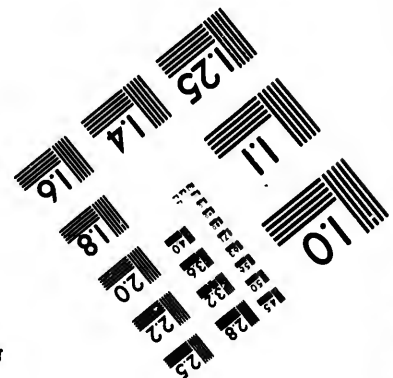
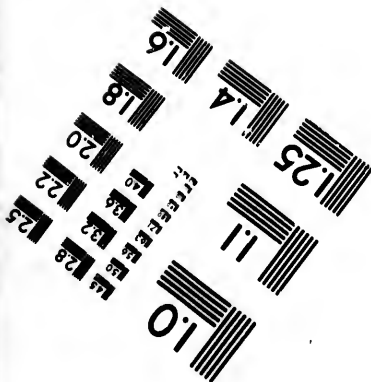
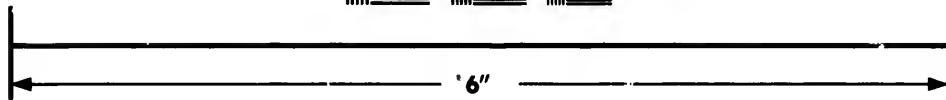
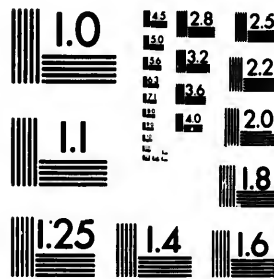


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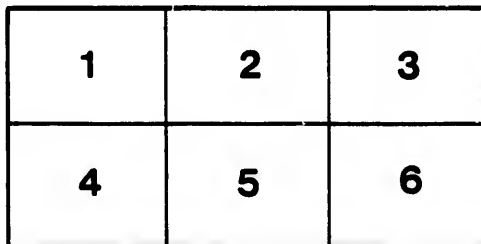
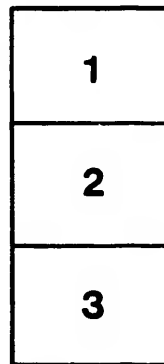
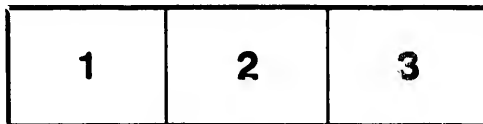
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# BY-LAWS OF THE TOWNSHIP OF RALEIGH.

## No. 534—A BY-LAW

To amend By-law No. 533, of the Township of Raleigh, passed on the Third day of March, 1890.

WHEREAS, the Municipal Council of the said Township, on the Third day of March, A. D. 1890, did pass a By-law numbered 533, and authorizing the issue of Debentures to the amount of three thousand dollars for the purposes of U. S. S. No. 6, (united with Dover), in the Township of Raleigh. And doubts have been expressed as to the validity of the said By-law in consequence of its omitting to recite the amount of the whole rateable property of the said Township, and the amount of the existing Debenture debt of the said Township; and it is desirable to amend the said By-law in these respects.

Therefore the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of Raleigh enacts as follows:

1. That the said By Law No. 533, be and the same hereby is amended by inserting therein two recitals in the words and figures following, that is to say:

And whereas, the amount of the whole rateable property of the said Township of Raleigh, according to the last Revised Assessment Roll is \$2,494,423.

And whereas, the amount of the existing debenture debt of the said Township of Raleigh is \$49,273.53, and no part of the principal or interest is in arrear.

2. That the said By law, as amended, be, and the same hereby is confirmed.

Read a third time and passed this fifth day of May A.D. 1890.

## No. 535—A BY-LAW

To appropriate certain sums of money for the improvement of the Roads and Bridges in Township of Raleigh.

Be it enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of Raleigh, in the County of Kent.

1. That the following sums be and they are hereby appropriated for the improvement of the Roads and Bridges in the Township of Raleigh, that is to say:

In the First Rural Road Division, the sum of Three Hundred Dollars.

In the Second Rural Road Division, the sum of Three Hundred Dollars.

In the Third Rural Road Division, the sum of Three Hundred Dollars.

In the Fourth Rural Road Division, the sum of Three Hundred Dollars.

In the Fifth Rural Road Division, the sum of Three Hundred Dollars.

And that the Commissioners of said R. R. Divisions respectively expend the same:

G. H. Dolsen and R. J. Morrison to be Commissioners on the Harwich and Raleigh Town lines. G. H. Dolsen to be Commissioner on the Town of Chatham and Raleigh Town lines.

On the Townline between Raleigh and Tilbury East, from the centre of the Eighth Concession to the River Thames, the sum of twenty-five dollars, and that R. J. Morrison be Commissioner to expend the same.

On the Townline between Raleigh and Tilbury East from the centre of the Eighth concession, southerly to Lake Erie, the sum of twenty-five dollars, and that S. L. Wellwood be Commissioner to expend the same.

Provided always that the next two preceeding amounts are appropriated conditionally on the adjoining municipality appropriating equal amounts for the said purposes respectively.

2. That the following sums accruing from Statute Labor tax be expended in the Statute Labor Divisions from which the same was collected as reported by the Clerk, that is to say:

In the First Rural Road Division, the sum of \$52.55.

In the Second " " the sum of \$64.47.

In the Third " " the sum of \$78.00.

In the Fourth " " the sum of \$49.90.

In the Fifth " " the sum of \$31.45.

And that the Commissioners of Rural Road Divisions superintend the expenditure of the same in their respective divisions.

3. That it shall be the duty of the said Commissioners so appointed, to expend the sums hereinbefore appropriated for the purpose, and in the manner so provided; and they are hereby authorized to grant orders on the Treasurer of this Corporation, to parties filling contracts thereon, not exceeding the amounts so appropriated for such purposes respectively; less the amounts hereinunder specified as overdrawn by the Commissioners of the preceding year, stating on such order the nature of the work done, and where it was performed. Provided always that no Commissioner shall exceed the amounts hereinbefore appropriated, without having first obtained the consent of the Council, and the Treasurer notified thereof by the Clerk.

4. That it shall be the duty of the Treasurer to charge the respective accounts with the following sums, shown by the Auditors' Report to be overdrawn, viz;  
In Rural Road Division No. 1, \$26.24. In Rural Road Division No. 5, \$15.11.

5. That R. J. Morrison be and he is hereby appointed Commissioner to superintend the Pike Drainage and Pumping Works, with the powers contained in the third clause of this By-law.

#### No. 536—A BY-LAW

To amend By-law No. 529, entitled "A By-law respecting Statute Labor."

Be it enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of Raleigh, in the County of Kent, under and by virtue of the provisions of the Municipal Act.

1. That By-law No. 529, entitled "A By-law respecting Statute Labor," be amended as follows:

Section three (3), of the said By-law is hereby repealed, and the following substituted therefor: "3. From and after the passing of this By-law all persons appearing by the last Revised Assessment Roll to be rated for property liable to taxation, shall commute for the Statute Labor in respect of such property, and pay the commutation tax levied thereon, in proportion to and in accordance with the scale of service hereinafter set forth, that is to say; \$500 and under, 2 days; above \$500 and up to \$1000, 3 days; and for every additional \$1000, 1 day."

#### No. 537—A BY-LAW

To appoint an Arbitrator in the matter of Union School Section Number One, of Tilbury East and Raleigh, and School Section No. Four of the Township of Raleigh.

WHEREAS, five of the ratepayers in that portion of Union School Section Number One, of the Townships of Tilbury East and Raleigh, situated in the said Township of Raleigh, have, in accordance with the provisions of Section 86 of "The Public Schools Act," petitioned the Council of the said Township of Raleigh, to take action jointly with the said Council of Tilbury East, with a view to the dissolution of said School Section.

And Whereas, the Trustees of School Section No. 4, of the said Township of Raleigh, have petitioned the said Council to change the boundaries of said School Section Number Four. Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the said Township of Raleigh, under and by virtue of "The Public Schools Act."

1. That John G. Stewart be, and he is hereby appointed Arbitrator to act in the premises, conjointly with an Arbitrator to be appointed by the said Council of Tilbury East, and the Inspector of Schools for West Kent, to hear, arbitrate upon and adjudicate on all matters so brought before them relative to the dissolution or re-adjustment of said School Sections.

Edward Murdoch to be Poundkeeper in R. R. Div. No. 5, in place of Sam. Irving.  
Alex. Coulet to be Fence Viewer in R. R. Div. No. 5, in place of Wm. H. Pardo.

### No. 539—A BY-LAW

To amend By-law No. 515, known as "The McGuigan Drain By-law."

WHEREAS, at the request of certain ratepayers, assessed for the construction of "the McGuigan Drain," the specifications of the Engineer were changed by straightening the part thereof through the 13th concession.

And whereas, the extra cost incurred by such straightening is the sum of seventy-three 97-100 dollars, and which sum was not provided for when the debentures were issued to raise funds for the construction of said drain, but have been paid by the Treasurer, on the order of the Commissioner, both of whom were under a misapprehension as to the powers contained in said By-law. And whereas, it is necessary to provide for raising the said sum of seventy-three 97-100 dollars, in order to reimburse the general fund. And whereas, the parties for whose benefit the said change was made, have petitioned this Council to increase the assessment on their lands so as cover the said sum of seventy-three 97-100 dollars, in the proportion of twenty-four 66-100 dollars on the south-east quarter of lot 23, in the 13th concession; and forty-nine 31-100 dollars on the southwest part of southwest quarter of lot 24, in the 13th concession, and to levy and collect the same, in the same manner and at the same time as the other assessments in the said By-law contained.

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the said Township of Raleigh.

1. That the said By-law No. 515, known as "The McGuigan Drain By-law" be amended as follows:—The Treasurer shall apply any surplus funds in his possession to pay the said sum of seventy-three 97-100 dollars, and charge the same to the McGuigan Drain Account.

2. That the said sum of seventy-three 97-100 dollars, together with interest at the rate of five per cent. per annum, shall be levied and collected in addition to the assessment levied in the said By-law No. 515, as follows: on the southeast quarter of lot No. 23, in the 13th concession in the year 1890, \$12.63, being two years assessment and interest. In 1891, \$5.70; in 1892, \$5.70; in 1893, \$5.70. On the southwest part of the southwest quarter of lot 24 in the 13th concession. In the year 1890, \$25.21, being two years assessment and interest, in 1891, \$11.40; in 1892, \$11.40; in 1893, \$11.40.

### No. 540—A BY-LAW

To appoint an Arbitrator in the matter of Union School Section No. 1, of the Townships of Tilbury East and Raleigh, and School Section Number Four, of the Township of Raleigh.

WHEREAS, ten of the ratepayers in that portion of Union School Section Number One, of the Townships of Tilbury East and Raleigh, situated in the said Township of Raleigh, have, in accordance with the provisions of Section 88 of "The Public Schools Act," petitioned the Council of the said Township of Raleigh to take action jointly with the said Council of Tilbury East, with a view to the dissolution of said school section. And whereas, the trustees of said School Section Number Four, have petitioned the said Council to change the boundaries of said School Section No. Four.

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the said Township of Raleigh, under and by virtue of "The Public Schools Act."

1. That John G. Stewart be and he is hereby appointed Arbitrator to act in the premises, conjointly with Arbitrators to be appointed by the said Council of Tilbury East and the Council of Dover, and the Inspector of Schools for West Kent, to hear, arbitrate upon and determine all matters so brought before them, relative to the dissolution and readjustment of the said School Section.

No. 541—A BY-LAW

To provide for draining part of the Township of Raleigh by the construction of the Edwards Drain, and for borrowing on the credit of the municipality the sum of \$460 for completing the same.

Provisionally adopted the 7th day of July, A. D. 1890.

WHEREAS, a majority in number of the owners as shown by the last Revised Assessment Roll, of the property hereinafter set forth to be benefitted by the construction of the Edwards Drain, have petitioned the Council of the said Township of Raleigh, praying that a drain be constructed on the  $n\frac{1}{2}$  of lot 22, in the 4th Concession, E. B. L., thence westerly into the west quarter of said lot 22: thence northerly on line between the  $s\frac{1}{2}$  and  $e\frac{1}{2}$  of lot 22, in con. III, E. B. L.; thence northeasterly and easterly through the east quarter of said lot 22, and  $se\frac{1}{2}$  of lot 23, in con. 3, E. B. L. to the Gregory Drain.

And whereas thereupon, the said Council procured an examination to be made by W. G. McGeorge, P. L. S., being a person competent for such purpose, of the said locality proposed to be drained, and has also procured plans and estimates of the work to be made by the said W. G. McGeorge, and an assessment to be made by him of the real property to be benefitted by such proposed work, stating as nearly as he can the proportion of benefit which, in his opinion, will be derived in consequence of such proposed work, by every lot or portion of lot; the said assessment so made, being the assessment hereinafter by this by-law enacted to be assessed and levied upon the lots and parts of lots hereinafter in that behalf specially set forth and described, with the report of the said W. G. McGeorge, in respect thereof, and of the said proposed work being as follows:

To the Reeve, Deputy-Reeves and Municipal Council of Raleigh: Chatham, 23rd June, 1890

GENTLEMEN.—We beg to report to your Honorable Body that we have made an instrumental examination over the route of the proposed drain petitioned for by Ernest Edwards and others. The drain will begin at our level stake, marked O in the north quarter of lot 22, in the 4th concession, E. B. L., and will run thence, as shown on the accompanying plan easterly on said quarter lot, and westerly, north-westerly and northerly, through the west quarter of said lot; and northwesterly and northeasterly through lot 22, in the 3rd concession E. B. L., and northeasterly and easterly through lot 23, in said 3rd con., all in Raleigh, and across the concession to the Gregory Drain.

The locality is very much in need of drainage, and we recommend the construction of a drain in accordance with the data given on the plan and profile accompanying this

Our estimate of the cost of the work is as follows:—

The drain when completed to be kept in repair and maintained at the expense of the lands and road assessed for construction, said lands and road paying in the same relative proportion as for construction.

And whereas, the said Council are of opinion that the work so reported on is necessary and desirable.

Be it therefore enacted by the said Municipal Council of the said Township of Raleigh, pursuant to the provisions of The Municipal Act and amendments thereto.

1st. That the said report, plans and estimates be adopted, and the said drain and the works connected therewith, be made and constructed in accordance therewith.

2nd. That the Reeve of the said Township may borrow on the credit of the Corporation of the said Township of Raleigh, the sum of \$460, being the funds necessary for the work not hereinafter otherwise provided for, and may issue Debentures of the Corporation for amount and interest, in sums of not less than \$100 each, payable within three years from the date thereof, with interest at the rate of five per centum per annum, that is to say, in three consecutive annual payments, to be of such amount that the aggregate amount payable for principal and interest in any year, shall be equal as nearly as may be to the amount payable for principal and interest during each of the other years of such period of three years, such Debentures to be made payable at the Branch of the Canadian Bank of Commerce, in the Town of Chatham.

3rd. That for the purpose of paying the sum of four hundred and sixty dollars, being the amount charged against the said lands so to be benefitted as aforesaid, other



than roads belonging to the municipality and to cover interest thereon for three years at the rate of five per centum per annum, the following special rates, over and above all other rates, shall be assessed and levied (in the same manner and at the same time as taxes are levied) upon the undermentioned lots and parts of lots, and the amount of the said special rates and interest assessed as aforesaid, against each lot or part of lot respectively, shall be divided into three equal parts, and one such part shall be assessed and levied as aforesaid in each year for three years after the final passing of this By-law during which the said Debentures have to run.

4th. That the sum of sixty-six 50-100 dollars, being the total amount assessed as aforesaid against the said roads of the said municipality, shall be paid by the Treasurer of this Corporation out of the general funds of the Municipality:

5th. That Gilbert H. Doleen be and is hereby appointed Commissioner to let the contract or contracts for the construction of the said drain and works connected therewith, by public sale to the lowest bidder (not exceeding the estimate), but every such contractor, with one good and sufficient surety, shall be required forthwith to enter into bonds for the due performance and completion of such contract according to said plans and specifications, and within the time mentioned in such bond (unless otherwise ordered by the Council); and it shall be the duty of the said Commissioner to cause the said works to be made and completed in accordance with such plans and specifications, and to grant orders on the Treasurer to each contractor, less twenty per cent. of the amount due, until the contract is fully completed and duly accepted by a competent Engineer; and for the due performance of these and all duties of Commissioner he, the said Commissioner, shall be entitled to receive a sum of fifteen dollars.

6th. That this By-law shall be published as provided in section 571, sub-section 2, of "The Municipal Act," three weeks previous to the final passing thereof, and may be cited and referred to as "The Edwards Drain By-law," and shall take effect on and after the final passing thereof.

No. 542—A BY-LAW

To provide for improving and extending the Ferguson Drain, in the Township of Raleigh, and for borrowing on the credit of the Municipality the sum of \$780 for completing the same. [Provisionally adopted the 7th day of July, A.D. 1890.]

WHEREAS on the 21st day of August, A. D. 1878, the Municipal Council of the Township of Raleigh did pass a By-law to provide for the construction of the Ferguson drain and known as "The Ferguson Drain By-law." And whereas the said drain was constructed and has been since operated as provided in the said By-law.

And whereas a majority of the owners as shown by the last revised Assessment roll of the property hereinafter set forth to be benefitted by the improvement and extension of the said drain have petitioned the Council of the said Township of Raleigh, praying that the said drain be improved along its present course, and extended through lots 23 and 24, in the 8th con., and through part of lot 24, in the 9th concession.

And whereas thereupon, the said Council procured an examination to be made by W. G. McGeorge, P. L. S., being a person competent for such purpose, of the said lo-

ality proposed to be drained, and has also prepared plans and estimates of the work to be made by the said W. G. McGeorge, and an assessment to be made by him of the real property to be benefited by such proposed work, stating as nearly as he can the proportion of benefit which, in his opinion, will be derived in consequence of such proposed work, by every lot or portion of lot; the said assessment so made, being the assessment hereinafter by this by-law enacted to be assessed and levied upon the lots and parts of lots hereinafter in that behalf specially set forth and described, and the report of the said W. G. McGeorge, in respect thereof, and of the said proposed work being as follows:

To the Reeve, Deputy-Reeve and Municipal Council of Raleigh: Chatham, 23rd June, 1890.

Gentlemen,—We beg to report to your Honorable Body that we have made an instrumental examination over the course of the Ferguson Drain in the Township of Raleigh and its extension into lot 24 in the 9th concession, to comply with the terms of the instructions and of the petition of L. Higgins and others.

The drain will now begin in lot 24 of the 6th concession about 10 chains south-east of the concession road in front of said lot, and will thence run generally northwesterly and westerly through lot aforesaid, and lots 24, 23 and 22 in the 6th concession, and through lots 21, 21 and 20 to the Flook Drain in the 4th concession.

The improvement and extension of the drain is very necessary and we recommend that it be carried out in accordance with the plan given on the profile accompanying this report; our estimate of the cost of the work is as follows:—The excavated earth to be cast three feet clear of the drain, and where it is on a road to be levelled evenly suitable for public travel.

1st. That the said report, plans and estimates be adopted, and the said drain and the works connected therewith, be made and constructed in accordance therewith.

2nd. That the Reeve of the said Township may borrow on the credit of the Corporation of the said Township of Raleigh, the sum of \$780, being the funds necessary for the work not hereinafter otherwise provided for, and may issue Debentures of the Corporation for that amount and interest, in sums of not less than \$100 each, payable within five years from the date thereof, with interest at the rate of five per centum per annum, that is to say, in five consecutive annual payments, to be of such amount that the aggregate amount payable for principal and interest in any year, shall be equal as nearly as may be to the amount payable for principal and interest during each of the other years of such period of five years, such Debentures to be made payable at the Branch of the Canadian Bank of Commerce, in the Town of Chatham.

3rd. That for the purpose of paying the sum of seven hundred and eighty dollars, being the amount charged against the said lands, so to be benefited as aforesaid, other than lands belonging to the municipality, and to cover interest thereon for five years at the rate of five per cent. per annum the following special rates, over and above all other rates, shall be assessed and levied (in the same manner and at the same time as taxes are levied) upon the undermentioned lots and parts of lots, and the amount of the said special rates and interest assessed as aforesaid, against each lot or part of lot respectively shall be divided into five equal parts, and one such part shall be assessed and levied as aforesaid, in each year for five years, after the final passing of this By-law, during which the said debentures have to run.

No. 543—A BY-LAW

To assess and levy rates for County, Township and School purposes for the year 1890.

Be it enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of Raleigh, in the County of Kent:

2nd That the Clerk of this Corporation is hereby required to levy a special rate (ever and above all other rates) upon, and which shall be collected from all the rateable property included in each and every School Section the Trustees of which shall furnish him, on or before the 24th day of August, with a written statement signed by the Secretary-Treasurer, and certified by the seal thereof, of the amount required for Public or Separate School purposes in each School Section, such a rate pro rata as will amount to the sum so required, as near as may be; and the Treasurer of this Corporation is hereby authorized and instructed to pay to the order of the Secretary-Treasurer or Trustees of each School Section all moneys so levied and credited to such School Section.

3 That the rates imposed by this By-law shall be collected by the Collector of rates for the said Township of Raleigh, and paid over to the Treasurer of this Corporation in bankable funds, on or before the 14th day of December, A. D. 1890, in so far as the law will enable him so to do; unless otherwise ordered by this Council.

To provide for the repair of the Carter Drain in the Township of Raleigh, in the County of Kent, and for borrowing on the credit of the Municipality the sum of \$401.50 for completing the same. [Provisionally adopted the 11th day of Aug't, A. D. 1890.]

WHEREAS, on the Ninth day of September, A. D. 1881, the Municipal Council of the Township of Raleigh, did pass a By-law to provide for the construction of the Carter drain, numbered 371, and known as "The Carter Drain By-law."

And whereas, the said drain was completed in terms of the said By-law, and has been since and is now in operation.

And whereas, complaint has been made that the portion of the said drain southerly from the junction of the Graham drain is in need of repair.

And Whereas thereupon, the said Council procured an examination to be made by W. G. McGeorge, P. L. S., being a person competent for such purpose, of the said locality proposed to be drained, and has also procured plans and estimates of the work to be made by the said W. G. McGeorge, and an assessment to be made by him of the real property to be benefitted by such proposed work, stating as nearly as he can the proportion of benefit which, in his opinion, will be derived in consequence of such proposed work, by every lot or portion of lot, the said assessment so made being the assessment hereinafter by this By-law enacted, to be assessed and levied upon the lots and parts of lots hereinafter in that behalf specially set forth and described, and the report of the said W. G. McGeorge in respect thereof, and of the said proposed work being as follows:

## No. 549—A BY-LAW

To provide for draining parts of the Township of Raleigh by the construction of the Pardo and Sullivan drains, both in the Township of Raleigh, in the County of Kent, and for borrowing on the credit of the municipality the sum of \$486, for completing the same. Provisionally adopted 11th day of August, A. D. 1890.

WHEREAS a majority in number of the owners as shown by the last Revised Assessment Roll, of the property hereinafter set forth to be benefitted by the construction of the Pardo and Sullivan Drains have petitioned the Council of the said municipality as follows:

No. 553—A BY-LAW

To provide for the construction of the Griffin drain, in the Township of Raleigh, in the County of Kent, and for borrowing on the credit of the municipality the sum of \$302.55 for completing the same.

Provisionally adopted 13th day of October, A.D. 1890.

WHEREAS a majority in number of the owners as shown by the last revised Assessment roll of the property hereinafter set forth to be benefitted by the construction of the Griffin drain have petitioned the Council of the said Township of Raleigh, praying that a drain be constructed on the southeasterly side of the line between Cons. 8 and A, across Lot one and southwest half of lot two, from the Town line to the Deary drain.

And Whereas thereupon, the said Council procured an examination to be made by W. G. McGeorge, P.L.S., being a person competent for such purpose, of the said locality proposed to be drained, and has also procured plans and estimates of the work to be made by the said W. G. 3. That the said Secretary shall be paid a salary of fifteen dollars per annum ; the said Medical Health Officer, a salary of twenty dollars per annum ; and that each member of the Board shall, for each day he is called upon to act receive the sum of two dollars.

4. That the following named persons be and they are hereby appointed Auditors, viz : Milton Backus, nominated by the Reeve, and Donald McPherson, nominated by the Council, who, in consideration of the sum of ten dollars each per annum, shall perform all the duties required by Section 263 of "The Municipal Act," and amendments thereto.

5. That Wm. H. White be and he is hereby appointed Assessor and Collector of dog tax, subject to the provisions of the "Assessment Act" and the By-laws of this municipality, and the said Assessor for such duties duly performed, shall receive the sum of \$100.

6. That W. G. McGeorge, P. L. S., be and he is hereby appointed Engineer under "The Ditches and Watercourses Act," and shall be paid by the usual fees for services rendered.

7. That the aforesaid officers shall hold office until their successors have been duly appointed and qualified, or until otherwise relieved by this Council.

## No. 557—A BY-LAW

Respecting Statute Labor.

Be it enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of Raleigh :

1. That from and after the passing of this By-law every male inhabitant of the Municipality, of the age of twenty-one years and under sixty years who is not assessed for taxable property and not exempt by law, shall perform two days of Statute Labor on the Public Highways, but may commute for the same at the rate of fifty cents per day, by tendering the money to the Overseer within two days from the time he was notified to perform Statute Labor, subject to the penalties contained in the 14th clause hereof.

2. All persons appearing by the last Revised Assessment Roll to be rated for property liable to taxation, shall perform Statute Labor on the Public Highways in the respec-

tive Statute Labor divisions in which their said property is situated as follows, except as provided hereinafter: Where the property is assessed \$500 and under, two days; over \$500 and up to \$1000, three days; and for each additional \$1000, one additional day; but the said labor may be commuted at fifty cents for each day's labor, if tendered in money to the overseer within two days from the time he was notified to perform Statute Labor. And in case the work is not performed or the money tendered as aforesaid, the oversaid shall return the said labor to the Township Clerk who shall place the same on the Collector's Roll at the rate of one dollar per day. Provided no person shall be compelled to perform Statute Labor in two separate Statute Labor divisions for the property on which he resides. Provided also where ratepayer is assessed for more than one piece of property two days shall be deducted on each piece of property as per the above scale for regulating Statute Labor, except for the first parcel assessed.

3. It shall be the duties of Overseers after having received notice of their appointment, to make their declaration of office at or before the time named in such notice, before the Reeve, Deputy-Reeves, Clerk or any Justice of the Peace, and shall deposit the same with the Clerk of the Municipality, from whom he shall receive the names of all persons appearing by the Assessment Rolls able to perform Statute Labor, and shall add thereto the names of all persons liable to perform Statute Labor under the first clause of this By-law. And shall give to all persons liable to perform Statute Labor at least three days' notice, stating the time and place at which they will be required to work, and what implements will be required. Provided that no person shall be required to furnish implements not in their possession.

4. It shall be the duty of the Overseers to superintend, make and keep in good repair the highways, ditches and sidewalks within their divisions, and expend faithfully to the best of their ability all moneys received by them in lieu of Statute Labor. To cause sufficient guards to be erected at all dangerous places, and to see that all work of ditching or grading is completed before the first day of August in each year. To prevent any person from ditching or grading after the said date, and if the work is not then performed the Overseer shall return it as undone to the Clerk.

5. It shall be the further duty of the Overseers in case of any serious damage to bridge or embankment, or in case of impediment by snow or other cause to call out the ratepayers of their division to repair such damage, or remove such impediment to the extent of their Statute Labor for the ensuing year, and the Overseer's certificate shall be sufficient to exempt all such persons from the amount of Statute Labor so performed. And in case the Statute Labor at the disposal of the Overseer is not sufficient for such purpose, then the Overseer shall immediately report to the Commissioner of the division, and after such report the responsibility of the Overseer shall cease.

6. It shall be the duty of the overseer to make a correct return to the Clerk of the Municipality not later than the first day of September in each year of all Statute Labor performed and unperformed. Also an account of the receipts and expenditures of all moneys received by him in virtue of his office; and the Clerk is hereby required to place on the collector's roll the sum of two dollars against every overseer who has not made his return at said date, and one dollar for each day's labor not then reported as having been performed.

7. It shall be the duty of the overseers to impound all horses, cattle, sheep, pigs, etc., running at large or injuring the public highway as provided in By-law No. 437, respecting Pounds, and to prosecute before any Justice of the Peace any person or persons who shall injure or destroy any tree or shrub growing or planted for shade or ornament upon any public highway, or who shall cut down or deface any signboards or any printed or written notices, or who shall place any timber, stone, wood, fences or any other encumbrance upon any public highway, or who shall commit any wilful injury to any bridge, embankment, ditch or sidewalk upon any public highway. Such persons being convicted thereof before any Justice of the Peace shall be liable to the penalties hereinafter imposed.

8. It shall be the duty of the overseers to enforce the provisions of "The Act to prevent the spreading of noxious weeds," by causing to be cut down all noxious weeds growing on the highway and also to give notice to the owner or occupier of any land within his division whereon noxious weeds of any kind are growing and in danger of going to seed, requiring him or them to cause the same to be cut down within five days from service of such notice, and in case such owner or occupant refuses to cut down such noxious weeds, the said overseer may enter upon the land and cause such noxious weeds to be cut down subject to the provisions and penalties in the above recited act contained.

9. That for the purposes of this By-law, eight hours shall constitute one day's labor, and eight hours of one man and team with plow, scraper or wagon shall constitute three days' labor. All damage to animals or implements to be at the risk of the owner.

10. That all overseers shall be allowed to the extent of their Statute Labor if not exceeding eight days, for the performance of their duty as overseers and no more.

11. It shall be the duty of the overseers to expend the money received by them in

lien of Statute Labor, in letting work by public sale to the lowest bidder, after posting notice of such sale four days prior to the sale, in at least three public places, except in case any bridge, culvert, embankment or other part of any highway gives way so as to endanger public travel thereon, then the work may be proceeded with at once on the most favorable terms without such notice.

12. Any person or persons neglecting or refusing to perform the duties hereby imposed shall, upon conviction thereof before any Justice of the Peace, incur a penalty of not less than two dollars and not more than twenty dollars, together with the costs of prosecution and distress, by distress of the offender's goods and chattels, and in case there is no sufficient distress, such offender may be committed to the common gaol of the county and there put to hard labor for any time not exceeding ten days, unless such penalty and costs and the costs of the warrant of commitment and of conveying the said person to gaol be sooner paid, and all such fines shall be paid to the Treasurer of this Corporation.

13. That all By-laws heretofore passed inconsistent with this By-law be, and the same are hereby repealed.
