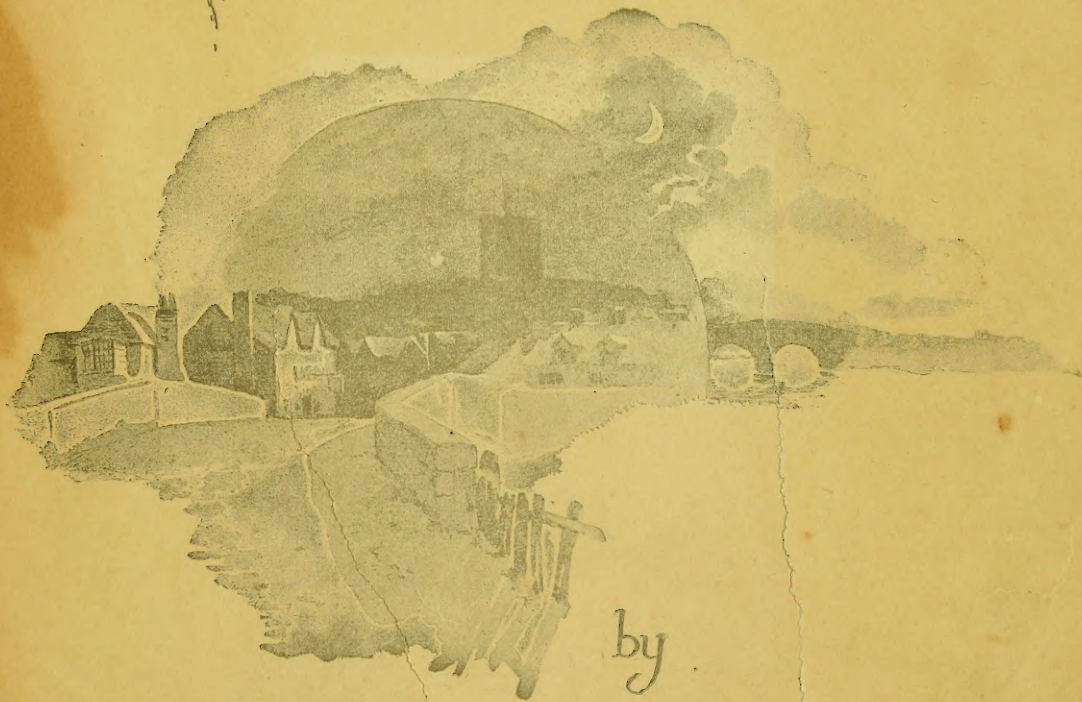

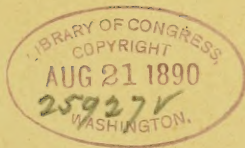

Christmas to-night!







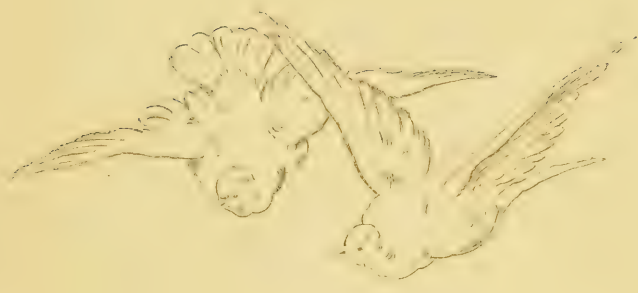



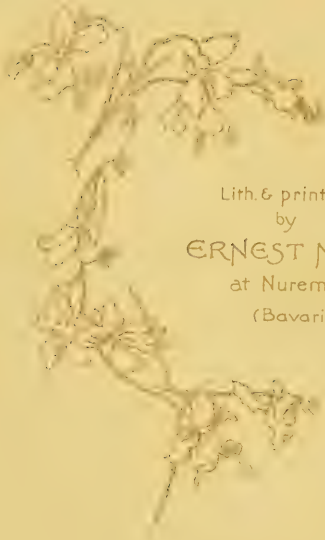
