CONSTITUTION OF THE SOCIETY.

The Society shall be called **THE DIOCESAN CHURCH SOCIETY OF NEW-BRUNSWICK.**

II.

No constitution, by-law, rule or regulation of the Society, nor any abrogation, repeal, change or alteration of the same, shall be of any force until it shall have been sanctioned and confirmed by the Bishop of, or administering, the Diocese for the time being, by writing under his hand.

III.

The payment at any one time of a sum not less than Ten Pounds, shall constitute a Life Member; and the payment annually of any sum, however small, shall constitute the person paying the same a Member of the Society.

IV.

The Society shall have a President, who shall be the Lord Bishop of the Diocese; two or more Vice Presidents, of whom the Archdeacon shall be the first; one or more Treasurers; one or more Secretaries; two Auditors of Accounts; and an Executive Committee of twenty-four Lay Members of the Society, being Life Members of the Society, or Subscribers of at least One Pound to the funds of the Society, who, with the exception of the President and Vice Presidents, shall be annually elected at the Anniversary Meeting.

V.

The Officers of the Society and the Clergy of the Diocese shall be *ex officio* members of the Committee: five to be a quorum, and three of the five Laymen.

VI.

The Society shall embrace the following objects and none other, viz.:

1. Missionary Visits to places where there is no settled Clergyman, and aid to new and poor Missions.
2. The establishment of Divinity Scholarships at King's College, Fredericton; and assistance where necessary to those who may be under preparation for the Ministry, especially Sons of Clergymen.
3. Aid to Sunday and other Schools, in which Church principles are taught; and the training and encouraging of Schoolmasters and Catechists.
4. The supply of Books and Tracts in strict conformity with the principles of the Established Church.

5. Aid to the building and enlarging of Churches and Chapels.

6. Aid to the building of Parsonage Houses.

7. The creation of a fund towards the augmentation of the stipends of poor Clergymen—towards making a provision for those who may be incapacitated by age or infirmity—and for the widows and orphans of the Clergy—and towards the education of the children of poor Clergymen.

VII.

The Society will employ no Clergyman on Missionary services, without the Bishop's license and appointment; and will submit its choice of Divinity Scholarships, to his Lordship's approbation.

VIII.

The Society will circulate no Books which are not in the catalogue of the Society for Promoting Christian Knowledge, except such as the Bishop shall approve.

IX.

It shall be competent to any member of the Society to limit his subscription to any one or more of the objects above recited, which he may be most anxious to promote.

X.

The Members of the Society in each Mission, or in each Parish of each Mission, at the discretion of the Missionary, shall constitute a Local Committee.

XI.

It shall be competent to each Committee to recommend any of the above recited objects to the special consideration of the General Committee, in the appropriation of the funds of the Society.

XII.

The Society shall hold its Anniversary Meeting at Fredericton and Saint John alternately; at the latter place on the Thursday after third Tuesday in January, and at the former place on the the Thursday after the second Tuesday in February in each year.

XIII.

The Committee of each Parish or Mission shall hold an Annual Meeting, on some convenient day, previous to the Anniversary Meeting, when the recommendation to the General Committee of special objects shall be determined on.

XIV.

Each Local Committee shall be empowered to depute two of its Lay Members, to be elected at the Annual Meeting of the Committee, to assist the Missionary in submitting the recommendations of the Committee to the consideration of the General Committee.

XV.

For this purpose the Missionaries and the Lay Deputies shall meet in General Committee on the two days, or more if need be, previous to the Anniversary Meeting, to make the annual appropriation of the funds of the Society.

XVI.

The Executive Committee shall meet either at Fredericton or Saint John, on the first Wednesday in January; on the day after the Annual Meeting, on the first Wednesday in March, on the 1st Wednesday in June, and on the Wednesday after the first Tuesday in October.

XVII.

The Clergy are requested to preach annually two Sermons in their respective Churches, with a Collection on each occasion for the General Purposes of the Society.

XVIII.

No Article of the Constitution of this Society shall be rescinded, altered, or amended, except with the concurrence of two-thirds of the Members present at a General Meeting: and notice of any motion shall be given at the General Meeting previous to the one at which such motion is to be made.

PRAYERS OF THE SOCIETY.

BEFORE THEY COMMENCE BUSINESS.

PRAY for us, O Lord, in all our doings, with Thy most gracious favour; and further us with Thy continual help; that in all our works, begun, continued, and ended in Thee, we may glorify Thy holy name, and finally by Thy mercy obtain everlasting life, through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen.*

O God, from whom all holy desires, all good counsels, and all works of piety and charity do proceed, we beseech Thee to visit with Thy favour our Sovereign Lady Queen Victoria; and so rule her heart that she may in all things seek Thy honour and glory. Prosper with Thy blessing the designs of this Society. Comfort with Thy grace those benefactors who contribute to its support. Bless the ministry of Thy servants, the Clergy; the endeavours of all who are engaged in spreading the knowledge of true religion in the dominions of our Sovereign, and the labours of those Missionaries who are promoting the same in this Province. And may Thy Holy Spirit direct all our consultations to the advancement of Thy glory, and the good of Thy Church, through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen.*

O MERCIFUL God, who has made all men, and hatest nothing that thou hast made, nor wouldest the death of a sinner, but that he should be converted and live: Have mercy upon all Jews, Turks, Infidels, and Heretics, and take from them all ignorance, hardness of heart, and contempt of Thy Word; and so fetch them home, blessed Lord, to Thy flock, that they may be saved among the remnant of the true Israelites, and be made one fold under one Shepherd, Jesus Christ our Lord, Who liveth and reigneth with Thee and the Holy Spirit, one God, world without end. *Amen.*

Our Father, which art in heaven, hallowed be thy name. Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done in earth, as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive them that trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation; but deliver us from evil: for thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, for ever and ever. *Amen.*

1847

FEBRUARY 10th, (being the day appointed for the Anniversary Meeting of the Diocesan Church Society of New-Brunswick,) the Clergy and Lay Deputies assembled in General Committee on the previous day, in the National School House at Fredericton :

Reports and Returns from the several Local Committees were read, of which the following is an Abstract.

ANDOVER.—Rev. John McGivern states that from the present general depression of the times, and the consequent scarcity of money, he can do very little to aid the funds of the Society. He acknowledges with thanks the grant of Books made to the Mission last year, with which he has laid the foundation of a lending Library, at one of his Churches, and solicits another grant for the same purpose at the other Church. He reports subscriptions to the amount of £7 7s. 6d. and a Collection in Trinity Church, Tobique, on Feb. 6, of 16s., making a total of £8 3s. 6d. Of this sum only £5 8s. 7d. has yet been paid to the Treasurer.

BATHURST.—Rev. N. Disbrow forwards no report, but returns Collections at the two semi-annual Sermons, of £1 15s. and £2 12s. 6d. making a total of £4 7s. 6d.

CARLETON.—Rev. F. Coster reports Subscriptions and Donations amounting to £12 16s. 4d., which together with a Collection on Trinity Sunday, 1847, of £3 3s. 2d., and one on Jan. 13, 1848, of £3 19s. 2d.; and an additional donation of £1, form a contribution to the funds of the Society of £20 18s. 8d. The Lay Deputies elected to represent this Committee are R. Duncan Wilmot, Esq. and Dr. Robb.

CHATHAM.—Rev. S. Bacon thanks the Society, on behalf of this Committee, for the last year's liberal and seasonable supply of Books, which, he says, proves a valuable acquisition to the Sunday School Library. He states that J. A. Street, Esq. and Wm. Carman, Esq. are appointed Lay Deputies; and further reports Subscriptions to the amount of £16 0s. 3d.; the collection on Trinity Sunday was £6 5s. and that on Jan. 6, £6 5s. 8d., making a total of £28 10s. 11d.

DOUGLAS.—Rev. G. T. Carey, in the absence of the Rev. J. Dunn, reports that Col. Robinson and W. Robinson, Esq. have been elected Lay Deputies by this Committee. He regrets that so little can be done this year in consequence of the sudden fall in the price of Timber; besides which it has been found necessary to expend considerable sums upon local objects. He mentions these circumstances as an apology for the smallness of the present contributions, and hopes the people will contribute more largely in future. He reports Subscriptions to the amount of £2 5s. and Collection in Oct. 1847, of £2, and another on Jan. 23, 1848, of 19s. 7½d. making a total of £5 4s. 7½d.

FREDERICTON.—The Ven. Archdeacon Coster transmits several resolutions passed at meetings of this Local Committee on the desirableness of maintaining the Depositories of the Society in an efficient state, and of holding semi-annual meetings of members of the Church for the purpose of promoting a missionary spirit, imparting information, and furthering the objects of the Church Society. Also resolutions expressing their satisfaction at the increase of the contributions on the part of the Committee as indicating a growing interest in the prosperity of the Society. He states that John Wilkinson and J. C. Allen, Esqrs. are the Lay Deputies, and that the Subscriptions amount to £153 2s. 8d., making with the Collection at the Sermon in July £19 7s., and that on Jan. 23, £21 6s. 1d., and one in St. Anne's Chapel of £1 13s. 4d.—a total of £195 9s. 1d.

GAGETOWN.—Rev. N. A. Coster. This Committee return thanks for the last year's grant of Books, being led to hope from the great use made of the Lending Library that it is a means of diffusing much useful information in the Parish; and also for the grant towards the Parsonage House. T. R. Wetmore and D. S. Kerr, Esqrs. were elected Lay Deputies. The Rev. N. A. Coster reports that the Subscriptions amount to £12 17s. 9d. and that the Collection at one of the two semi-annual Sermons was 16s. 3d.—making a total of £13 14s. 6d.

GLENELG.—Rev. J. Hudson writes that he is requested by the members of this Committee to thank the Society for the grant of Books last year, and to solicit another of works suitable to the children in the Sunday School. He states that the Church at Nelson, to which the Society had granted aid, was consecrated in September last, and requests a further grant towards it; and reports Subscriptions to the amount of £6 6s. 6d. making, with the Collections at the two Sermons of £1 2s. 6d. and £1 2s. 5d. and sale of Books 4s. 5d., a total of £8 15s. 10d.

Mr. Hudson reports the following Collections on the South West Miramichi, viz.: Newcastle, £1 2s. 4d.; Blackville, £1 14s. 7d.; Nelson, £1 1s. 1d.

GRAND MANAN.—Rev. J. Neales returns thanks for the last grant of Books, and solicits another of low priced prayer-books. He also reports Subscriptions to the amount of £6 13s. 3d. and Collections at the semi-annual Sermons of 12s. 9d. and 12s. forming a total of £7 18s.

HAMPTON.—Rev. W. W. Walker, on behalf of this Committee, thanks the Society for the grant to the Church at the French Village, and also for the grant of Books. He reports Subscriptions to the amount of £15 18s. 2d. and the Collections at the semi-annual Sermons £4 and £2 10s. making a total of £22 8s. 2d.

HAMPSTEAD AND PETERSVILLE.—No report or return has been received.

KINGSLEAR.—Rev. E. J. W. Roberts returns Subscriptions to the amount of £4 15s. and Collections at the semi-annual Sermons of £2 4s. 2d. and £1 10s. 1d. the total of £8 9s. 3d.

KINGSTON.—Rev. W. E. Scovil states that the Hon. Col. McLeod, and Samuel J. Scovil, Esq. are elected Lay Deputies in behalf of this Committee, and reports that the Subscriptions amount to £15 14s. 3d., and the Collections at the two Sermons to £5 and £4 5s. 9d.: the total being £25.

LANCASTER.—Rev. T. W. Robertson writes to solicit another grant for the Church at Pisirrinco, and third grants for those at Manawagonish and Dipper Harbour, and also another grant for the Parsonage-House: together with a grant of Books. He reports no Subscriptions: the Collections at the two Sermons he states to be £2 10s. and £1 5s., making a total of £3 15s.

MAUGERVILLE AND BURTON.—Rev. J. M. Sterling, on behalf of the former of those Committees, thanks the Society for the late grant to the Parsonage-House; and on behalf of both, for the grants of Books respectively made to them, which are much in request.
