Explanation of the Calender Pages.

THE first column contains the Days of the Month ; the second, the Days of the Week ; the third, remarkable Days, &c. The fourth, the Sun's rising and setting. The fifth, the Moon's Place. The sixth, the Moon's Age. The seventh, Aspects, Weather, &c. The eighth, the Moon's rising and setting. The ninth, the Time of Fall Tide, or High Water ; for instance, suppose you look at the fifth Day of January, it will read thus ; it is Sunday the fifth Day of the Month, and the 2d Sunday after Christmas, sun-rises 37 minutes after seven o'Clock, and Sets 37 minutes before five, the Moon is in Pisces, or the Sign so called, is in the Fish ; the Moon is 4 Days Old, rises 24 minutes after nine o'clock in the Evening, and is High Water Thirty Minutes past Eleven in the Evening.

THE Lines immediately preceding every Sunday throughout the Year, contain the Week of the Year, the Epistle and Gospel used in the Church Service, and the Days length : For instance read the line next before the 5th Day of January, thus, it's the 1st Week in the Year, the second Sunday after Christmas, the Epistle is Titus, Chapter 3d Verse, 4. 7. the Gospel St Matthew 2nd Chapter, 13. 15. Verse ; and the Days length 8 hours 48 minutes, and so of the rest. This Line refers always to the Day next following.

TWO Tars, who knew and cherished the noble principles of Friendship, chanced to be on board the Sandwich go gun-ship, at the relief of Gibraltar, under the command of Lord Howe; one of them being killed, was carried on shore to be buried; his constant friend attended him to this last stage of human action: when the body was laid in the grave, the survivor, struggling with all those manly feelings that ornament the soul of a brave and honest man, articulated this short and fervent prayer in the presence of sundry Noblemen and other officers of the Garrison; "O Lord God Almighty! here lies as good a Sailor as ever slept on shipboard; give him, O God! a birth in the Main Top in Heaven, a smooth Sea, and full Allowance, for Jesus' sake."

The postage of letters from any of the British Colonies in North America, or 100 pds. of his Majesty's dominions in Europe (except to Gibraltar and Port Mahon) may, or may not be paid at the time of putting them into any post-office, at the option of the writer; among the American inland postage to Halifax, which must be paid where the letters are put in, otherwise they must be opened and returned to the postmaster that postage.	
All merchant accounts, not exceeding one sheet of paper, Royal Bills of Exchange, Invoices, and Bills of Lading, to or from any parts or places, not within his Majesty's dominions; and the copies of letters to or from Turkey, and not exceeding one quarter of a sheet of paper are allowed to pass without payment of the Foreign Postage, but are to pay the full inland post to and from London.	
Letters to all parts of Europe, are dispatched from London every Tuesday and Friday, between the 10 & 29 August which are forwarded by the Lisbon mail on Tuesdays only.	
Letters to all parts of America, are dispatched from London the first Wednesday in every Month.	
Letters for the East-Indies dispatched from London, as occasion offers.
