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It is not known that William Odell, Jr., was the eldest son. Savage's Genealogical Dictionary describes him as William Odell of Greenwich, Conn., aged 47 in 1681. Nothing has been found, however, to fix the date of birth of his brother John Odell.

NER, who in 1683, signed as witness; in 1706, sold to George Keele, of Rye, his interest in the undivided lands "below the marked trees which belong to the eighteenth," being a thirty-sixth part of the land which belonged to his deceased father, William Odell. (Rye Town Records, Liber C, p. 283.)

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HACKALIAH ODELL, in 1685, mentioned in Rye Town Records as witnessing Robert Bloomer's deed; no further trace.

ISAAC ODELL, of Eastchester, N. Y., in 1704, gave to Moses Huit, Jr., deed of land in Eastchester.

MICHAEL ODELL, of whom no trace has been found beyond the mention of his name as an executor of the will of Johannes Odell, of Fortam, in which instrument he is called by the testator "My brother, Michael Odell."

Peter Bulkeley, who was rector of the Parish of Otell in Bedfordshire, England, 1644 and became the owner of a large estate; his name appears there in the probate dated 6 June, the same year, mentions his son William and John, daughter Rebecca. Records are now being made in English with the hope of obtaining further evidence of spelling, such as Wodell, Woddel, Wodde, Odil, Odell, and Odle. 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

JOHN ODELL, Jr., of Stratfield, Conn., b. about 1666; received grant of land as grandson of William Odell, of Fairfield, deceased; in 1669, was made freeman; in 1664, deed from his father, John Odell; d. 1 June, 1743, at Stratfield; will at Fairfield mentions wife Sarah, two sons, two daughters and others. (Fairfield Probate Records, Liber 1741-8.)

JOHN ODELL, Sr., of Fairfield; in 1664, made Freeman by General Assembly; in 1666, in behalf of his father, William Odell, joined with Francis Hall in deed of partition; in 1672 and 1682, received grants of land at Fairfield; in 1697, named as member of Stratfield Church; in 1707, made will appointing "Mary, executrix. (Fairfield Town Records.)

REBECCA ODELL, bap. at Concord, 17 July, 1643, mar. Lieut. Samuel Morehouse, of Fairfield, son of Thomas and Isabella (Kester) Morehouse, who was at Weatherfield, Conn., as early as 1640. Lieut. Morehouse was Marshall of Fairfield in 1673; inventory of his estate recorded in 1733. His left issue, Samuel Jonathan, Thomas, John and others. (Schenck's Hist. Fairfield.)

HANNAH ODELL, b. 20 Oct., 1679. DEBORA ODELL, b. 28 Oct., 1682; mentioned in Stratfield Church Records as renewing the Covenant 7 Dec., 1712. MARY ODELL, mentioned in father's will; in 1704, called daughter of John Odell, and renewed the Covenant in Stratfield Church.

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SARAH, dau. Deacon Wheeler, of Stratfield; she d. 2 Oct., 1743, aged 78; gravestone in old churchyard at Stratfield; he will, dated 19 Oct., 1743, mentioned honored father Deacon Wheeler, last of Stratfield, sons William and Hezekiah Odell, dau. Aon Gill, children of deceased dau. Bethiah and Sarah, and grandson, Abigail Odell. (Fairfield Probate Records.)

SAMUEL ODELL, of Stratfield, Conn., b. 16 Mar., 1667; in 1697, named as member of Stratfield Church; in 1707, made will appointing "Mary, executrix. (Fairfield Town Records.)

DEBORA, no further trace beyond the mention of her name as "Widow Debora" in the inventory of her husband's estate, 14 Aug., 1727.

HANNAH ODELL, b. 20 Oct., 1679. DEBORA ODELL, b. 28 Oct., 1682; mentioned in Stratfield Church Records as renewing the Covenant 7 Dec., 1712. MARY ODELL, mentioned in father's will; in 1704, called daughter of John Odell, and renewed the Covenant in Stratfield Church.

HEZEKIAH ODELL, of Stratfield; in 1700, named in Stratfield Church Records as son of John Odell, and renewed the Covenant; in 1725, with brother John, named in deed to Timothy Wheeler; in 1727, appointed guardian of minor son and daughter; in 1746, commissioned as Lieutenant at Stratfield by the General Assembly. (Fairfield Town Records.)

DEBORAH, dau. Thomas Bayley, of Fairfield; she d. 27 June, 1756, aged 54; bur. in old church yard at Stratfield and described in epitaph as wife to Lieut. Hezekiah Odell; issue, four children, Asariah, Gershom, Bula and Anne; Gershom Odell had two children, William and Ruth. (Old Stratfield Church Records.)

SAMUEL ODELL, of Stratfield; in 1733, called "brother, eldest son of Samuel O'ell, dec." in deed from Ebenezer Mary Gregory; in 1735, on list of grand jurors; in 1751, commissioned Captain by General Assembly; in 1775, called "Samuel Odell, Esq., late of Fairfield," and widow Sarah mentioned in distribution of estate. (Fairfield Town and Probate Records.)

JOHN ODELL, of Connecticut Farms, N. J.; in 1710, lived at Stratfield; in 1730, as son of Eustace Samuel Odell, late of Stratfield, joined in deed to eldest brother Samuel; d. 23 June, 1750; will, at Tronston, N. J.; proved 28 same month, mentions wife Temperance, only son Jonathan and three daughters. (Probate Records, Liber E, p. 435.)

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HANNAH ODELL, in 1725, renewed the Covenant in Stratfield Church; in 1730, with brother John, and as children of Eustace Samuel Odell, deceased, gave deed to eldest brother Samuel Odell of Stratfield. UNICE ODELL, in 1704, as daughter of Samuel Odell, renewed the Covenant. MARY ODELL, in 1707, as daughter of Samuel Odell, renewed the Covenant.

AZARIAH ODELL, of Stratfield; in 1737, received deed from his father Hezekiah Odell; in 1762, appointed surveyor at Fairfield; in 1762, made guardian of minor, Odell, minor, of Fairfield; in 1774, one of a committee of gentlemen in regard to certain proceedings of Continental Congress; in 1777, estate inventoried at Fairfield. (Fairfield Town Records.)

ANNE, dau. Cornelius and Rachael (Horton) Mandeville, of Cornwall Manor, N. Y.; b. 27 Nov., 1760; d. 15 Aug., 1825, bur. Sleepy Hollow Cemetery; Mr. Mandeville's will, dated 24 Mar., 1768, mentions daughter Anne; Jelia Mandeville, the founder of the family, came to America in the "Beaver" in April, 1639; will in New-York, dated 15 Sept., 1696. (N. Y. Gen. and Bio. Record, Vol. XVI, p. 95.)

GERSHOM ODELL, of Fairfield; in 1742, received deed of land from his father, Hezekiah Odell, of Fairfield; in 1756, estate administered on by Eunice Odell, of Fairfield, single woman; in 1765 described as Gershom Odell, late of Fairfield, in distribution of his estate, with mention of widow and children William and Ruth. (Fairfield Town and Probate Records.)

JOHANNA, dau. Daniel S. and Rebecca (Brown) Wilcox, of Greenburgh, b. 30 Dec., 1769; issue, seven sons and four daughters. Mr. Wilcox's will, at White Plains, dated 17 Feb., 1831, proved 25 Jan., 1833, makes bequest to Anna, wife of William Odell, of New-York City, and mentions, among others, granddaughters, Rebecca, wife of William Odell. (Probate Records, Liber O, p. 169.)

ANNE (Niece of Rev. Jonathan Odell, N. J.; 25 Sept., 1737; graduate College of New Jersey, class 1754; surgeon British Army and afterward rector of St. Ann's Church, Burlington, N. J.; joint author "Loyal Veterans of Stanbury and Odell"; removed to Fredericton and appointed Secretary Province of New Brunswick; d. 25 Nov., 1818. (Hills Hist. Church in Burlington, N. J.)

JOHANNA ODELL, mentioned in father's will. EUNICE ODELL, mentioned in father's will and perhaps that Eunice Odell who, in 1796, administered on the estate of Gershom Odell, deceased. ELIZABETH ODELL, mentioned in father's will.

HON. ABRAHAM ODELL, of Greenburgh, b. 4 Jan., 1760; lived in the American Army in Van Bergen's Regiment during the war of the Revolution; member of New-York State Assembly 1785-86 and 1807-10; d. 26 Feb., 1807; Phoebe Odell, his youngest wife, b. 27 Feb., 1804; mar. Rufus King, Esq., of New-York City 13 Oct., 1823; their son, Rufus King, the compiler of this Pedigree. (degree of King of Salem, Mass.)

HANNAH, dau. Bishop and Ann Underhill, 3 Oct., 1822; a descendant of Capt. John and Elizabeth (Fiske) Underhill; issue, one son, Cornelius, d. 26 June, 1823. Mrs. Odell died 21 June, 1823. (Underhill Pedigree.)

WILLIAM ODELL, of Greenburgh, b. 18 Mar., 1762; served in Col. Van Bergen's Regiment during the War of the Revolution, and held, later, a Colonel's commission in a Westchester County Regiment; in 1812, named in his father's will with bequest of an estate called the Homestead; removed to Kendall, Orleans Co., N. Y., and d. there 14 Feb., 1836; bur. in Beechwood Cemetery, West Kendall. (White Plains Probate, Liber I, p. 157.)

JOHANNA, dau. Daniel S. and Rebecca (Brown) Wilcox, of Greenburgh, b. 30 Dec., 1769; issue, seven sons and four daughters. Mr. Wilcox's will, at White Plains, dated 17 Feb., 1831, proved 25 Jan., 1833, makes bequest to Anna, wife of William Odell, of New-York City, and mentions, among others, granddaughters, Rebecca, wife of William Odell. (Probate Records, Liber O, p. 169.)

ELIZABETH, dau. Dr. Elisha Newell (Niece of Rev. Jonathan Odell, N. J.; 25 Sept., 1737; graduate College of New Jersey, class 1754; surgeon British Army and afterward rector of St. Ann's Church, Burlington, N. Lyndford, Royal Engineers, who d. at Gibraltar, 1813; issue, seven children. SARAH ANNE ODELL, b. 21 May, 1789; mar. Charles Lee, Esq., of Lancaster, Kingsbury, N. H.; no issue. (Odell Family Papers.)

RENEVILLE MANDEVILLE ODELL, (Odell) Underhill, 3 Oct., 1822; a descendant of Capt. John and Elizabeth (Fiske) Underhill; issue, one son, Cornelius, d. 26 June, 1823. Mrs. Odell died 21 June, 1823. (Underhill Pedigree.)

HANNAH, dau. Bishop and Ann Underhill, 3 Oct., 1822; a descendant of Capt. John and Elizabeth (Fiske) Underhill; issue, one son, Cornelius, d. 26 June, 1823. Mrs. Odell died 21 June, 1823. (Underhill Pedigree.)

WM. DYCKMAN ODELL, of Brooklyn, N. Y., b. 17 Dec., 1794, d. 17 Nov., 1875, bur. in Greenwood Cemetery, Brooklyn. Will in Brooklyn, proved 23 Feb., 1876, mentions wife Susanna and others. Mr. Dyckman for many years filled an important and responsible position in the United States Custom House at New-York. (Obituary in N. Y. Evening Post.)

SUSANNA, dau. Moses and Hannah (Field) Fowler, of Mount Pleasant, West Co., N. Y. Mr. Fowler d. 10 Oct., 1815, aged 57; his wife d. 18 Dec., 1829, aged 69; both bur. at White Plains. Mr. Fowler's will, there proved, 5 Dec., 1815, mentions son William and ten daus., including Susanna. Mrs. Odell's will, in Brooklyn, was proved 5 July, 1876.

ELIZABETH, dau. Dr. Elisha Newell (Niece of Rev. Jonathan Odell, N. J.; 25 Sept., 1737; graduate College of New Jersey, class 1754; surgeon British Army and afterward rector of St. Ann's Church, Burlington, N. J.; joint author "Loyal Veterans of Stanbury and Odell"; removed to Fredericton and appointed Secretary Province of New Brunswick; d. 25 Nov., 1818. (Hills Hist. Church in Burlington, N. J.)

DR. GEORGE MOUNTAIN ODELL, of Newport, R. I., b. 8 Mar., 1814, in Fredericton; graduate College of New Brunswick, class 1837; of Medical College, University of Edinburgh, class 1841, and of Royal College of Surgeons, Edinburgh, class 1842; practiced medicine for thirty years in Fredericton and afterward in Newport; d. there 21 Apr., 1891, bur. at Fredericton. (N. Y. Gen. & Bio. Record, Vol. XXIV, p. 46.)

WILLIAM ODELL, of Stratfield, Conn., b. about 1666; received grant of land as grandson of William Odell, of Fairfield, deceased; in 1669, was made freeman; in 1664, deed from his father, John Odell; d. 1 June, 1743, at Stratfield; will at Fairfield mentions wife Sarah, two sons, two daughters and others. (Fairfield Probate Records, Liber 1741-8.)

FRANCES ELIZABETH, dau. Samuel Darling, and Orl James (Sherman) Rockwell, of Yonkers, granddau. Ensign Runa and Rachael (Darling) Rockwell, of Ridgebury, Conn., and a descendant of John Rockwell, who was of Stamford, Conn., in 1641 and mar. Elizabeth Weed in 1676. Mrs. Odell mar. a John Hancock Kiker, Esq., counselor at law, of New-York City, 25 Apr., 1877. (Rockwell Genealogy, in preparation.)

HON. MOSES FOWLER ODELL, of Brooklyn, b. in Tarrytown, 24 Feb., 1818; bur. in 1861-66, member of the United States Congress; in 1865, naval officer, port of New-York; d. 13 June, 1866, bur. in Greenwood Cemetery.

SARAH FISH, dau. Hon. Abraham and Jane (Fish) Van Derveer of Brooklyn, N. Y., and granddaughter Hendrick and Maria (Voorhies) Van Derveer. Abraham Van Derveer was member United States Congress from King's Co., N. Y., from 1837-39. Cornelius Janse Van der Veer, the founder of the family in America, came from Holland in 1659 and settled in Flatbush, N. Y. (Bergen Genealogy.)

ELIZABETH, dau. Dr. Elisha Newell (Niece of Rev. Jonathan Odell, N. J.; 25 Sept., 1737; graduate College of New Jersey, class 1754; surgeon British Army and afterward rector of St. Ann's Church, Burlington, N. J.; joint author "Loyal Veterans of Stanbury and Odell"; removed to Fredericton and appointed Secretary Province of New Brunswick; d. 25 Nov., 1818. (Hills Hist. Church in Burlington, N. J.)

Major WM. HENRY ODELL, of Fredericton, b. there 6 May, 1825; in 1869, entered Royal Military College, at Sandhurst, England; in 1871, gazetted to commission in 5th Light Infantry; in 1879, as special service in South Africa and mentioned in despatches; in 1882, promoted to Captain in Osfordshire Light Infantry; in 1893, promoted to Major in same regiment.
