BY-LAWS OF THE TOWNSHIP OF RALEIGH,

No. 508—A BY-LAW

To appropriate certain sums of money for the improvement of the Roads and Bridges in Township of Raleigh.

Be it enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of Raleigh, in the County of Kent.

1. That the following sums be and they are hereby appropriated for the improvement of the Roads and Bridges in the Township of Raleigh, that is to say :

- In the First Rural Road Division, the sum of Three Hundred Dollars,
- In the Second Rural Road Division, the sum of Three Hundred Dollars.
- In the Third Rural Road Division, the sum of Three Hundred Dollars.
- In the Fourth Rural Road Division, the sum of Three Hundred Dollars.
- In the Fifth Rural Road Division, the sum of Three Hundred Dollars.

And that the Commissioners of the said R. R. Divisions respectively expend the same: On the Town Lines between the Town of Chatham and Raleigh the sum of Twenty-five dollars, and that G. H. Dolsen be Commissioner to expend the same.

On the Town Line between Raleigh and Harwich, the sum of One Hundred dollars, and that T. L. Pardo be Commissioner to expend the same.

On the Town Line between Raleigh and Tilbury East, from the centre of the Eighth Concession, northerly to the River Thames, the sum of Fifty dollars, and that E. S. Dyke be Commissioner to expend the same.

On the Town Line between Raleigh and Tilbury East, from the centre of the Eighth concession southerly to Lake Erie, the sum of Seventy-five dollars, and that Levi B. Marshall be Commissioner to expend the same. Providing always that the next four preceding amounts are appropriated conditionally on the adjoining municipalities appropriating equal amounts for the said purposes respectively.

2. That the following sums accruing from Statute Labor tax be expended in the Statute Labor Divisions from which the same was collected as reported by the Clerk, that is to say :

- In the First Rural Road Division, the sum of One Hundred and Ten 70-100 dollars.
- In the Second " " the sum of Ninety-seven dollars.
- In the Third " " the sum of sixty-one dollars.
- In the Fourth " " the sum of twenty-five dollars.
- In the Fifth " " the sum of twenty-three dollars.

And that the Commissioners of Rural Road Divisions superintend the expenditure of the same in their respective divisions.

3. That it shall be the duty of the said Commissioners so appointed, to expend the sums hereinbefore appropriated for the purpose, and in the manner so provided; and they are hereby authorized to grant orders on the Treasurer of this Corporation, to parties filling contracts thereon, not exceeding the amounts so appropriated for such purposes respectively; less the amounts hereinunder specified as overdrawn by the Commissioners of the preceding year, stating on such order the nature of the work done, and where it was performed. Provided always that no Commissioner shall exceed the amounts hereinbefore appropriated, without having first obtained the consent of the Council, and the Treasurer notified thereof by the Clerk.

4. That it shall be the duty of the Treasurer to charge the respective accounts with the following sums, shown by the Auditors' Report to be overdrawn, viz.:

In Rural Road Division No. 1, \$213.49. In Rural Road Division No. 3, \$21.21.
In Rural Road Division No. 4, \$12.15.

5. That Elbert S. Dyke be and he is hereby appointed Commissioner to superintend the Pike Drainage and Pumping Works, with the powers contained in the third clause of this By-law.

No. 509—A BY-LAW

To raise by way of loan the sum of \$1900, for the purpose of building a schoolhouse and enlarging the school site, in and for school section number five, of the Township of Raleigh in the County of Kent.

WHEREAS, the Public School Trustees of school section number five, in the Township of Raleigh, have, in terms of the one-hundred and twenty-ninth section of "The

Public Schools Act," by requisition dated the sixteenth day of March, A. D. 1889, and certified as having been submitted to and approved by the duly qualified school electors of the said school section, at a special meeting called for that purpose on the twenty-first day of February, A. D. 1889, made application to the Municipal Council of the said Township of Raleigh, to raise by way of loan the sum of one thousand and nine-hundred dollars, for the purpose of building a school house and enlarging the school site in and for the said school section.

And whereas, the total amount required to be raised annually by special rate, to discharge the several instalments of principal and interest accruing due on such debt, is the sum of four-hundred and thirty-eight dollars and eighty-five cents.

And whereas, the amount of the whole rateable property in the said school section, according to the last revised Assessment Roll, in the sum of two hundred and fifteen thousand four hundred and ten dollars.

And whereas, there is no existing debenture debt of the said school section.

Therefore, the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the said Township of Raleigh, enacts as follows :

1. That the Reeve and Treasurer of the said Township of Raleigh, may borrow on the credit of the Corporation of the said Township of Raleigh, the sum of one thousand and nine hundred dollars, being the funds required for the purposes hereinbefore recited, together with interest at the rate of 5 per cent. per annum, payable annually, and may issue debentures of the Corporation for that amount, and to cover interest thereon, payable within five years from the date thereof at the Canadian Bank of Commerce, in the Town of Chatham, such debentures to be of the amounts and payable at the times as follows, that is to say :

2. That for the purpose of paying the said sum of one thousand and nine hundred dollars, and to cover interest thereon at the rate of five per centum per annum for five years, a special rate sufficient to raise the sum of four hundred and thirty-eight dollars and thirty-five cents (\$438.35), shall, over and above all other rates, be levied in the same manner and at the same time as taxes are levied, upon the whole rateable property of the said school section number five for the period of five years after the final passing of this By-law, during which time the said debentures have to run.

3. This By-law shall come into force and take effect on the day of the final passing thereof. Passed in open Council this twenty-third day of April, A. D. 1889.

No. 510—A BY-LAW

To regulate the granting of Licenses and limiting the number thereof to be granted in the Township of Raleigh, in the County of Kent.

WHEREAS, in consequence of the repeal of the "Canada Temperance Act," in the County of Kent, it is expedient to provide for regulating the number of licenses, and the amount for which the same shall be granted in the said Township of Raleigh.

Therefore the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of Raleigh, enacts as follows :

1. That the number of licenses to be granted in the Township of Raleigh, shall not exceed three.

2. That the duties to be imposed for Tavern Licenses in the said Township shall be the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars each.

No. 511—A BY-LAW

To provide for Draining part of the Township of Raleigh by the construction of the Payne Drain, and for borrowing on the credit of the Municipality the sum of \$370.79 for completing the same.

PROVISIONALLY ADOPTED the 23rd day of April, A. D. 1889.

WHEREAS, a majority in number of the owners, as shown by the last Revised Assessment Roll of the property hereinafter set forth to be benefitted by the construction of the Payne Drain, have petitioned the Council of the said Township of Raleigh, praying that a drain be constructed commencing on lot 21, in the Second Concession by the Eastern Boundary, thence to the 19 and 20 Side Road; thence along said road and across part of lot 18, in the Fifth Concession, to an outlet in the Backus Drain.

AND WHEREAS thereupon, the said Council procured an examination to be made by W. G. McGeorge, P. L. S., being a person competent for such purpose, of the said Drain proposed to be constructed, and has also procured plans and estimates of the work to be made by the said W. G. McGeorge, and an assessment to be made by him of the real property to be benefitted by such construction, stating as nearly as he can the proportion of benefit which in his opinion, will be derived in consequence of such drainage by every road and lot or portion of lot; the said Assessment so made, being the Assessment hereinafter in this By-law enacted to be assessed and levied upon the lots and parts of lots hereinafter in that behalf specially set forth and described, and the report of the said W. G. McGeorge in respect thereof, and of the said proposed work being as follows:

CHATHAM, 18th April, 1899.

To the Reeve, Deputy-Reeves and Municipal Council of Raleigh:

GENTLEMEN,—We beg to report to your Honorable Body, that we have made an instrumental examination over the course of the proposed Payne Drain, in the Township of Raleigh, and find that the locality is very much in need of the improvement. The Drain will begin on Lot 21, in the 2d Con., E. B. L., a little east of the line of lots 21 and 22, and a little south of the line between the Se ½ and the Nw ¼ of said lot, and it will thence run generally southwesterly to the 19 and 20 Side Road, and thence along the westerly side of this Side Road to the south side of the road between the 5th and 6th Concessions W. B. L., and thence along the easterly side of the Side Road to the westerly angle of lot 20, in the 2nd Concession, E. B. L., thence southwesterly and northwesterly in lot 19, in the 5th Concession, W. B. L., to its termination in the Backus Drain. We estimate the cost of the work to be as follows:

This sum we assess as in the annexed Schedule on the lands and roads benefitted and using the drain as an outlet. The drain when completed to be kept in repair and maintained at the expense of the lands and roads assessed for its construction, said lands and roads paying in the same relative proportion as for construction. And whereas, the said Council are of opinion that the work so reported on by the Engineer is necessary and desirable.

Be it therefore enacted by the said Municipal Council of the said Township of Raleigh, pursuant to the provisions of "The Municipal Act," and amendments thereto.

1st. That the said report, plans and estimates be adopted, and the said Drain and the works connected therewith be made and constructed in accordance therewith.

2nd. That the Reeve of the said Township may borrow on the credit of the Corporation of the said Township of Raleigh, the sum of Three Hundred and Seventy Dollars and Seventy-Nine Cents, being the portion of the funds necessary for the work not hereinafter otherwise provided for; and may issue Debentures of the Corporation for that amount and interest, but subject to consolidation, in sums of not less than One Hundred Dollars each, payable within three years from the date thereof with interest at the rate of five per centum per annum, that is to say, in three consecutive annual payments, to be of such amount that the aggregate amount payable for principal and interest in any year shall be equal as nearly as may be to the amount payable for principal and interest during each of the other years of such period of three years; such Debentures to be made payable at the Branch of the Canadian Bank of Commerce in the Town of Chatham.

3rd. That for the purpose of paying the sum of three hundred and seventy 79-100 dollars being the amount charged against the said lands to be benefitted as aforesaid, other than roads belonging to the Municipality, and to cover interest thereon for three years at the rate of five per centum per annum, the following special rates, over and above all other rates, shall be assessed and levied (in the same manner and at the same time as taxes are levied), upon the undermentioned lots and parts of lots, and the amount of the said special rates and interest assessed as aforesaid against each lot or part of lot respectively, shall be divided into three equal parts, and one such part shall be assessed and levied as aforesaid, in each year for three years, after the final passing of this By-law, during which said debentures have no run.

4th. That the sum of One hundred and Eight Dollars, being the total amount assessed against the said roads of the said Municipality, shall be paid by the Treasurer of this Corporation out of the general funds of the Municipality.

5th. That Gilbert H. Dolsen be and he is hereby appointed Commissioner to let the contract or contracts for the construction of the said drain and works connected therewith, by public sale to the lowest bidder (not exceeding the estimate), but every such contractor, with one good and sufficient surety, shall be required forthwith to enter into bonds for the due performance and completion of such contract according to said plans and specifications, and within the time mentioned in such bond, (unless otherwise ordered by the Council); and it shall be the duty of said Commissioner to cause the said works to be made and completed in accordance with such plans and specifications; and to grant orders on the Treasurer to each contractor, less twenty per cent. of the amount due, until the contract is fully completed and duly accepted by the Council; and for the due performance of these and all duties of Commissioner the said Commissioner shall be entitled to receive a sum of Twenty Dollars, and shall be held personally responsible for the completion of the work and payment of the money as herein provided.

6th. That this By-law shall be published by serving a copy thereof on each ratepayer assessed therefor, three weeks previous to the final passing thereof, and may be cited and referred to as "The Payne Drain By-law," and shall take effect on and after the final passing hereof.

D. 1889, and certified as having been submitted to and approved by the duly qualified school electors of the said school section, at a special meeting called for that purpose on the seventh day of May, A. D. 1889, made application to the Municipal Council of the said Township of Raleigh, to raise by way of loan the sum of two thousand dollars, for the purpose of building a school house required in and for the said school section.

And whereas the total amount required to be raised annually by special rate to discharge the several instalments of principal and interest accruing due on such debt, is the sum of two hundred and fifty-nine 1-100 dollars.

And Whereas, the amount of the whole rateable property in the said School Section, according to the last revised Assessment Roll, in the sum of Two Hundred and Fifty-Seven Thousand, Two Hundred and Forty Dollars.

And whereas there is no existing debenture debt of the said school section.

Therefore, the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the said Township of Raleigh, enacts as follows :

1. That the Reeve and Treasurer of the said Township of Raleigh, may borrow on the credit of the Corporation of the said Township of Raleigh, the sum of two thousand dollars, being the funds required for the purpose hereinbefore recited, together with interest at the rate of five per cent. per annum, payable annually; and may issue debentures of the Corporation for that amount, and to cover interest thereon, payable within ten years from the date thereof, at the Canadian Bank of Commerce, in the Town of Chatham; such debentures to be for the amounts; and payable at the times following, that is to say :

Nc. 513—A BY-LAW

To amend By-law No. 507, entitled "A By-law to appoint certain Municipal Officers, in the Township of Raleigh."

Be it enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of Raleigh, 1. That By-law numbered 507 be amended and the appointment of certain Municipal Officers confirmed as follows :

That John C. Bell be appointed overseer in Statute Labor Division No. 6, in place of Richard Allen; that Alexander Dolsen be appointed overseer in Statute Labor Division No. 19, in place of R. P. Dolsen; that G. H. Morrison be appointed overseer in Statute Labor Division No. 27, in place of John McComble; that James Rhodes be appointed overseer in Statute Labor Division No. 29, in place of G. H. Morrison; that John J. Doyle be appointed overseer in Statute Labor Division No. 51, in place of F. W. Wilson; that William Gill be appointed overseer in Statute Labor Division No. 68, in place of Samuel Irving; that Farmer Bennett be appointed poundkeeper in R. R. Division No. 1, in place of Thomas Irwin; that Joseph Sharon be appointed overseer in Statute Labor Division No. 67, in place of John Sullivan; that Geo Johnston be appointed poundkeeper in R. R. 2. That Statute Labor Division No. 30 be abolished and that lots 16 to 18 in said division be added to Statute Labor Division No. 29; and that lots 19 and 20 in said division be added to Division No. 31.

BY-LAW No. 514

As amended by 520. A By-law to provide for the Repair of the Stewart Drain in the Township of Raleigh, in the County of Kent, and for borrowing on the credit of the Municipality, the sum of \$479 for completing the same.

Provisionally adopted the 27th day of May, A. D. 1890 Whereas, the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of Raleigh, did on the Twenty-third day of August, A. D. 1875, pass a By-law to provide for the construction of the Stewart Drain, and known as the "Stewart Drain By-law."

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And whereas the said drain was completed in terms of the said By-law. And whereas complaint has been made that the said drain has become filled up and in need of repair.

And whereas, thereupon, the said Council procured an examination to be made by W. G. McGeorge, P. L. S., being a person competent for such purpose, of the said locality proposed to be drained, and has also procured plans and estimates of the work to be made by the said W. G. McGeorge, and an assessment to be made by him of the real property to be benefitted by such proposed work, stating as nearly as he can the proportion of benefit which, in his opinion, will be derived in consequence of such proposed work, by every lot or portion of lot; the said Assessment so made being the assessment hereinafter by this By-law enacted to be assessed and levied upon the lots and parts of lots, hereinafter in that behalf specially set forth and described, and the report of the said W. G. McGeorge in respect thereof, and of the said proposed work being as follows:

CHATHAM, 3rd May, 1889.

To the Reeve, Deputy-Reeves and Municipal Council of Raleigh:

GENTLEMEN,—We beg to report to your Honorable Body that we have made an instrumental examination over the course of the Stewart Drain, with a view to having it improved in order to its efficiency. The drain in its present state is quite insufficient, and we recommend that it be enlarged in accordance with the data given on the profile accompanying this report.

The drain begins at a point on the south-easterly side of the road between Concession 5 and Concession 6, of Raleigh, near the middle of the front of lot number two, and thence runs north-easterly along the south-easterly side of said concession road to the Government Drain No. 2, of Raleigh, at the Drake Road.

It will greatly benefit said concession road and the lands on either side.

NO 516—A BY-LAW

To amend By-law numbered 510 entitled "A By-law to regulate the granting of licenses, and limiting the number thereof to be granted in the Township of Raleigh, in the County of Kent."

Whereas, on the twenty-third day of April, A. D. 1889, the Municipal Council of Raleigh did pass a By-law, to provide for imposing a license fee of one hundred and fifty dollars, on all tavern licenses in the said Township. No. 517—A BY-LAW

To divide the Municipality of Raleigh into Polling Subdivisions for the election of Municipal Officers and Members of the Legislative Assembly of Ontario.

Be it enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of Raleigh, in the County of Kent, that from and after the passing of this By-law the Municipality of Raleigh shall be divided into Polling sub-divisions for Municipal and Legislative purposes as follows, that is to say:

1. Polling subdivision number One—Shall comprise and consist of all that portion of the Township of Raleigh northwest of the line between the 4th and 5th Concessions W.B.L., and the 1st and 2nd Concessions E.B.L., from lots one to twenty-two inclusive.

2. Polling subdivision number Two—Shall comprise and consist of lots one to twelve inclusive, from the line between the 4th and 5th Concessions to the line between A and 8th Concessions.

3. Polling subdivision number Three—Shall comprise and consist of lots 13 to 19 inclusive, in the 5th, 6th, 7th and A Concession, and lots 20 to 23 inclusive, in the 2nd Concession E.B.L., and lots 20 to 24 inclusive, in the 3rd and 4th Concessions E.B.L.

4. Polling subdivision number Four—Shall comprise and consist of lots 1 to 6 inclusive, from the line between Concessions A and 8, to the line between Concessions 14 and Talbot Road lots.

5. Polling subdivision number Five—Shall comprise and consist of lots 7 to 11 inclusive, from the line between Concessions A and 8, to the line between Concessions 14 and 15 and Talbot Road lots.

6. Polling subdivision number Six—Shall comprise and consist of lots 12 to 19 inclusive, from the line between Concession A and 8 to the line between Concessions 15 and 16 and Talbot Road lots.

7. Polling subdivision number Seven—Shall comprise and consist of lots 20 to 25 in-

clusive, from the line between Concessions 4, E. B. L., and 8, W. B. L., to the line between Concessions 15 and 16:

8. Polling subdivision number Eight—Shall comprise and consist of all lots south-east of the line between Concessions 14 and 15 and Talbot Road lots from lots 1 to 11 inclusive, and the line between Concessions 15 and 16 and Talbot Road lots, from lots 12 to 25 inclusive. No. 518—A BY-LAW

To provide for deepening and enlarging the Backus Drain, in the Township of Raleigh, in the County of Kent, and for borrowing on the credit of the Municipality the sum of \$514.64, for completing the same.

Provisionally adopted the 5th day of August, A. D. 1889.

Whereas on the Eighteenth day of September, A. D. 1884, the Municipal Council of the Township of Raleigh did pass a By-law to provide for the deepening and enlargement of the Backus Drain in the said Township of Raleigh and known as "The Backus Drain By-law." And Whereas the said drain was not completed in terms of the said By-law. And Whereas complaint has been made that the said drain is in need of repair.

And Whereas, also, in consequence of the construction of the Payne Drain, and the waters therefrom finding an outlet and causing an additional body of water to flow into the said Backus drain which was not contemplated in its construction, and for the discharge of which the present capacity of the Backus drain is insufficient, and therefore liable to flood and injure the lands along its course.

And Whereas, it has therefore been deemed expedient to deepen and enlarge the said Backus drain so as to provide a sufficient discharge for the waters so caused to flow into it.

And whereas, thereupon, the said Council procured an examination to be made by W. G. McGeorge, P. L. S., being a person competent for such purpose, of the said locality proposed to be drained, and has also procured plans and estimates of the work to be made by the said W. G. McGeorge, and an assessment to be made by him of the real property to be benefitted by such proposed work, stating as nearly as he can the proportion of benefit which, in his opinion, will be derived in consequence of such proposed work, by every lot or portion of lot; the said Assessment so made being the assessment hereinafter by this By-law enacted to be assessed and levied upon the lots and parts of lots, hereinafter in that behalf specially set forth and described, and the report of the said W. G. McGeorge in respect thereof, and of the said proposed work being as follows:

CHATHAM, 10th July, 1889.

To the Reeve, Deputy-Reeves and Municipal Council of Raleigh:—

GENTLEMEN,—Having made an instrumental examination over the route of the Backus drain in the Township of Raleigh, we beg to report to your honorable body that we find the drain much in need of repairs. This drain has not much fall, and runs through a friable soil, very liable to fall and settle in the bottom of the drain until the sides become sodded over with grass, and what we now recommend is that the drain be deepened, with a bottom width of three feet, to the depths given on the profile herewith sent in, leaving the top width the same as at present, and sloping uniformly from the top to the bottom, and disturbing the sides where grassed over as little as possible, and casting the excavated earth three feet clear of the sides of the drain. The bottom to have a uniform fall of (1/10) one-tenth of a foot from the line of lots 19 and 20 downwards to the outfall, and not disturbing the life drain at the head in Lot 20, as Mr. Perry Doleen has notified us of his intention to drain his farm. No half lot 20, by a tile drain to the river, which we consider the best for him. Our estimate of the cost of repair is as follows:

No. 519—A BY-LAW

To assess and levy rates for County, Township and School purposes for the year 1889.

Be it enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of Raleigh, in the County of Kent:

1st. That the following sums shall be levied and collected upon and from all the ratable property of the Township of Raleigh for the year of our Lord 1889.

The sum of two thousand eight hundred and forty-two 96/100 dollars, (\$2842.96), is hereby levied upon and shall be collected from all the ratable property of the said Township of Raleigh for the general purposes of the County of Kent for the year 1889, by a rate of 1 14/100 mills in the dollar.

The sum of six thousand two hundred and thirty-six dollars, for the general purposes of the Township of Raleigh, as per Schedule A, hereunto annexed, by a rate in the dollar of 2 1/2 mills.

The sum of four hundred and fifty-six dollars, being a sum equivalent to the Legislative School grant for the year A. D. 1889 (exclusive of the property assessed to certain supporters of Separate Schools), by a rate in the dollar of 21/100 of a mill.

2nd. That the Clerk of this Corporation is hereby required to levy a special rate (over and above all other rates) upon, and which shall be collected from all the ratable property included in each and every School Section the Trustees of which shall furnish him, on or before the 24th day of August, with a written statement signed by the Secretary-Treasurer, and certified by the seal thereof, of the amount required for Public or Separate School purposes in each School Section, such a rate pro rata as will amount to the sum so required, as near as may be; and the Treasurer of this Corporation is hereby authorized and instructed to pay to the order of the Secretary-Treasurer or Trustees of each School Section all moneys so levied and credited to such School Section.

3. That the rates imposed by this By-law shall be collected by the Collector of rates for the said Township of Raleigh, and paid over to the Treasurer of this Corporation in bankable funds, on or before the 14th day of December, A. D. 1889, in so far as the law will enable him so to do; unless otherwise ordered by this Council.

No. 521—A BY-LAW

To provide for repairing the Doane Drain and Gilhula Branch Drain in the Township of Raleigh, in the County of Kent, and for borrowing on the credit of the Municipality the sum of \$1060.19 for completing the same.

PROVINCIONALLY ADOPTED the 16th day of Sept'r, A. D. 1899.

WHEREAS on the fifteenth day of November, A. D. 1876, the Municipal Council of the Township of Raleigh did pass a By-law, numbered 295, to provide for the construction of the Doane drain, the outlet for said Drain being the branch of the Gilhula drain.

And Whereas the said drain was completed in terms of the said by-law. And whereas complaint has been made that the said drain and outlet are in need of repair. And whereas the said Council are required to preserve and maintain the said drain so as to fully carry out the conditions contemplated in its construction.

AND WHEREAS thereupon, the said Council procured an examination to be made by W. G. McGeorge, P. L. S., being a person competent for such purpose, of the said locality proposed to be drained, and has also procured plans and estimates of the work to be made by the said W. G. McGeorge, and an assessment to be made by him of the real property to be benefitted by such proposed work, stating as nearly as he can the proportion of benefit which in his opinion, will be derived in consequence of such proposed work by every road and lot or portion of lot; the said Assessment so made, being the Assessment hereinafter by this By-law enacted to be assessed and levied upon the lots and parts of lots hereinafter in that behalf specially set forth and described, and the report of the said W. G. McGeorge in respect thereof, and of the said proposed work being as follows :

CHATHAM, 31st July, 1899.

To the Reeve, Deputy-Reeves and Municipal Council of Raleigh :

GENTLEMEN,—Having under instruction from your Honorable Body made an examination of the Doane Drain and Gilhula Drain Branch, with a view to having them repaired. We beg to report that we find these drains very much in need of repair, as they are not now sufficient to do the work they were intended to do, and, although, some work has recently been done on the branch to the Gilhula Drain, more is required to be done to make it effective.

The Doane Drain begins on the westerly side of the road between Lots 7 and 6, and on the southerly side of the road between Concessions 13 and 14, and thence runs along the south-easterly side of said Concession Roads, south-westerly to the line of Lots 5 and 6, thence north-westerly along the line of Lots 5 and 6 in the 18th Concession to the road between Concessions 12 and 13, then south-westerly along the south-easterly side of this Concession Road, a distance of about seventy-eight rods to the Gilhula Drain Branch; thence the Gilhula Drain Branch runs north-westerly through Lot 5 in the 12th Concession to the south-easterly side of the Middle Road, then north-easterly along the south-easterly side of the Middle Road about 37 rods, then generally westerly through Lot 5 in the 11th Concession, and in Lot 4 in the 11th Concession to its junction with the Gilhula Drain, in the north half of said Lot 4. The data for the work is given on the profile accompanying this report, the excavated earth to be cast two feet clear of the drain, and where the drain runs along a road to be spread evenly on the road.

Be it therefore enacted by the said Municipal Council of the said Township of Raleigh, pursuant to the provisions of "The Municipal Act," and amendments thereto.

1st. That the said report, plans and estimates be adopted, and the said Drain and the works connected therewith be made and constructed in accordance therewith.

2nd. That the Reeve of the said Township may borrow on the credit of the Corporation of the said Township of Raleigh, the sum of One Thousand and Sixty Dollars and Nineteen Cents, being the funds necessary for the work not hereinafter otherwise provided for; and may issue Debentures of the Corporation for that amount and interest, in sums of not less than One Hundred Dollars each, payable within five years from the date thereof with interest at the rate of five per centum per annum, that is to say, in five consecutive annual payments, to be of such amount that the aggregate amount payable for principal and interest in any year shall be equal as nearly as may be to the amount payable for principal and interest during each of the other years of such period of five years; such Debentures to be made payable at the Branch of the Canadian Bank of Commerce in the Town of Chatham.

3rd. That for the purpose of paying the sum of one thousand and sixty 60-100 dollars being the amount charged against the said lands to be benefitted as aforesaid, other than roads belonging to the Municipality, and to cover interest thereon for five years at the rate of five per centum per annum, the following special rates, over and above all other rates, shall be assessed and levied (in the same manner and at the same time as taxes are levied), upon the undermentioned lots and parts of lots, and the amount of the said special rates and interest assessed as aforesaid against each lot or part of lot respectively, shall be divided into five equal parts, and one such part shall be assessed and levied as aforesaid, in each year for five years, after the final passing of this By-law, during which said debentures have to run.

To provide for the construction of the Phipps Drain, in the Township of Raleigh, in the County of Kent, and for borrowing on the credit of the municipality the sum of \$1200.00 for completing the same.

Provisionally adopted the 10th day of Sept., A. D. 1889

WHEREAS a majority in number of the owners, as shown by the last Revised Assessment Roll of the property hereinafter set forth to be benefitted by the construction of the Phipps Drain, have petitioned the Council of the said Township of Raleigh, praying that a drain be constructed on the south side of the line between the Fourth and Fifth Concessions; and a Tap Drain therefrom in or near a certain swale or water-course about the line of Lots 3 and 4, in the Fourth Concession, and that the lands and roads benefitted of using the same as an outlet be assessed therefor.

G. McGeorge in respect thereof and of the said work being as follows:

To the Reeve, Deputy Reeve and Municipal Council of Raleigh:

ORATHAM, Sept. 4th, 1889.

GENTLEMEN,—We beg to report to your honorable body that we have in compliance with instructions made an instrumental examination and survey for the drain petition for along the road between the 5th Concession and 4th Concession from a point near the Drake Road to a point a little east of and near the outlet to Gov't Drain number one of Tilbury East, without confining the work to the Tilbury and Raleigh Town Line, as we found that the work of improving the road and draining it west of the Gov't Drain had been let by Mr. Dyke. We also made a survey for a tap drain about the line of lots 3 and 4 from the Catchwater Drain to Jeannette's Creek, through what is known as Robinson's Creek. We have found great difficulty in working a line along the Concession Road for the drain strikes as the timber and brush in clearing have been piled on the road and a heavy growth of small saplings has since grown up and the time taken to get through has been very much more than would have been the case had the road been cleared up or the heavy timber left standing. We find it almost impossible also to correctly locate the line of lots 3 and 4 in the 4th Concession owing to there having been a brush fence made near it, and a very heavy second growth sprung up where the timber was cut and our stakes on the top are located not exactly on the true line, but merely for the purpose of an estimate, and we would recommend that the commissioner placed in charge of the drain be allowed a very liberal commission to look after the work, as it will be very tedious to overlook and it will be necessary for him to get Mr. D. W. Crowe who owns lands on both sides of the tap to go over the ground to locate the line to his wishes and the same level stakes will answer for the work. The drain is quite expensive but it will be the making of the road and will greatly improve the lands in this vicinity and it is a necessary work and will be the outlet for the drainage of the lands enclosed by embankment from the Stewart Drain to Jeannette's Creek, it being contemplated we believe to place an embankment on the west side of the Drake Road which will prevent drainage in that direction. NO 523—A BY-LAW

To provide for the construction of the Simpson Drain in the Township of Raleigh, in the County of Kent, and for borrowing on the credit of the Municipality the sum of \$2000 for completing the same.

Provisionally adopted the 30th day of September, A.D. 1889.

WHEREAS a majority in number of the owners, as shown by the last Revised Assessment Roll of the property hereinafter set forth to be benefitted by the construction of the proposed Simpson Drain have petitioned the Council of the said Township of Raleigh praying that a drain be constructed to commence at the line of lots 9 and 10, thence along the southerly side of the road allowance at rear of Talbot Road lots, to the Town Line between Raleigh and Tilbury East, with a tap ditch at centre of lot 163 south-easterly to the outlet of the Goulet drain; thence through said outlet to Lake Erie, and that all the lots from the west half of lot 161 to lot 164, both inclusive, and the road allowance in rear of Talbot Road lots be assessed therefor.

And whereas, thereupon, the said Council procured an examination to be made by Sherman Malcolm, P. L. S., being a person competent for such purpose, of the said locality proposed to be drained, and has also procured plans and estimates of the work to be made by the said Sherman Malcolm, and an assessment to be made by him of the real property to be benefitted by such proposed work, stating as nearly as he can the proportion of benefit which, in his opinion, will be derived in consequence of such proposed work, by every lot or portion of lot; the said assessment so made being the assessment hereinafter by this By-law enacted to be assessed and levied upon the lots and parts of lots hereinafter in that behalf specially set forth and described, and the report of the said Sherman Malcolm in respect thereof, and of the said proposed work being as follows:

The Honorable Municipal Council of the Township of Raleigh in Council:

Whereas, — In accordance with your instructions I have examined the locality of the Simpson Drain, made plans, planted posts and made estimates of the same, which are herewith handed in; what the Simpson Drain proposes to accomplish is to commence at Stake 0, planted on the west side of the centre line road which divides lot 161 into two equal parts at the southerly limit of the rear road or within three feet of the same, and construct a dam across the westerly ditch or drain of said centre road some 10 or 12 feet northwest of the said stake; thence to construct a drain following along a line within eight feet of the southerly limit of the road in rear of the west half of lot 161, the whole of lots 162, 163, 164, 165, 166, 167, 168, 169, 170, 171, 163 and the east half of lot 168 Talbot Road survey, sufficient to carry the waters of said lots, and the west half of the centre line road and off the road in rear of said lots as far as stake No. 48 (shown on field plan) which stands within three feet of the rear angle of the centre line of lot 162.

To appoint Deputy Returning Officers, and to provide Polling places for holding Elections during the year 1890; also, to appoint a place for holding Nominations therefor.

BE IT ENACTED by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of Raleigh, under and by virtue of "The Municipal Act" and amendments thereto.

1. In Polling subdivision No. 1, Robert Williams. In Polling subdivision No. 2, Garrison Shadd. In Polling subdivision No. 3, James Rhodes. In Polling subdivision No. 4, Jas. Phelan. In Polling subdivision No. 5, D. C. Echlin. In Polling subdivision No. 6, S. F. White. In Polling subdivision No. 7, Oliver J. Fuoc. In Polling subdivision No. 8, Wheeler DeClute.

3. And it is further enacted, that the public meeting required to take place for the purpose of nominating candidates as aforesaid, at noon on the 1st Monday of December 1889, shall take place and be held at the Township hall in the said Township of Raleigh on Monday the 30th day of December, A. D. 1889.

No. 526—A BY-LAW

To provide for the construction of the Moore Drain, in the Township of Raleigh, in the County of Kent, and for borrowing on the credit of the municipality the sum of \$397.00 for completing the same.

Provisionally adopted the 9th day of Dec'r, A. D. 1889

Whereas a majority in number of the owners as shown by the last Revised Assessment roll of the property hereinafter set forth to be benefited by the construction of the Moore Drain have petitioned the Council of the said Municipality of Raleigh, praying that a

drain be constructed under the provisions of "The Municipal Act," commencing at the road in rear of the Talbot Road lots; thence northwesterly along the line of lots 8 and 9 in the 15th concession and 14th concession to the line between concessions 13 and 14; and that the lands benefitted be assessed therefor.

And Whereas thereupon, the said Council procured an examination to be made by Sherman Malcolm, P. L. S., being a person competent for such purpose, of the said locality proposed to be drained, and has also procured plans and estimates of the work to be made by the said Sherman Malcolm, and an assessment to be made by him of the real property to be benefitted by such proposed work, stating as nearly as he can the proportion of benefit which in his opinion, will be derived in consequence of such proposed work by every lot or portion of lot; the said Assessment so made being the Assessment hereinafter by this By-law enacted to be assessed and levied upon the lots and parts of lots hereinafter in that behalf specially set forth and described, and the report of the said Sherman Malcolm in respect thereof, and of the said proposed work being as follows:

To the Municipal Council of the Township of Raleigh, in Council assembled.

GENTLEMEN, I have the honor to report that I have examined the locality of the proposed Moore Drain, mentioned in the petition of Alexander Moore and others, asking for drainage in said locality. And I find the said locality much in need of a drain, to enable the proper cultivation of the lands of the same. That I have made a survey, planted stakes, taken levels, made plans, estimates and assessments for the construction of the drain as follows: Commencing at a stake planted (marked O) just one rod northwest of the road in rear of the Talbot Road lots, and northerly from the corner post between lots Nos. 8 and 9 in the 15th concession, just five chains and eighty links; thence northwest 78 1/2 rods to stake No. 5; thence southwest 23 rods 3/4 feet to stake No. 7, planted on the line between lots Nos. 8 and 9; thence northwest along the line between said lots to stake No. 19, planted on the south edge of the Larabee Drain, on the road between the 13 and 14th concessions of the Township of Raleigh, 201 rods to the end of the proposed drain. I have given the size or capacity of the drain proposed in my estimate attached hereto. All fences along the route of the proposed drain, that may prove to be in the way of construction, to be removed and replaced at the expense of the owners of the adjoining lands on either side thereof; my plans, estimates and assessment for the construction of the drain, you will find attached hereto.

And when the proposed drain is made and completed, it shall be kept and maintained, at the joint expense of the land herein assessed for the construction of the same, and in the same relative proportion as herein assessed for the construction thereof. I have the honor to be, your obedient Servant,

My estimates for the construction of the Moore Drain are as follows:

1st. Section No. 1 from 0 to stake 5, distance 78 1/2 rods; to be made two feet across the bottom, 7 1/2 feet across the top, and the various depths marked opposite the places of the stakes from 0 to 5 inclusive, with an even inclination along the bottom; all excavated earth to be lodged three feet away outwards from the upper edges of the drain, and will cost \$60.00.

2nd. From stake No. 5 to No. 7, a distance of 23 rods and 3/4 feet; to be made 2 1/2 feet across the bottom, by seven feet 9 inches across the top, by the depth marked in the places of the stakes Nos. 5, 6 and 7, on the profile attached for the drain, with an even inclination in and along the bottom of the drain; all excavated earth to be lodged three feet northerly of the upper edge of the drain, will cost \$20.00.

3rd. From stake No. 7 to stake No. 19 a distance of 201 rods; to be made three feet across the bottom by 8 feet 9 inches across the top, by the depths marked opposite the places of the stakes on the profile for the said drain, with an even inclination in and along the bottom of the drain; all excavated earth to be lodged three feet away from the westerly side of the drain, will cost \$208.00.

4th. For grubbing trees and extra items, \$30.00. Total for construction, \$318.00.
For By-law, \$25.00; for survey, plans, reports, etc., \$29.00; for other engineering, \$30.00. Total cost, \$397.00. (Signed) SHERMAN MALCOLM, D. & P. L. S.

And whereas, the said Council are of opinion that the work so reported on by the Engineer is necessary and desirable.

Be it therefore enacted by the said Municipal Council of the said Township of Raleigh, pursuant to the provisions of "The Municipal Act," and amendments thereto.

1st. That the said report, plans and estimates be adopted, and the said Drain and the works connected therewith be made and constructed in accordance therewith.

2nd. That the Reeve of the said Township may borrow on the credit of the Corporation of the said Township of Raleigh, the sum of Three hundred and ninety-seven Dollars, being the funds necessary for the work; and may issue Debentures of the Corporation for that amount and interest, in sums of not less than One Hundred Dollars each, payable within three years from the date thereof with interest at the rate of five per centum per annum, that is to say, in three consecutive annual payments, to be of such amount that the aggregate amount payable for principal and interest in any year shall be equal as nearly as may be to the amount payable for principal and interest during each of the other years of such period of three years; such Debentures to be made payable at the Branch of the Canadian Bank of Commerce in the Town of Chatham.

3rd. That for the purpose of paying the sum of three hundred and ninety-seven dollars being the amount charged against the said lands to be benefitted as aforesaid, other than roads belonging to the Municipality, and to cover interest thereon for three years at the rate of five per centum per annum, the following special rates, over and above all other rates, shall be assessed and levied (in the same manner and at the same time as taxes are levied), upon the undermentioned lots and parts of lots, and the amount of the said special rates and interest assessed as aforesaid against each lot or part of lot respectively, shall be divided into three equal parts, and one such part shall

be assessed and levied as aforesaid, in each year for three years, after the final passing of this By-law, during which said debentures have to run.

4th. That Isaac E. Simpson be and he is hereby appointed Commissioner to let the contract or contracts for the construction of the said drain and works connected therewith, by public sale to the lowest bidder (not exceeding the estimate), but every such contractor, with one good and sufficient surety, shall be required forthwith to enter into bonds for the due performance and completion of such contract according to said plans and specifications, and within the time mentioned in such bond, (unless otherwise ordered by the Council); and it shall be the duty of said Commissioner to cause the said works to be made and completed in accordance with such plans and specifications; and to grant orders on the Treasurer to each contractor, less twenty per cent. of the amount due, until the contract is fully completed and duly accepted by a competent engineer; and for the due performance of these and all duties of Commissioner, he the said Commissioner shall be entitled to receive a sum of Ten Dollars.

5th. That this By-law shall be published as provided in Sec. 571, Sub-sec. 2 of the Municipal Act, three weeks previous to the final passing thereof, and may be cited and referred to as "The Moore Drain By-law," and shall take effect on and after the final passing hereof. No. 527—A BY-LAW

To appoint certain Municipal Officers in the Township of Raleigh.

Be it enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of Raleigh, in the County of Kent.

1. That the following named persons be and they are hereby appointed Commissioners of Rural Road Divisions and Watercourses, viz:— In the First R. R. Division, Gilbert H. Dolson. In the Second R. R. Division, R. J. Morrison. In the Third R. R. Division, S. L. Wellwood. In the Fourth R. R. Division, N. H. Shepley. In the Fifth R. R. Division, A. G. Robertson.

2. That the following named persons be and they are hereby appointed a Local board of Health under the provisions of the "Public Health Act," R. S. O., and amendments thereto, viz:—Robert J. Morrison, Chairman, ex officio; J. G. Stewart, Secretary, ex officio; S. L. Wellwood, N. H. Shepley and A. G. Robertson.

3. That the said Secretary shall be paid a salary of fifteen dollars per annum; the said Medical Health Officer, a salary of twenty dollars per annum; and that each member of the Board shall, for each day he is called upon to act, receive the sum of two dollars.

4. That the following named persons be and they are hereby appointed Auditors, viz: Milton Backus, nominated by the Reeve, and George Foxton, nominated by the Council, who, in consideration of the sum of ten dollars each per annum, shall perform all the duties required by Section 263 of "The Municipal Act," and amendments thereto.

5. That Albert Williams be and he is hereby appointed Assessor and Collector of dog tax, subject to the provisions of the "Assessment Act" and the By-laws of this municipality, and the said Assessor for such duties duly performed, shall receive the sum of \$100.

6. That W. G. McGeorge, P. L. S., be and he is hereby appointed Engineer under "The Ditches and Watercourses Act," and shall be paid by the usual fees for services rendered.

7. That the aforesaid officers shall hold office until their successors have been duly appointed and qualified, or until otherwise relieved by this Council.

No. 528—A BY-LAW

Respecting Footpaths and ditches on Public Highways.

WHEREAS It is expedient to make better provision for the regulation of the traffic on the Public Highways; to set apart a portion thereof for the purpose of a footpath, and to preserve and maintain the same, and the ditches on each or either side thereof.

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of Raleigh, in the County of Kent, by authority of and subject to the restriction and provisions contained in "The Municipal Act," and amendments thereto.

1. That from and after the passing of this By-law, all that portion of any and every highway in the said Township of Raleigh situate, lying and being between the boundary lines and the road ditch, on each or either side thereof, be, and the same is hereby set apart as a footpath, for the use and convenience of travellers on foot only.

2. That all horses or other animals, led, ridden or driven, whether or not attached to any carriage, wagon, sleigh, machine, engine or any vehicle when passing along any public highway in the said Township of Raleigh, shall occupy only the portion of such highway which is situated between the ditches on either side thereof, and in case there is no ditch on any or either side thereof, shall then occupy only such portion as lies between lines drawn fifteen feet from the boundary line of such highway, and all such traffic, other than persons travelling on foot, shall be restrained and wholly prohibited from trespassing upon, injuring or in any way using or occupying, for the purpose of such traffic, any portion of any highway, as is used for the purpose of, or occupied by any ditch, footpath or reserved space as aforesaid.

3. It shall be the duty of the Overseer in each and every Statute Labor division, or other officers appointed by the Municipality, to prosecute in the name of the Corporation, any person or persons violating or infringing any of the provisions of this By-law who, if found guilty on the oath or affirmation of a credible witness, shall, in the discretion of any Justice of the Peace having jurisdiction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding ten dollars, nor less than two dollars and costs, to be levied by distress and sale of goods and chattels; and if no sufficient distress can be found on which to levy it shall and may be lawful for the convicting or other Justice to commit the offender to gaol for any period not exceeding twenty days, or until the fine and costs of committal shall be paid. One half of such fine to be paid to the informant and the other half to the Treasurer of the Municipality.

4. Any person other than the Overseer of Highways may, for the purposes of prosecution under this By-law, be the informant or complainant.

5. Any Overseer of Highways may expend a portion of the Statute Labor fund in his division in improving and keeping in repair the said footpaths, and may erect such posts, rails, fences and bridges as he may deem necessary to protect the said footpaths from injury or trespass.

6. This By-law shall take effect on and after the first day of May, A.D. 1890.

Read a third time and passed, this fifth day of February, A. D. 1890.

No. 529—A BY-LAW

(As Amended by By-law No. 536), respecting Statute Labor.

Be it enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of Raleigh, in the County of Kent, under and by virtue of the powers in them vested by the Municipal and Assessment Acts.

1. From and after the passing of this By-law, all By-laws heretofore passed, providing for the performance of Statute Labor, and the appointment of Officers to superintend and enforce the same, are hereby repealed; and the performance of Statute Labor in the said Municipality is hereby abolished, except as hereinafter provided.

2. In lieu of the performance of Statute labor as aforesaid, a commutation tax of fifty cents for each day's labor, shall be assessed and levied in each year, and shall be placed upon the Collector's Roll, and shall be collected and accounted for as other taxes.

3. From and after the passing of this By-law all persons appearing by the last Revised Assessment Roll, to be rated for property liable to taxation, shall commute for the Statute Labor in respect of such property, and pay the commutation levied thereon, in proportion to, and in accordance with the scale of service hereinafter set forth, that is to say: \$500 and under, 2 days; above \$500 and up to \$1000, 3 days; and for every additional \$1000, 1 day.

4. All persons appearing on the said Assessment Roll, rated otherwise than for taxable property, and who are not bona fide taxpayers, and all other male inhabitants of the Township between the ages of 21 and 60 years, whether or not their names appear on the Assessment Roll, shall, in lieu of the performance of Statute Labor, pay a Poll

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Tax of \$1 each, which shall be placed on the Collector's Roll by the Clerk, and shall be paid to the Collector of Rates, or other officer of the municipality appointed for that purpose, whether so placed on the Collector's Roll or not, within six days from demand thereof, and in case of neglect or refusal so to do, shall, without further notice, incur a penalty not exceeding five dollars and costs, exclusive of the Poll Tax aforesaid, which, on complaint of the said Collector or other officer, and in name of the Corporation, may, on summary conviction before any Justice of the Peace having jurisdiction, and on his order, be recovered, together with the costs of prosecution and distress, by distress of the offender's goods and chattels, and in case there is no sufficient distress, such offender may be committed to the Common Gaol of the County, and there put to hard labor for any time not exceeding ten days, unless such penalty and costs and the costs of the warrant of commitment and of conveying the said person to gaol be sooner paid; and all such fines shall be paid to the Treasurer of this Corporation, and form part of the Statute Labor fund thereof.

5. It shall be the duty of the Commissioners of Rural Road Divisions, or other officer appointed by the municipality for the purpose, to expend the moneys so collected or to be collected, in their respective divisions, as reported by the Clerk, for the improvement and repair of the roads, bridges, ditches and footpaths, and for the performance of all work hitherto performed by Statute Labor. All such work to be sold by public sale to the lowest bidder, after notice of such sale having been posted in the locality thereof for at least four days previously, unless in cases of urgency, when such notice and sale may be dispensed with, and such work shall not necessarily be restricted to any particular road or Statute Labor Division; and for the purposes of this By-law, the Statute Labor Divisions of the Township shall be the same as the Rural Road Divisions. And the said Commissioners or other officers may grant orders on the Treasurer for such work, and shall report to the Council the amounts so paid for such work, and when and where performed, and the nature of such work; and for the faithful discharge of these and all duties connected therewith, the said Commissioners or other officers shall be paid six per centum on such expenditure.

6. The Treasurer of this Corporation shall account for all moneys so received or paid by him, separate and distinct from all other moneys, and may be designated as the "Statute Labor Account."

No. 530—A BY-LAW

To provide for aiding and assisting the Amherstburg, Lake Shore & Blenheim Railway, and for issuing Debentures therefor for the sum of Ten Thousand Dollars to be given by way of bonus to the said Amherstburg, Lake Shore and Blenheim Railway Company by the Municipality of the Township of Raleigh, in the County of Kent.

WHEREAS a portion hereinafter described of the said Municipality of Raleigh is desirous of aiding by way of bonus the Amherstburg, Lake Shore and Blenheim Railway Company, subject to the conditions hereinafter mentioned

And Whereas seventy-six of the persons rated on the last assessment roll of the Township of Raleigh as freeholders in that portion hereinafter described of the said Municipality desiring to grant said bonus, and who are qualified voters under the Municipal Act in said portion of the Municipality of Raleigh, have petitioned the Council of the said Municipality according to the statutes in that behalf made and provided, to pass a By-law granting the sum of Ten Thousand Dollars by way of bonus to said Railway Company, and to be assessed therefor.

3 And Whereas it is necessary, in order to provide the said sum of Ten Thousand Dollars, to issue Debentures of the said Municipality of Raleigh to the said amount, and to provide for the payment of the same and of the interest thereon in the manner hereinafter mentioned.

4. And Whereas the portion of the said Municipality of Raleigh so desirous of granting aid, as aforesaid, to the said Railway Company is all that part of the said Township of Raleigh lying south of the line between the Tenth and Eleventh Concessions, from lots 1 to 12 inclusive, and south of the line between the 12th and 13th Concessions from lots 13 to 18 inclusive, and south of the line between the 13th and 14th Concessions from lots 18 to 25 inclusive, more particularly described as follows:

Commencing at the intersection of the limit between said Township of Raleigh and the Township of Tilbury East, with the southerly limit of the Tenth Concession, thence northeasterly following said southerly limit to the easterly limit of lot number twelve said concession; thence southeasterly following the easterly limit of lot 12 in the 11th and 12th concession to the southerly limit of the road between the 12th and 13th concessions; thence northeasterly following said southerly limit to the easterly limit of lot number 18 in said Thirteenth concession; thence southeasterly following said east-

erly limit to the southerly limit of the road between the 13th and 14th concessions; thence northeasterly following said southerly limit to the limit between the Townships of Raleigh and Harwich; thence southeasterly following said Township limit to the water's edge of Lake Erie; thence westerly following said water's edge to the limit between the Townships of Raleigh and East Tilbury; thence northerly following said last mentioned limit to the place of beginning.

5. And whereas, the amount of the whole rateable property of the said municipality of Raleigh, irrespective of any future increase of the same, according to the last revised assessment roll of the said municipality, being for the year One Thousand Eight Hundred and Eighty-nine, was two millions four hundred and ninety-four thousand four hundred and twenty-three dollars, and the amount of the whole rateable property as aforesaid of the said portion of the said portion of the said Municipality desiring to aid the said Railway according to the same roll was seven hundred and sixty-three thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven dollars.

6. And whereas, the existing debenture debt of the said municipality is the sum of fifty-one thousand six hundred and ninety-nine dollars and seventeen cents, and there is no principal or interest due or in arrears.

7. And whereas, it will require the sum of six hundred and fifty dollars and fifty-two cents to be raised annually by a special rate for the payment of the said sum of ten thousand dollars and interest thereon, at the rate of five per centum as herein provided.

8. And whereas, the said Municipality of Raleigh is desirous of paying a portion of the said principal of ten thousand dollars and the interest thereon every year, and to avoid the necessity of keeping a sinking fund it is necessary to issue thirty debentures of the said municipality for the amount of six hundred and fifty dollars and fifty-two cents each, without interest, payable in one, two, three, four, five, six, seven, eight, nine, ten, eleven, twelve, thirteen, fourteen, fifteen, sixteen, seventeen, eighteen, nineteen, twenty, twenty one, twenty-two, twenty-three, twenty-four, twenty-five, twenty-six, twenty seven, twenty-eight, twenty-nine and thirty years from the date hereinafter mentioned on which said by-law is to take effect.

9. And whereas, for paying the said sum of ten thousand dollars and interest at five per centum, as aforesaid, it will require an annual special rate in the dollar in addition to all other rates levied, in each year on the rateable property in the said portion of the said Township of Raleigh, sufficient to raise yearly the said sum of \$650.52.

Be it therefore enacted by the Corporation of the said Township of Raleigh:

1. That it shall and may be lawful for all that part of the said Township of Raleigh lying south of the line between the 10th and 11th concessions, from lots one to 12 inclusive, and south of the line between the 12th and 13th concessions, from lots Thirteen to Eighteen inclusive, and south of the line between the 13th and 14th concessions, from lots eighteen to twenty-five inclusive, more particularly described as follows: Commencing at the intersection of the limit between the said Township of Raleigh and the Township of Tilbury East with the southerly limit of the Tenth Concession; thence northeasterly following said southerly limit to the easterly limit of lot number twelve in said concession; thence southeasterly, following the easterly limit of lot twelve in the 11th and 12th concessions to the southerly limit of the road between the 12th and 13th concessions; thence northeasterly following said southerly limit to the easterly limit of lot number eighteen in said 13th concession; thence southeasterly following said easterly limit to the southerly limit of the road between the 13th and 14th concessions; thence northeasterly following said southerly limit to the limit between the Townships of Raleigh and Harwich; thence southeasterly following said Township limit to the water's edge of Lake Erie; thence westerly following said water's edge to the limit between the Townships of Raleigh and East Tilbury; thence northerly following said last mentioned limit to the place of beginning; to assist the said Amherstburg, Lake Shore and Blenheim Railway Company by giving thereto by way of free grant or bonus the sum of ten thousand dollars, upon conditions as hereinafter provided.

2. That in order to procure the said sum of ten thousand dollars, as aforesaid, the Municipal Corporation of the Township of Raleigh shall issue thirty debentures of the said corporation for the sum of six hundred and fifty dollars and fifty-two cents each, without interest, payable, as aforesaid, yearly and every year for thirty years, the said debentures to be sealed with the corporation seal of the said Township of Raleigh, and to be signed by the Reeve and Treasurer thereof.

3. That the said debentures shall be made payable at the agency of the Canadian Bank of Commerce in the Town of Chatham, in the County of Kent, Province of Ontario.

4. That for the purpose of paying said debentures an equal special rate on the dollar sufficient to pay the said annual sum or debentures of six hundred and fifty dollars and fifty-two cents shall be in addition to all other taxes assessed, raised, levied and collected in each year upon all the rateable property in the said portion of the said Municipality during the continuance of the said debentures or any of them or any part thereof.

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5. That the Reeve and Council of the said Municipal Corporation of the Township of Raleigh shall, within one month after the final passing of this By-law, deliver to the Trustees for the said Municipality and Railway Company, to be appointed in pursuance of the statutes of the Province of Ontario in that behalf, for receiving and holding the same, and for the purpose of realizing the sum of ten thousand dollars, the said debentures granted by way of bonus to the said Amherstburg, Lake Shore and Blenheim Railway Company.

6. That the said sum of ten thousand dollars or said debentures shall be paid by the said Trustees to the said Amherstburg, Lake Shore and Blenheim Railway Company as soon as the works and railroad of the Company from Leanington shall have been completed, and the regular freight and passenger trains are running as far as the eastern limit of the said Township of Raleigh for at least ten days after the completion of such works and road at least as far easterly as such easterly limit of Raleigh.

7. That this By-law shall take effect on the first day of February one thousand eight hundred and ninety.

8. That on the thirtieth day of December one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, at the hour of eleven o'clock in the forenoon, at the Township Hall of the Township of Raleigh, the appointment of persons to attend at the polling places and at the final summing up of the votes by the Clerk respectively, on behalf of the persons interested in and promoting or opposing the passage of the said By-law respectively shall be made.

9. That the votes of the duly qualified electors in the hereinbefore described portions of the said Municipality of the Township of Raleigh shall be taken on this By-law on Monday the Sixth day of January one thousand eight hundred and ninety, commencing at the hour of nine o'clock in the forenoon and closing at the hour of five o'clock in the afternoon of the same day, at the polling places in Polling sub-division No. 4 at the school house in Union School Section No. 5, at Merlin; in Polling sub-division No. 5, at the house of James Gihuly in the Village of Buxton; in Polling sub-division No. 6, at the Township Hall; in Polling sub-division No. 7, at the Grange Hall on lot 22 in the 12th Concession; in Polling sub-division No. 8 at the house of William Little on lot 142, Talbot Road, all in the Township of Raleigh.

10. That the following persons shall be Returning Officers to take the votes:—At the said Polling sub-division No. 4, James Phelan; at the said Polling sub-division No. 5, Daniel C. Echlin; at the said Polling sub-division No. 6, Sylvester F. White; at the said Polling sub-division No. 7, Oliver J. Fuce; at the said Polling place No. 8, Wheeler DeClute, in the Township of Raleigh.

11. That John G. Stewart, Esquire, Clerk of the said Municipal Corporation of the Township of Raleigh, shall, on the Seventh day of January, one thousand eight hundred and ninety, at the Town-Hall of the said Township of Raleigh, sum up the number of votes given for and against this By-law.

No. 533—A BY-LAW

To raise by way of loan the sum of \$3000, for the purpose of building a schoolhouse required in and for Union school section number Six, united with Dover, in the Township of Raleigh in the County of Kent.

WHEREAS the Public School Trustees of school section number six, united with Dover, in the Township of Raleigh, have, in terms of the 129th Section of "The Public Schools Act," by resolution dated the 20th day of February, A. D. 1890, and certified as having been submitted to, and approved by the duly qualified School Electors of the said School Section, at a special meeting called for that purpose on the 31 day of January, A. D. 1890, made application to the Municipal Council of the said Township of Raleigh, to raise by way of loan the sum of \$3000, for the purpose of building a school house, required in and for the said School Section. And whereas the total amount required to be raised annually by special rate to discharge the several instalments of principal and interest accruing due on such debt is the sum of \$289. And whereas there is no Debenture debt of the said school section. And whereas it will require the sum of \$259 to be raised annually by special rate for the payment of the said sum of \$3000 and interest thereon at the rate of five per centum per annum, as herein provided.

And whereas, to avoid the necessity of keeping a sinking fund, it is necessary to issue fifteen debentures of the said corporation for the sum of \$289 each, payable in one, two, three, four, five, six, seven, eight, nine, ten, eleven, twelve, thirteen, fourteen and fifteen years from the date thereof. Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the said Township of Raleigh:

1. That the Reeve and Treasurer of the said Township of Raleigh, may borrow on the credit of the Corporation of the said Township of Raleigh the sum of three thousand dollars, and may issue fifteen debentures of the said Corporation for the sum of two hundred and eighty-nine dollars each, without interest, being equal to the said sum of three thousand dollars and interest thereon at five per cent. for fifteen years; such debentures to be payable at the Canadian Bank of Commerce, in the Town of Chatham.

2. That for the purpose of paying the said debentures an equal special rate on the dollar sufficient to pay the said annual sum or debentures of two hundred and eighty-nine dollars, shall, in addition to all other rates, be levied in the same manner, and at the same time as taxes are levied, upon the whole rateable property of the said Union school section number six, in each year during the continuance of the said debentures, or any of them or any part thereof.

3. This By-law shall come into force and take effect on the day of the final passing thereof. [Read a third time and passed this third day of March, A. D. 1890.
