INTRODUCTION.

Industrial Exhibitions, the exponents of civilization, industry, social advancement and national prosperity, have wielded their influence for several centuries. Historians refer their origin to the days of Ahasuerus, when he exhibited "the riches of his kingdom, an hundred and fourscore days." It is not necessary for us to trace the progress of exhibitions so far back, but it may be interesting to know that the first Industrial Exhibition, since the Christian era, was held in Venice in 1208. This was not merely of a local character, but included a display of articles illustrative of the industries of various countries.

During the same century International Fairs were instituted for the sale and exchange of goods; some of these are continued to the present day. It is to England and France that the world is most indebted for the inauguration of industrial competitive exhibitions. In the 17th century the Society of Arts in London and the Government of France, aided and supported the advancement of exhibitions for arts and manufactures.

Industrial Exhibitions are the means of creating a healthy stimulus to industry and exciting emulation among our agriculturists and manufacturers. This is of importance to all countries, and especially so to a new country like Canada. We have an area of about 3,000,000 square miles of land, of which upward of 2,000,000 are agricultural and timbered lands, we have an abundance of valuable minerals, and our natural resources are not surpassed by any other country. Our wheat zone extends over 1,000,000 square miles, in addition we have abundant grazing pasture, extensive forests of timber, and lakes and rivers abounding with fresh water fishes of every description. With the large field of Great Britain as our export market for our food products we have immense mines of wealth in prospect. Our government and municipal laws all tend to the prosperity of our country; the enormous development of our educational system within the past twenty years has fostered an interest in practical knowledge of vast importance to our advancement as a nation. Our daily and weekly papers team with information showing the recent improvements in agriculture, arts and manufactures; our Government fosters and encourages the formation of Provincial Fairs, Agricultural Societies, Mechanics' Institutes, and Dairymen's and Fruit Growers' Associations, which hold out inducements for the importation of improved live stock for breeding purposes, and for advancement in the preparation of food products and agricultural and domestic manufactures.

With a just appreciation of these facts, a few of our prominent citizens considered that we are now in a position for the establishment of a permanent Industrial Exhibition. The City Council of Toronto were induced to consider a scheme for the formation of an annual exhibition, which finally led to the formation and incorporation of this Association, whose first resolution was, that a Permanent Annual Exhibition, under joint management, should be established and maintained in the City of Toronto, for the encouragement of Agriculture, Horticulture, Arts and Manufactures, and that the first of such exhibitions should be held during the first three weeks of September, 1879.

It was resolved that the Association should consist of the following representatives from public bodies: The Mayor, Treasurer, and City Council of Toronto, 12 members; the Directors of the Electoral District Society of Toronto, 12 members; the Manufacturer's Association, 5 members; and two representatives from each of the following Societies, Associations, &c.: York County Council, Ontario Society of Arts, Toronto Mechanics' Institute, Toronto Horticultural Society, Toronto Board of Trade, Stock Breeders' Association, Dairymen's Association, Fruit Grower's Association, Canadian Institute, Lumbermen's Association, College of Pharmacy, Education Department, and one each from the Millers' Association and Corn Exchange.

At the first Annual Meeting held on the second Tuesday in February, 1879, the following officers were elected: President, John J. Withrow; First Vice-President, W. F. McMaster; Second Vice-President, Wm. Rennie; Manager and Treasurer, Jas. McGee; Solicitor, W. G. McWilliams; Secretary, H. J. Hill; also a Board of twenty Directors. Committees of Management were appointed for Horses, Cattle, Sheep and Pigs, Poultry, Agricultural Implements and Tools, Agricultural Products, Dairy Products, Horticultural Products, Fine Arts Department, Industrial Department, Manufactures, Machinery and Tools, Chemical Manufactures and Pharmaceutical Preparations, Natural History, Grievances, Judges, Reception and Transportation.

The first business of the Association was to make their financial arrangements by which they proposed to secure a cash fund of over \$30,000, two-thirds of which was to be distributed as Prizes.

It is gratifying to state that their appeal for grants of money from the City and County Councils, and various Societies, together with subscriptions from private individuals, have been generously responded to, and the Officers of the Association have been able to make improvements, by the alteration of old buildings and the erection of new buildings on the Exhibition Ground of last year, which will make the accommodation superior to any previously afforded in Canada. This of course involved a considerable expenditure of money; but it is money well expended. The Officers and Committee have done wonders in supplying the necessary requirements for the proper display of the exhibits, and the comfort and convenience of visitors. A careful consideration of the deficiencies of last year, when the Provincial Exhibition was held, has enabled them to overcome these obstacles. They have erected new buildings, modified and improved old buildings, and made the necessary changes to impart what is intended, viz.: a permanent character, and an adaptability of each building to the purpose for which it is intended.

The principal buildings are:

1. *The Main Building*.—This is built in the Crystal Palace style of architecture; it is 292 feet long, 64 feet wide, and from the ground to the top of the flag-staff, surmounting the Dome, 185 feet high. It has two tiers of galleries extending around the whole building, ranging from 16 to 32 feet wide; these are approached by eight sets of beautiful and wide staircases with oak steps and balustrades. This building is well ventilated, having over one hundred Patent Ventilators.

2. *The Agricultural Hall* has a very pleasing appearance; it is built of ornamented wood with ventilating cupolas, and is well fitted with all the necessary appliances offices, &c. It is 102 feet in length and 52 feet in width.

3. *The Agricultural Implement Building* is built in the form of a cross, having one section 332 feet and the other 188 feet long. The centre is fitted up with over 1,000 feet of line of Shafting, driven from eight different points, by portable steam engines, which will be used for working the machinery exhibited. This is provided by the Association, enabling Exhibitors to exhibit their Implements and Machines in motion, at much less expense than if each exhibitor had to supply power and shafting for working their own exhibits. This will, no doubt, be one of the most interesting and important buildings on the ground. Our recent successful display of Agricultural Implements at Paris, and the development of the extensive export trade which has followed that exhibit, is a proof of the excellency, superiority and cheapness of our Agricultural Implements, and of a growing trade in this direction.

4. *The Stables, Cattle Sheds, Sheep Pens.*—There are 14 Stables; 18 Cattle Sheds; and several Sheep and Pig Pen buildings, all neatly and tastefully decorated, and what is of more importance, amply provided with a supply of water from our City water works.

The importance of our Horse and Cattle Show has been taken into consideration by providing the most approved conveniences for them; it being well known that the future wealth and prosperity of this country will be greatly enhanced by the breeding and raising of improved breeds of live stock.

5. *The Poultry Building.*—This is a neat building, also in the form of a cross, being 218 feet from east to west, and 85 feet from north to south. It is 28 feet wide, having an ample supply of water.

6. *Hatching House.*—This building is fitted for hatching chickens by steam. The first eggs were placed in the apparatus on the 7th of August, so that the first hatch will take place about the 1st Sept. Successive hatchings will take place daily during the Exhibition. An extra fee of 10 cents is charged to enter the building, in order to defray the great outlay in fitting up the steam apparatus, &c.

7. *The Machinery Hall.*—This is a spacious building, having a handsome appearance, being surmounted with a tower 78 feet high. The building is 202 feet in length, and 72 feet in width, with a large boiler-house attached. The machinery will be driven by two lines of shafting, by a sixty-two horse power Corliss Engine on one side of the building and a high pressure forty-horse power on the other side.

8. *Carriage House.*—This is a neat building, 252 feet long and 42 feet high; it is well adapted for the display of Carriages.

9. *The Dairy.*—The building is 66 feet square, and is amply provided with what is necessary to make a grand display of Butter and Cheese. This building is also supplied with water from the City water works.

In addition to the buildings for exhibits every provision is made for the comfort of visitors, they consist of the following :

10. *Public Restaurant.*—This building is 100 feet long by 38 feet high, with additional kitchen, store rooms, &c.

The Hall has a seating capacity for 300 people. In addition there are refreshment booths in different parts of the ground. Visitors will be supplied with a good plain dinner for 25 cents.

11. *Offices, &c.*—There are several buildings provided for the accommodation of the Officers of the Association, Police, Caretakers, &c., also Ticket Offices on the ground.

12. *The Grand Stand and Judges' Stand*, facing the Horse Ring, will seat four thousand people. It is a semi-circular building 300 feet long and 30 feet wide, and is so constructed as to be used for holding meetings by Societies and Delegates who may visit the Exhibition. On other occasions it will be free to the public. The Judge's Stand is in the centre of the Driving Ring.

13. *Pioneers' Huts*.—Two log huts have been erected by the Society of York Pioneers, which will have no modern improvements but be typical of olden times in Canada. One of them will have a main room, with sleeping apartments above, to which access is obtained by a ladder of rude construction.

It is the intention of the York Pioneers to present an Address to the Governor-General, and Her Royal Highness, the Princess Louise, in one of these buildings.

The following extracts from the Rules and Regulations of the Association will be of interest to exhibitors and visitors.

— • —
ADMISSION TO THE GROUNDS.

The price of admission will be 25 cents each time of entering. The admission will be by means of registering turnstiles, and *each person must be provided with the proper change before entering*.

Necessary attendants upon stock and machinery will be furnished with special passes on applying at the Secretary's office on the grounds. These passes will bear the name of the person to whom it is issued, and if presented by any other person will be forfeited.

One Exhibitor's ticket, admitting an exhibitor only *once* each day, and *positively not transferable*, may be purchased by any individual exhibiting, and if a firm by any one member thereof, at the office of the Association on the grounds, at the following rates, viz., for one week, \$1 00; two weeks, \$1 50; and for the whole exhibition, \$2 00.

Judges, special delegates from other Associations, and members of the press, will be furnished with badges. No other tickets whatever will be issued.

The entry tickets upon animals or articles will admit the person bringing them to the Show Grounds for exhibition, along with such animals or articles, without the use of any other ticket. Afterwards, such parties must be provided with proper passes, as above.

DELIVERY OF ARTICLES, AND CHARGE OF SAME WHILE ON EXHIBITION.

Exhibitors will, at all times, give the necessary personal attention to whatever they may have on exhibition, and at the close take entire charge of the same.

Articles placed on exhibition must not be removed until the close, except by permission of the Board of Directors; and except, also, in the dairy, fruit, vege-

table and floral sections, where such removal is necessary to a continuous display. Every facility will be afforded for the transaction of business by taking orders, but no delivery of articles sold can be made on the premises during the exhibition, except by special arrangement.

Though the Association will take reasonable precaution to ensure the safety of articles sent to the Exhibition, yet they wish it to be distinctly understood that the owners themselves must take the risk of exhibiting them; and that should any article be accidentally injured, lost or stolen, the Association will give all the assistance in their power towards the recovery of the same, but *will not make any payment* for the value thereof.

At the close of the Exhibition, exhibitors must take charge of their exhibits and remove the same as early as possible.

PAYMENT OF PRIZES.

The Treasurer will be prepared to commence paying the premiums, at his office on the grounds, for all classes except Live Stock, at 9 a.m., on Monday, the 15th of September, and for Live Stock on Friday, the 19th of September, at 9 a.m.

Parties who shall have prizes awarded them are particularly requested to apply for them before leaving Toronto, or leave a written order with some person to receive them, stating the articles for which prizes are claimed.

Persons entitled to cash premiums must apply for them at the Secretary's Office, who will give *orders on the Treasurer* for the amount. These orders must be endorsed, as they will be payable to *order* not to *bearer*, and on presentation to the Treasurer, properly endorsed, will be paid either in cash, or by cheque on the bank.

Orders for premiums, not applied for as above, will be given by the Secretary, and the amount forwarded by the Treasurer, on receipt of proper instructions.

All persons to whom a prize is awarded, must apply to the Secretary of the Association for payment thereof, on or before the 30th day of November, of the year in which such prize is awarded, or such prize will be forfeited.

MEDALS.

Medals will be awarded in lieu of money prizes when desired by exhibitors, subject to approval by the Board of Directors.

MISCELLANEOUS.

If any person, through ignorance of the regulations, shall bring things to the exhibition without having entered them at the proper time, the same may, in the discretion of the Superintendent in charge of the several departments, be allowed to be brought upon the grounds, and so placed that they may be examined by

the public, but shall not be classified, nor shall any official examination of them be made or premiums awarded.

All prize cards which have been affixed by the Judges must be displayed during the Exhibition. Any infraction of this rule will incur the forfeiture of any premium awarded.

The Board of Directors, on being made aware of any fraud having been committed by any exhibitor, in the entry of any stock or goods in competition for prizes at any exhibition, have the power of withholding the payment of any prizes that may have been awarded by the Judges to such exhibitors, on such fraudulent or any other entries made at any such exhibition.

If any person wilfully injures or destroys any property within the Exhibition grounds of the Association, or hinders or obstructs the officers or servants of the said Association, or any policeman or constable, duly appointed, in the execution of his duty, or gains admission to the said grounds contrary to the rules of the Association, he shall be liable to a fine of not less than one or more than twenty dollars; said fine to be enforced and collected as fines are usually collected, and to be paid over to the Association for its use and benefit; and, in default of payment, the said offender shall be imprisoned in the common gaol for a period of not more than thirty days.

The officers of the Association have the power, by their Act of Incorporation, to enforce these Rules, and to prohibit and prevent all kinds of gambling, theatrical, circus, or mountebank performances, exhibitions or shows; and also to regulate or prevent the huckstering or trafficking in fruits, goods, wares or merchandise on the Exhibition grounds, or within three hundred yards thereof; and any person who, after due notice of such rules, violates the same, shall be liable to be removed by the officers, policemen, or constables of said Association, and be subject to the penalty prescribed.

FIRE AND POLICE PROTECTION.

The most careful and thorough arrangements possible have been made to guard against fire; and, with the precautions taken, it is believed the danger of such an occurrence is very remote, but exhibitors desiring insurance must give the matter their personal attention.

An ample police force, detailed for the purpose by the city, will be on duty night and day during the continuance of the Exhibition. A full corps of watchmen will also be present at all times; but exhibitors are expected to exercise constant supervision over their articles on exhibition, as the Association will not be responsible for loss or damage by theft, fire, or otherwise. Small and valuable articles should be exhibited in show-cases, which may be securely locked when desirable.

During the Exhibition inquiries may be made at the Business Office, and every officer of the Association will, when applied to, either furnish the information

TELEGRAPH AND POST OFFICES.

The Montreal and Dominion Telegraph Companies have offices on the grounds; and a Post Office will also be provided for the delivery and despatch of letters.

VISITORS.

Visitors may be assured of finding on the grounds everything necessary to the convenience and comfort of young or old during the entire day. An ample restaurant and lunch rooms, managed by experienced caterers, and under the supervision of the Board of Directors as to price and quality of food, will serve meals and refreshments during hours of exhibition at reasonable rates. Baggage rooms for the deposit of satchels, cloaks, &c., and in charge of responsible parties, are conveniently located for the accomodation of visitors. The hotels of the city, ample for any occasion, will adhere to their regular rates; and the city authorities will co-operate with the officers of the Association in every practicable manner to ensure the safety and contribuet to the pleasure of visitors.

HOW TO REACH THE GROUNDS.

The grounds, some sixty acres in extent, are most beautifully located on the shore of Lake Ontario, on the western outskirts of the city, and from them a splendid view of Toronto, the Queen City of the West, with the surrounding country, can be obtained. They are easy of access, and can be reached in a few minutes by either of the lines of Street Railway cars, by the Great Western Railway cars, running every few minutes, or by a line of Steamers on the Bay, which land visitors directly upon the grounds.
