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


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
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BY-LAWS OF THE TOWNSHIP OF RALEIGH,

Passed between 7th April, 1887, and 15th March, 1888.

No. 469-A BY-LAW

To appropriate certain sums of money for the improvement of the Roads and Bridges in the Township of Raleigh.

WHEREAS the sum of one hundred and eighty-six 49-100 dollars is accruing from nonresident Statute Labor tax, as reported by the Clerk. And Whereas it is necessary to raise an additional sum of one thousand five hundred dollars for the maintenance and improvement of the Roads and Bridges in the Township of Raleigh for the current year.

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of Raleigh, under and by virtue of the Consolidated Municipal Act of 1883 and amendments thereto.

lst. That the sum of one thousand eight hundred and six 49-100 dollars, inclusive of the amount accruing from non-resident Statute Labor tax aforesaid, be and the same is hereby appropriated for the improvement of the roads and bridges in the said Township of Raleigh, in accordonce with By law 412 and the above recited Act, that is to say :

2d. That it shall be the duty of each Commissioner as appointed by By-law No. 449 to expend the amount so appropriated for the improvement of the roads and bridges in his Division, and he is hereby authorized to grant orders on the Treasurer of this Corporation to persons filling contracts thereon, less the amount hereinunder specified as overdrawn in the respective Rural Road Divisions in the year A.D. 1886, stating on each order the nature of the work done and where it was performed; provided always, that the moneys accruing from non-resident Statute Labor tax shall be expended in the Statute Labor division wherein it was collected as reported by the Clerk to each Commissioner; and that no Commissioner shall exceed the aint. hereinbefore appropriated to his Division without hav ing first obtained the consent of the Council and the Treasurer notified thereof by the Clerk.

3d. That it shall be the duty of the Treasurer to withhold the following sums, as shown

by the Auditors' Report to be overdrawn, and to charge to the respective Rural Road Divisions, as follows:—To R. R. Division No. 1, \$121.03; No. 2, \$21.04; No. 3, \$125.69. 4th. That the following special appropriations be made, viz:—On the Raleigh and Har wich Town line, one hundred dollars, and that Stephen White be Commissioner to expend the same. On the line between Raleigh and Tilbury East from the centre of the Eighth Con, to Lake Eric, the sum of sixty dollars, and Samuel Wellwood be Commissioner to expend the same. On the line between Raleigh and Tilbury East from the centre of the Eighth Con. to the River Thames, the sum of forty dollars, and Gilbert H. Dolsen be Commissioner to expend the same. Provided always, that the adjoining Municipalities appropriate equal amounts for the several purposes herein provided for.

To amend By-law No. 468, entitled "A By-law to regulate the keeping and running at large of Dogs.

BE it enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of Raleigh:

1st. That By-law mumbered 468 be amended as follows :- Section number One of said By-law number 468 is hereby repealed, and the following section shall be read in lieu thereof : That from and after the passing of this By-law the owner or harborer of every dog or bitch within the limits of the Township of Ruleigh shall cause the same to be registered at the office of the Township Clerk or Assessor, and shall cause a collar to be worn around the neck of each to which shall be attached a metallic plate to be supplied by the Township Clerk or Assessor, having stamped thereon a number corresponding with the number under which said dog or bitch is registered, and the year for which the said registration has been made, and such metallic plate shall be supplied free of cost after registration. The owner or harborer of every dog or bitch, or person registering the same, shall at the time of registration pay to the said Clerk or Assessor, for every dog the sum of one dollar, and for every bitch the sum of two dollars, and such registration shall be renewed annually on or before the first day of May in each and every year. The said Clerk shall from time to time, at the meetings of Council, account to the Treasurer of this Corporation for the sums so received by him, and the said Assessor shall pay over to the said Treasurer at loast every two weeks the sums so received by him, and shall report to the Clerk the names of owners and numbers of tags of all registrations made by him after the commencement of his duties, until the roll is finally returned by him.

2d. That the following named persons be and are hereby appointed Inspectors to enforce the provisions of this By-law and of the "Canada Thistle Act," viz.:—In the First R. R. Division, Milton Backus; in the Second R. R. Division, Hulbert D. Kersey; in the Third R. R. Division, James H. Gillhuly; in the Fourth R. R. Division, A. D. Whaley; in the Fifth R. R. Division, Wm. H. Taylor.

3d. It shall be the duty of the said Inspectors to see that the provisions of the said Bylaw are enforced, and to prosecute all owners or harborers of dogs who have not complied thereunto. Also, it shall be their duty to see that the provisions of the Canada Thistle Act are efficiently and diligently enforced in their Divisions, independent of the Overseers of the Statute Labor, and the salary of said Inspectors shall be fifteen dollars each

4tb. It shall further be the duty of the said Inspectors to attend to and prosecute upon all complaints made by ratepayers in his Division under a penalty of forfeiture of salary, and he shall not divulge the names of those ratepayers who have given information. It shall be the duty of the Clerk to provide the said Inspectors with the names of all persons on the Assessment Roll who have not paid the tax on dogs when the Assessor returns his Roll.

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No. 472-A BY-LAW

To open up and establish a road upon and across part of Lot number Nineteen in the Seventh Concession of the Township of Raleigh.

WHEREAS this Council have determined and agreed to open up and establish a road upon and across the south-easterly part of Lot number Nineteen in the Seventh Concession of Raleigh, as hereinafter set forth and described. And Whereas this Council have caused all notices to be given as required by the Consolidated Municipal Act of 1883 and amendments thereto, of the intention of this Council to open said road. And Whereas all persons whose lands might be prejudicially affected by the opening of said road have been heard who petitioned to be so heard. And Whereas all objections made to the opening of said road have been duly considered. And Whereas this Council are of opinion that the opening of the said road is necessary and expedient. Therefore be it enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township

of Raleigh in the County of Kent :

1. That the parcel of land comprising all and singular that portion of Lot No. Nineteen in the Seventh concession of the said Township of Raleigh, commencing at the southerly termination of the road between Lots Nincteen and Twenty on the easterly limit of said road allowance; thence southeasterly fifty one rods, more or less, on a line which, if produced, would run on the line of the lands owned by Alfred Davidson; thence southwesterly to the easterly limit of the road allowance between Lots Eighteen and Nineteen; thence northwesterly along said line thirty-three feet; thence north-casterly parallel with The above described line to within thirty-three feet of the line between Lots Nineteen and Twenty above described; thence north-westerly parallel with the said line between Lots Nineteen and Twenty to the lands owned by Mitchell Bell; thence north-easterly thirtythree feet to the place of commencement; be and the same is hereby opened up and estab-lished for public use as a road and public highway of and for the said Township of Raleigh. Read a third time and passed this 26th day of June, A.D. 1887.

To provide for draining part of the Township of Raleigh by the deepening of the Snell Drain, and for borrowing on the credit of the Municipality the sum of \$708.00 for

completing the same. Provisionally adopted the 26th day of May, A.D. 1887. WHEREAS a majority in number of the owners as shown by the last revised Assessment Roll of the property hereinafter set forth to be benefitted by the deepening of the Snell Drain, have petitioned the Council of the said Township of Raleigh, praying that the said Snell Drain be deepened at least one foot deeper than the original specifications, and of sufficient width to carry the waters flowing into it from the 13th and 14th Concessions.

And Whereas thereupon the said Council procured an examination to be made by W. G. McGeorge, P.L.S., being a person competent for such purpose, of the said Drain proposed to be deepened, and has also procured plans and estimates of the work to be made by the said W. G. McGeorge, and an assessment to be made by size of the real property to be benefitted by such deepening, stating as nearly as he can the proportion of benefit which in his opinion will be derived in consequence of such deepening by every road and lot or portion of lot; the said assessment so made and the report of the said W. G. Me-George in respect thereof and of the said works being as follows:

Be it therefore enacted by the said Municipal Council of the said Township of Raleigh pursuant to the provisions of the "Consolidated Municipal Act of 1883, and amendments thereto."

1st. That the said report, plans and estimates of the said Engineer be adopted, and the sald works be made and constructed in accordance therewith.

2nd. That the Reeve of the aaid Township of Raleigh may borrow on the credit of the Corporation of the said Township, the sam of seven hundred and eight dollars, being the portion of the funds necessary for the work not assessed to the Municipality together with interest at the rate of five per centum per annum, payable annually, and may issue Dehentures of the Corporation for that amount and interest, in sums of not less than One Hundred Dollars each, payable in five years from the date on which this By-law takes effect, in five consecutive annual instalments, to be of such amounts that the aggregate amount payable for principal and interest in any year, shall be equal (as nearly as may be) to the amount payable for principal and interest during each of the other years of such period of five years : such Debentures to be made payable at the Branch of the Canadian Bank of Commerce in the Town of Chatham.

3rd. That for the purpose of paying the sum of seven hundred and eight dollars, being the amount charged against the said lands so to be benefited as aforesaid, other than roads belonging to the Municipality, and to cover interest thereon for five years at the rate of five per centum per annum, the following special rates, over and above all other rates, shall be assessed and levied (in the same manner and at the same time as taxes are levied), upon the undermentioned lots and parts of lots ; and the amount of the said special rates and interest assessed as aforesaid against each lot or part of lot respectively shall be divided into five equal parts, and one such part shall be assessed and levied as aforesaid, in each year for five years, after the final passeing of this By-law, during which the said Debentures have have to run.

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4th. That the sum of one hundred five and 10-100 dollars, being the total amount assessed against the said roads of the said Municipality, shall be paid by the Treasurer of this Corporation out of the general funds of the Municipality.

this Corporation out of the general funds of the Municipality. 5th. That Samuel L. Wellwood be and he is hereby uppointed Commissioner to let the contract or contracts for the deepening of the said drain and works connected therewith, by public sale to the lowest bidder (not exceeding the estimate), but every such contractor, with one good and sufficient surety, shall be required forthwith to enter into bonds for the due performance and completion of such contract according to said plans and speclications, and within the time mentioned in such bond, (unless otherwise ordered by the Council); and it shall be the duty of the said Commissioner to cause the said works to be made and completed in accordance with such plans and specifications; and to grant orders on the Treasurer to each contractor, less 2) per cent, of the amount due, until the contract is fully completed and duly accepted by the Council; and for the due performance of these and all duties of Commissioner, he the said Commissioner shall be entitled to receive a sum of twenty-five dollars, and shall be held personally responsible for the completion of the work and payment of the money as herein provided.

6th. That this By-law shall be published in THE CHATHAM BANNER newspaper for four successive weeks previous to the final passing thereof, and may be eited and referred to as "The Snell Drain By-law of 1887," and shall take effect on and after the final passing hereof. [Read a third time and passed this Thirtieth day of June, A.D. 1887.]

No. 474-A BY-LAW

To assess and levy rates for County, Township and School purposes for the year 1887. BE it enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of Raleigh, in the County of Kent.

ist. That the following sums shall be levied and collected upon and from all the rateable property of the Township of Raleigh for the year of our Lord 1887:

2d. The sum of three thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven 18-100 dollars is hereby levied upon and hull be collected from all the rateable property of the said Township of Raleigh for the general purposes of the County of Kent for the year of our Lord 1887, by a rate of one and a-half mills in the dollar.

3d. That the further sum of six thousand dollars, as per Schedule A hereunto annexed, is hereby levied upon and shall be collected from all the rateable property of the Township of Raleigh for Township purposes for the year of our Lord 1887, by a rate of two 3-10 mills in the dollar.

4th. The further sum of five hundred and thirty-eight dollars is hereby levied upon and shall be collected from all the rateable property of the said Township of Raleigh [save and except on the property of certain Roman Catholic supporters of Separate Schools], for the year of our Lord 1887, by a rate on the dollar of 23-100 of a mill.

5th. That if the above sums of money so levied and collected according to the said rates shall at any time exceed the amount so required for the aforesaid purposes respectively, the Treasur r of this Corporation shall pass such excess to any deficiency that may arise for any or either of the above mentioned purposes; and if no deficiency should arise then such excess shall be approviated to the general purposes of the Township.

6th. That the Clerk of this Corporation is hereby required to levy a special rate [over and above all other rates] upon, and which shall be collected from all the rateable property included in each and every School Section the Trustees of which shall furnish him, on or before the 24th day of Angust with a written statement signed by the Secretary-Treasurer and certified by the seal thereof, of the amount required for Public or Separate School purposes in each School Section, such a rate pro rata as will amount to the sum so required, as near as may be—save and except Union School Sections where the school houses are beyond the limits of the Municipality; and the Treasarer of this Corporation is hereby authorized and instructed to pay to the order of the Trustees of each School Section within the limits of this Municipality any moneys received by him on account of School rates so levied and applied and credited to such School Section.

7th. That the rates imposed by this By-law shall be collected and paid over to the Treasurer of this Corporation in bankable funds on or before the 14th day of December, 1886, [unless otherwise ordered by the Council], by the Collector of rates for the said Township of Raleigh, in so far as the law will enable him to do so.

No. 475-A BY-LAW

To appoint an Arbitrator in the matter of the appeal by the Corporation of the Township of Harwich against the assessment levied for the repair of the Gregory Drain.

WHEREAS the Corporation of the Township of Harwich have appealed against the assessment made by W. G. McGeorge, P.L.S., to provide for repairing the Gregory Drain in the Township of Raleigh, on the ground that the assessment levied on the said Township of Harwich is too high, and for other reasons. And Whereas the said Corporation of the Township of Harwich have nominated and appointed an arbitrator in said matter.

Therefore be it enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of Raleigh, in the County of Kent, under and by virtue of the "Consolidated Municipal Act of 1883," and amendments thereto :

1st. That John Wright, of the Township of Dover, in the County of Kent, be and he is hereby appointed an arbitrator on behalf of the said Township of Raleigh, to hear, arbitrate upon, and finally dotermine all matters so in dispute between this Corporation and the said Corporation of the Township of Harwich, in reference to the said assessment for the repair of the said Gregory Drain.

No. 476-A BY-LAW

To appoint an Arbitrator in the matter of the Howard Drain in the Township of Harwich. WHEREAS the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of Harwich have served upon the Reevo of this Township a copy of report, plans and estimates for the con-struction of the Howard drain in the said Township of Harwich. And Whereas this Council is of opinion that the said assessment is unjust, and that no benefit is or can be derived by lands in Raleigh from the said drain.

Therefore be it enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of Raleigh :

1. That John Wright, Esquire, of the Township of Dover, in the County of Kent, be and he is hereby nominated and appointed Arbitrator by and for the said Township of Raleigh to hear, arbitrate upon and determine all matters so in dispute between the said Municipalities of Harwich and Raleigh relative to the said Howard Drain.

2. That Charles E. Pegley be und he is hereby appointed to prepare notice of appeal and to act as legal agent and conduct the said arbitration for and in behalf of the said Township of Raleigh. [Read a third time and passed this 25th day of July, A.D. 1887.

No. 477-A BY-LAW

To amend By-law No. 437, entitled "A By-law respecting Pounds and Poundkeepers." BE it enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of Raleigh, in the County of Kent: That By-law numbered 437 of the Township of Raleigh, entitled "A By-law respecting Pounds and Poundkeepers," finally passed on the Second day of September, 1885, be and the same is hereby amended as follows :

The first chanse of said By-law numbered 437 is hereby repealed, and the following clause shall be read in lieu thereof : "1st. That from and after the passing of this By-law all horses, bulls, oxen, cows, sheep, goats, pigs, geese, turkeys, hens or any other animal, shall be restrained and wholly prohibited from running at large within this Municipality, and all such animals found running at large on any public highway within the Municipality may be impounded, subject to the provisions and restrictions hereinafter set forth, by the Overseer of Highways or any other person; and such Overseer or any other person may deliver to the Poundkeeper at the time such animals are impounded, a statement of their charges for loss of time and trouble in conveying such animals to the Pound, not exceeding twenty-five cents for each horse, fifteen cents for each head of cattle, and ten cents for any other animal so impounded, except poultry, which shall be five cents each. And the Poundkeeper shall levy and collect such sum in addition to his other lawful fees and charges, and shall forthwith pay over the same to the person delivering such animals to him, and shall account for such charges in the manner provided in the twelfth elause of this By-law." 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No. 478-A BY-LAW

To provide for draining parts of the Township of Raleigh by the repairing of the Waddick Drain, and for borrowing on the credit of the Municipality the sum of \$865.00 for completing the same. Provisionally adopted the 30th day of June, A.D. 1887.

WHEREAS on the sixth day of October, A.D. 1873, the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of Ral. It passed a By-law numbered 242, and entitled "A Byhaw to provide for the deepening of the Waldick Creek in the Township of Raleigh, and for borrowing on the credit of the Municipality the sum of \$2296.80 for completing the same." And Whereas the said Drain was completed in terms of the said By-law. And Whereas complaint has been made to the said Council that a portion of the said drain, commencing at the line between the 10th and 11th Concessions, thence towards its outlet, has become tilled up with dirt and rubbish, and in need of repair. And Whereas the said Council are required to maintain and keep in repair the said drain, as provided in the above recited By-law.

And Whereas thereopon the said Council procured an examination to be made by W. G. McGeorge, P.L.S., being a person competent for such purpose, of the said drain proposed to be repaired, and has also procured plans find estimates of the work to be made by the said W. G. McGeorge, and an assessment to be made by him of the real property to be benefitted by such repair, stating as nearly as he can the proportion of benefit which in his opinion will be derived in consequence of such repair by every road and lot or portion of lot; the said assessment so made and the report of the said W. G. Mc-George in respect thereof, and of the said work, being as follows:
