

## CONSTITUTION OF THE SOCIETY.

T.

The Society shall be called the DIOCESAN CHURCH SOCIETY OF NEW-BRUNSWICK.

II.

No constitution, by-law, rule or regulation of the Society, or any abrogation, repeal, change, or alteration of the same, shall be of any force until it shall have been sanctioned and confirmed by the Bishop of, and administering the Diocese for the time being, by writing under his hand.

III.

The payment at any one time of a sum not less than Ten Pounds, shall constitute a Life Member; and the payment annually of any sum, however small, shall constitute the person paying the same a Member of the Society.

IV.

The Society shall have a President, who shall be the Lord Bishop of the Diocese; two or more Vice Presidents, of whom the Archdeacon shall be the first; one or more Treasurers; one or more Secretaries; two Auditors of Accounts; and an Executive Committee of twenty-four Lay Members of the Society, being Life Members of the Society, or Subscribers of, at least, One Pound to the funds of the Society; who, with the exception of the President and Vice Presidents, shall be annually elected at the Anniversary Meeting.

V.

The Officers of the Society and the Clergy of the Diocese shall be ex-officio members of the committee: five to be a quorum, and three of the five Laymen.

VI

The Society shall embrace the following objects, and none other, viz.:

1. Missionary Visits to places where there is no settled Cler-

gyman, and aid to new and poor Missions.

2. The establishment of Divinity Scholarships at King's College, Fredericton; and assistance, where necessary, to those who may be under preparation for the Ministry, especially Sons of Clergymen.

3. Aid to Sunday and other Schools, in which Church principles are taught, and the training and encouraging of School-

masters and Catechists.

4. The supply of Books and Tracts, in strict conformity with the principles of the Established Church.

5. Aid to the building, and enlarging of Churches and

'Chapels.

6. Aid to the building of Parsonage Houses.

7. The creation of a fund towards the augmentation of the stipends of poor Clergymen—towards making a provision for those who may be incapacitated by age or infirmity—and for the widows and orphans of the Clergy—and towards the education of the children of poor Clergymen.

#### VII.

The Society will employ no Clergyman on Missionary services without the Bishop's license and appointment, and will submit its choice of Divinity Scholarships to his Lordship's approbation.

VIII.

The Society will circulate no Books which are not in the catalogue of the Society for Promoting Christian Knowledge, except such as the Bishop shall approve.

#### 1X.

It shall be competent to any Member of the Society to limit his subscription to any one or more of the objects above recited, which he may be most anxious to promote.

#### X.

The Members of the Society in each Mission, or in each Parish of each Mission, at the discretion of the Missionary, shall constitute a Local Committee.

#### XI.

It shall be competent to each Committee to recommend any of the above recited objects to the special consideration of the General Committee, in the appropriation of the funds of the Society.

#### XII.

The Society shall hold its Anniversary Meeting at Fredericton and Saint John alternately; at the latter place on the Thursday after third Tuesday in January, and at the former place on the Thursday after the second Tuesday in February in each year.

#### XIII.

The Committee of each Parish or Mission shall hold an Annual Meeting, on some convenient day, previous to the Anniversary Meeting, when the recommendation to the General Committee of special objects shall be determined on.

#### XIV.

Each Local Committee shall be empowered to depute two Lay Members of the Society to be elected at the Annual Mecting of the Committee, to assist the Missionary in submitting the recommendations of the Committee to the consideration of the General Committee.

#### XV.

For this purpose the Missionaries and Lay Deputies shall meet in General Committee on the two days, or more if need be, previous to the Anniversary Meeting, to make the annual appropriation of the funds of the Society.

#### XVI.

The Executive Committee shall meet either at Fredericton or Saint John, on the first Wednesday in January, on the day after the Annual meeting, on the first Wednesday in March, on the first Wednesday in June, and on the Wednesday after the first Tuesday in October.

#### XVII.

The Clergy are requested to preach annually two Sermons in their respective Churches, with a Collection on each occasion for the General Purposes of the Society.

#### XVIII.

No Article of the Constitution of this Society shall be rescinded, altered, or amended, except with the concurrence of two-thirds of the Members present at a General Meeting: and notice of any motion shall be given at the General Meeting previous to the one at which such motion is to be made.

## REPORT. &c.

In presenting to the Subscribers of the Diocesan Church Society its Fourteenth Report, it has been thought desirable to say a few words respecting its past operations, its present condition, and its claim for the continued "prayers and alms" of every devout member of the Church.

Beset with difficulties ever attendant upon human institutions, this Society has from its commencement gradually gained strength and importance. By offerings sent in to forward its holy object, each succeeding year has seen the sphere of its usefulness enlarge: aided by its funds, Missionaries have been sent to poor and distant settlements where, else, means sufficient for such objects could not be obtained; in such places Churches and Chapels have been built; in several instances the people have been aided in providing a residence for their Pastor. Bibles, Prayer-books, books of devotion, and religious instruction to a very large amount, have been imported into the Diocese-furnished in many cases gratuitously, in all at a very low rate. Yearly, for some time past, an amount has been set apart to create a fund, from which the Missionary may be aided when enfeebled by labour or age, or for those he may leave helpless in the world when his labours are over; a fund also was accumulated for Missionary objects, and a small amount for the establishment of a Divinity Scholarship at King's College.

Such, in brief, are some of the results of the labours of this Society for the past thirteen years. Comparing the returns of the present year with those contained in the last Report, it will be found that the subscriptions and collections have increased to an amount exceeding £200. The reports from the several Local Committees and from the Missionaries aided by the Society, many of which will be read with interest, shew

an increased contribution from almost every mission. Taking therefore into account the great monetary depression which has so long existed in the Province, all who regard the advancement of this Society must now feel heartily thankful to the Most High and be cheered on to further exertion by the

hope that his blessing attends it.

In this holy work the most humble individual may take a part and the smallest contribution aid. The Society only waits for additional funds in order to extend the ministrations of the Church to every Parish and to every Settlement in this extensive Diocese. Through its means thirteen Missionaries are now employed, and from many places near us and far distant, ignorance, irreligion,-"not a famine of bread nor a thirst for water but of hearing the words of the Lord,"-loudly call for instruction and relief. To this call the Church Society would at once respond, and reach forth to others the blessings so long and so freely vouchsafed to us. For this the Church calls upon Churchmen to combine. For this she calls upon all without exception, rich and poor, "to lay by in store as God hath prospered them," and by the same Apostolic rule she claims in this holy work her children's prayers. She urges them to risc above all minor differences of opinion and party prejudice in One holy, united, zealous, self-denying effort and aid in performing that work with which the Church is yet entrusted and yet responsible, contained in the Redeemer's last command—to "PREACH THE GOSPEL TO EVERY CREATURE."

The Secretary read Reports and Returns from the several Local Committees, of which the following is an abstract:

St. Andrews.—The Rev. J. Alley, D.D., reports that the Local Committee met on the 28th December, 1849, when resolutions were passed expressive of deep thankfulness to Almighty God for the presperous condition of the Society, and the call for increased exertion on the part of its Members. The Committee apply for a grant of Bibles, Prayer Books, and a supply of other Books, for the Lending Library. Contributions for general purposes, £21 6s 8d.

CHATHAM.—The Rev. S. Bacon, on behalf of this Local Committee, which met at Chatham on the 21st November lust, expresses the great satisfaction felt at the increasing prosperity of the Society; and that the Committee consider no better institution could be devised to advance the interest of the Colonial Church, which, therefore, should be warmly supported by every sincere member of the same. With many thanks for the grant of Books last year, he regrets that owing to the continued monetary depression, the contributions do not amount to quite so much as on some preceding years. They are as follows:—Missionary Visits, £15 15s. 11½d; aids to agod and infirm Clergy £1; general purposes, £7 10s. Total, £24 5s. 11¼d. Sale of Books on account of the Fredericton Book Depository, £3 13s. 3¼d.

GREENWICH AND PETERSVILLE.—The Rev. J. Bartholomew writes, that he is directed by the Local Committee in his Mission to convey to the Society their grateful thanks for the liberal allowance made to their Ministers, and their regret that their contributions are not more nearly proportioned thereto, which they trust may be the case in succeeding years. They are, from Petersville, general purposes, £5 5s.; and from Greenwich, £6 14s. 10½d. In all, £11 19s. 10½d.

As the enlargement of the Church at Petersville is in contemplation, to which local resources are inadequate, the Committee urgently solicit aid for that object, and also a small grant for Books, which the Missionary states would prove highly useful.

KINGSCLEAR.—Rev. J. Black, on behalf of this Committee, requests another grant of Books for the Lending Library. Contributions are as follows:—Widows and Orphans, £2; general purposes, £15 6s. 9d. From the upper part of Kingsclear, 9s. 2d. Total, £17 15s. 11d.

THE BEND.—Rev. W. N. Boyer, writes, that the Local Committee met on the 21st January. The state of the Church in his Mission, he considers, is prosperous, Congregations are large and attentive. The site for a Church is marked out, and the requisite documents for securing it are in his possession. In the neighbouring Parisb of Salisbury, land has also been secured, and promises made on which he cau rely, to proceed at once with the erection of a small Chapel.

CARLETON.—The Rev. F. Coster reports Collections and Contributions for the general purposes of the Society, amounting to £19 9s. 8d.

GRAND MANAN.—Rev. G. T. Carey encloses Contributions to the amount of £3, towards which he states the few persons on the island attached to the Church, though poor, have contributed according to their ability.

FREDERICTON.—This Local Committee met on the 6th December, the Venerable the Archdeacon in the Chair, and passed unanimously the following resolutions:—Ist. "That the amount of Contributions from this Parish, under existing circumstances, is an evidence that the Members of the Church here regard the interests of the Church and the benefits derived from the operations of this Society with increased attachment and affection." 2d. "That this Committee, regarding the Diocesan Church Society as the most important channel through which the people of this Province should contribute towards the support and extension of the Church, recommend that means be taken to call the attention of Churchmen in general to the great benefits which the Society has effected, and their imperative duty to maintain it." The Committee also recommended that the powers and duties of the Executive Committee should be more clearly defined; and that a grant for the importation of Books for sale be made by the General Committee to the Depository in this place. Contributions reported as follows:—Books and Tracts, £1; Parsonage Houses, £1; Widows and Orphans, £4 17s. 6d.; General purposes, £167 13s, 3d.

MARYLAND.—Rev. W. Q. Ketchum reports Contributions for this Mission to the amount of £6 1s. 10d. for general purposes, and states that the Leading Library, which contains about 100 vols. is becoming very useful. During the past eyear, Services on a week day have been occasionally held in the Settlements beyond Maryland, at which a good number attended, who not only seemed to engage with devotion in Services which many before had never heard, but were also eager to obtain and to read the Books and Tracts of the Society. A small grant is therefore requested for sale or distribution in those much neglected Settlements.

GAGETOWN.—The Secretary of this Local Committee, J. T. Millidge, Esq., writes, that at its Annual Meeting, held on the 4th February, Resolutions were passed thanking the Society for the grant of Books to the Leading Library, which is found of essential service, and requesting a small grant for the same this year. Contributions reported, general purposes, £6 7s. 10 dd.

SACKVILLE AND DORCHESTER.—The Rev. T. N. DeWolfe is happy in being able to report Collections exceeding in amount those of previous years, which, taking into account the scarcity of money, he considers is a proof that the interest of his people in the Society have not abated. BATHURST.—Rev. N. Disbrow writes, that although he has not failed to impress upon his people the importance of this Society, yet owing to the scarcity of money he has been able to collect only £4 2s. 7½d. He writes, that during the past year he has visited Shippegan, 56 miles from Bathurst, and also Dalhousie and Campbletown. In Soptember last, he admitted into the Church, by baptism, seven persons, the family of a settler, 20 miles from Campbletown. This rite performed in a log cabin, in the solitude of the forest, he states to have been very interesting, and deeply impressive both upon the recipients and the people assembled. As the Books granted for his Parish have been of service, he trusts an additional supply may be obtained.

SIMONDS.—Rev. James Disbrow reports, that the Local Committee at the Annual Meeting, on the 1st January, returned thanks to the Society for the Grant made last year to the Church at Loch Lomond, which, with private subscriptions, have enabled them to add a neat chancel, and make other improvements in the same. Thankful also for the Grant to the Lending Library, which is the means of diffusing much useful information in the Parish, they trust to be remembered in the appropriation this year. Contributions for general purposes, £8 17s. 8d.

UPHAM .- The Rev. W. H. DeVeber reports the formation of a Local Committee in this Mission, on which occasion the following resolutions were passed:-1st. That as members of a pure and Apostolic Church, it is our duty to diffuse as widely as possible the Spiritual privileges which it is our happiness to enjoy. 2d. That the Diocesan Church Society having for its object the propagation of the Gospel, is every way deserving our support, more especially as it seems destined, at no very distant period, to become, under the blessing of God, the chief stay of the Church in this Province. 8d. That the Members of the Church now present do, in accordance with Article X. of the Constitution of the Diocesan Church Society, form themselves into a Local Committee for the furtherance of the Society's objects. 4th. That the thanks of this Committee be tendered to the Society for its liberal Grants to this Parish, and that a further Grant be solicited for the Church at South-Stream. The Missionary writes, that in obtaining Contributions to the Society he has succeeded beyond his most sanguine expectations, all to whom he applied having freely given of their oftentimes limited means. He asks aid of the Society to build a Church at Londonderry, a Settlement thirteen miles in extent, where he now holds Service in the house of a zealous Churchman, which is far too small for the Congregation. The Contributions from this Mission, for general purposes, amount to £24.

HARVEY AND HOPEWELL.—The Rev. C. P. Bliss reports £5 the Contribution to the Society for this new Mission. That the sum is so small is owing to the people having been called upon to aid other objects. Towards the building Church in Harvey, they have subscribed £114; towards one in New Ireland, £30; and for his own support, £45, which he considers good proof of their willingness to aid in planting the Church among them. The Missionary adds, that the Society for Promoting Christian Knowledge has placed at his disposal £150 sterling, being £50 for each of the Churches he purposes to build. This will enable him to finish the Church in New Ireland, but he must ask the assistance of the Society and his friends, to build a Church in Harvey and another in Hopewell—a work which, by God's blessing, he trusts ere long to see accomplished.

PRINCE WILLIAM AND DUMFRIES.—In the name of this Local Committee, the Rev. J. Elwell begs to thank the Society for the Grant of Books which have been and are in much request. The Committee regrets that the amount of their Contribution is so small, but hope in coming years to be enabled to increase it. They are, for general purposes, £8 2s. 8d.

St. John.—R. Parker, jun., Esquire, as Secretary of this Local Committee, reports Contributions as follows:—Missionary Visits, £4 5s.; Schools, £1 10s.;

Books and Tracts, £5; Parsonage Houses, £4 2s. 6d.; Widows' and Orphans' Fund, £4 17s. 6d.; General Purposes, £270 5s. 3d.—Total, £290 1s. 3d.

PORTLAND.—The Rev. W. Harrison reports Contributions from this Parish, amounting to £31 7s. 5½d.; and in a letter to the Lord Bishop, regrets that the illness of a Parishioner prevents his attendance at the Meeting of the Society.

ANDOVER.—The Rev. S. J. Hanford, on behalf of this Mission, acknowledges the grant of Books last year. Two Lending Libraries are now formed in the Parish, consisting respectively of 93 and 76 Volumes, which are greatly valued by the people. The Missionary expresses a very earnest desire to increase this means of instruction which is so wanting in remote districts. The grant made to the X Clurch at the Grand Falls has enabled the Committee to enclose it. Further aid is solicited in order that a work of so great importance as the completion of the Church in that place may be accomplished in the ensuing season. In addition to the Services held in the two Churches in this Parish, the Missionary visits the Grand Falls every fourth Sunday, holding an Evening Service at another place on his return home. Contributions from this Mission as follows:—Widows' and Orphans' Fund, £1 10s.; General Purposes, £11 15s. 4d.—Total, £13 5s. 4d.

GLENELG AND THE WEST SETTLEMENTS ON THE MIRAMICHI.—The Rev. J. Hudson reports that the annual meeting of the Glenelg Committee was held on the first of January, immediately after morning prayers. As usual, the Missionary availed himself of the opportunity of enumerating the holy objects embraced by the Diocesan Church Society, und impressing upon all then present the necessity for active exertion and support in behalf of this humble hand-maid of the English Church. Here, as elsewhere in his extensive mission, the people express their thankfulness for the hensits conferred on them through the medium of this institution, and the Missionary is satisfied that the want of money alone prevents many of them from increasing their annual offerings. These for the present year are as follows:—Nelson, £3 19s. 2d.; Ludlow, 19s. 2d.; Blackville, £5 10s. 9d.; Glenelg, £9 0s. 4d.; Newcastle (not including what has been collected by Mr. Baoon), £2 3s.; Books sold, £1 6s. 9d.—Total, £22 19s. 9d.

At the meeting referred to, resolutions were passed expressive of great satisfaction at the advances made by the Diocesan Church Society and earnestly appealing to all "truly conscientious sons of the Church of England" to remember in their prayers its various works of mercy and to aid the same with their alms. It was also recommended to the Society to aid the Missionary in his endeavours to unish the Church at Newcastle. In this work during the past year good progress has been made; the Church consists of a Nave, Chancel, Vestry and Porch. The external Walls of which are completed. As the means for finishing the Church are still deficient the Missionary hopes for such aid from the Society as will strengthen his hand and animate with new zeal the little flock which has been gathered

together by the blessing of God upon his very humble labours.

"It might be interesting," the Missionary adds, "to the Sc laty to learn that the Churches at Glenelg, Nelson and Blackville, (all which is a sisted by its charity), are still served by him as regularly as possible. Divine Service is also read in a School House at Newcastle every alternate Sunday evening, and occasional visits are paid to Peint Le'Cuminac, Ludlow, Bois Town, and Northesk—a poor Settlement on the North-West branch of the River, where there seems a favourable opening for the ministrations of the Church. During the Bishop's late visitation tour through this tract of country sixty-three persons were confirmed, several of whom (chiefly young people) have since become partakers of the Holy Communion. Thus the good seed has not fallen quite without a blessing. Laus Dee!

Before closing this communication the Travelling Missionary desires to return his best thanks to the members of the Diocesan Church Society who through evil

report and good report have so long befriended him and his poor district; and to reiterate the assurance, should that assurance be necessary, that if he knows anything of his own heart, he is still, after ten years' trial, 'willing to spend and be spent' pro Ecclesia Dei.''

SHEDIAC.—The Rev. Dr. Jarvis reports that the contributions as well as collections at Sermons from his mission exceed those of the last year. They are as follows:—Shediac, £3 10s. 6d.; Cocaigne, 9s. 6d.; 1st Sermon, £1; 2d ditto, £1 5s.—Total, £6 5s.

St. Mary's.—The Rev. W. Jaffrey, in forwarding the report of this Local Committee, adds much of interest relating to the state of the Church in this mission, which for the last three years has been under the fostering care of the Diocesan Church Society. On his first entering upon his labours about four years since, the Missionary writes, he found the Church out of repair, and the people scattered "as Sheep having no Shepherd," it being difficult to collect at the only Church then in the Parish a congregation numbering 20 persons. He now holds three Sunday Services at different places, besides occasionally on a week day, at which the attendance at one place ranges from 12 to 20, at the second from 40 to 60, at the third from 40 to 100. And the people, besides contributing to the support of the Missionary, have largely aided in the completion of a neat and commodious Church, and they gladly give, according to their means, towards the support of the Diocesan Church Society. The Missionary adds that he has baptized in this mission seventy persons, seven of whom were adults, and one of the advanced age of 70 years, and eighteen persons have been confirmed by the Lord Bishop.

WESTFIELD.—The Rev. C. Milner, in forwarding contributions from this mission, expresses regrets that the poverty of his Parishioners renders the amount so small; for general purposes, £2 19s. 10½d.

Sussex.—The Rev. Thos. McGlee writes that his people having been solicited to contribute to two objects—the Diocesan Church Society and the repairs of the Parsonage—have with the exception of a small settlement called the "Butternut Ridge" preferred to give to the latter object. He trusts that in future years their contributions will revert to the funds of the Society. From Butternut Ridge, Missionary Visits, £1 2s. 6d.; general purposes, £2 11s. 9d.—Total, £3 14s. 3d.

St. George's.—The Rev. J. McGivern reports that nt a meeting of this Local Committee, resolutions were unanimously passed to the following effect:—

I. That the principle upon which this Society is founded, by uniting into one body the Members of the Church for support and action, is, we believe, under God calculated to promote the growth and prosperity of the Church.

II. This Committee desire to record their thanks to Almighty God for the continued blessing upon the labours of this Society, among which they view none with more satisfaction, than the sending forth to the poor, Clergymen duly ordained to search and bring into the Fold "the Sheep for whom the Shepherd died."

The Contributions, the Missionary adds, though not so large as he could wish, were willingly made, and the scarcity of money is the only cause why the amount

is not greater. They are for general purposes, £12 10s. 7d.

RICHIBUCTO.—Rev. James Neales writes that at a meeting of this Local Committee held immediately after Morning Prayer, at St. Mary's Church, on the 4th January, it was resolved "that the increasing usefulness and prosperity of the Society is matter of unfeigned satisfaction"; and the Committee return sincere

thanks for the liberal grant towards the purchase of a Parsonage and for the Books for the Lending Library. Contributions for general purposes amount in all to £26 5s.

Springfield.—The Rev. R. D. Palmer regrets that owing to severe illness he was unable to call a meeting of this Local Committee; he forwards contributions and Collections at Sermons, amounting to £11, and requests a grant to aid in building a Church in the Irish Settlement.

MAUGERVILLE AND BURTON.—The Rev. J. M. Stirling, in forwarding contributions from his mission, which he is glad to say exceed those of the past year, is desired by the Local Committee to thank the Society for the grant of Books, and to hope they may be remembered in the appropriation for that object this year. He rejoices to hear of the increasing prosperity of the Society, and trusts it may go on yearly increasing in numbers and in means, until it is enabled, by God's blessing, to send forth the ministrations of our beloved Church to long destitute portions of this extensive Diocese. Contributions from Burton for general purposes are £11 2s. 9d., and from Maugerville, for general purposes, £10 11s. 6d.; total £21 14s. 3d.

NORTON.—Rev. W. Scovil reports amount of contributions from his mission, for general purposes, to be £20 14s. 5d.

KINGSTON.—Rev. W. E. Scovil writes, that this Local Committee met on the 29th December, 1849, and unanimously adopted the following resolution:—"That, sincerely attached as we are to the distinctive principles of our Church, we rejoice in the successful progress of our Diocesan Church Society, and are desirous that all Churchmen in the Province should heartily unite in promoting its prosperity.—That we are persuaded this general co-operation will be better secured by cultivating that liberality of sentiment, which, without confounding truth with error, requires every one to allow to others that liberty of thinking and acting which he claims for himself." Contributions for general purposes, £24.

Douglas.—Rev. A. V. Stewart forwards a resolution passed at the meeting of this Committee, held at the Rectory, on the 29th December, 1849, in which they acknowledge the great benefits they have received from the Lending Library by the late Grant, for which they return sincere thanks. He writes, that the sum collected at this time, though small, he is confident will, by the blessing of God, be increased next year. The willingness and liberality with which, in several instances, Contributions were given, evinced how highly the Society is estimated among his people. This disposition has been in a great measure created by means of the Books and Tracts imported by the Society. The Missionary adds, that he makes it his endeavour to impress upon all under his charge the indispensable duty of giving some portion of their substance, and of practising some self-denial to further and enlarge God's kingdom upon earth. Contributions are as follows:—Westmorland, £5 13s. 7½d.; Botsford, 14s. 3d.; Sermon, October 11th, £1 10s.; Sale of Books, £1 2s. 1½d.—Total, General purposes, £9.

Woodstock.—Rev. S. D. Lee Street encloses several Resolutions passed at a meeting of this Local Committee on the 18th December, 1849, expressive of thanks for the Grant of Books to the Lending Librsries, which are becoming very valuable, and asking further appropriations to these objects. The Committee also return thanks to the Society for the Grant towards the Curato's Stipend. At the Meeting alluded to it was also resolved, "That it is our bounden duty as Churchmen to promote to the utmost of our ability the objects of the Diocesun Church Society, as a most ready means of imparting to others the principle of Christianity, and of carrying out our blessed Saviour's last injunction, "Go ye and teach all nations," and may God's grace be with our individual and united exercions in the furtherance of so good and holy a cause. It might be satisfactory, Mr. Street adds, to the Society to learn that by the aid given for the services of the Curate in the four Churches, and two other stations in this Mission, five Services are performed every Sunday, no do which between forty and fifty miles are travelled, besides attending the Sunday School and occasional Services during the week. Mr. Street strongly urges upon the consideration of the Society the propriety of adopting some system by which Subscriptions made for the support of the Clergy could be more punctually paid, and those dependant upon them be relieved from much anxiety and annoyance. Contributions from this Mission amount to £31 9s. 2½1.

QUEENSBURY .- The Rev. H. W. Tippett reports on behalf of this Committee, a grateful sense of the kindness of the Society in its timely Grant to this Mission, and Contributions amounting to £4 5s. 3d. The Committee apply for a Grant towards liquidating the debt of the Parsonage lately erected. The Missionary adds, for the information of the Society, much interesting matter regarding the state of the Church in this Parish, of which a brief abstract is subjoined. Two years ago, when appointed to this Mission, there was no Church or Parsonage House; the Church property was in the hands of trespassers, and the Members of the Church to a great extent alienated from her Communion. Happily there were a few whorose above this condition, by whose cordial co-operation and kind assistance from other quarters, and especially from this Society, a favourable change has, by the Divine blessing, been effected. One neat Church has been erected, progress made in the second; a Parsonage has been provided; a Sunday School and Lending Library established; fifteen infants have been baptized; sixteen couples married. The holy Communion is administered every month to about twenty Communicants. Public worship is performed at three points in the Mission, at which the attendance ranges from twenty to seventy, and in the Parish Church the children are catechised after the second lesson, as often as circumstances will permit.

LANCASTER.—Rev. T. W. Robertson forwards, with the Contributions from this Mission (which amount to £13 4s. 6d.) several Resolutions expressive of their gratitude to "the Giver of every good and perfect gift" for the beneficial effects of the Diocesan Church Society, and their determination, with the Divine blessing, to continue their efforts to support the same. Thanking the Society for the aid afforded towards the support of their Minister, which they pray will be continued, the Committee pledge themselves to contribute according to their ability to the same important object. They thank the Society for the grant of Books and ask for a further supply, and also a grant in aid of individual subscription towards the enlargement of the Parish Church by a Chancel. The Missionary adds, that the state of the Church in this Mission is very encouraging, and he trusts, that by God's

blessing on his feeble and imperfect services, time will prove that he "has not run in vain, neither laboured in vain."

ST. PATRICK AND ST. DAVID.—Rev. S. J. Thompson regrets that the amount of Contributions are not larger, but ascribes the deficiency to the great emigration to California and the United States, which, during the past year, has drained this part of the country of money and inhabitants. But, the Missionary adds, while pecuniary matters are thus for the present only, I trust, depressed, I rejoice from my immost heart, and ascribe the glory to God, that the Church has in the past and previous years increased by the addition of thirteen Communicants, many of them quite young, "remembering their Creator in the days of their youth," and all, I bolieve, humbly striving to conform and fashion their lives and conversation to the example of Christ. Contribations for general purposes, £5.

ST. STEPHENS.—Robert Watson, Esquire, as Secretary of this Committee, encloses a Subscription List amounting to £16, for the general purposes of the Society.

Weldford.—The Rev. D. J. Wetmore reports Contributions for general purposes, £7, which were obtained chiefly by taking in the produce of the country. He trusts that an increase in the amount next year will be proportionate to that of this year on their parts.

HARIPTON.—The Rev. W. W. Walker is glad to report an increased amount of Contributions this year. They were obtained principally by himself, and are not limited to any special object. General purposes, £23 17s. 7d.

A Subscription has since been reported from Samuel Scovil, Esq., Queen's County, £1 3s. 4d., collected by him at White's Point, 16s. 8d.—Tetal, £2.
