And may We behave towards them With such Justice, Humanity and Prudence, and live in their Sight so righteously, soberly, and godly, that they may honour, instead of blaspheming, the worthy Name Whereby We are called, and the heathen become the Inheritance, and the utmost parts of the Earth the possession of thy beloved Son: To Whom, with Thee, O Father, and the holy Ghost, be all Glory and Praise, now and for ever.
